B-52 conducts long-range training with Colombia

U.S. STRATEGIC COMMAND

FFUTT AIR FORCE BASE, Neb. -- A B-52 Stratofortress from Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, conducted a longrange training sortie to engage with South American military partners, April 1-2, 2016.

During the course of the 27-hour non-stop mission, the aircrew trained with the Colombian Air Force before executing a flyover of the Feria Internacional del Aire y del Espacio in Santiago, Chile.

"This bomber mission is just one of many demonstrations of our ability to maintain a credible strategic defense force," said Adm. Cecil D. Haney, U.S. Strategic Command commander. "Within the last year, U.S. Strategic Command bomber forces have conducted missions with Canadian, Colombian, Australian and Jordanian forces in national and international airspace. In addition to the outstanding training value realized by the U.S. and our partners, these missions demonstrate the credibility of our forces

to address a global strategic and security environment that is more diverse and uncertain than at any time in our history."

U.S. Strategic Command routinely displays its capability to command, control and conduct global bomber missions, most recently by deploying B-52s into the U.S. European Command and B-2 Spirits into the U.S. Pacific Command areas of responsibility last month.

One of nine DoD unified combatant commands, **USSTRATCOM** has global strategic missions, assigned through the Unified Command Plan, which include strategic deterrence; space operations; cyberspace operations; joint electronic warfare; global strike; missile defense; intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance; combating weapons of mass destruction; and analysis and targeting.

Bombs Away!

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Since The Vietnam War, the M-117 bomb has been in the U.S. Air Force's weapon stockpile. This 750-pound general purpose bomb, once used for combat missions, is now solely used for pilot training.


With only a couple hundred bombs still in their inventory, Minot Air Force Base's 5th Munitions Squadron completely phased out the remaining bombs on March 30, 2016.

Beginning on March 22, 2016, munitions Airmen took the final step before loading the last of the bombs onto the aircraft. The lowest ranking munitions Airman placed the clip on the arming wire and a Major trimmed the wire to the proper length.

"I was there for the first continuous bomber presence in 2004, and since then the Air Force decided to demilitarize the M-117," said Master Sgt. Larry Cartwright, NCO in charge of conventional maintenance

assigned to the 5 MUNS. "However, someone had the idea to use this as training instead of paying money to just get rid of them."

Munitions Airmen here built over 100 M-117s in the last few months.

"The only struggle we really had with building the bombs was rusted threading," said Airman 1st Class Blake Bradley, conventional maintenance crew member assigned to the 5 MUNS.

"We put a fin on the bomb and fuse it together," said Cartwright. "These bombs are so old that we do not use electrical fuses and there is no laser guidance. The metal fin on the back adds aerodynamic stability. It only takes us between 3-8 minutes to build one bomb.

Once this bomb is dropped from the B-52 Stratofortress, the nose fuse lines up the components and will detonate on impact, said Cartwright.

"My instructors in Tech School 22 years ago said I would never see an M-117," said Cartwright. "I have probably seen more M-117 bombs that any other bomb."

Now that the last of these bombs have been dropped, B-52 aircrews and munitions Airmen can focus on training with newer bombs rather than bombs manufactured in the mid-1950s.

"It is crazy that this is the first time the Air Force has ever said they want to just completely get rid of something," said Bradley. "I've only been in the Air Force for about a year now, so it's awesome to be happening already in my career."

Airmen discuss one of the little-known best jobs in Air Force

WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- If you're an Airman with technical skills, an outstanding performer who always meets physical training standards and has completed all military and other education requirements, the 844th Communications Squadron may have a job for you.

The jobs themselves vary,

but all involve working as part of the executive travel communications teams for the secretary and deputy secretary of defense, chairman and vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and secretary and chief of staff of the Air Force.

The work is tough, the training technical, the standards stringent and

the travel is plentiful, with about 60 to 120 nonconsecutive travel days a year, according to Airmen now doing the four-year controlled tour.

One of Defense Secretary Ash Carter's travel team members is Staff Sgt. Cody Corley, who's part of the team's Residential Command Post, or RCP, section.

