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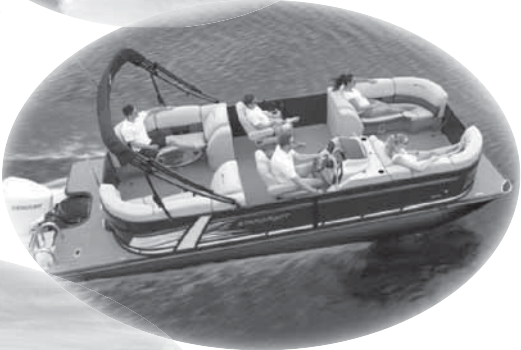
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Governor's Cup Committee Members

First in the seat, last in the seat

Zach Jackson from Garrison and Bobb McKeehen from Bismarck took the top place in the 50th Anniversary of the North Dakota Governor’s Walleye Cup tournament departing from Fort Stevenson State Park on Lake Sakakawea this weekend.

On Friday, the Jackson/McKeehen team were in the fourth flight headed out in the morning. By the end of the day, they returned with a very hefty basket of five walleye and weighed-in 26.46 pounds and ended up in first place for Day 1.

On Saturday, the flight order was flip-flopped, and they were in the first flight. First out meant they were one of the first 65 teams to weigh-in for the day.

When they brought their Day 2 basket to the stage, it was almost as much Day 1’s catch at 25.31 pounds.

Their total of 51.77 pounds of walleye blew the previous record of 43.84 pounds (with the current 10 fish limit), literally ‘out of the water’, (pun intended).

They were the first, and last, the only team to climb into the winner’s seats in the boat.

“We actually fished east and west,” McKeehen said.

They were back and forth between east and west both days. The team caught most of their 10 fish in three different locations.

“The biggest thing for us was covering water and only casting at fish that we thought were over 4.5 pounds,” McKeehen said. “If we didn’t think it was 4.5 pounds

and it wasn’t sitting the way we wanted it to sit in the water, we didn’t cast. We just kept moving until (we found) the right fish and we were in the wind the right way to make the cast.”

Montana boys know how to fish

For the first time in 21 years, a team has won the North Dakota Governor’s Cup for the second time. Ken Schmidt of Glasgow, Montana, and Mark Jones of Billings, Montana, caught a little over 40 pounds of walleye between Friday and Saturday, 7.53 pounds more than their winning weight from the 2014 Governor’s Cup.

By the end of the first day of the derby Friday, the Montana duo had placed sixth, with 20.66 pounds of walleye.

For a while, it wasn’t looking too promising as the teams that were in the lead when Schmidt and Jones arrived had racked up accumulated weights in the range of 38 and 39 pounds. For them to advance to first, they would need 18 pounds of walleye – and they got it, and then some. They brought in almost 19.4 pounds Saturday afternoon.

“I’m ecstatic,” Schmidt said after their win was announced. “Today, we were so disappointed because we figured we had 16, 17 pounds because we measure everything in Montana, we don’t weigh it.”

Husband, wife win derby title

For the first time in North Dakota Governor’s Walleye Cup Tournament

history, a husband and wife team is the derby winner.

Todd and Michelle Gehring of Garrison led from start to finish at the 2016 event to claim top prize in the state’s premier walleye fishing tournament.

The two were day one leaders with 18.20 lbs. of walleye. They followed that up totting 18.27 lbs. of fish to the scale Saturday.

The Gehrings were sitting pretty in the hot seat, leading their nearest competitors, James and Jason Wright, both of Bismarck, by nearly 7 lbs.

Stepping to the scale were David Jensen, Hazen, and David Brandt of Binford. The two were in second place after Friday action. The two brought a hefty basket of five walleye to the scale. Trailing the Gehrings by less than a pound after Friday fishing, announcer Jim Carroll barked out the weight – 18.29 lbs. A sigh went up. It was not enough to unseat the Gehrings. The nearest challengers came up short.

Todd and Michelle were Governor’s Walleye Cup Derby champions.

Low water, no problem

Low water levels on Lake Sakakawea are not expected to disrupt this year’s Governor’s Cup

Despite the lake sitting about six feet lower than last summer, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and North Dakota Game and Fish say most boating access sites will remain usable throughout the season.

“The lake level seems to be holding at 1828 and according to the predictions, it will fluctuate very little for most of the month of July,” Fort Stevenson State Park Manager Chad Trautman said. “As far as the state park’s involvement with launching and loading of Governor’s Cup, we do not feel the lake elevations will af-

fect operations at the ramp. Of course, a longer boat ramp will mean more time to back down however, it also allows users more opportunity to correct their trailer.”

North Dakota Game and Fish officials say 2026 is shaping up to be one of the lowest water years since 2008, pushing shorelines farther out and exposing hazards that are typically underwater. Rock piles, sandbars and old structures may sit closer to the surface, increasing risks for boaters navigating the lake.

Officials urge boaters to stay patient, slow down, and remain alert to changing conditions as they launch and load.

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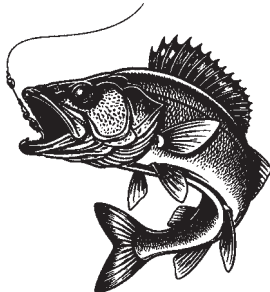

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Fishing Hall of Fame established to recognize contributions to North Dakota fishing

The North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame will mark its 46th anniversary in 2026. The hall of fame recognizes individuals, organizations and institutions that have made significant, lasting contributions to sportfishing across the state. The program highlights achievements that have advanced the sport, supported ethical fishing practices, and promoted conservation of natural resources. The organization was created in 1981 after members of the Governor's Cup Committee pushed for a way to honor people who helped grow sportfishing in North Dakota and to preserve official records and historical fishing artifacts.

