

INOT AIR **FORCE** BASE, N.D. --Several Minot Airmen recently received nonjudicial punishment for their actions under the Uniform Code of Military Justice. The following cases are from December 2015.

A Staff Sergeant from the 5th Security Forces Squadron received a reduction to the grade

of Senior Airman, suspended forfeiture of \$1225 pay for one month, and a reprimand for three specifications of Article 91, disrespect to a superior NCO and one specification of Article 92, dereliction of duty.

A Senior Airman from the 791st Missile Security Forces Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, forfeitures of \$500

pay per month for two months and a reprimand for one specification of Article 123, forgery.

An Airman First Class from the 5th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman Basic suspended, forfeitures of \$773 pay per month for two months, 45 days of extra duty with 30 days suspended, restriction to base for 45 days with 30 days suspended and a reprimand for one specification of Article 86, failure to go and one specification of Article 91, disrespect to a NCO.

An Airman First Class from the 5th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman with reduction to Airman Basic suspended, restriction to base for 45 days with 30 days suspended, 45 days extra duty with 30 days suspended and a reprimand for one specification of Article 92, dereliction of duty.

An Airman First Class from the 5th Security Forces Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman, forfeiture of \$250 pay per month for two months and a reprimand for one specification of Article 92, dereliction of duty and one specification of Article 108, damaging military property (more than \$500).

An Airman First Class from the 91st Missile Security Forces Squadron received reduction to Airman with reduction to Airman Basic suspended,

forfeiture of \$773 pay per month for two months with forfeiture of \$773 pay for one month suspended and a reprimand for one specification of Article 111, drunk driving.

Under the

Uniform Code of Military Justice, Articles 15 provide commanders the authority to impose non-judicial punishment. NJP provides commanders with an essential and prompt means to maintain good order, morale and discipline. It also promotes positive behavior changes in service members without the stigma of a court-martial conviction. NJP is considered when other non-punitive disciplinary measures - such as counseling, letters of reprimand and administrative withholding of privileges are not effective. By imposing NJP fairly, swiftly and efficiently, the commander promotes good order and discipline within the unit. The rules and procedures for NJP administration are governed by Air Force Instruction 51-202, "Non-Judicial Punishment."


# TOP DOG










## **AF Selective Re**enlistment Bonus program list triples

WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- Air Force officials released details on the fiscal year 2016 Selective Re-enlistment Bonus program Feb. 1. This year's program, consisting of 117 Air Force specialties eligible to receive bonuses, is a substantial increase from the previous year's program where 40 Air Force specialty codes were eligible.

The program's expansion coincides with Air Force plans to grow the force to meet mission demands in the face of changing geopolitical situations, and to address key gaps in nuclear, maintenance, cyber, intelligence, remotely piloted aircraft and support career fields through fiscal 2017.

According to Col. Robert Romer, the chief of military force policy for the Air Force, the criteria used to determine career fields eligible for

re-enlistment bonuses includes current and projected manning levels, re-enlistment trends, career field force structure changes, career field stress levels, and the cost levels associated with training new Airmen.

"This year's SRB list increased by nearly threefold as we focused on retaining key experience while continuing our deliberate plan to grow our force," Romer said. "We are increasing our accessions and training pipeline to support the increased growth, but these new enlistees won't be seasoned for some time. Retaining the experience we have is critical to our success in reaching target end strength."

All AFSC bonus changes are effective Feb. 1, 2016.

## Susan Wefald to Speak of "Important Voices" at ND Heritage Center & State Museum

ISMARCK -The public is invited to a free program, "Important Voices," on Feb. 7 at 2 p.m. at the North Dakota Heritage Center & State Museum, Bismarck, presented by author Susan Wefald.

Only 17 women have been elected to statewide office in North Dakota in the past 125 years. Susan Wefald will present the stories of these women, their triumphs and losses, their hopes and challenges. Based on Wefald's book "Important Voices, North Dakota's Women Elected State Officials Share Their Stories – 1893-2013," the

presentation will share what these North Dakota women accomplished and the challenges still facing women running for statewide office today. Wefald will be available for book signing following the presentation, with books available for purchase at the Museum store.

Wefald was the first woman to serve on the North Dakota Public Service Commission. Appointed to the Commission by Governor Edward Schafer in 1992, she was elected to three more terms and served on the Commission for 16 years. She is the author of several books including the award winning "Spectacular North Dakota Hikes – Bring the Dog."

