Minot AFB hosts successful air show

The sounds of aircraft engines, the smell of turkey legs grilling and cheese curds frying, with squeals of excitement from children, these were just some of the sights, smells and sounds of Northern Neighbors Day 2016 on Saturday.

For the first time in seven years, Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota brought back the Northern Neighbors Day Air Show and hosted more than 10,000 attendees.

"The show was a resounding success," said Pat Travnick, Northern Neighbors Day Air Show deputy director. "After not having a show in seven years the public was ready to visit the base and it showed."

The air show allowed civilians on base to see the capabilities of the Air Force while interacting with active duty personnel.

"Minot Air Force Base hosts open houses to enhance the public awareness of Air Force preparedness, to demonstrate modern weapon systems and capabilities, to promote positive community and international relations, to showcase our Airmen and to support Air Force recruiting and retention," Travnick said. "Opening Air Force bases to the public provides opportunities for education and generates interest in the military and its role in national security.

Travnick said that he was pleased with the way the show went and the attendees agreed with him.

"It was a great day and the air show was amazing! My whole family enjoyed it so much!" wrote an enthusiastic attendee on Facebook.

"This was amazing!

So glad to see it back. We really missed it. What a way to welcome my almost 2 year old to them. He was enthralled with the F-16 show. He fought me covering his ears. Thank you so much!" agreed another person on Facebook.

Although there were many great acts throughout the day, Travnick feels there were a few that stood out to the crowd.

"The F-16 demo and the Golden Knights were the headliners, but I heard great comments on the B-52 and B-2 flyovers," Travnick said. "Also seeing the P-51 Spitfire and the P-40 fly gives you a great sense of military aviation history. It's hard to pick one event as the most popular. The open house committee tried very hard to provide something for everyone and I think we succeeded."

Even though Travnick couldn't pick just one thing that stood out for others, he does have one personal favorite moment from the air show himself.

"As I looked over the crowd on Saturday afternoon, I realized how important it is to the community to come out and see what the Air Force does to defend the United States," Travnick said. "the Northern Neighbors Day Open House gave the public a chance to see not only what Minot Air Force Base does on a daily basis, but what the Air Force does worldwide. The ability to get up close to the static displays and see the military aircraft past and present fly gives the public better appreciation of what the military does to protect their freedom."

With NND in the rearview mirror, Travnick is already preparing for the next air show for Minot AFB, and he said it will be bigger and better.

"We are already working on the 2018 show," the deputy director said. "The Thunderbirds have been requested and

we have high hopes of being selected to host them in 2018. More food vendors, more static displays and a single

ship demonstration team in addition to the Thunderbirds are several big things being worked for the 2018 show."

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, To hear the dining

facility at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, is nearing completion will bring a sigh of relief to most Airmen.

The 5th Force Support Squadron, 5th Civil Engineer Squadron and several contractors have been giving the old dining facility a "face-lift" for the past year.

Ken Davis, the site project manager with Hospitality Millwork Construction Inc., has been working on the project site for 14 months.

"My responsibility is to coordinate the contractors," said Davis. "I also evaluate change

orders to make sure the customer gets the best available product for their money spent. I inspect the contractor's work, and I make sure it conforms to the approved documents."

The over \$4 million project is scheduled for completion on Aug. 25, 2016.

"One of the things we are waiting to finalize is the entryway," said Master Sgt. Swanzetta Myers, a food service manager assigned to the 5th FSS.

New flooring, televisions and lounge chairs have been placed in the DFAC to offer a better dining experience for everyone, she said.

The DFAC will offer a new serving line with various entrée choices.

Some of the new meal choices include a Mongolian grill, a smoothie bar and a sandwich station with a panini press.

"We are also offering a grab-n-go style, like what you would see at the shoppette," said Myers, who added that heat and serve and salads-to-go will be available at this station.

Not only Airmen, but members of their family, GS employees and civilians with base access will be able to enjoy what the DFAC has to offer.

"The meal card will allow holders to eat at [Non-Appropriate Funds] facilities as well," said Myers. "Rockers, Rough Riders, the B-Fifty Brew and Kelley's will all allow

Airmen to swipe their card."

The DFAC will be open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. The hours of operation are as follows:

Breakfast – 6 a.m. to 9 a.m.

Lunch - 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Dinner – 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

With the completion date just around the corner, the crew is excited and anxious for the project to be completed.

"You will be totally impressed with the final product!" said Myers.

Transformational not transactional

and Blue organization is a group that consists of active duty military members, veterans and community members whose main goal is to enrich the lives of America's veterans by connecting them to their community through physical and social activities.