Corley's job is to stay close to the defense secretary -- no more than two minutes or two doors away at any given time -- to ensure that the secretary has nearly instant access to whatever he needs to communicate anywhere in the world 24/7.

The six phones, printerscanners and other communications devices that Corley carries in two bags and a hard case are state of the art, and the former radio-frequency transmissions specialist has been trained to use them.

He also has a special appreciation for the less technical aspects of the work.

"A lot of jobs leave you wondering, 'What is my mission? What is my impact on the big Air Force?" he said during a recent DOD News interview. "But I can tell you (that during the Jan. 12 capture of U.S. Sailors by Iran), when you

hand that phone over and the secretary is making plans to help those guys out, you see firsthand the impact you had."

Executive travel communication

Corley, like everyone else in the RCP job, first spent three years as a member of the secretary's **Executive Travel** Communications team. Tech. Sgt. Glenn D. Andrews Jr. is a team chief now with the secretary's

travel team. Andrews and fellow team members travel with Carter on his military aircraft during domestic or international trips to prep, test and transport a range of communications equipment from the plane, and to and from each hotel in every state or country the secretary and his delegation visit.

On the plane his team provides the secretary and his immediate staff with everything they need for secret and top-



secret communications, including secure phones, computers, Wi-Fi, scanners, and printers.

"Once we get (to a location) we take whatever gear we have and all the luggage off the aircraft and convoy or motorcade to the hotel," he said, where a two- or three-member advance team will have done initial preparations for rooms for the secretary and his delegation, and for comms and security rooms.

In the comms room, he explained, the team sets up more communications gear, including laptops, secure video teleconferencing equipment, shielded tents for secure comms, scanners, printers and other devices.

All team members are trained to the same standard, Andrews said, and over time, and after receiving technical certifications, they advance from team member to site lead, managing small teams at advance sites, and

then to mission lead, which is Andrews' role now.

In that job he oversees operations at each location during the secretary's entire

trip.
"I like the job," he said. "It's been a very rewarding experience. I've been here five and a half years now. It's a four-year tour for us and I like it so much I've extended two more years. We get to see a lot of interesting places that we wouldn't get to see otherwise."

The travel team for the chairman/vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff is also part of the 844th CS.

CJCS travel team The job description for this travel team is drier than the actual experiences of

those who lead and execute the mission.

"Member deploys to locations worldwide providing a full-spectrum of aircraft and ground communication packages to include secure and non-secure voice, video, data and satellite network services," the job description reads.

On this team, Tech. Sgt. Ben Davis is a communications team leader.

"I provide executive travel communication to the chairman of the Joint Chiefs and the vice chairman," he said. "Anytime they're outside the National Capital Region at least one of us is with them to provide communications at the highest level."

He added, "We use commercial off-the-shelf equipment so we're always looking for the newer, lighter, faster equipment so we're not pigeonholed by anything that's specifically military.'

As on the defense secretary's executive travel team, CJCS travel team members all are trained to the same standard. Within the team, the three positions are and progress from team member to site lead to mission lead roles.

The chairman's team also supports the Air Force secretary and Air Force chief of staff, and Master Sgt. Josh Wessling leads those missions when they travel outside the National Capital Region.

"In addition to providing that secure and non-secure voice, video and data reachback to the Pentagon, we're also responsible for logistics on the ground -- equipment, movement, room checkin and checkout, luggage bag drags, all the logistics that enable the principals, the CSAF and his staff, to engage in their official itinerary," Wessling said.
"We're basically the

brains of the operation

behind the scenes," he added, noting, "I'm personally in charge of making sure that (Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Mark A. Welsh III), while he's on the ground, has anything and everything he needs to communicate back to the Pentagon ... at any time of day or night."

Tech. Sgt. Richard Carter is also part of the CJCS travel team.

"I'm the low man on the totem pole," he said. "I'm still in my training mode for site lead and mission lead, so if I go on a trip with Sgt. Davis, he's the site lead and I'm the team member."

