Minot AFB Article 15s

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

A vast majority of members of Team Minot will never have to experience the nonjudicial punishment process pursuant to Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). However, it is important for members to understand the different types of misconduct that can warrant nonjudicial punishment and how commanders can punish. Under Article 15 of the UCMJ, all commanders may initiate non-judicial punishment. The member is given the right to accept nonjudicial punishment or demand trial by court-martial. If the member accepts the Article 15 process they are provided an opportunity to respond before guilt and punishment is determined by the Commander. After the Commander reviews the member's submitted matters, the circumstances of the offense, any factors in mitigation or extenuation, and the member's history of misconduct (if any), the Commander will then determine guilt or innocence and if found guilty an appropriate punishment. The maximum punishment for an Article 15 action depends on the rank of the member being punished and the rank of the officer imposing punishment. Typical punishments include, but are not limited to, reduction in rank, forfeitures of pay, extra duties, restriction to base and a reprimand. The Commander can also choose to suspend a portion of the punishment. The suspended punishment acts as a probation period no more than six months.

If the member commits further misconduct the suspended punishment can be vacated, meaning the suspended punishment will take effect. For the month of April, May, and June 2016, the Minot AFB Legal Office processed forty Article 15s. Listed below are short summaries of these cases to inform the base community of the serious nature of non-judicial punishment and the potential severity of punishment.

1. A Senior Airman from 5th Logistics Readiness Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, forfeitures of \$1041.00 pay per month for two months, 14 days extra duty suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 128, Assault Consummated by a Battery and one specification in violation of 134 Drunk and Disorderly.

2. A Senior Airman from 5th Maintenance Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, forfeiture of \$1041.00 pay per month for one month, 45 days extra duty and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 107, Sign False Official Statement.

3. A Senior Airman from 5th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, suspended forfeitures of \$1041.00 pay per month for two months, 45 days extra duty with 15 days suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 111, Drunken Driving.

4. A Senior Airman from 791st Missile Security

Forces Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman with reduction below Airman First Class suspended, forfeitures of \$878.00 pay per month for two months with one month suspended, 60 days restriction to the base suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 111, Drunken Driving.

5. A Senior Airman from 91st Missile Security Forces Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, suspended forfeitures of \$1041.00 pay per month for one month and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 92, Neglect; Dereliction of Duty.

6. An Airman First Class from 791st Missile Security Forces Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman, forfeitures of \$500.00 pay per month for two months, 45 days restriction to the base and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 92, Failure to Obey Lawful Order.

7. An Airman First Class from 5th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman Basic, 45 days restriction to the base with 30 days suspended, 45 extra days extra duty with 30 days suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 134, Malingering.

8. An Airman First Class from 5th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of Airman Basic with reduction below Airman suspended, suspended forfeitures of \$783.00 pay per month for two months, 45 days restriction to the

base with 15 days suspended, 45 extra days extra duty with 15 days suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 92, Failure to Obey Lawful Order and one specification in violation of Article 107, False Official Statement.

9. An Airman First Class from 791st Missile Security Forces Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman, suspended forfeitures of \$878.00 pay per month two months, 60 days restriction to the base with 30 days suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 134, Disorderly. The reduction to Airman and the 30 days restriction to base was later vacated for violation of one specification of Article 112a, Wrongful Use of Marijuana.

10. An Airman First Class from 91st Missile Maintenance Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman, forfeitures of \$878.00 pay per month for two months with forfeiture of one month suspended, 45 days restriction to the base suspended, 45 extra days extra duty suspended and a reprimand for one specification in violation of Article 92, Willful; Dereliction of Duty

Minot prepares for Northern Neighbors Day 2016 Air Show

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

A lot goes into preparing for an air show and often times much of that prepping can be getting ready for the worst, the just in case, and how to deal with it if that adversity comes.

Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota participated in a major accident response exercise with the purpose of emergency prevention and preparation if something was to happen during an air show.