## Department of Health Survey Reveals State Child Passenger **Safety Restraint Use Down**

BISMARCK, N.D. – Fewer North Dakotans buckled up their children last year compared to 2012, according to the latest statewide "point in time" child passenger survey conducted by the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) during the months of June and July 2015. The survey, completed in the 10 largest cities in North Dakota, involved 1,804 observations of children estimated to be younger than 10 years of age. Despite evidence proving the benefits of using child restraints and seatbelts,

nearly 13 percent of North Dakota's children are not being safely restrained in a vehicle. Only 87 percent of the children younger than 10 years of age were restrained in a car seat or seat belt compared to 91 percent in 2012. The lowest restraint use previous to this year was in 2004 and was 83 percent; this was prior to the improved child passenger safety law that went into effect in 2005.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), every 34 seconds one child under

age 13 is involved in a crash. When used correctly in passenger cars, child safety seats reduce the risk of fatal injury by 71 percent for infants and by 54 percent for toddlers.

Other survey findings show there has been a slight increase of children riding in the front seat. In 2015, 15 percent of the children observed were seen riding in the front seat compared to 12 percent in 2012. The back seat is the safest place for children under 13, with or without a front air bag.

Another outcome of the survey the department found was that too many toddlers ages one to four were observed being inappropriately transported in seat belts. According to child passenger best practices, children this age should be using a car seat or a booster seat-not just a seat belt. Typically, a seat belt doesn't safely "fit" a person until they

No, counting LBBs – Little Brown Birds – isn't exactly how the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) works but it's almost as

The Great Backyard Bird Count began 1998, the first online citizenscience project collecting wild bird data while displaying results virtually in real time.

A joint effort of the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology and National Audubon Society, volunteers simply need a computer to create a free account and then enter the species and number of birds they observe over a minimum 15-minute period.

This year's GBBC takes place Feb. 12 – 15. Observers can count for as many days as they want during the official four-day period, anytime of the day, and from anywhere. They can count from more than one location and multiple times a day or over a course of multiple days of the official Count days.

Observing one's backyard bird feeder is a good location.

A heated birdbath brings birds together, so that's another good place to find feathered bodies.

While the Great Backyard Bird Count is considered "citizen-science", it's not something requiring observers be an ornitholo-

Or even a bird expert, for that matter.

And the numbers don't have to be exact.

The GBBC just asks participants to provide their best estimate of the numbers of individual birds of a particular species.

The data form includes a list of species that could typically be in North Dakota in February, which helps with species identification.

It helps to have a field guide handy when making identification, as well.

The count is held in February because researchers and scientists using the information wanted to get a "snapshot" of populations just before the jumpstart of spring migration.

The information helps answer several questions, including how weather affects bird populations, how the timing of migration compares with past years, are diseases affecting birds, and how species and numbers compare from various sized communities, such as rural, urban, and natural areas.

Finches are one species that tends to migrate in large numbers to one area in some years and other areas in other years. The GBBC helps tracks where they're at from year to year and in what quantity.

Like all populations surveys, the more data and the more yeas that information can be collected helps determine trends and details to those farreaching questions.

Participating in the Great Backyard Bird Count is free. More information is available on the GBBC website, (www. gbbc.birdcount/org). The website includes downloadable instructions, "how to" video, data from past Great Backyard Bird Counts, identification tips, and even an online bird

The count began in the United States and Canada but went global in 2013 with more than 100,000 people now participating.

The Great Backyard Bird Count is just one of Cornell Lab's citizenscience projects, including eBird, YardMap, NestWatch, and Project FeederWatch. More information about Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology is available at their website, (www.birds.cornell.edu).

While the Great Backyard Bird Count requires a bit more information than one LBB, two LBB, it's still an excuse to spend a few minutes observing birds.

And if someone asks why, the answer is simple it's fun, easy, and an opportunity to play scientist.

The first time rapperturned-actor Ice Cube and comedian-turned-actor Kevin Hart teamed up for a cop-comedy caper, Ride Along in 2012, critics mostly turned up their noses. But audiences turned over their dollars, making the moderately budgeted movie a substantial box-office hit.