On the team's training process, Wessling said, 'Roughly a year and a half into your four-year tour we're going to expect you to be fully qualified, and when and if the opportunity presents itself, for you to step into a team chief slot, giving you approximately two years to serve as a mission lead team chief."

When the team thinks about hiring, Wessling said they review applicants' performance reports to look for outstanding performers, they check PT scores to make sure they can physically perform, and they look at military records to make sure applicants hold all required professional military and other education credentials.

Airmen who succeed in the job usually have certain personality traits, Davis


"Some people get nervous when they're looking people who control the military in the face and they're asking you questions directly, sometimes not in a very good mood. You need to have a distinct personality to be able handle that," he added.

Airmen can find ads for these jobs in the Air Force Assignment Management Systems and Wessling said there are financial benefits for team members supporting the secretary and other leaders.

"Civilian clothing allowances, extra money to wear a suit and tie on the road, and we get special-duty pay ... as a way of saying what (team members) are doing is above and beyond your normal Air Force responsibilities," he said.

On top of their base pay, Wessling said team members get \$75 a month, site leads get \$150 a month and mission leads get \$225 a month.

"So when we all leave here we're taking a huge pay cut to go back to the Air Force," he said. "But you're going back a better leader and a better Airman, for sure."



Tax Day Military Star discount

Outbreak of Mumps in North Dakota

🕽 ISMARCK, N.D. – B The North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) has received 14 reports of mumps since Feb. 24, 2016. Eight of the cases were reported from Ward County. The age range of cases is 14 to 86 years. The NDDoH is urging North Dakotans to be sure they have received their MMR vaccine. Anyone with symptoms of mumps should be evaluated by a health care provider, and, if they have mumps, stay home for five days after symptoms started, and avoid contact with others.

Mumps is a viral illness best known for the puffy cheeks and swollen jaw that it causes as a result of swollen salivary glands. The most common symptoms include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Muscle aches
- Tiredness • Loss of appetite
- Swollen and tender
- salivary glands under the ears on one or both sides

(parotitis)

Mumps is generally a mild illness, but can cause complications, such as deafness, and inflammation of the testicles, brain, and ovaries. Symptoms may appear from 12 to 25 days after infection. People with symptoms are recommended to see a health care provider for testing, because other illnesses, including influenza, can cause parotitis.

"The best way to prevent mumps is to be vaccinated," according to Molly Howell, **Immunization Program** Manager for the NDDoH. "The MMR vaccine protects against measles, mumps, and rubella. All children are recommended to receive MMR vaccine at 12 to 15 months of age and again at 4 to 6 years of age. MMR vaccine is required to attend child care, school, and colleges in North Dakota. People born before 1957 are generally considered immune to mumps due to the high rate of infection at that time."

Only two of the mumps cases had a history of two doses of MMR vaccine "It is not surprising to see mumps cases in vaccinated individuals," said Howell. "The mumps component of the MMR vaccine is about 88 percent effective, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. MMR vaccine is the only tool that we have available to prevent mumps; 88 percent is a lot better than not being vaccinated at all. People who have received two doses of the MMR vaccine are about nine times less likely to get mumps than unvaccinated people who have the same exposure to mumps virus."

Mumps spreads when an infected person coughs or sneezes. A good way to prevent transmission of mumps is to practice good hygiene habits; regularly wash hands with soap and water, sneeze and coughing into a tissue or your elbow, and avoid sharing drinks, food and utensils.

PRAIRIE ADVENT



"It has always been my private conviction that any man who pits his intelligence against a fish and loses has it coming."

– John Steinbeck.

Over the past several years the N.D. Game and Fish Department has adopted a philosophy that suits most anglers just fine – the idea of having fishing regulations be as broadbased, simple as possible.

That's not to say they don't change as needs arise and more biological information or science becomes available.

North Dakota has more than a century of fishing regulations. It's intriguing to see how things like walleye and sauger limits and size restrictions evolved in the time since automobiles were a novelty.

A century ago, anglers across the state generally fished for northern pike, bullheads, and sauger. Walleye were considered a prize because while native to a few of the state's waters, they were more like a treasured novelty than an expectation.