"We're going to be conducting an on-base aircraft mishap with mass casualties," Rodney Onstott, 5th

Civil Engineer Squadron flight chief of readiness and emergency management flight, said. "It's a requirement to have this exercise within 30 days of the air show."

The exercise involved all base personnel so their real-time response skills can be tested.

"This is a base-level exercise, so you're going to have participation from your first and emergency

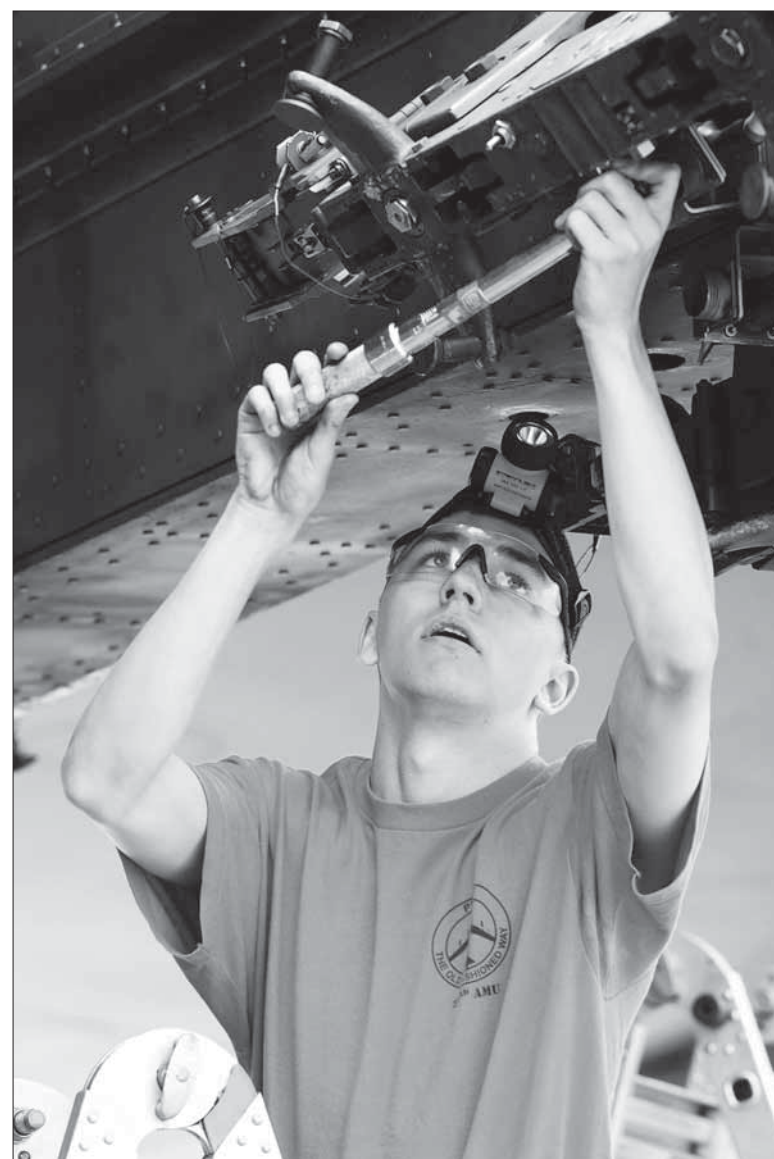

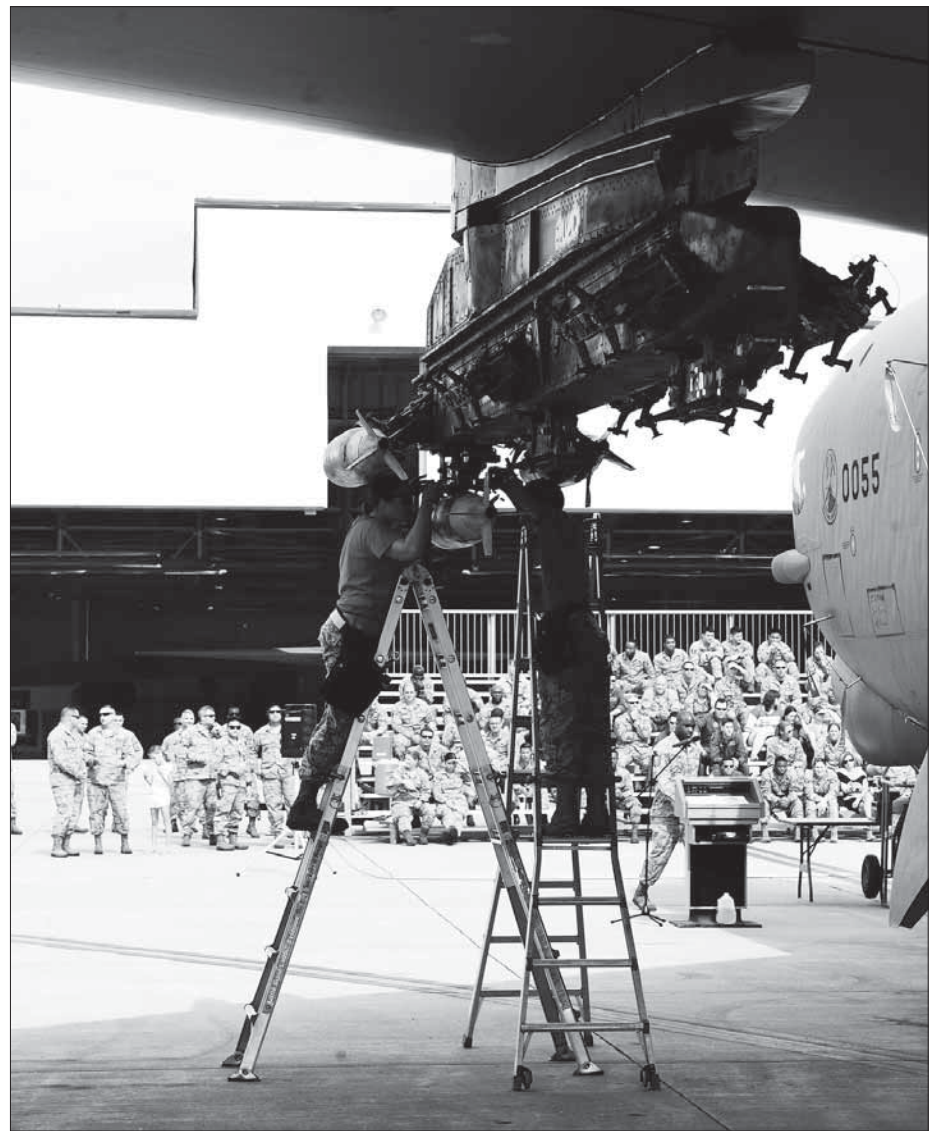


5 AMXS LOAD CREW OF THE QUARTER

Roughriders gear up for code change

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Airmen of the 91st Missile Wing are increasing time, tempo and teamwork on the job as the code change season kicked off this week.

In order to maintain the upmost security, the codes used to launch the 91st MW's 150 Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missiles are changed during an approximate 6-week process.

responders," Onstott said. "There's also going to be participants from wing safety, air field management, public affairs and multiple agencies across the base."

The point of the exercise is to prepare the base if something were to occur during the Northern Neighbors Day Air Show.

"We're going to simulate, based on the aircraft that are going to attend, what could be our greatest potential for an aircraft accident," Onstott said. "We're going to use the fire department trainer and we're going to simulate our helicopter accident and we're going to simulate about 40 simulated injured personnel."

In addition to preparing for Northern Neighbors Day, exercises like these maintain mission readiness for base first responders as well as all personnel. If a mass casualty accident did ever occur, the hands-on practice would benefit everyone involved.