So of course—the mismatched duo is back for more comedic crime shenanigans in Ride Along

This time around, hardboiled Atlanta vice detective James Patton (Cube) heads to Miami to investigate an interstate drug pipeline. He wants to bring along dweeby rookie officer Ben Harper (Hart), who'll soon marry his sister (Tika Sumpter), just to prove once and for all that Ben doesn't have the right stuff to be a cop.

Ken Jeong (from the TV series Dr. Ken) plays a computer hacker who becomes a shrill, shriek-y, and squeaky third wheel on this careening comedy tricycle. Olivia Munn's Miami police detective has some swaggering self-defense mojo that can bring any tough guy to his knees—but

the movie doesn't miss an opportunity to show her sweaty-'n'-sexy in a sports bra, and have Hart's character make a wowza crack about it.

Veteran TV and movie actor Benjamin Bratt walks the line between smooth and sinister by sprinkling some Scarface sauce onto his role as a shady businessman.

Director Tom Story, whose resume also includes Fantastic Four, Barbershop, Taxi and Think Like a Man, was also in the driver's seat for the original Ride Along. Maybe that's why it feels like we've ridden by everything before, in the previous Ride Along and in almost every other buddy-cop comedy.

There's a frantic foot chase, a wild car chase, a bootylicious nightclub party and a lavish bash at a millionaire's mansion, where Ben screams, stumbles and scampers as he's chased by an alligator. (It's about as funny as you think it is—or isn't.) There's gunfire, explosions and a climax at a shippingcontainer yard. At least the movie sometimes seems to wink at it own clichés. "Classic!" Ben says.

"Something always goes down in a container yard!"

In one scene, Ben evades a car of bad guys by imagining it's a game of Grand Theft Auto. I'd like to think director Story wanted to make a "meta" statement about how many action scenes in today's blockbusters are little more than multimillion-dollar build-outs of videogames anyway, but I really think it was just to get a cheap chuckle by turning Cube's character into a pixelated, gunpopping passenger.

The yapping, hyperkinetic Hart's a funny guy, and Cube, the "grumpy," grounded straightman, somehow still gets his share of the laughs. But most of the banter-y jokes are lame, the writing unimaginative and uninspired, the plot thinner than a thong bikini and the performances so limp and lazy they seem to evaporate in the Florida heat.

And too much of Ride Along 2 simply isn't funny enough—or anything enough—to justify the trip. This jaunt to Miami feels like a quick cashdash coasting on recycled comedy fumes.

### Puffed French Toast



#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 2 eggs 2 ½ tablespoons sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

2 cups milk 1 cup flour

2 ½ teaspoon baking powder 12 slices texas style toast, cut in half diagonally

#### INSTRUCTIONS:

In a large skillet or frying pan, heat about  $1/4^{\prime\prime}$  of vegetable oil (not olive oil) over medium heat. In a shallow bowl or pie plate, whisk together eggs, sugar, salt, vanilla, milk, flour, and baking powder. Working quickly, take each 1/2 slice of bread and soak it both sides in the milk/egg/flour mixture. if you leave it in too long, it will get soggy, but you want to make sure enough of the egg mixture has soaked into the bread. gently shake to remove excess batter and place in hot oil. Cook until puffed, golden brown, and a nice, crispy crust has formed on each side (probably 3-5 minutes per side; you really need to babysit them and make sure they're cooking correctly) and then remove from oil and drain on a paper towel. When ready to serve, roll each piece in cinnamon sugar. Don't skip it. it's delicious!

### Red Velvet Waffles

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 box Red Velvet Cake Mix, plus ingredients listed on the box
- 6 oz cream cheese, softened 1 cup powdered sugar
- tsp vanilla extract
- 2 Tbsp milk or more depending on desired consistency of the icing Mixed fresh or frozen berries

#### INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat a waffle iron. Prepare the cake mix according to the box directions. Spray the waffle iron with nonstick cooking spray, then pour some of the batter (about ½ cup for my size waffle iron) on the hot waffle iron and spread it out (the batter is pretty thick) being careful to not overfill the iron. Cook according to the manufacturer's instructions. To make the cream cheese drizzle, mix together the cream cheese, powdered sugar, and vanilla. Whisk in the milk until desired consistency. Top each waffle with some berries and drizzle the cream cheese mixture over the top.

Each dress was modeled for this event with photographs captured by Photographer Steffaney Price. Palmer enjoys exploring different mediums in her art by using everyday objects to represent deeper concepts. Being physically engaged in art that will integrate both visual art and physical activity through audience interaction has become a major influence in her work. As a continuing learner Palmer seeks out experiences that help people express art, think critically, and sew their shadow back on.

