



Investigation Continues After B-52 Accident on Andersen AFB, Guam

36TH WING PUBLIC AFFAIRS

NDERSEN AIR FORCE BASE, Guam -- Emergency responders and law enforcement officials have successfully completed their initial response procedures following a B-52H Stratofortress accident that occurred earlier today.

The seven aircrew

members aboard are safe and no injuries have been reported.

"We are thankful that the aircrew are safe," said Brig. Gen. Douglas Cox, 36th Wing Commander. "Because of their quick thinking and good judgment in this emergency situation, the aircrew not only saved their lives but averted a more catastrophic



incident."

Responding to the incident was a joint effort as emergency response personnel from Andersen, Navy Base Guam, Joint Region Marianas and Government of Guam promptly established a cordon and extinguished the flames.

"Our personnel regularly train to respond to crises like the one we experienced today," said Cox. "We're also grateful for the support from our Government of Guam and U.S. Navy partners in addressing this serious incident." Andersen

environmental specialists are assessing any potential impacts that may have resulted from leaked fluids or burning aircraft materials to prevent damage to the ecosystem. gathering and the preservation of evidence.

Following the ISB, a Safety Investigation Board will be convened to investigate the incident for the sole purpose of preventing future mishaps. The SIB report is privileged and is not releasable outside of safety channels. Upon completion

of the SIB, the Accident Investigation Board is convened. The AIB's charter is to perform the legal investigation, and as such that is a publically releasable report. Once the AIB is completed, results will be released via a public affairs release. For questions concerning the investigation, contact Air Force Global Strike **Command Public** Affairs. 
HONORING THE DEFENDERS








Commentary: A Proud Heritage

We hear it over and over from our leadership as it's reiterated at each commander's call. It feels like a mandatory tag line at the end of every speech. It's the topic that the chief will inevitably have to 'piggyback' off of.

What am I talking about? We all know the phrase, "Airmen, know your Air Force heritage " Even our Airman's Creed states that we are "faithful to a proud heritage."

We all read the stories about Jimmy Doolittle and the Raiders, Henry "Hap" Arnold, and certainly, the Tuskegee Airmen. We've memorized the key dates in the Air Force's historical timeline, and we share a slice of cake on our service's birthday.

This is what I thought it meant to know your heritage, because that's the heritage I'm told to know for my promotion test, right?

At the beginning of this year I was told by my leadership to make a list of work-related goals for 2016.

My goals were simple: Write more stories, strengthen my photography skills and make Senior Airman Below the Zone. In order to work towards my goal of improving my photography, I made an effort to take more portraits.

What began as a single cold-call interview formed into a personal project taking portraits of veterans, and in turn learning about my heritage - a heritage more personal than something I could ever find in the Air Force **Professional Development** Guide.

I drove a little more than two hours to Mandan. North Dakota, to meet with a man named Wilbur Pleets. Airman 2nd Class (Sep.) Pleets served in Europe as an aircraft missile accessory repairman during the Vietnam War era.

Pleets and I sat at a small table in his living room. He sipped his coffee and reminisced about his time in the service, and I

tried to catch every word with my pen and notepad.

"I remember the little pots of coffee on the flightline, that Airmen sat around talking about being home," said Pleets with a chuckle as he took another drink from his own cup.

We sat for hours as he told me stories of his time in France, Holland, Ireland, North Africa, Spain, Germany and Iceland.

"Airman 2nd Class Pleets reporting," said Wilbur, recalling his first moments overseas as he reported to his barracks chief. "He said, 'where you from chief,' he must have known I was Indian."

Pleets, who is Standing Rock Sioux, told me about his experience as one of the few Native Americans, whom he knew of, at his air base.

Pleets also spoke of his visit to the American Cemetery and Memorial in Normandy, France and seeing the remnants of WWII.