Up until March of 2015, Minot did not have an RWB chapter.

1st Lt. Austin Howard, 5th Medical Support Squadron flight chief, decided to start it himself with the help of a few

"I started it along with Will Wright, our social director," Howard said. "It happened because I heard he was a member of RWB in Lakenheath, and I was a member at Nellis. We both saw each other in our RWB shirts and we thought it would be cool to start our own here at Minot."

When Howard and Wright first started the Minot chapter

the numbers weren't impressive, but they've grown substantially.

"It started with about four or five people that just wanted to work out together, then we went through the formal interview process and started building our staff," Howard said. "We have eight people on our staff now. Right now we are at about 550 members and do around 10 to 15 events per month."

Team RWB holds several events each month to bring people together, ranging from athletic activities such as rock climbing, to leisurely activities like a game night at a restaurant in town.

"We have a wide range of events that vary from athletic events, one weekend could be a 5k, the next could be paintball," Howard said. "We have all those different events and the whole concept is building relationships."

Though RWB's mission is to help veterans, it's not in the way most people would think.

"The organization was designed for veterans but the definition of that, by Team Red White and Blue, is anyone who has served at least one day," Howard said. "We believe in the funnel

approach, which means we like to affect people at the top of the funnel before they really need help when they're at the bottom."

Howard started RWB for the sake of others, but since joining he says the people have really come back around to help him when he needed it.

"I joined to help others, but I'm being helped as well because it helps you get a sense of community with people you could be lifelong friends with," Howard said. "It's been nice to be able to invest in other people's lives and have them invest in mine."

His main goal for the chapter isn't to have a record amount of people join, but to have a lasting impact on those who do.

"I don't want to focus on the numbers -- I want to focus on the people," Howard said. "My goal is to build relationships that are transformational not transactional."










Lemon Swiss Roll Cake with Lemon Cream Cheese Filling



INGREDIENTS:

Lemon Swiss Roll Cake:

3 eggs 3/4 cup granulated sugar 3 tablespoons lemon juice 1 tablespoon lemon zest 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon baking powder 3/4 cup all purpose flour Powdered sugar

Lemon Cream Cheese Filling:

8 oz full-fat softened cream cheese 1/4 cup unsalted softened butter 2 cups confectioners' sugar 1 tablespoon lemon juice teaspoon lemon zest 1 teaspoon vanilla extract For Garnish lcing sugar, for dusting Lemon slices

INSTRUCTIONS:

For the Lemon Swiss Roll Cake:

Preheat the oven to 350 F (176 C) and prepare a 10 x 15 inch cookie sheet by lining it with foill. Grease the foil with oil, and flour it well. This will help to ensure that the cake does not stick to the foil. In a medium boul for the bound of x the decided beautiful to the following the fol dium bowl (or the bowl of a stand mixer) beat the eggs on high speed for about 2-3 minutes, until pale and frothy. Add in the sugar, lemon juice and lemon zest. Beat on high speed until well combined. In a separate bowl, whisk together the salt, baking powder and flour. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, and stir until just combined. Do not over mix. Pour the cake batter onto the prepared cookie sheet. You may have to use a spectful to spread out the botter over the sheet. You may have to use a spatula to spread out the batter over the cookie sheet and the batter will be spread out in a very thin layer.

Bake for about 10-11 minutes. While the cake is baking, spread out a clean kitchen towel and sprinkle liberally with icing sugar (this is to ensure that when the cake is placed onto the kitchen towel, it will not stick). As soon as the cake is done, take it out of the oven, and carefully turn it over onto the prepared kitchen towel. Gently peel off the foil, and working quickly start rolling the kitchen towel to roll the cake from the shorter edge. Let cool completely.

For the Lemon Cream Cheese Filling:

In a medium bowl, using a band miver or a stand miver begt the

In a medium bowl, using a hand mixer or a stand mixer, beat the cream cheese and butter on medium speed until smooth and well combined. This will take about 1-2 minutes, and you should scrape down the sides of the bowl with a spatula as needed. Add the sugar, lemon juice, lemon zest and vanilla, and beat on medium speed for about 2 minutes until well combined and thick. Assembling the Lemon Swiss Roll Once the cake has completely cooled down, unroll it from the kitchen towel. Spread the cream cheese filing liberally, making sure that it covers all ends. Gently roll back the cake into shape, and cover that it covers all ends. Gently roll back the cake into shape, and cover with cling film. Cool for about 2 hours in the refrigerator or overnight. When ready to serve, unwrap the cling film, dust the cake with icing sugar and decorate with lemon slices.