The artworks may be purchased through a silent auction for the duration of the exhibition. A percentage of proceeds will go to Operation Smile, an organization for cleft-lip, cleft-palate repair surgeries. This correlates to Palmer's work as her way to support an organization that provides necessary surgeries for people around the world with a similar condition she continues to overcome through her walk of faith that is expressed in her show.

## Sesame Street supports military families in transition

WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- Elmo, Big Bird and Abby Cadabby are teaming up with the Defense Department to support thousands of military families as they transition to civilian life, according to Transition to Veterans Program Office officials.

On Jan. 27, the Sesame Workshop, the nonprofit organization behind Sesame Street, launched a website devoted to helping families cope with the changes associated with transitioning into civilian life, the officials said. Sesame Workshop includes several videos for children and adults, an activity book called "My Story, My Big Adventure Activity Book," and other resources that military parents can use to help their families communicate through the transition process, the officials said.

The products are intended to increase the ability of parents to communicate with young children in age-appropriate ways and create awareness among transition service providers of the importance of including the whole family, particularly children, when addressing transitions for active duty service members, the officials said. The products are

available online and will be distributed through a variety of networks where military families and children are present, both on and off military installations, the officials

"We are grateful to Sesame Workshop for their efforts to assist our transitioning military families," said Susan Kelly, the director of the DOD's Transition to Veterans Program Office. "Transitioning out of the military can be challenging for families, and we hope these products will help ease that transition."

The DOD has worked with the Sesame Workshop in the past to use Sesame Street's familiar characters to help preschool-aged military children understand aspects of military life, such as the deployment of a parent, moving to a new home, and the injury or even death of a parent, the officials said. Previous

examples of resources that have been developed through this

collaboration between the Sesame Workshop and the Department of Defense can be found through Military OneSource, the officials said

The latest collection of resources about the transition of military families comes through collaboration with the National Center for Telehealth and Technology of Defense the Centers for



## Who will win Super Bowl 50?

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Feb. 7, 2016 will be a big day for one of two quarterbacks. For Peyton Manning, it could be his ride into the sunset after what could be what he called his last rodeo; for Cam Newton it could be his first ring in a career that is only just getting started.

The two have a lot in common. They both came from SEC schools; Cam went to Auburn where he won the 2010 BCS championship, and Peyton went to Tennessee, where he still holds many school and conference records. Maybe the most talked about similarity they share is their draft number. For the first time in history two number one picks face off in the Super Bowl.

Our very own public affairs "experts" have taken time from their busy schedule to share their predictions.

Senior Airman Kristoffer Kaubisch:

The Denver Broncos will win Super Bowl 50 because they have Peyton "Freaking" Manning. Even if the defense struggles, or the running game for the Broncos falls short, in the end, they still have Peyton Manning. Manning is a great leader, and he makes everyone around him better.

While the Panthers' defense is focused on containing the Broncos' run game, it won't work. Emmanuel Sanders or Demaryius Thomas will be deep down the field. They have a combined 12 touchdowns during the season, and each had over 1,000 receiving yards. The Broncos are scary good with their deep threat receivers as well as their running backs: CJ Anderson and Ronnie Hillman are both dangerous if they get through a hole.

Peyton Manning and DeMarcus Ware are both leaders. These two veterans will have a central role in the Super Bowl, whether they're making big plays on the field, or helping their teammates off the field.

The linebackers in Denver are solid; Von Miller and DeMarcus Ware will get the job done. They'll put constant pressure on Cam Newton. The Broncos led the league with 52 sacks. This defense has playmakers at every level. There are pass-rushers and rundefenders all over the front, and the secondary can lock down an entire receiving corps.

The Broncos had one of the best defenses in the NFL throughout the season, and will use their defensive strengths to shut down the Panthers' mediocre wide receivers. The Broncos defense allowed only seven touchdowns to opposing wide receivers over the 16 regular season games, only seven. Defense wins championships.

My final prediction is a too-close-for-comfort, shootout style win with the Broncos taking it all. 31-27.

Airman 1st Class Christian Sullivan: Heisman winner. Soon-to-be NFL MVP. A winner at all levels of football since high school.