"We want to ensure that our emergency responders are capable of handling any event that might happen during an air show as well as something that could happen day-to-day," Onstott said. "That's why we practice this, to get all of that as a unit, all working for the same goal."

"Code change is important because it allows us to make sure our security systems are still fully functional, and keep our nuclear deterrence process constantly changing to prevent unauthorized access," said Senior Airman Joshua Blake, 91st Missile Maintenance Squadron facilities maintenance technician team chief.

All 91st MW units are involved in code change. Operators, security forces and maintainers work together to ensure the change goes off without a hitch. Working that closely with other units isn't a foreign idea, but that teamwork is much more essential during code change.

"Code change is different because usually we are working by ourselves at our own pace," Blake said. "With the different teams that are involved, we have to make sure everybody is able to do their job when they get to site to make sure everything runs smoothly. There's a point your team reaches when they figure out the flow with each other, and from that day forward, everything begins to run smoothly."

In addition to working together with all units, the

maintainers' schedules are greatly altered for those six weeks.

"Code change is different than the day-to-day work because of having to stay in the field for five days straight, along with multiple shops and dispatches being involved for every site," said Senior Airman Ryan Brown, 91st MMXS FMT.

While completing the code change itself, communication is key for maintainers. One miscue could double their workload.

"It's critical for all shops to be communicating and getting updates," Brown said. "If that communication chain fails, your day often goes from eight hours to 16 hours long."

Despite such a demanding and important few weeks, the atmosphere isn't always intense. Being on site for up to 16 hours and having to work as a cohesive unit to accomplish such a crucial mission creates a strong bond between Airmen. And if not the friendships, the morale

visits and food-runners always make code change memorable.

"I would have to say my favorite about of code change is getting fed by our leadership," Brown said. "I always look forward to sloppy joes and tacos in a bag."

Blake agrees.

"My favorite part about code change would have to be getting food from the morale runners," Blake said. "It's nice just sitting down in the truck with the team, enjoying some good food and cool A/C!"

PRAIRIE ADVENTURES

As days get shorter and the realization that we're diving headfirst into August hits folks, the consolation for many is that hunting season is just around the corner.

Summer often means playing and exercising one's favorite four-legged hunting companion in The Great Outdoors under summer skies. However, as temperatures soar that can be dangerous.

People get heat stroke and heat exhaustion.

Their dogs can suffer the same fate. Keep them hydrated, don't overdue exercise, provide shade, and never, ever leave a dog in a vehicle. It's deadly for humans and it's deadly for dogs.

Dogs don't sweat, they can only pant, and they can't handle too much heat regardless of it's inside a vehicle or outside in a yard or at the lake.

When exercising, do so in early morning and evening hours when it's cooler, limit exercise in hot weather, and provide lots of water.

Plus, there could be other nasties out there posing problems for that canine hunter simply because it's summer.

For example, blue-green algae is rearing its ugly head again. Never, ever knowingly allow your dog to swim or ingest blue-green algae infested waters. There are many types of algae and most are harmless.

Blue-green algae isn't harmless - even to livestock.

It's a killer, there is no other way to put it.

Learn to identify it.

And it comes on quickly, often too quickly to do anything.

Plus there are flying critters that are just as annoying to a hunting dog - or any dog, for that matter - as they are to humans. You know, things like wasps and bees.

If stung, gently clean the area and if the stinger is vis-

ible, try to remove it. However, don't frighten the dog or cause panic. Even the gentlest of canines could bite when in pain or wrath with fear.

Just as with humans, some dogs bit by bees and wasps have allergic reactions, including swelling of the face and muzzle, hives, difficulty breathing, vomiting, or just plain lethargic. Take the dog to your veterinarian if any of those signs appear.

One advantage to North Dakota's locale and climate is we're fortunate to have only one venomous snake species - rattlesnakes. Plus, they're typically not found throughout the state. And compared to desert or Mohave rattlesnakes, our prairie rattlers aren't that nasty.