Who You Gonna Call?

New Gender-Flipping Ghostbusters Confronts Critics—Then Gets Back to Funny Business

If there's something strange in your neighborhood, who you gonna call?

The Ghostbusters, of course! But which ones? The latest, if you haven't heard, are an all-female crew headed by Kristen Wiig and Melissa McCarthy, with Saturday Night Live cast mates Kate McKinnon and Leslie Jones.

Months before the new Ghostbusters movie was finished, some people didn't like the idea of anybody futzing with the iconic 1984 original, starring Bill Murray, Dan Áykroyd, Har-old Ramis and Rick Moranis—and especially, apparently, changing the gender roles. The first trailer for the film ignited a firestorm of online trolling and ugly sexist criticism, mostly about bringing women into an all-boy's club.

The new movie confronts its critics head-on, in a scene where the new Ghostbusters see the doubtful and hateful—comments underneath online clips of the first spooks they've ever captured on video.

'You're shouldn't even be reading this," Abby (Mc-Cartney) tells her colleague Erin (Wiig). "You're not supposed to listen to what crazy people write in the middle of the night.

Then it's back to funny business—and girls busting ghosts.

Mixing fresh new gags with respectful retro riffs, director and co-writer Paul Feig lets his funny bone point the way, as he demonstrated in Bridesmaids, The Heat and Spy. And he's working with a cast of comedic dynamos. Wiig's delightfully dry, droll wit is a perfect complement to Mc-Cartney's bigger, brasher, bawdy physical bravura. They haven't teamed up for a project since Bridesmaids, and it's great to see them collaborating again.

Leslie Jones gets plenty of laughs as Patty, a subway worker with a knack for Big Apple history who becomes the fourth Ghostbuster. Chris "Thor" Hemsworth seems to be having a ball as the gals' office "himbo" receptionist, perhaps relishing the opportunity to parody his own macho movie image and the film's flip of gender roles in general.

But it's Kate McKinnon who practically steals the show. Her wacky, tech-crazy, live-wire lab-nut weapons wonk feels somewhat of a nod to Dan Aykryod's character in the original, but she takes it to a totally new place in a unique role that may break her out beyond her hilarious SNL skits. The plot: Yes, there is

one, but it's hardly worth mentioning. There are fleeting cameos by former Ghostbusters stars and other folks too, including Ozzy Osborne, who shows up at a heavy metal concert. So does a big, bad winged ghost demon. The audience loves it—rock and roll!

It all rises to a screaming crescendo, wobbles and then kind of falls apart, when all the ghosts come out to wreck havoc on the streets and there's a big, swirling special-effects vortex, a bunch of goop and goo, a parade of giant ghost balloons and appearances by Ghostbusters Hall-of-Famé specters.

Definitely stay for the credits, though, and beyond, because this is one movie that's not over until it's over—completely over. And when it is, as the final version of the familiar theme music (this time by Fall Out Boy and Missy Elliot) plays out and makes your toes tap, the message is clear: For good, ghostly summertime fun with a strong dose of freewheeling 2016 girl power, who you gonna call? You know who!

o you grab your purse and duck out the door the minute you know your kids are looked after so you can shop for groceries alone?

While it's a nice treat to do the food shopping by yourself from time to time, I think that it's very important to bring the children along with you whenever you can. If you're worried about your little ones asking for treats and misbehaving in the store, just remember that teaching them how to act in public and how to respond to hearing the word "no" are also important life skills! It might not be easy the first time or the third time, but you'll get there.

Now let's get back to the shopping. The first thing to remember is that you should always stick to the perimeter of the store. Why? Well, if you stick to the outside of the store, where the fresh produce, meat and dairy are, you shouldn't have any trouble with your kids begging for unhealthy treats. It also helps to ensure you're not making unhealthy choices yourself.

Here are some other shopping with kids tips for you:

Go to the market. Even better than sticking to the perimeter of the grocery store? Start out at the local farmers' market, so your kids can meet the people who grow the food you'll be eating that week. Encourage them to ask the farmers questions and to really connect with the food items they encounter.

Let the kids choose. Try to be flexible with your grocery list and let the kids make some of those important shopping decisions. For instance, tell them you need three green vegetables, two orange vegetables, and a fruit in every other color

of the rainbow. Go with the items they choose even if you foresee a disaster. The only catch should be that they'll have to eat the foods they choose when you serve them.