The number one overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft. All these things describe Cameron Newton, the Carolina Panther's franchise quarterback. Yet only one thing will matter to him at 11 P.M. Feb. 7, 2016, and that is whether or not he's an NFL Super Bowl champion. Which he will be.

There are just too many factors in play for the Broncos for me to believe there won't be Carolina blue flooding the stores with Super Bowl attire come Monday morning.

The Broncos may flaunt the number one defense in the league, but there is an X-factor that will test them, and that's Cam Newton. The most mobile quarterback that the Bronco's defense has faced all season is Minnesota Vikings' Teddy Bridgewater, who can be dangerous at times, but does not have the skill set, or the stature that Cam has. Bridgewater had a solid game against Denver's smothering defense where he racked up 269 yards and a touchdown through the air, and adding 23 on the ground with zero turnovers. Those stats sound pretty good on paper, until you add in the pressure. Bridgewater was sacked 7 times that game. While it's hard to bring down a 6 foot, 5 inch, 250 pound man, when you add Carolina only allowed 33 sacks in the regular season versus Minnesota's 45, you have to think the outlook is bright for Cam in the backfield, even if it is against Von Miller and DeMarcus Ware.


The saying is "defense wins championships," and people have said this about the upcoming Super Bowl like the Panthers don't have the fourth-best run defense, along with the sixth-best overall defense in the league. If that isn't enough to convince you, we can dig a little deeper.

Carolina also leads the league in interceptions with 24. 24! Now look at who they're facing, Peyton Manning. In his prime and even today, most call him one of the best quarterbacks in the league, but we are all human, and we all have our flaws.

Manning's challenge will be his age. At 39, Manning will be the oldest quarterback to start in a Super Bowl, and his age has shown this year. He threw 17 interceptions in the regular season after missing several games due to injury, and losing a starting job after throwing four interceptions in a 29-13 loss to Kansas City. Expect the young, physical Carolina defense to take advantage of that.

When looking at the Panthers on offense, often overlooked is the guy who pounds it out between the tackles almost 20 times a game, Jonathan Stewart. Stewart racked up 989 yards rushing to go with six touchdowns, and averaging 4.1 yards a carry. When looking at the defensive side, more often than not people think of the young hard-hitting linebacker, Luke Kuechly, or the lock-down corner, Josh Norman, but they sleep on the Ohio State alum, Kurt Coleman, who leads not only the team, but is tied for third in the league with 7 interceptions. The Broncos will get all they can handle and more from both sides.

My final prediction is Carolina in a less than contested win for Super Bowl 50. 45-13, Panthers.

## High year of tenure extension for 122 specialties

**AIR FORCE PERSONNEL CENTER PUBLIC AFFAIRS** 

OINT **BASE SAN** ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas (AFNS) -- Eligible senior airmen, staff sergeants, technical sergeants, and master sergeants in 122 Air Force specialties can apply for a high year of tenure extension and, if approved, will be able to extend between 12 and 24 months past their current HYT.

Eligible Airmen who apply for an extension should be approved by their unit commander or civilian leader, and should meet regular reenlistment criteria as well. Airmen with a reenlistment restriction are not eligible to apply for an HYT extension.

The HYT extension application window will be open Feb. 1, 2016, through May 31, 2017.

Eligible Airmen with a current HYT in February 2016 should apply as soon as possible to obtain approval prior to their current HYT. Eligible Airmen with a current HYT March 1-May 31, 2016, should apply at least 30 days prior to their current HYT. All other eligible Airmen should submit their requests for extension at least 120 days prior to their current HYT.

Eligibility is limited to specific control Air Force specialty codes and grades as of Jan. 26, 2016, but the following Airmen may also apply:

- Airmen who previously held an eligible AFSC, who are projected to return to

the eligible AFSC on or before Sept. 30, 2017, and who have a current HYT between Feb. 1, 2016, and Sept. 30, 2017, may apply. Airmen in this category should provide documentation showing their projected return date with their HYT extension request.

- Airmen who are in a special duty or developmental special duty assignment, who have an eligible AFSC, and who have an assignment availability code or date eligible for return from overseas date that expires on or before Sept. 30, 2017, may apply. Airmen in this category should provide documentation of the eligible AFSC with their HYT extension request. DEROS and AAC curtailment requests will not be approved for this program.

Airmen approved for an extension should get required retainability within 10 days of being notified or they will forfeit the opportunity for an HYT extension.