Not only do we not have to worry about coppermouth and water moccasin snakes in goose and duck blinds in the fall, we only have to worry about dogs encountering one type of poisonous snake.

However, don't downplay a rattlesnake bite - even a prairie rattler bite can be deadly to dogs.

A potential snakebite also means an emergency veterinarian trip, especially if bit near the face and neck where swelling can cause loss of breathing. Rattlesnake teeth marks can be hard to identify sometimes so look for swelling, intense pain, and possible bruising around the bite area as snakebite symptoms.

It seems eating grass is as engrained as pointing, flushing, and retrieving, so generally dogs don't do much more than vomit.

However, other plants can cause problems. The Dog Health Guide website publishes a list of some of the many in- and outdoor plants that are toxic to animals, (<http://www.dog-health-guide.org/dogpoisonousplants.html>).

Enjoy what is left of summer with your dog - just do it safely.

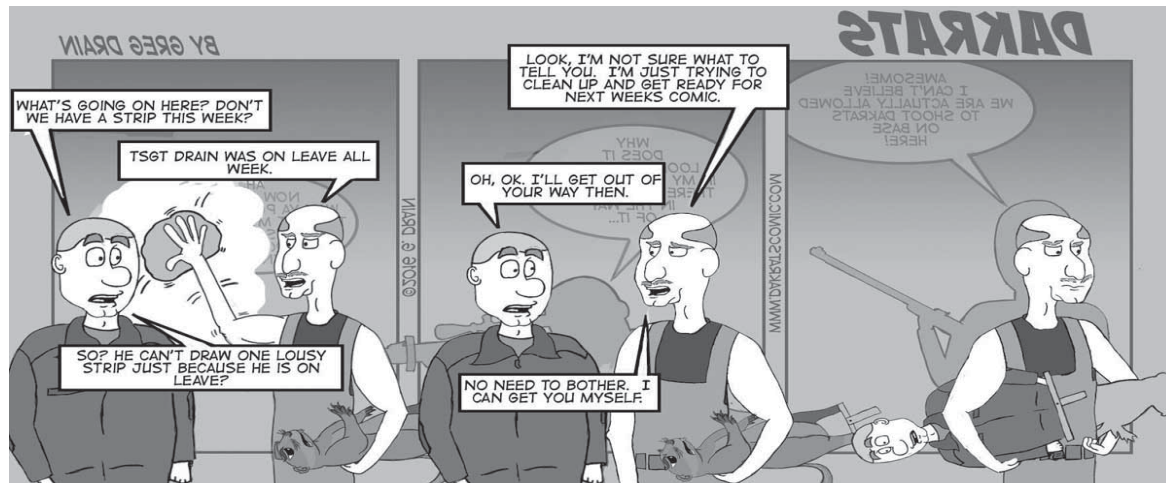

Jungle Swinger

New Tarzan a rollicking tale of adventure, romance and eye candy

You probably know Tarzan, one way or another. Edgar Rice Burroughs launched the "ape man" into popular culture in magazines and novels in the early 1900s. Several other actors had already portrayed him before former Olympic swimmer Johnny Weissmuller put on a loincloth and grunted his way through the 1930s and '40s for a dozen films, which ran endlessly on TV in the following decades. Ron Ely and others played him on television. Walt Disney turned him into a cartoon. And there were other Tarzans, too, in some 200 movies and TV shows between 1918 and today.

Now the original "Lord of the Apes" returns to the big screen in a sumptuous, sprawling epic that blends his backstory with a rollicking new tale of adventure, romance and enough eye candy to attract audiences of all sorts.

Swedish-born actor Alexander Skarsgård (from TV's *True Blood* series) stars as British nobleman John Clayton, raised as a feral child by mighty apes of the African Congo after the deaths of his parents. Now an adult for years resettled in his ancestral home with his beautiful wife Jane (Margot Robbie), he's lured back to the Dark Continent by a plot of deception involving slavery, revenge, railroads, diamond mines and a corrupt Belgian megalomaniac (Christopher Waltz).

