ZIKA VIRUS

INOT AIR **FORCE** BASE, Zika virus is primarily transmitted by infected mosquitos. Presently these transmissions are limited to the Caribbean including Puerto Rico and the U. S. Virgin Islands, the Pacific Islands, Mexico, Central America and South America. Mosquito transmission of Zika virus has also occurred in Cape Verde, Africa and in several regions of Southeast Asia. However, not all areas within Zika-affected regions or countries are equally affected.

As of 18 May 2016, no active transmission of Zika virus by mosquitos has been documented within the continental United States, but there have been 544 travel-associated cases [http://www.cdc.gov/zika/ geo/united-states.html]. On 28 April 2016, the CDC reported to the State of North Dakota the first confirmed case of travelassociated Zika virus in a North Dakota resident having recently traveled to Puerto Rico [http://www. ndhealth.gov/disease/ zika/].

Zika virus is also known to be secondarily transmitted in the blood and body fluids of infected persons to non-infected persons, and there is a plausible link between birth defects (microcephaly) and Zika virus infection during pregnancy. Therefore, it is highly recommended to use condoms or avoid sexual activities with a pregnant partner and suspend blood donations for 28 days upon return from a Zika affected

As the weather continues to warm, it is expected the mosquitos which transmit Zika virus will become more active in the Southeastern United States. Officials speculate this increased activity will result in the active transmission of Zika virus by mosquitos within the continental United States. However, the transmission of Zika virus is limited by the range of the mosquitos which can carry it.

Currently, Zika is transmitted solely by Aedes species mosquitos which are prevalent throughout most of the warmer tropical areas in the Americas. These mosquitos typically bite during the day and can be found indoors under beds and furniture. Aedes species mosquitos are present in the continental United States, predominantly in the Southeast and across Texas with a few pockets in New Mexico, Arizona and California. They have been known to come as far north as New Jersey and across to Nebraska.

Neither of the Aedes species implicated in spreading Zika virus have been found during mosquito surveillance at Minot Air Force Base. The Public Health office traps mosquitos annually and sends specimens for testing to the United States Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine (USAFSAM) laboratories at Wright Patterson AFB. The Public Health and Civil

Engineering Entomology offices continue to work directly with the North Dakota Department of Health to control mosquito breeding, track local mosquito species and identify the prevalence of disease causing virus in those species.

Zika virus symptoms may include fever, rash, headache, joint and muscle aches, and red irritated eyes (conjunctivitis). However, 80% of infected individuals may never develop symptoms. For those who do exhibit symptoms, they typically last 2 to 7 days and complete recovery is the norm.

There is no vaccine or medications available for treating Zika infections. Healthcare providers and individuals must focus on treating the symptoms. If you had recent travel to a region where the active transmission of Zika virus is ongoing and you are experiencing a combination of the symptoms mentioned above, then consider speaking with a health care provider. BASE, N.D. -- Minot Air Force Base has requested assistance from the 910th Airlift Wing's Air Force Aerial Spray Squadron, to conduct aerial spraying for mosquito control between June 27 - 30 and July 18 - 21 for Minot Air Force Base, and the city of Minot. Due to uncertain weather conditions the exact time and area to

be treated cannot be

determined in advance.

MINOT AIR FORCE

The Air Force Aerial Spray Squadron will be applying U.S. **Environmental Protection** Agency registered pesticides. Adult mosquito control will occur between the hours of 7 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. The applications will be made using a modified C-130H cargo aircraft at 150ft above ground level.

The purpose of the aerial spraying for mosquitoes is to protect public health, ease working conditions, and improve the quality of life for members

working at Minot AFB and living in the surrounding area. Again, due to uncertain weather conditions the exact time and area to be treated cannot be determined in advance.

Minot AFB Public Health recommends humans and domestic animals remain indoors while the aerial spraying is occurring immediately overhead or upwind from your location and until the mist settles to the ground. These products were selected because they pose minimal health hazards to humans and domestic animals with aerial application.
























BALTOPS B-52 mining operations: The Build

OYAL AIR FORCE FAIRFORD, United Kingdom -- Hours before the U.S. Air Force's BALTOPS 2016 mine-drop exercise, Airmen and U.S. Navy seamen were cutting wires, turning wrenches, and hoisting munitions in preparation for the mission.

Twelve MK-62 Quick Strike inert mines were built and loaded onto two B-52H Stratofortresses for an exercise mission where the bombers tested their ability to precisely drop munitions into a target

zone.

"The mines were built so we can show our allies that we can come out here and assemble them whenever we need to," said Seaman Clarence Burns, a mineman from the Navy Munitions Command Atlantic Unit Charleston.

This was Burns' first time participating in exercise BALTOPS, which provides an opportunity for personnel from different services and nations to engage in realistic maritime training to build experience and teamwork and strengthen interoperability.

"This opportunity allows us to see what happens after we build them," Burns said. "We don't always get to see the loading process, we normally just build them and that's it."

Operating out of RAF Fairford also provided Burns the opportunity to practice building the inert mines in an unfamiliar environment.

