


Ryan Buetow






My SAE project is a Vegetable production. This year I planted Peas, Tomatoes, strawberries, lettuce and many different peppers. We built a planter out of scrap wood we had. It took a lot of hard work and time. I took all the old soil out and put in fresh soil. We put up a fence for the peas to grow on. I watered it every day once a day and on very hot days I would water it twice. I weeded it once a week and once everything started to grow I would go out every day and see if anything was ripe enough to pick and eat. When it started to get cold I would take a sheet and place it over the plants so they would not freeze to keep them alive and to get as much off of them as I could.



My SAE is working with horses. I feed them and ride them. I halter broke one of my horses. I brush them to have good soft fur. I give them showers and wash them in the summer. I make sure that they have enough water. I also help teach little kids to ride horses like for example my little sister.



My SAE is a Beef Cattle production placement. I own cows, which I calve out. I take care of the cows by making hay and feeding them. I fix fences and work on equipment to be able to keep my operation running. I also help my dad out on the ranch.

My SAE project is a beef production steer. I bought my steer last spring and I bought him with stimulus checks. My family raises 2 every year but this year I wanted to raise one on my own. In total we have 3 steers. In the winter time they get fed 1 five gallon bucket and a half of scoop mineral. In the summer we put them out in the pasture for the duration of time and 3 times a week I go out and feed a half a bucket of corn. In the summer my family and I decided to put electrical fencing up so the steers would not get out. I plan to bring them to the butcher this year. I think this project has taught me how to take on major responsibility and to be held accountable at any time. In the future I will definitely be doing this again and I enjoyed this a lot.



My SAE project is restoring this 1963 John Deere model 2010 for the past five months. Restoring this tractor has taken a lot of time to get into a running and working order. I have been taking apart the PTO to replace the clutch. I have done ignition work and did maintenance on the engine to make sure it works without any problems. This tractor will be used for farm work and for the hay season. The farm is located east of White Shield.





My SAE is a Forage Production. I spent my summer cutting and baling hay for the cattle. Due to the lack of rain this year, most of the hay made for our cattle was made east of Carrington. I kept up with maintenance and repairs on the haybine, as well as other equipment.

My SAE was a Vegetable Production. I worked with GAIA and the Garrison Area Food Pantry to grow corn in the Garrison Community Garden. In the garden, I measured each plot for community members to grow their crops. I then put the stakes in the ground and used twine to make the plots easily identifiable as different plots. I planted corn in my plot. Even though it didn't turn out exactly how I had planned, it was a good learning experience.



My SAE is Dairy Goat Production. Through this SAE I raise and care for two breeds of dairy goats, Nigerian Dwarf and Mini Nubian. I feed and water them daily and breed the does in the fall. I currently have a herd of fourteen goats, eight of which are due to have kids this spring. After the does kid in the spring I milk the does twice daily and feed the milk to the babies. I sell most of the kids over the summer and take my goats to various shows.

Last year I was able to run grain cart over the summer and still ran combine but not as much because I was learning how to operate the cart. My plan for this year is to farm a small field close to our farm. I plan to pay rent to my uncle and dad. I'm going to plant, spray, and combine at the end of this year.



My Supervised Agricultural Experience is tapping box elder trees. The first step is to make a 1 inch hole with an electric hand screwdriver about 3 feet up from the ground, then grab a spile and a hammer and hammer the spile in the hole in the tree. The second is to get a 5 gallon bucket and put it under the spile and get some elastic. The third thing to do is to get a hose that fits in the spile, and make a hole in the lid of the bucket so you can put the hose through the lid.







