
## Classes to be held at Fort Stevenson

## Our Director: Jude

A familiar face and name once again graces the director's chair of the Sakakawea Area Council for the Arts' production of Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol." The production is part of this year's Dickens Village Vestival.

Jude Iverson directs the 30th anniversary SACA production.

Iverson was there from the start. She recalled it was 30 years ago and she was SACA president and theater chair. Pat Crank Koenig was music chair.

"Early in the year she suggested we do a musical version of "A Christmas Carol" and bring in the Chamber of Commerce to do some special promotions on the days of the productions," Iverson recalled. The cast featured more than 40 actors.

Koenig met a couple in Minot who had some background with a Dickens Festival in Southern California. They were hired to direct the production, but it didn't work out, so Koenig and Iverson took the reins with only  $3\frac{1}{2}$  weeks to go.

The Dickens Village Festival was born.

"Over the summer, Pat had more ideas for expanding the whole festival concept and we had numerous brainstorming sessions," Iverson said. "By September, we held a townhall-type meeting at the Kota Theater. Fortyfive people showed up and volunteered to either chair and/or work on the various subcommittees that had been created."

Iverson recalls she directed 6-7 plays and had small roles in a few others before branching out to be part of other aspects of the festival before focusing on her Bed and Breakfast, ideally called "Cricket on the Hearth" another one of Dickens' books.

With the 30th anniversary of Dickens and the SACA production coming up, she thought about doing something special. As the first production and director wasn't in the cards, she contacted Lisa Haugen, the musical director for the second year's production, to see if she was interested in reviving the play as scripts and musical manuscripts were still available. Haugen said she'd think about it.

No further discussion took place until a current SACA board member, Lisa Maki, inquired. Iverson agreed to direct, only if Haugen would come onboard as musical director.

With other musical talent, Chandler Hertz, Garrison High Musical Director, master pianist Deleene Wilcox and former SACA board member and stage assistant Peggy Huettl, the dream became a reality, and Iverson said she couldn't be happier.

"It's great working with these people," she said, "I'm loving it."

Iverson said her involvement and the history with the festival aside, she prefers to shine the spotlight on the contributions of the arts council and the local talent that continues to provide a production of "A Christmas Carol" year after year.

"Charles Dickens wrote a story, not a play," she reminds. "But his work has been adapted for the stage many times.

"SACA has been able to find a different script almost every year with only a few repeats and with several adaptations scripted by a local aspiring playwright. That's not an easy task." Iverson said it's the dedication of area theater lovers who commit to two and a half months of long rehearsals, studying and learning lines whenever they can squeeze in the extra time, voluntarily sharing their talent with only a few minutes of applause as their reward.



"This is truly homegrown entertainment at its best,"

she said. "Few communities can boast such a gift and we should not only be proud but ever so appreciative of the dedication they give freely."

Putting together a production the scope of "A Christmas Carol" is no easy task. This year there are 13 crew titles from directors to makeup.

"It's not only the actors we see on stage, it's an amazing crew of workers behind the scenes," she said. "It's weeks of rehearsals along with time spent on each's own learning lines, working on characters, remembering all the stage moves. And in many cases, helping with other aspects like sets, props and costuming."

A musical is doubly hard, she said.

The camaraderie, friendships made, and acquaintances renewed ties the festival to Charles Dickens and it's the one entertainment that has been a constant for 30 years.

"And it's all home grown," she said.



## Who is Charles Dickens?

Born in Portsmouth, England February 7, 1812, Charles John Huffam Dickens was an English writer and social critic.

He created some of the world's best known fictional characters and is regarded as the greatest novelist of the Victorian era.

His works enjoyed unprecedented popularity during his lifetime, and by the 20th Century, critics and scholars recognized him as a literary genius. His novels and short stories enjoy lasting popularity.

Despite his lack of formal education, he edited a weekly journal for 20 years, wrote 15 novels, five novellas, hundreds of short stories and non-fiction articles, lectured and performed extensively, was an indefatigable letter writer, and campaigned vigorously for children's rights, education, and other social reforms.

Dickens's literary success began with the 1836 serial publication of The Pickwick Papers.

Within a few years he had become an international literary celebrity, famous for his humor, satire and keen observation of character and society.

His novels, most published in monthly or weekly installments, pioneered the serial publication of narrative fiction, which became the dominant Victorian mode for novel publication.

The installment format allowed Dickens to evaluate his audience's reaction, and he often modified his plot and character development based on such feedback.

He died of a stroke June 9, 1870, leaving his final novel, The Mystery of Edwin Drood, unfinished.

He is buried in the Poets' Corner of Westminster Abbey. Charles Dickens | Feb. 7. 1812 – June 9, 1870

#### **Dickens facts:**

- Second of eight children.
- •He was forced to leave school at the age of 12 to work in a boot blacking factory along the River Thames when his father was incarcerated in a debtors' prison.
- •In 1833, he began submitting sketches to various magazines and newspapers under the pseudonym "Boz."
- •Dickens began writing "A Christmas Carol" in October 1843. It was finished by the end of November and was published in time for Christmas.
- Dickens and his wife, Catherine, (Hogarth) had 10 children before the couple separated in 1858.





He will still be around for all to see and greet and give a friendly smile as he's just going into "retirement" for a while!


