Lemer resurrects century old steel

Makoti Threshers thankful for his knowledge and support

There's a man from Martin, N.D. who can make nearly any century old machine run like it's new again. His name is Dean Lemer, and he volunteers his time at threshing bees all around North Dakota.

Lemer's passion has without a doubt helped save a dying art in the communities he volunteers in.

"I like doing it," Lemer said in 2023. "My wife (Shonella) and I love going around to all the shows and helping wherever we can."

Whether it be at Drake, Makoti, New Rockford, or Crosby, Lemer is a vital asset to each and every thresher's association he's a member of. His knowledge on the old gastype tractors and engines, and his ability to quickly tune them up, is immeasurable.

"We couldn't do it without him," Darin Vangsness, vice president and former president of the Makoti Thresher's Association (MTA), said. "Dean's been coming for quite a few years now, and not only can he make a tractor that's been sitting idle for 10 or 20 years run like it's new again, he is fun to be around."

Vangsness said what he and the MTA appreciate the most is how Lemer teaches others what he knows.


provided by EZ Street) on Saturday.

"Dean jumps from tractor to tractor a lot of times, and I've watched him do it – helping others he doesn't even know get their rare tractors running. "I don't know how we'd keep it all running without him and his on the spot repairs and advice."

Operating the early gas tractors that the North Dakota homesteaders used during the turn of the century, isn't an easy feat. A tractor built in 1908 is much different and much less user-friendly than a tractor built in 1948.


"Dean's knowledge and passion for teaching other people is second to none," Chris Huus, the MTA's newly elected president, said. "His character and work ethic is enjoyable to be around, and people in Makoti have learned so much from him over the last few years. The relationship we've been able to create between him and

There will also be a number of food vendors on the Makoti Threshing Show grounds throughout the weekend.




Check out the live music

Print press changes hands

Makoti Threshers and Pioneer Village collaborate

Late last fall a very heavy piece of western North Dakota history was moved from Makoti to Burlington. The Makoti Thresher's Association (MTA) donated a vintage print press to the Ward County Historical Society (WCHS) for future display in the Pioneer Village.

Darin Vangsness, now vice president of the MTA, was president at the time the ink dried for the transaction. He said the print press has been in Makoti for a few decades, and unfortunately not much is known about it.

"What we do know is that a

former editor of the New Town News donated it to the MTA to be displayed," Vangsness said. "Well over the years, it became disregarded, and we felt it should be given a new home."

Dave Lebrun, president of the WCHS said he really appreciates the Makoti Threshers approaching WCHS to help save an important piece of local history.

"It takes more than one organization to effectively preserve history, and the collaboration between the different historical societies like the

Ward County and Makoti helps do that," Lebrun said. "Different people have different passions and strengths when it comes to preserving history, and when these people work together, more history is saved."

Vangsness echoed Lebrun's sentiment.

"I feel we should preserve history as long as we can – and preserve it well," he said. "We're trying to keep it as local as we can, so gifting the press to the Pioneer Village at Burlington only made sense in my opinion."

Presumed History

Although there is not concrete evidence of where the press came from before New Town, it is probably safe to assume it came from Sanish prior to 1953. If the print press was in fact moved from Sanish to New Town, which it likely was, its original home was at the Sanish Sentinel.

The history of Sanish is much too long for a single newspaper article; however, according to Maxfield (1986) and Andes (2019), the Sanish Sentinel played an important role in keeping locals aware about the Garrison Dam during its construction.

Maxfield (1986) scribes how Rev. Harold Case, who was the minister at the Fort Berthold Congregational Mission at the time, fought on behalf of the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara's best interests — keeping the tribal council "in the know" as the federal government had a tendency of not doing so; also, describing how Rev. Case kept the public informed with help from the Sanish Sentinel as the Minot Daily News had been known to editorialize stories in favor of the dam (likely because of the economic benefit the dam brought to this region at the time).

Rev. Case was a critical figure at the time because he helped advocate for the Three Affiliated Tribes heavily on the national stage. Case spent countless hours on his type-writer during those years. According to the late Ed Hall of Parshall, "Most nights a continuous clicking could be heard from Case's home office."

"This print press is an important artifact to North Dakota history," Lebrun said. "And we are very glad we are able to preserve such a significant part of our state's history."





Rewinding the Clock in Makoti

Beginnings of the Makoti Thresher's Association

Year after year hundreds flock to the now small sleepy town of Makoti to remember what the pioneers had to endure out on the harsh North Dakota prairies in the early 20th Century.

Makoti's devout volunteers have been bringing history alive for the past 64 years, and although the Makoti Thresher's Association (MTA) has faced some difficult years, the good fight in remaining relevant for 21st Century youth still continues.

MTA's Beginnings

The steam whistle first blew at Makoti's Golden Jubilee in July of 1961 when Clarence Schenfisch, a progressive farmer in Mountrail

Township southwest of Makoti, brought his collection of antique farm machinery into town for the celebration. He encouraged others to do the same.

According to the MTA Silver Anniversary book, Schenfisch had a love for old machines. The book states, "His hobby of restoring old tractors started in 1957 - 'They're just too much a part of the past to be left in the fields to rust,' [Schenfisch once saidl. During the Makoti Golden Jubilee in 1961, his idea of saving old machines caught on. Inspired by public interest, the MTA was formed."


Many of the rare tractors, steam engines, and stationary engines

that are still in Makoti today were pulled out of rock piles, tree rows, etc. in the late 1950s and early 1960s because of Schenfisch's vision to preserve local history for future generations. Without Schenfisch, much of what is preserved today from southeast Mountrail County, southwest Ward County, and northern McLean County would likely have rusted away.

Legacy

Schenfisch only lived a couple of years into what he had started, but his legacy continues to arouse one's senses to a much different way of life. Each year since 1961, "the buildings housing the antiques are opened — each year the machines are awakened, spruced up, and paraded for all to see and hear" (MTA Silver Anniversary book, 1986). This year marks the 64th annual show, and it will take place July 12, 13, and 14, 2024.

Saturday's parade is at 3 p.m. and Sunday's parade is at 1 p.m. A full itinerary can be found on the Makoti Threshing Show's Facebook page.



"Clarence C. Schenfisch (1920-1964) had the vision and foresight to see the historical value and general interest in preserving pioneer farm machinery. His original collection of more than a dozen tractors, which he restored himself, was the beginning of the present Makoti Threshers Association. May all who view this collection of antique farm equipment know that Clarence was originator of it all in this community."
