INOT AIR **FORCE** BASE, N.D. -- In recognition of pet abuse month in May, the Family Advocacy Program is holding an event during wingman week. This is event is the 2nd Annual Shaggy Shuffle Community Walk, which raises awareness for domestic violence and pet abuse. The primary reason for the event is to recognize the correlation between pet abuse and domestic abuse.

"When pet abuse is occurring, there is a strong likelihood that abuse is occurring between the people living in the home," said Laurel Grams, Outreach Program Manager and Family Advocate. "We want to let people know that there is a link between pet abuse and domestic abuse."

The Shaggy Shuffle is a walk to raise awareness for pet abuse. It also teaches people who see pet abuse or they know of it going on, there is potential for other abuse to be going on in that home as well.

"There will be treats and giveaways for every

dog," Grams said. "Minot Community Homes will have refreshments for the dog owners, and the Youth Center will take care of the pools that have water for the dogs."

There will also be contests for the dogs such as best smile, best dressed, longest ears, longest tail and biggest dog. There will be nine different categories. The winner of each category will receive a certificate, a treat bag and a flavored tennis ball.

"You don't have to register for this, you just need to hang around at the

dog park after the walk," Grams said. "There will also be an information table at the dog park about pet abuse. It is occurring during wingman week, so it provides a great opportunity for families to participate in a wingman event."

Work Smarter Not Harder

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Saving money is helpful because a person can then use that saved money for a few extra luxuries. Saving money is also helpful for the Air Force, especially when that money can go toward more and better equipment. It's also a bonus that the moneysaving idea makes the mission more efficient.

That's what Staff Sgt. Roland Nelson, 5th Maintenance Squadron non-commissioned officer in charge of the hydraulic section, did when he helped come up with an idea to save the Air Force

money by preventing damage to landing struts on the B-52H Stratofortress.

"We freeze the lubricant, Petrolatum, which breaks down into a liquid after it's heated," Nelson said. "I came up with the idea of freezing it because the colder it gets the stickier it gets. We tried it and it was very successful."

"Basically it all came down to inexperience from the younger Airmen on the flightline," Nelson said. "Between the inexperience and lack of knowledge, plus being in a hurry to get the job done."

Nelson said the change in the temperature, from being in a warmer hangar to going out on the frigid flight line, caused the problems with the struts.

"Whenever you go from hot to cold it contracts the seal and cold to hot expands it," Nelson said. "When that happens it allows fluid to pass and leak out, which turns into maintenance, which makes us tear apart the strut and put new seals on. There's a cam in there that has lock keys, and if you don't put the keys in exactly right it will cut through the metal and makes its own keyways, which destroys the component."

Often people are afraid of change because of the "we've always done it this way" mind-set. That


wasn't the case with Nelson's idea.

"For the most part everybody jumped right on board," Nelson said. "I did back-shop overhaul at Seymour-Johnson for 11 years, so I'm used to tearing these things apart and knowing what goes on inside of them, so no one really opposed the idea. Plus it never really changed the process itself."

Although it helped the maintainers by not having to work as hard, the big picture is the dollar sign. With this idea, Nelson made that a pretty picture.

"Each strut's exchange cost is roughly \$133,000; the repair kit we use to re-seal it now is about \$60," Nelson said. "Man hours required for the new process with a good crew is about 12 hours opposed to changing a strut which takes close to 72 hours."





Altru Health System selected as 2015 **Million Hearts Champion**

he North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH), is pleased to announce that Altru Health System has been named a 2015 Million Hearts Hypertension Control Champion. The 2015 Hypertension Control Champions were chosen for using evidence-based strategies and patient engagement to help their patients achieve blood pressure control rates at or above the Million Hearts target of 70 percent.

Eighteen Champions providing care to nearly 1.5 million adults were selected, ranging from small practices to large health care systems throughout the U.S. All Champions achieved control rates of 70 percent or greater for their adult patients by using a variety of approaches.

Altru Health System is currently working with the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) on improving care for patients with hypertension (high blood pressure). "We are excited that Altru has been chosen for the award, and are being celebrated for their hard work to achieve blood pressure control of their patients," said Tiffany Knauf, NDDoH Hypertension Management Coordinator.

Saving lives through better blood pressure control has been a longstanding priority of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). By recognizing the Champions' performance and sharing their lessons learned, the CDC aims to help other health care professionals achieve the same success in communities nationwide.

Nearly 1 in 3 American adults has high blood pressure, a leading cause of heart disease and stroke. Nearly half of adults with high blood pressure do not have their condition under control. Even more alarming, millions of Americans have high blood pressure that is undiagnosed or untreated.

North Dakota State Parks offer an array of hiking and bicycling trails.

But they're not alone. Oh, sure, people likely heard about or trekked North Dakota's premier trail, the Badlands' Maah-

The 96-mile trail garners its share of national attention, for good reason given its scenery and ad-

Daah-Hey Trail.