"My uncle, Herbert Buffaloboy, was assigned to the 82nd Airborne Division and was in the invasion of Normandy," said Pleets proudly. Then after a long pause of contemplation, he continued in a more somber tone.

"We saw some of those places, where they kept Jews. It made you upset how people died there."

There was a certain light in his eyes as he spoke about his time in the Air Force, remembering old friends and long forgotten memories.

It was that moment when it hit me. This is my heritage.

Pleets is just one of many Airmen that served their country before me and paved the way to make us the world's greatest Air Force.

The N.D. Game and Fish Department has offered online licensing and lottery applications for several years and it continues gaining popularity.

gaining popularity. The 2015 legislature ramped that up a notch by requiring online sales only for all non-lottery licenses – fishing, upland, habitat and small game stamp, sportsman's combination, and archery licenses, for example.

People need to go online with their computer or smartphone to order licenses or they can go to authorized vendors with computer access to purchase them.

So far, though, paper applications are still available for all lottery species – turkey, tundra swan, deer, pronghorn, and the "Big Three" – elk, moose, and bighorn sheep.

Admittedly, feedback is mixed about online only license sales, N.D. Game and Fish Department wildlife division chief Jeb Williams.

Some hunters prefer to go to vendors and mail in lottery applications, Williams explained, while others might not have Internet access.

However, every year more hunters apply for lottery licenses online. "It's been climbing every year... it's about 70 percent online," Williams described.

The Game and Fish Department will eventually have all lottery applications be available online only. However, there is no timeframe or target date, Williams added.

Part of the hesitancy to online only lottery applications is the challenge of dealing with legal land descriptions for gratis license applicants. Most paper, mail-in lottery applications are from those requesting gratis licenses because they must enter the nuances of legal descriptions for each parcel they want applied to the gratis license.

ready discovered online licensing advantages, however: They can print out multiple copies.

If they lose their hard copy license, they can access the Game and Fish Department website and print it out again.

In addition, the North Dakota legislature also made it legal for hunters who carry smartphones with them to use an electronic copy of the license, saved either as a PDF file or by going to the online copy from the Game and Fish Department website, as the equivalent of a paper hard copy license.

Basically, there isn't any reason not to have one's hunting license in their possession as required by North Dakota law.

By ordering online hunters can have license copies in every vehicle, jacket, shirt, or pants pocket, and one's smartphone.

Also, when by submitting online lottery applications, the Game and Fish Department politely informs applicants if they're successful.

Or not.

Hunters don't even have to go online to search for their lottery results nor do they have to wait patiently – or impatiently – for the license or, sadly, the refund.

As if these reasons haven't convinced every hunter to apply for the upcoming deer gun season via online lottery applications, there is yet one more reason: Data can be processed faster when more applications are done online. Paper applicants still require someone at the Game and Fish Depart-




INGREDIENTS:


- 1/2 tsp sesame oil


In a mixing bowl whisk together ketchup, brown sugar, soy sauce, pineapple juice, 2 Tbsp olive oil, rice vinegar, garlic, ginger and sesame oil. Stir in 3/4 tsp pepper and season with salt if desired. Place chicken in a gallon size resealable bag. Reserve 1/2 cup of the marinade in refrigerator then pour remaining marinade over chicken. Seal bag and refrigerate 3 hours (meanwhile soak 10 wooden skewer sticks in water for 1 hour). Preheat a grill over me-dium heat to 400 degrees. Meanwhile, drizzle remaining 2 Tbsp olive oil over red onion, bell pepper and pineapple and toss. Season red onion and bell pepper with salt and pepper, then thread red onion, bell pepper, pineapple and chicken onto skewers until all of the chicken has been used. Brush grill grates with olive oil then place skewers on grill. Grill 5 minutes then brush along tops with 1/4 cup of remaining marinade. Rotate to opposite side and brush remaining 1/4 cup of marinade on opposite side and allow to grill about 4 minutes longer, or until chicken registers 165 degrees in center on an instant read thermometer. 