"It's different from my shop because we have an assembly line built specifically for the mines," Burns said. "Here there is less space and it's a lot leaner."

Although they face challenges such as using new equipment and learning the other services' acronyms and lingo, the mine build allows the services to see the skills and knowledge each member brings to the table.

"It's an honor to be here and to get the chance to work with the other services and see how it all fits together," Burns said. "It puts my job into perspective and really shows what I'm doing."

Senior Airman Kody Regelbrugge, 5th Munitions Squadron conventional

maintenance crew chief, agreed that it's important to get to work with other services because it paints the whole picture to show what the entire effort is about.

"Working day-to-day I just see the Air Force," said Regelbrugge. "But here I get to see the Navy, Air Force and Royal Air Force -- everybody working together."

"It's humbling and it definitely puts our job and mission into perspective," he added. "Over here you feel like you're a part of the bigger picture."



North Dakotans Reminded to Take **Safety Precautions While Attending Summer Events**

BISMARCK - Summer fairs and outdoor festivals are important North Dakota traditions. The North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) reminds people to take healthy precautions at fairs, festivals, carnivals, and rodeos this summer. Certain diseases, like E. coli and influenza, can be passed back and forth between humans and animals.

"With so many outdoor festivities and gatherings, summer is a great time to enjoy activities with friends and family," said Michelle Feist, epidemiologist with the NDDoH. "A few simple precautions can help to keep illnesses from interrupting summer fun."

General recommendations for attendees:

Wash your hands often with soap and running water before and after exposure to live animals and their surroundings. If soap and water are not available, use an alcoholbased hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol.

Do not eat or drink while

in petting zoos or livestock viewing areas.

Do not allow children to put anything in their mouths while in animal areas.

Do not take toys, pacifiers, cups, baby bottles, strollers, or similar items into animal viewing areas; these items can pick up germs from animal areas and can become a source of contamination for small children.

Always provide adult supervision in animal areas for children younger than 5

Avoid close contact with any animal that looks or acts ill.

If you are ill, avoid close contact with animals and viewing animals in enclosed spaces, such as barns.

To further reduce the risk of infection, minimize direct contact with animals in barns and viewing areas.

If you are bringing or preparing your own food, don't let food sit out for more than two hours—one hour if the temperature is over 90°F. Keep perishable food items in a cooler or

insulated bag.

Wear U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)registered insect repellent to keep mosquitos, ticks, and other bugs away when outdoors.

Anyone at high risk of serious complications from infectious diseases like influenza or E. coli may consider avoiding contact with live animals at the fair. High risk individuals can include small children, pregnant women, people 65 years and older, and people with long-term health conditions. People with respiratory conditions should consider avoiding enclosed spaces where livestock are present, such as barns and indoor arenas.

Anyone who becomes ill after contact with livestock or other animals should contact a health care provider, and should tell the health care provider about the animal contact. un in the summer sun doesn't always translate into such a grand time for dogs.

Let's face it, Americans love their dogs. They're often a large part of the family. More and more people travel with their dogs and it's increasing common to see dogs on family vacations.

And sometimes bad things happen despite all of the best efforts of a dog's human.

That's why PetPlace, (www.petplace.com), which is an online website with a plethora of informational and educational articles dedicated to people's pets, recently passed along some first aid tips – "Top 10 things to know for Dogs".

Actually, it's more than 10 things to know but who bothers counting?

*For starters, when dealing with a canine emergency remember not to panic, protect yourself from injury, and be prepared.

It's kind of like what people should do when they're lost – stop and take a moment to assess the situation because, ultimately, that keeps it from getting worse than it was already.

*Find out if the dog needs to moved immediately, for example if a vehicle hit it.

*Determine if there could be additional danger of injury to the dog and those providing first aid.

*It is important to know and understand basic canine behavior, especially to never assume an injured dog won't bite. In reality, even the gentlest of dogs - including your own - can bite when in pain or in fear. Approach the dog carefully and cover its head with a towel. That helps the dog feel safe while transporting it to the veterinarian.

*Keep your veterinarian's telephone number and address handy and try to find out in advance the location and contact information for any local vets if planning to travel to new areas.

*Try to have someone along so a person is available to focus on the dog and help keep it calm and settled while the other drives to the veterinarian's office.

*Learn animal CPR.

*While uncommon, dogs can choke on things such as squeaky toys, so it is also a good idea to know how to perform the Heimlich maneuver on a dog. However, only perform the technique if totally certain the dog is in peril and you are properly trained. Otherwise injury could result to the dog if done incorrectly.

*Apply a bandage -a cloth or paper towel or even clothing or fabric - to a wound to control bleed-

*Apply pressure to an obvious source of bleeding, using a clean cloth or towel applied directly to the wound.