Maybe they rode horse on the Maah-Daah-Hey or headed over, down, and around its buttes, draws, and crevices via mountain

However, the North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department's "State Trail Guide" points out other

trails throughout the state. Some of North Dakota's trails garner special designations, such as National Recreation Trail, for their regional significance.

Several North Dakota trails have National Scenic Trail designation as part of the 4,600-mile, multi-state North Country Trail.

In North Dakota, National Historic designated trails are segments of the Lewis and Člark National Historic Trail, which meanders through the 11 states the expedition traversed from 1804 through 1806.

Some trails, such as Fort Ransom, Sully Creek, and Little Missouri State parks, allow horses. Others are groomed for winter's cross-country ski and

snowshoeing seasons.
They all provide hiking opportunities.

Other trails crisscrossing parts of North Dakota are found on North Dakota State forests.

Yes, North Dakota has state forests - Sheyenne River, Tetrault Woods, and Turtle Mountain State forests. All three allow hiking, horseback riding, snowshoeing, and cross-country skiing. Tetrault Woods and Turtle Mountain State forests also allow mountain biking.

Three miles of the Shey-

enne River State Forest trails are part of the North Country Trail, as are segments in Fort Ransom and Lake Sakakawea State Parks, Lonetree Wildlife Management Area, and the U.S. Forest Service Sheyenne National Grasslands in southeastern North Dakota.

Turtle Mountain State Forest trails loop and loop and loop throughout parts of the Turtle Mountains. They're accessed off N.D. Highway 43, which also has National Scenic Byway designation.

The Tetrault Wood State Forest Trail takes hikers and mountain bike or horseback riders through the Pembina Gorge. Sometime the trail has water issues, courtesy of busy beavers, so trail users should contact the N.D. Forest Service Walhalla Field Office, (701) 549-244, or email pgsra@nd.gov for trail updates.

Indian Hills Resort west of Garrison is also a Parks and Recreation Department State Recreation Area. Its Nux-Baa-Gaa Trail is part of the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail, as is a segment near Tobacco Garden Resort and Marina.

The Missouri River Natural Area near Mandan is a great area for mountain bikers who don't want the ups and downs of places like the Maah-Daah-Hey. Instead, the trails are flat and fast through the wooded river bottom.

Hiking is also part of the recreational opportunities available at several U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Wildlife Refuges, including Audubon, Upper Souris, J. Clark Salyer, Arrowwood, Des Lacs, and Lostwood refuges.

Some trails are relatively short – one-half mile or so – and paved. Others are rugged. Some allow bicycles or horses.

Yet they all provide opportunities to enjoy the Great Outdoors.

ASHINGTON (AFNS) -- Air Force leaders outlined what the next 20 years will look like for remotely piloted aircraft in the Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems Flight Plan published April 30.

"The Small UAS Flight Plan outlines a vision and strategy for the continued development, operation and sustainment of SUAS over the next 20 years," said Lt. Gen. Robert Otto, the deputy chief of staff for intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance. "Integrating SUAS into the Air Force's ISR portfolio enables a more agile force that will help meet future warfighter demands in both permissive and highly contested environments."

The flight plan presents an aggressive but realistic vision on how the Air Force must take significant steps, not only in system acquisition, but also in adaptive warfighting concepts, to integrate and institutionalize an Airmencentric family of SUAS as exponential force multipliers across all domains. The SUAS concept supports the Defense Department and Air Force's Better Buying initiatives: reversing the cost curve by looking at

lower-cost alternatives, enabling operational agility against a diverse set of adversaries and operational environments.

"RPAs have been foundational to the growth of the Air Force's globally integrated ISR enterprise, but as new sensors and payloads are integrated, system costs continue to rise beyond sustainability," said Col. Brandon Baker, the director of ISR capabilities. "SUAS offer a way to provide more capability and capacity to the warfighter at equal or lower operational cost."

The plan also gives industry partners an outlook on the capabilities the Air Force wants to have in the future, ranging from creation of new RPAs to possibilities of automated systems. Teaming with industry will enable the rapid advancement of equivalent RPA capabilities in a compact, cost benefiting and operationally successful family of SUAS focused on Air Force roles and mission.

"There is so much more that can be done with SUAS," Baker said. "SUAS will enable new operational concepts like teaming, swarming and loyal wingman, which allow for a single operator to control


large numbers of platforms."

Additionally, with infinitely new sensors and payloads available across the globe, the incorporation of automation and novel analytical approaches will be required to efficiently and effectively manage the Air Force's processing, exploitation and dissemination to alleviate potentially overwhelming manpower requirements.

Looking beyond the next decade, SUAS and RPA capabilities will have the potential to meet many surveillance and C4ISR roles for the Air Force. The future of the Air Force's RPA programs will be continuously evolving to allow the Air Force to be the leader in air, space and cyberspace.