Game and Fish Department fisheries division chief Greg Power perused historic files to see how walleye and sauger regulations changes over the years. Here are some of his findings:

*Statewide daily walleye limits varied from five to 15 fish between 1911 and 2016.

*What hasn't changed for decades, though, is the current five-fish daily walleye limit.

*In 1968 the Missouri River system didn't have any walleye or sauger limits. That's not a size limit, that's quantity. Yup, in 1968 anglers on the Missouri River and Lake Sakakawea could catch any number of walleye they wanted in a day.

*Most walleye length restrictions were minimum size limits not slot or maximum restrictions and typically ranged from 8- to 16inch minimums.

*Even though the Game and Fish Department's management philosophy in recent years has been to try to keep restrictions to a minimum for specific lakes, even today some lakes have various walleye size

limits. However, there was a 30-year span when there weren't any size limits on any water body anywhere in North Dakota.

*The statewide daily limit from 1911 through 1914 was 15 fish but that included a combination of bass, crappie, perch, northern pike, trout, and walleye.

*There was also an 8-inch minimum walleye and sauger limit statewide from 1911 through 1914.

*Daily and possession limits remained the same from 1915 through 1930 but the statewide walleye and sauger minimum length restriction increased to 10-inch minimum.

*Daily and possession limits changed in 1931 and until 1948 anglers had a 10-fish daily limit for a combination of walleye, sauger, and pike. Possession limit those years was 20 for the three species.

*The statewide minimum walleye and sauger length changed to 14 inches from 1949 through 1954 while daily walleye, sauger, and pike limits dropped to five with 10 in possession.

*Statewide walleye and sauger length limits were removed in 1955. Length restrictions weren't put on again until 1987 and that was only for two specific

*Since 1987, at least one lake has had some type of walleye and sauger length restriction but at no time have the number of lakes with length restrictions exceeded 12 throughout North Dakota.

*Ten lakes in the state have had a 14-inch minimum walleye and sauger limit since 2012. That will continue through the end of the current fishing regulation period, which ends March 31, 2018.

*Missouri River System walleye and sauger daily and possession limits generally mirrored statewide regulations with the exception from 1968 through 1980 when daily limits varied from none (1968) to 10 (1976 - 1980).

crete bunker. "Please let me go," she fearfully, tearfully begs when she meets the man who brought her there as he delivers a tray of food. "There's nowhere to go," Howard (John Goodman) calmly tells her. "Everyone

outside of here is dead." There's been an attack, he explains, a big onemaybe chemical, maybe nuclear, maybe Russians, maybe Martians. "Luckily," he reassures her, "I'm prepared."

So begins 10 Cloverfield Lane, the "little" movie— with a small ensemble cast of three, filmed almost entirely in a tight, enclosed set—that comes with such big expectations. Beginning as a script called The Cellar, it later enlisted the writer-director of the critically lauded Whiplash, Damian Chazelle, to "whip" the screenplay into something with a bit more bite. When Midas-touch super-

star producer J.J. Abrams came onboard, fresh off the blockbuster buzz of Star Wars: The Force Awakens, and changed the title, fans went crazy with frenzied speculation: How would this movie connect to Cloverfield, the 2008 surprisehit monster-movie smash about an extraterrestrial attack, that he also pro-

> duced? Questions abound in (and about) 10 Cloverfield Lane, and if you want them answered, well—you're just like the characters. And also like them, you'll have to stick around to the end of the film, a terrifically tense, tightly wound underground psychological thriller that eventually explodes wildly, violently upward and outward.

> Is Howard an overzealous doomsday prepper, a conspiracy-theorist nut-job, a grieving father, a U.S. Navy vet who went off the deep end, all of those, none of those, or something else entirely? Why was Michelle in such a hurry to leave town that night? And what about Emmett (John Gallagher Jr.), the other guy in the bunker? What are those noises? Cars? Helicopters? Spaceships? Is the air outside really as contaminated as Howard says?