The Hall of Fame also maintains public displays honoring its members and displays historical artifacts tied to North Dakota's fishing heritage. Exhibits include photographs of inductees along with antique and historically significant fishing equipment. Located in Garrison, the North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame and Museum operates inside North Country Marine & Motorsports. The owner of North Country Marine & Motorsports, Jason Foss, is the newly appointed president of the hall of fame. Visitors can view the full collection of member portraits and explore a range of items documenting the evolution of sportfishing in the region.

This year nomination

This year, there was one nomination for the Team Walleye Slayerz. Team Walleye Slayerz is a North Dakota tournament group known for chasing trophy size walleyes. Much of the organization's activity centered on Devils Lake and Lake Sakakawea. The team has built a strong following through its focus on big fish waters and its presence in competitive events across the region. "(Team Walleye Slayerz) host a great event for veterans and first responders," NDFHF President Jason Foss said. "However, (that organization) did not fill enough of our requirements to get inducted."

Nomination Information

The North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame accepts nominations year-round for individuals, organizations and institutions that have made lasting contributions to sportfishing in the state. Candidates are put forward by people familiar with their work and dedication to improving fishing in North Dakota. Inductions take place each July during the North Dakota Governor's Walleye Cup Derby. Nomination forms are available through the Hall of Fame website, by contacting the Garrison Convention and Visitors Bureau at 1-800-799-4242 or 701-463-2345. Forms must be submitted by May 1 for consideration in that next year's class.

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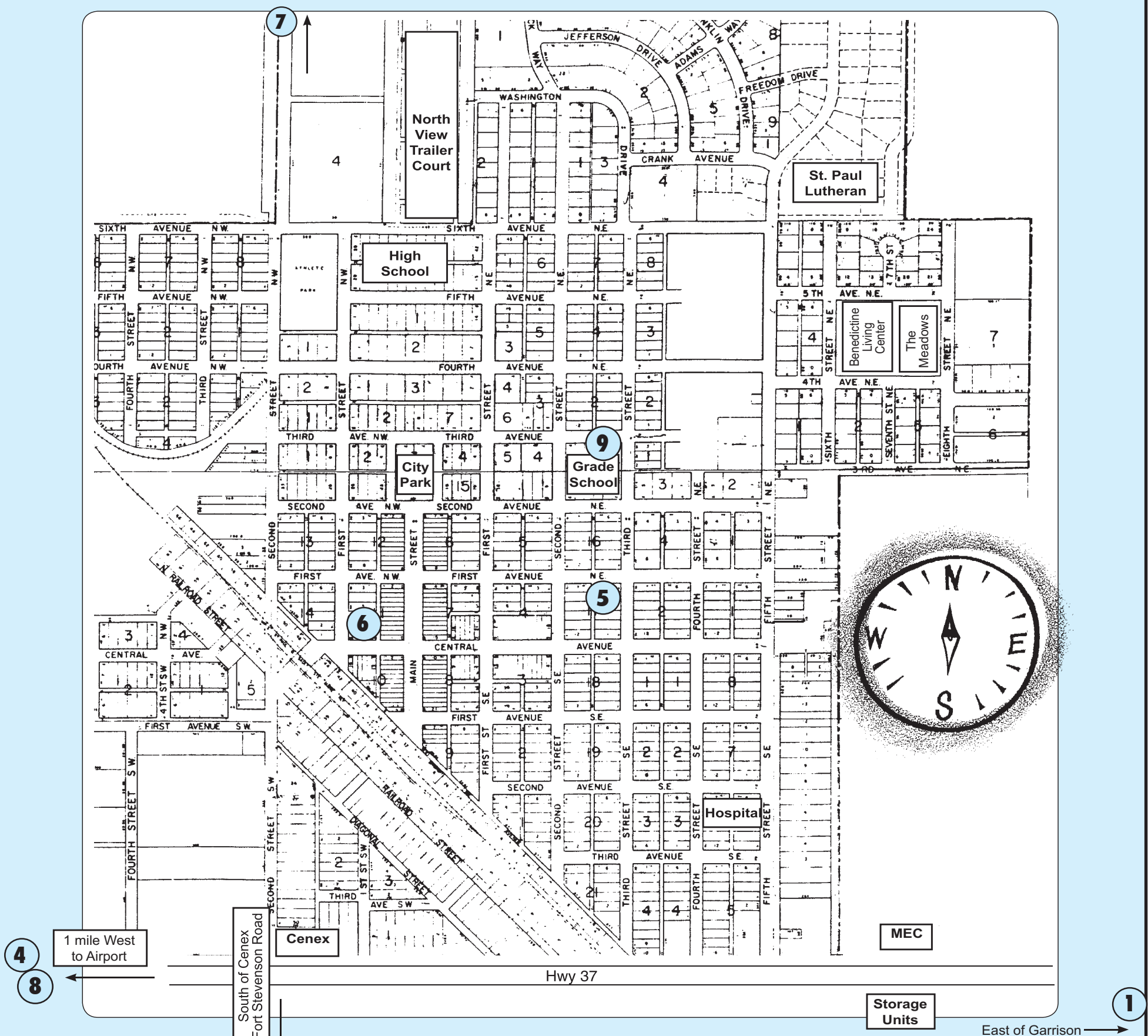
