

#### Items to avoid when composting

• Black walnut tree leaves or twigs: Leaves or twigs from black walnut release substances that might prove harmful to plants.

• Coal or charcoal ash: Coal or ash from charcoal, such as the ash that builds up in the bottom of charcoal grills, may contain substances that are harmful to plants.

• Dairy products: When added to compost piles, dairy products, including butter, milk, sour cream, yogurt and eggs, can be malodorous and may attract pests, including rodents and flies.


• Diseased or insect-ridden plants: The diseases and insects that plague plants may survive being transferred to compost piles. When the compost is ultimately distributed, these diseases and insects might then plague other plants.

• Fats, grease, lard, or oils: Fats, grease, lard or oils also may attract rodents and flies, and that might be due to the unpleasant odors such substances can pro duce when added to compost piles. • Meat or fish bones and scraps: Like fats, grease, lard or oils, scraps from meat and fish and fish bones can smell unpleasant, potentially attracting rodents and flies. • Pet waste: Pet waste, including soiled cat litter, may contain parasites, bacteria, germs, pathogens, and viruses that can be harmful. • Grass trimmings treated with chemical pesticides: Trimmings from grass that was treated with chemical pesticides can negate the effects of composting by killing beneficial organisms produced within compost piles or bins.







During the spring I rolled soybeans, during the summer I threw square bales, and in the fall, I ran grain cart during harvest. I enjoy working for the farm and look forward to being out there again this year.



#### Ryan Trautman

My SAE project is tapping trees. I collect sap from box elder trees. I've been collecting sap for years. We start tapping in February and stop in April. We start by cleaning the equipment needed for tapping. Then we go to each tree one by one and tap them using a spile. As we are doing that we attach one end of the hose to the spile and the other end to the bucket then put a bucket at the base of the tree; so that we can collect it from the tree. Then we start checking for sap the next day. We check the trees two times a day, once in the morning and once at night.








#### Morgan Seidler