Col. Brandon Baker, the director of intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance capabilities, answers questions from the media after the release of the Small Unmanned Aircraft System Flight Plan at the Pentagon Conference Center May 17, 2016, in Washington, D.C. Integration of SUAS into operations across all domains and levels of warfare will increase the Air Force's ability to meet emerging requirements of combatant commanders.







American Idol Winner David Cook To Perform At Minot AFB



On Monday, May 30th, Nashville singer and songwriter and "American Idol" winner David Cook will be bringing his band to perform an outdoor concert for Minot AFB Airmen and their families. The concert will be held in the Jimmy Doolittle Center grassy area beginning at 6 p.m.

In 2008, Cook was a bartender who had also been fronting a bar band for 10 years ("We'd be lucky to get 10 people," he quips, "and most of them would be family members"). That year, he accompanied his younger brother to audition for the show "American Idol." On a whim, he auditioned himself and wound up winning the seventh season of the competition. Later that year, Cook released his self-titled major label debut album which sold 1.5 million copies. He moved to Nashville in 2012 to forge a new career as a songwriter and had immediate success co-writing country tunes, including the Top-20 single "Kiss You Tonight" for David Nail in 2014.

Along with his songwriting, Cook and his band have continued to record and tour. His latest album is "Digital Vein," released in 2015. Although he's become known for writing for country acts, "Digital Vein" is something else entirely, with Cook's powerful voice and dynamic guitar work "knifing through vibrant soundscapes that boldly juxtapose man-made grooves and electronic textures."

Cook understands that success in the music business can be fleeting, so he put everything he had into recording "Digital Vein." "Every album from here on out could be the last one," he says, "so I'd better swing for the fences, and that's what we did on this one."


The program focuses on teaching youth how to golf using clubs fitted especially for them. The

Hasselback Chicken Stuffed with Mozzarella, Tomato and Basil



INGREDIENTS:

2 chicken breasts Sliced mozzarella cheese Grape tomatoes; sliced in half Basil leaves 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning salt, pepper 2 teaspoons olive oil

INSTRUCTIONS:

Place the chicken breasts on a cutting board. Using a sharp knife, cut slits across the chicken breast about 3/4 of the way through the chicken breast being careful not to cut all the way through. 



spot backstage where performers go to relax, hang out and kick back before or after a show. It's usually a secluded place of high spirits and hos-

pitality.

But not in this wickedly sharp thriller-chiller horror show about a band of young punk rockers whose gig turns into a ghastly fight for their lives. Barricaded in the club's grungy green room, they square off against the owner and his army of neo-Nazis when a shocking episode of violence becomes a raging nightmare.

Anton Yelchin (Chekov in the Star Trek movies), Alia Shawkat (from TV's Arrested Development), Callum Turner and Joe Cole play the members of the Ain't Rights, whose unlikely booking at a backwoods roadhouse full of white supremacists turns into a bloody standoff when they stumble onto the aftermath of a "crime of passion" and can't get away before the owner (Patrick Stewart) tries to frame them for it—and eliminate them along with all the

evidence. British actress Imogen Poots has a key role as a club patron who inadvertently becomes

'green room" is the young rockers—who play music steeped in destruction, doom and death find out how they fare when suddenly faced with the real thing

In his debut mainstream theatrical feature, director Jeremy Saulnier, 36, shows an incredible amount of promise. He takes his time setting up the story and establishing the characters, patiently drawing the audience into the subculture of their musical world and their low-rent camaraderie—a slog of constant touring to crappy gigs in their old van, living on food scraps, siphoning stolen gas and playing loud, anarchic songs to indifferent or

sometimes hostile listeners. Saulnier gets the details just right: life on the road, the band's dedication to their music, their banter and their interactions—and how actual people might react, think and speak when they find themselves in the middle of a situation that suddenly, unexpectedly becomes gruesome and deadly. As another band rumbles through their songs onstage, the dark, ominous tones reverberate through the walls of the club, into the bowels of the green room, like the howls of a great, angry beast.

The movie has the gritty, grubby feel of a film-festival, midnight-madness indie, especially when it gets down to the bloody business of slashing, hacking, shooting, stabbing, ripping and tearing. Who will escape, who will survive? It's not for the queasy or the faint of heart, but Saulier makes inventive use of his set and props, including the squeal of PA feedback as a weapon, a fire extinguisher and a permanent marker first seen in a band prank.

But the real treat is watching the classically trained Stewart, best known as Star Trek's wise Capt. Picard and as Professor Xavier, the benevolent leader of the X-Men, in a role that stretches him so far in the other direction. In Green Room, he's one seriously scary dude mixing evil and eloquence, refinement and malevolence, and hellbent on maintaining order anywhere things get messy. His harrowing performance gives this raw, edgy, awesomely impressive, little hard-hitting punk-rock movie even more of a visceral