Director David Yates, who made his bones with all four movies of the Harry Potter franchise, works with all the tools in his impressive kit—and what must have been every nickel of his mega-budget. The visuals are grand: mist-shrouded mountain passes, jungles with impenetrable foliage; armies of Congolese warriors; fearsome gorillas; a stampeding herd of hun-

dreds of wildebeest. Even though most of the film was reportedly shot on soundstages and sets in England, you'd never know it: When the action shifts to Africa, you're transported there, too.

Margot Robbie is terrific as Jane, who was raised in the jungle, as well, the daughter of a missionary teacher. A real spitfire of spunk and spirit, she's so much more than a "damsel in distress." Samuel L. Jackson plays George Washington Williams, an American envoy to Britain who accompanies Tarzan and Jane on their return trip to Africa. He's got a backstory of his own, and though he may not be in prime shape to keep up with Tarzan step for step, he comes in pretty handy with a gun.

Waltz, as usual, makes a dandy villain, and Djimon Hounsou (from *Gladiator* and *Guardians of the Galaxy*) has a necessary, if somewhat nasty, role as a tribal leader looking to stage a major grudge match.

Ladies will swoon—as Jane does—when Skarsgård initially reveals his sexy, sculpted torso, in a flashback scene that recalls their first steamy jungle encounter. And moviegoers in general will thrill when Tarzan finally gets around to doing what he does best: working those jungle vines, baby!

Late in the movie, we get to hear the iconic Tarzan yell, rolling across the miles—he's coming. "Tarzan," says Waltz's character, relishing the moment, knowing the man he's been trying to catch is close. "It sounded different than I thought...better."

Different, and better, like this movie. After years of musty, rusty so-so and too-many Tarzans, now there's a new, sexy big-screen Lord of the Apes—and he's swinging again.



Baked Chicken, Bean & Cheese Taquitos



INGREDIENTS:

For the chicken:

- 1 lbs boneless, skinless chicken breast or thighs
- 1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1/4 tsp cumin
- 1/4 tsp onion powder
- 1/4 tsp garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp coarse sea salt
- 1 tsp olive oil or olive oil spray

For the taquitos:

- 12 corn tortillas
- 1 lb shredded chicken (about 3 cups)
- 1 cup shredded Mexican cheese blend
- 1 cup mashed or refried pinto beans (about 1-1.5 oz can)
- Olive oil spray (or tsp of olive oil)

INSTRUCTIONS:

For the chicken:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a small bowl, mix together chili powder, cumin, onion powder, garlic powder and sea salt. Place chicken on baking sheet and coat in olive oil or olive oil spray. Sprinkle seasoning on top of chicken and bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until fully cooked. Shred with a fork and knife. Season with more salt if needed.

For the taquitos:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray large baking sheet with olive oil spray or grease with olive oil. Heat the corn tortillas in the microwave for about 30 seconds (or on a hot griddle until soft and pliable). Spoon about a tablespoon or so of beans and shredded cheese in the middle of the tortilla. Top with about 2 tbsp of shredded chicken and roll tightly. Secure taquito with a toothpick and place on a baking sheet seam side down. Repeat process until all tortillas are filled, rolled, secured and placed on the baking sheet. Spray the tops of the taquitos with olive oil or brush lightly with olive oil. Sprinkle with some sea salt. Bake in oven for 15 to 20 minutes, until edges of the taquitos are browned. Serve topped with chopped greens, cheese, sour cream, and your favorite salsa or dipping sauce.