The mysteries mount, the clues pile up, the screws turn tighter and tighter, the distrust deepens, and claustrophobia and paranoia permeate every frame. Debut feature director Dan Trachtenberg, working with cinematographer Joe Cutter and production designer Ramsey Avery, creates an underground mini-labyrinth that teems with the details of Howard's scarily obsessive mind—like a show home stocked from the Armageddon bargain bin of Bed Bath & Beyond.

Howard, Emmett and Michelle eat meals, play old board games, work jigsaw puzzles and listen to classic rock on an old jukebox in an artificial, increasingly edgy loop of normal domestic life. Frankie Valli's "Venus" and Tommy James' "I Think We're Alone Now" never sounded so ominous and foreboding.

When things really break loose, in the movie's final sequence, fans of the original Cloverfield will finally be able see just how this movie connects to the previous one. And as the address in the title suggests, monsters can come in all shapes and sizes, in all kinds of places, above us, below us and even right beside us.

Strawberry Cream Cheese Bread



INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon Kosher salt
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 1 1/2 cups strawberries, rinse, dried and chopped

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Grease and flour a 9×5 inch loaf pan.
- 1. Grease and flour a 9×5 inch loat pan.
 2. With electric mixer cream butter, sugar and cream cheese until fluffy. Add eggs one at a time. Mix in vanilla.
 3. In separate bowl, mix flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Blend flour mixture with butter mixture just until blended. Add buttermilk and only stir until just combined; do not over mix.
 4. Carefully fold in strawberries. Dough mixture will be thick.
- 5. Bake in a 350ŰF oven for 50-60 minutes.
 6. Let it cool for at least 15 minutes before removing from pan. each side. Invert onto paper towels. Repeat with remaining batter. To serve, fold pancake in half, spread with 1 Tbsp lemon curd and fold in half again. Dust with powdered sugar and serve with fresh raspberries and sweetened sour cream.





Family Child Care On Minot AFB

As parents, one of the most important decisions that we will ever make is to choose who will care for our children while we are working or attending school. While there are many people to choose from, the goal is to find the best person to meet the needs of the child and the parents.

Because the health, safety and development of all children are so important, it is vital that child care providers be trained to give the best possible care. Keeping this in mind, the current family child care policy at Minot AFB states that any individuals caring for other families' children a total of more than 10 hours a week on a regular basis must be licensed to provide care in on-base quarters. This does not include:

- individuals who occasionally provide care for a friend or neighbor
- individuals providing baby-sitting on an occasional basis for other families
- teenagers doing evening or weekend baby-sitting for families
- child care provided in the parents' own home
- parent cooperatives where one of the parents provides supervision for other parents' children on an exchange basis for social functions and no fees are involved
- temporary full-time care of a child during a parent's absence for temporary duty or deployment by the person listed on the AF Form 357, Family Care Plan.

You can compute the requirements to be licensed by multiplying the number of hours the provider offers care on a regular basis by the number of children in care. For example, if an individual provides care one afternoon a week for 4 children for 3 hours, they must be licensed. Anyone providing more child care than the allowed amount must be approved by the Mission Support Group Commander as a licensed child care provider.

Persons who are suspected of providing unlicensed child care will be sent a written request asking them to complete the licensing procedures. Persons who continue to provide unlicensed care will receive an unannounced visit from the Family Child Care coordinator, accompanied by the Flight Chief, FSS Commandei or Security Forces. Persons who continue to provide unlicensed care are subject to the loss of their housing privileges on Minot AFB.

choose licensed care over unlicensed care. Parents can feel secure knowing their child is in a regulated environment that is subject to monthly unannounced visits. These visits focus on a variety of health, safety and child development areas. This helps to ensure the best quality care is consistently provided. In addition, licensed providers are required to be CPR and First Aid certified and must receive 24-hours of training per year.

There are many advantages to becoming a licensed Family Child Care professional. It can provide the opportunity to establish a career while remaining home with your own children. The business of Family Child Care is booming and the satisfaction of running your own home based business can be wonderful! The Family Child Care office will provide all the necessary training to become licensed. There is no charge for this training.






MAFB Airmen fly to Chile, Colombia