*Having towels or blankets handy, such as in a vehicle or camper, can help in picking up an injured dog and control bleeding. Just as wrapping an injured or frightened child in a blanket helps ease their fears, a blanket could have the same effect on a dog, especially if their head is wrapped in darkness to provide a calming sensa-

*Sometimes it might be necessary to use a board or strong blanket to help move or transport an injured dog. If one is needed, carefully roll or slide the dog onto the board or blanket, such as a sturdy wool blanket or canvas. Using a board or blanket means the need for two people and must be done with care so as not to further injure the dog or frighten it so it puts people in danger of bites.

*Emergency visits can be costly and in some cases, it may help if a pet owner has pet insurance. Research the variety of pet insurance companies to find out if one fits your family and canine's needs.





Go Ask Alice

Magic mirror returns plucky lass to Wonderland—or Underland

British author Lewis Carroll's tales of a Victorian lass and her escapades in an enchanted place of talking animals, odd humans and other curious creatures have been made into numerous movies, TV shows and stage adaptations—dozens since Alice's Adventures in Wonderland was originally published in 1865. In the early 1970s, the rock band Jefferson Starship made Alice the hook of its hippy-dippy song "White Rabbit," which used her journey down a rabbit hole as a metaphor for another kind of "trip." The ABC-TV modern-day fairytale anthology Once Upon a Time spun off a standalone series, Once Upon a Time in Wonderland, based on Carroll's novels, in 2013.

Clearly, something about the plucky, curious young Alice never falls out of fash-

"Go ask Alice," sang Jefferson Starship's Grace

Go ask Alice, indeed, for she is a most resourceful gal in this Disney followup to the House of Mouse's Alice in Wonderland, which reunites most of the cast of the 2010 film. When we meet her in the opening scene, Alice Kingsleigh (Mia Wasikowska) is the coolheaded captain of her late father's sailing ship, The Wonder, excitedly exploring the globe, narrowly escaping from pirates and clearly making her own way in a "man's world" that wants to put her—and keep her—in her place.

When the Mad Hatter (Johnny Depp) gets in a bit of a bind, his friends in Wonderland—now called "Underland"—know just what to do: Go ask Alice!

That sets the stage for Alice's return—this time through a magic mirror—to the enchanted realm, where she again meets up with

the Red Queen (Helena Bonham Carter), the White Queen (Anne Hathaway), Tweedles Dee and Dum (Matt Lucas), the Cheshire Cat, the March Hare, the Dormouse and the Bloodhound.

In order to help the Hatter, Alice must make a dangerous, daring trip back in time. That's always tricky in any movie, and here it involves stealing a device called the Chronosphere from Time himself (Sacha Baron Cohen). The film's weirdly wacky new character is a clockwork despot who speaks like German actor Christoph Waltz and is served by a staff of comical, robotic minions he refers to as his "seconds"—a time pun, get it?

Once again, Johnny Depp is all tics, weird hair and crazy quirks—three shades of eye shadow, eyebrows that look like florescent orange caterpillars attacking his forehead, ghoulish white makeup and yellow teeth. When the Hatter speaks, he sounds like he's got marbles in his mouth and a lisp. It's just too much.

So it's practically an invitation for Sacha Baron Cohen to glide right in and steal the show with a perfectly calibrated performance of comedic timing, camp and cleverness, which he does.

British director James Bobbin (who also steered two Disney Muppets movies plus the brilliant Flight of the Conchords and Cohen's satirical Da Ali G Show) replaces Tim Burton, who directed the 2010 Alice in Wonderland. Burton's influence remains as one of the producers, however, and the whimsy and imagination of his original are still very much evident.

So: How long before we get our next trip to Wonderland/Underland? Go ask Alice!



Crock Pot Bacon Mushroom Swiss Chicken



INGREDIENTS:

- 3 slices of bacon, crisply cooked, crumbled and drippings reserved 6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 4 oz can sliced mushrooms, drained
- 10.75 oz can cream of chicken soup 6 slices of swiss cheese

INSTRUCTIONS:

Pour your reserved bacon grease in a skillet and heat up over medium heat. Place your chicken breasts in the warmed grease and cook for 3-5 minutes until slightly golden (turning once). Spray your crock pot with cooking spray. Put your chicken in your crock pot. Cover with your mushrooms. Pour your soup in your skillet, warm through, then pour over your chicken. Cover and cook on low for 4-5 hours, check with a meat thermometer to know when the chicken is done. Place a slice of Swiss on top of each chicken breast, sprinkle with bacon, turn heat up to high and cover and cook for 10-15 minutes more until the cheese is melted.

Red, White and Blueberry Sangria



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 bottle dry White wine (I used an inexpensive Chennin Blanc)
- 1 C white grape juice
- 2 C blueberries
- 1 lb strawberries, hulled and sliced
- 1 bottle champagne/sparkling wine or Prosecco 2 apples, thinly sliced

INSTRUCTIONS:

Stir together the white wine, white grape juice, blueberries and strawberries in a large pitcher. Cover and refrigerate for up to 4 hours. The longer it sits, the redder it will be. When you're ready to serve, add the chilled champagne and apple slices then pour

Wiese said that she loved being able to bring together bluegrass musicians and lovers for the event every year, and that it gave people an excuse to visit the state.