Talk to them. Explain how you know if one pear is ripe and one isn't. Teach them how to look for the perfect bunch of bananas. Tell them why you choose the organic kale over the other kale. Talk about the prices of items and how to tell which protein is the best deal.

Reward good behavior. When the time comes to pay for your groceries, if your child or children have not given you any grief during the shopping adventure, tell them how proud you are of the way they behaved. Consider rewarding that good behavior if it's something you've been working towards. Depending on the age and interest of your children, some ideas might be a new book, an hour at the park, a toy car, or some crayons or stickers.

A-hunting we will go, a-hunting we will go, a-hunting...

OK, now try to get that tune out of your head...

But, yes, hunting season is almost upon us. For dogs, that kicks off with the Sept. 1 dove season.

While here in North Dakota it's not the hallowed, revered species like it is in southern states, dove hunting offers a chance to get the rust off one's shooting skills and provides a real sense that fall is in the air. Perhaps most importantly, it gives Fido the four-legged hunting maniac of the household a chance to retrieve something for real.

Assuming, that is, Fido's hunter can actually get a dove or doves.

But that's another story for another day.

Let's get back to Fido and being in the field.

Hopefully by now Fido is well into fieldwork exercise and preparation so his or her muscles are well conditioned and their weight is in check.

While no one wants to think injuries could happen in the field to human or canine alike, the reality is they do. Barbed wire encounters have resulted in hunters making many emergency runs to their veterinarian.

There are encounters with wild animals, such as porcupines and raccoons, to worry about.

And just like people, dogs can break legs, tear ACLs and tendons, and sprain feet.

Part of preseason preparation could also include making sure one is prepared for potential emergencies involving Fido.

First-aid kits make sense for people and they make sense for dogs, as well.

Commercial caninespecific first-aid kits are available, but it's possible to make one.

Here are some basic items to put in a canine first-aid kit: Elastic wrap roll, gauze roll, gauze tape,

gauze pads, cotton balls, hydrogen peroxide, hydrocortisone ointment, scissors, tweezer or needlenose plier, saline solution or eye wash, wound disinfectant such as Betadine or Nolvasan, large towel, 1-inch white medical tape, emergency blanket, instant cold pack, disposal gloves, magnifying glass, tongue depressors, nail clipper, styptic powder or sticks to stop bleeding, eye dropper or oral syringe, thermometer, rehydrating solution such as Gatorade, Powerade, or Pedialyte, and antiseptic wipes.

Use a plastic tackle box or something with divided compartments to easily find the items when in a hurry to administer first aid. Write your veterinarian's telephone number and address on the box, your name and contact information, and Animal Poison Control Center 24-hour hotline, (888) 426-4435.

The gauze roll can be used to make a muzzle because any dog can bite when in pain.

Activated charcoal helps dogs absorb ingested poisons but talk to your veterinarian beforehand to know how to administer it in the event of an accidental poisoning

Keep a leash in the kit or vehicle.

The items all closely resemble things that would be in a human first-aid kit. However, because one is dealing with an animal, things like gauze rolls for muzzling or needle-nose pliers don't typically show up on one's radar screen for humans, yet come in handy for dogs.

Some canine first aid reference books include "Dog First Aid: A Field Guide to Emergency Care for the Outdoor Dog" by Randy Acker (4- by 6-inch spiral bound pocket guide) or "Pet First Aid" by Dr. Bobbie Mammato in conjunction with the American Red Cross.

The Striker Pathfinder Program is a three-year internship at Air Force Global Strike Command headquarters at Barksdale Air Force Base, Louisiana. A single missileer, usually a captain, is hand-picked for the position; a position that offers rare insight and mentorship to young officers.

"We have special programs for the 13N community," Sullivan said. "Things like Striker Trident or Pathfinder. They're highly competitive programs."

Upon applying for the programs, the nearly 20 missileers met a board, where their packages were rated and ordered. Sullivan was fortunate enough to be put in the top spot.

"Pathfiinder only had one spot available, it's kind of like the highest program and I was selected for that one," he said. "It was kind of breathtaking."

Sullivan is no stranger to standing out. During his nearly six years at Minot AFB, he's been a flight commander, part of the standardization and evaluations team, was a distinguished graduate at squadron officer school, and now holds an executive officer job for the 91st OG Commander Col. Stacy Huser.

'Captain Sullivan was selected for this program because he is recognized in the 13N community as one of our strongest technical experts," Huser said, "More than that, he was selected because leadership sees in him what we all see here at the 91st Ops Group. He's someone with a natural ability to lead and mentor others, who is humble, and the guy people seek out when they have a question or problem."