Hawaiian BBQ Chicken Wraps

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut into bite-size pieces
- salt and pepper
- 1/2 cup barbecue sauce
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 2/3 cup chopped pineapple, fresh or canned
- 1/4 of a red onion, chopped
- 1 romaine heart, chopped
- 1/4 cup fresh chopped cilantro
- 4-5 large wheat or white tortillas

INSTRUCTIONS:

Heat oil in a large skillet over medium high heat. Add chicken pieces to the pan and season with salt and pepper. Cook, flipping once until chicken is cooked through and golden brown. Remove pan from heat. Add barbecue sauce to the pan and toss chicken to coat. Place tortilla on a plate. Layer with a spoonful of barbecue chicken, cheese, pineapple, onion, chopped romaine and cilantro. Roll, burrito style and secure with a toothpick. Serve immediately.

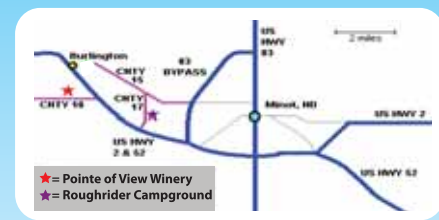

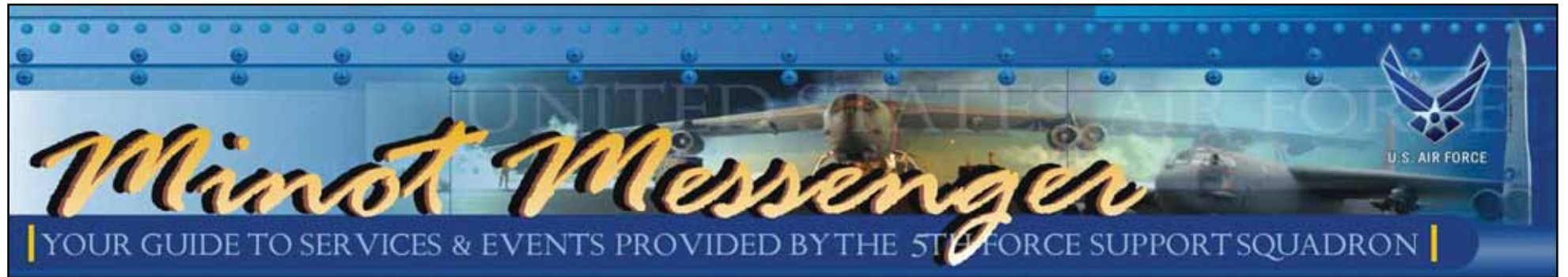

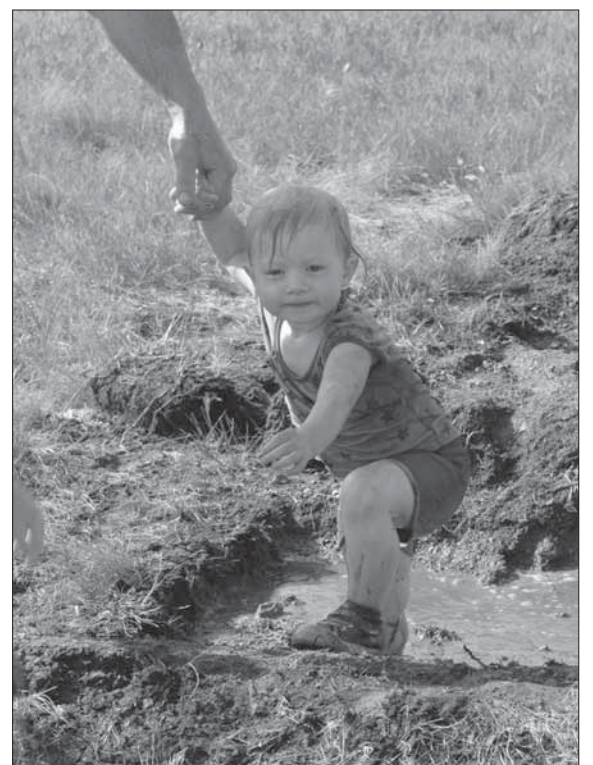
