



CMC girls basketball team sweeps shootout

The Central McLean Cougars girls basketball team started the season with back-to-back wins at the McLean County Shootout in Washburn and a win at Velva.

They swept the shootout, with a 63-48 win against Bowman County and a 72-40 win against Beulah. The Cougars defeated Dickinson Trinity 65-34 Tuesday, a strong start for the Cougars which ended their season last year 20-4.

Coach Ethan Vaagene says the team is poised to have a successful season.

"We have a lot of returning

players," Vaagene said. "We only had one senior from last year, so we returned a lot of experience for the group."

The Cougars' will face new teams this year, including Kenmare, Des Lacs-Burlington, Harvey-Wells County and Grant County-Mott-Regent. Grant County joined a co-op with Mott and Regent last year.

Vaagene said. "We wanted the best competition. We believe that good competition makes you better. Wins and losses aren't the most important thing, it's about having the best team that is ready for the court when it comes time for the tournament in February. Our goal is to make it to state."



Small Miner squad aims for growth

Wilton-Wing girls are looking to find some victory on the court this season, regardless of a lack of numbers.

Miner girls bring a total of 20 athletes to the court this year, with 14 of those slated for varsity action this season. Half of those athletes are seventh or eighth graders who are being brought up to help fill in the varsity roster.

It's a smaller-than and youngerthan-average team for Wilton-Wing, who head coach Lisa Jenkins said will work to become more competitive as the season progresses.

"Our weakness is just experience, time on the floor, but they do understand (it's) not where you begin the season but how it ends, and that we need to get better every week," Jenkins said.

Helping lead the Miners will be seniors Justus Boos and Jordyn Thorson, who Jenkins said are setting an example for the younger players.

"That is so important when you have a young team, that you have that senior leadership," Jenkins said. "They both bring experience and they understand how hard we work everyday in practice."

Rounding out the Miner upperclassmen are juniors Macie Filipek and Makennah Fisher, who move up to varsity from JV last year.

"Macie has had a really good first week of practice, she works extremely hard, and gives us more quickness defensively," Jenkins said.

Sophomore Moana Tooke is out with a torn ACL, leaving room for a new Miner point guard.

A surprise addition to the team is sophomore Audrey Oswald, a firstyear student at Wing High School, who will join the varsity squad.

The Miners are rounded out by freshman Aubrey Steinert, five eighth graders and two seventh graders.

"We have a very talented 8th

grade and 7th grade group, I fully expect that quite a few of them will be getting varsity time this season," Jenkins said.

With competition starting for the Miners, Jenkins said the team is focused on laying a solid foundation and growing from there.

"We are keeping practice very basic, working on all the little things, starting over," Jenkins said. "Basic, Basic Fundamentals every day, work on knowledge, understanding, and building on what we do not know."

Jenkins said the girls will be taking each game one at a time, while keeping an eye on strong regional competition out of Shiloh-Christian, Central McLean and Garrison. For now, she said, the team is simply going to leave it all on the court.

"Our goals are to get better every week, practice hard every day, stay positive, play as a team, and be our best by season end," Jenkins said.

Cardinals aim for top four

Washburn's girls varsity team is hoping for a strong enough regular season to send them straight into regional competition in February.

Head coach of the Cardinal girls Jarod Obering said this year's scrappy varsity team is hitting the 2022-23 season with sights set on playing in the Region 5 semifinals.

"The girls came up with a goal of not having a play-in game, having a spot before that point," Obering said. "For me, playing in the semifinals would be very realistic, I think we'd be one of the top four."

The team, comprised of a total of eight varsity athletes with seven junior varsity players on standby, will need to work with a squad short in both numbers and in overall height.

"The biggest issue we're going to have to fight is our size," Obering said. "Monica (Goven) is 5'10" or 5'11" and after that, the next tallest position is 5'7".

Obering said the girls will work to overcome a lack of height with overall speed that will help fill in defensive gaps. The coach said the team will also need to be on the attack to get open shots whenever possible.

Without any seniors on the team, Obering said he will be looking at juniors Monica Goven and Dara Beck to help push the team forward. Also expected to play big roles will be Kari Patterson and Kya Kulzer, who Obering said have skill in shooting from the perimeter.


But there is strength across the board when it comes to this year's team, the coach said, noting that the girls have a bond that will help carry them.

"This group in particular has really good cohesiveness, genuinely cares about each other and are very selfless," Obering said. "That aspect allows teams to really succeed."

Obering said he was excited to see how the season played out and that he felt good about the team's chances at "making some noise" and fighting through the regional tournament.

"We are thrilled about the prospects of our year," Obering said. "Even though we're young, we're excited about the prospect of coming back."



Young Warriors ready for season





The Miners will be focusing on working through tough competitors in hopes of playing through the end of the regional championship.


"We want to be playing our best basketball at the end of the year," Wolff said. "We want to get to the last game of the regional tournament with a different outcome."

The group will be led by Head Coach Chad Barstad, who is now in his fourteenth year as the coach of the Velva wrestling team.

Cozy Winter Drinks Real Hot Chocolate


