
Rounding out the time will be senior Sierra Rodriguez, juniors Dara Beck and Morgan Olson and sophomore Shelby Verke.

The girls will take on Region 5 competitors including last year's champions, the Garrison Troopers, and runners up, the Grant County Coyotes.





Miner girls push strong mental game

With a roster of upperclassmen bringing the skill, Wilton-Wing's volleyball coaches are working to bring effort and confidence up to match.

Heidi Weisgarber, head coach for the Miners, said the team of girls brings solid experience for the varsity team and strong leadership for younger girls this year. Now, the team is working on pushing confidence in the girls' skill.

"All the girls are great about trusting each other on the court but struggle with trusting themselves throughout the entire game, so we are working on that mindset piece a lot," Weisgarber said.

Weisgarber said the Miners are working hard on the mental aspect of the game, from confidence to effort.

"We always say, 'we don't coach effort,'" Weisgarber said. "The harder the girls work in practice, the more it'll show in matches."

While the team works on defense and passing improvements this season, Weisgarber said that the team is showing strength in several areas, including serving, communication and general flexibility.

"(We) switched rotation from 5-1 to 6-2 this year, adjusted to new coaching staff and new positions," Weisgarber said. "They're open to trying new things and making adjustments."

Key players this year will be seniors Jordyn Thorson and River Soto, who bring skill and attitude to the court.

"Jordyn Thorson -- Not only is she a great setter, but she is consistent with her serves and can attack the ball well. She knows how to play all around the court and is always willing to help younger athletes," Weisgarber said. "And River Soto. She has the most positive attitude, which carries over to her teammates. She can put up great blocks at the net and is always striving to be better. She's a hard worker and is constantly improving with playing at the net."

Weisgarber said the team is looking forward to competing

against neighboring Washburn in a fun rivalry and is overall looking for growth this year.

"We have a 'Miner Mission' this season and a huge part of that is development," Weisgarber said. "Coaches and players are always learning new things and making adjustments, so we just want to capitalize on that and see improvements every game throughout the season."



Consistency is key

It has been eight long years since Velva's football program has missed out on an opportunity to play in the postseason. A streak like this takes hard work and above all else consistency

"The stability of our program, I've been here for over 30 years now and the assistants I've had underneath me provide a sense of stability in this program I believe." said Velva head coach Larry Sandy when asked about his team's extended success as a program.

With consistency something the coaching staff of the Aggies values, they have to be pleased with the early look of this year's roster. The team is welcoming back all but four of their varsity players from last season, including senior linebacker/tight end Payton Bodine "We just work well together, we only lost four guys from last year and outside of that many of us grew up playing ball together. We trust each other to go out there and make the plays necessary."

Consistency on the roster to this level is incredibly rare in high school sports, often varsity teams rely heavily on a core of seniors that graduate following the season and start the process all over again next year.

While many of the athletes present at practices are familiar faces this marks the second year of Garrison co-oping with Velva and the first season cooping with Velva for Drake/ Anamoose. With this being the second year of the Garrison Co-op there will no longer be restrictions on who the Aggies are able to use on the varsity roster, Drake/Anamoose will only be able to send seniors to play on the varsity team as are the rules for a first year emergency co-op.

Athletes from Drake/ Anamoose may be new to the Aggies gridiron but Velva already co-ops with them for track so many of the Velva players feel like they already know their Drake/Anamoose teammates.

A winning culture such as Velva's has helped the Aggies establish a physically dominant brand of football, "We want to play hard, fast, competitive football . You go out there and you hit a guy. As a lineman that's what we're taught. There's a guy three yards downfield of you? Then you go out there, smack him, and get him out of the way for our team to score." senior offensive lineman Gabe Lakoduk had to say when asked

about the type of football they hope to play this season.

Following yet another successful season in which they went 7-3 and secured a playoff berth the Aggies have their sights set on the current season hoping to not only replicate past success but improve upon it with the new members of the team and coaching staff.

The Aggies are already ahead of the game, winning their first three games (44-12 against Hazen, 30-19 against Beulah and 40-8 against Des Lacs-Burlington), placing them as the top-ranking team in Region 3.


The team is focusing on growth on and off the field, the coach said.

Stamstad said the boys will work on carefully planning for competitions, keeping in mind the variety of runners on the

"We will have to manage the miles carefully with such a wide range of experience on our teams," Stamstad said. "Seniors can typically handle a higher mileage load than 7thand 8th-graders, so we'll have to be careful about how we group the kids.'

Stamsaid said the Roughriders are looking to grow steadily over the course of the season, both physically and mentally.

"We're looking to grow and get stronger as the season goes on," Stamstad said. "Obviously, we want to do well and for the kids to improve. But ultimately, we want them to develop that desire to win -- that internal motivation that they can call on when the races get tough."