Sullivan's time as an executive officer has been a learning experience he knows will help benefit his career in the long-run, he

"I'm in all the leadership meetings, so I learn the bigger picture of things," Sullivan said. "I see why decisions are made and how decisions are made. For a young officer like me, it's very eye-opening and prepares me for the future, to be an actual leader myself."

Despite holding several high-visibility jobs within the career field, Sullivan admits it's simply his passion for the job that makes people notice his work.

"The mission is

an amazing mission, something a lot of people don't even know exists," Sullivan said. "I show up to work every day and I do my job with a smile on my face every single day. As far as standing out, I think that's what makes me stand out."

Sullivan applied for the program in June of 2015 and found out he was accepted shortly after, but the anticipation to begin the program hasn't died down over the past year.

"It feels amazing," Sullivan said. "To be chosen for this, it means you did something right and someone noticed. To me, it was kind of reaffirmation I'm doing my job right."

During his three-year internship, Sullivan will be a part of the future operations division and branch, which focuses on bringing new programs like the new GBSD, cruise missile and B-21 into fruition. Although the future conceptions part of the job is exciting for Sullivan, he said he mostly looks forward to working with AFGSC leadership.

"To be in a room with those individuals, and you get to see their decisionmaking process, I think that's going to be the best part of the job," Sullivan said. "The mentorship opportunity is the best part."

After the program, Sullivan hopes to take everything he learned over the next three years and apply them to whatever assignment comes next. He said he's excited to have insight on the future of the 13N career field, and to be bred as a successful leader. He'll do it all without

changing who he is. "Just be yourself," Sullivan said. "No one can be you like you are. I think that will take a lot of people far, whatever their career is, just be yourself. That's my thing to live by."



Eighth Air Force bomber presence felt in Indo-Asia Pacific

The Indo-Asia-Pacific region is no stranger to U.S. bombers. For more than a decade, the U.S. military has maintained a deployed strategic bomber presence in the Pacific, focused on enabling regional security and stability.

To sustain that presence, Eighth Air Force, historically known as "the Mighty Eighth," provides combatant commanders with the B-1 Lancers, B-2 Spirits, B-52 Stratofortresses and Airmen to support joint and allied partnerships within the region.

When B-2s deployed to Guam earlier this week with B-1 and B-52 units currently operating from Anderson Air Force Base, it marked a historical first for the Service.

"As a result of simultaneous operations, we have all three Mighty Eighth bomber

aircraft assigned to the U.S. Pacific area of responsibility at the same time – it's a first," said Maj. Gen. Richard M. Clark, 8th Air Force commander.

Though the aircraft have appeared together in past instances in the Pacific AOR, this is the first time all three bombers are there to conduct integrated operations in the region.

The Air Force will maximize on the overlap of strategic bombers by conducting the first integrated bomber operation in the Pacific AOR while all the bombers are in place in Guam.

"This presents a great opportunity," Clark said. "By integrating every platform within this environment, we will strengthen our interoperability and demonstrate to our allies we have the capability to strike anywhere, anytime using a variety of methods.'

The total bomber force came together via two separate operations, both which provide opportunities to train with regional partners and demonstrate a shared commitment to global security and stability.

The short-term B-2 deployment is part of a U.S. Strategic Command bomber assure and deter mission focused on conducting local sorties, regional training and integrating with partner nations. During the deployment, members of the 509th Bomb Wing will hone skills in areas to include command and control, air refueling, long-rang navigation while directly interacting with allied military forces.

"There's no substitute for operating in theater," said Lt. Col. Charles Bailey, 8th Air Force deputy director for Plans. "Deployments like the ones to Guam focus unit training while allowing us to interact with our allies

and partners right there in the Pacific region."

The B-2 is known for its low-observable or "stealth" characteristics and ability to penetrate highly sophisticated defenses while avoiding adversary detection. The aircraft is also able to fly at subsonic speeds, possesses a 7,000-mile unrefueled range and can reach an elevation of 50,000 feet.

The B-2 BAAD mission comes at a time when the Air Force is conducting a Continuous Bomber Presence swap out in the Pacific.

Approximately 300 Airmen along with B-1s from Ellsworth AFB, South Dakota, are replacing B-52s and their support personnel from Minot AFB, North Dakota, who currently support U.S. Pacific Command strategic deterrence and regional training missions.

This is the first time in a decade B-1s will be based in the PACOM AOR,

however both aircraft have a long historical role in the CBP missions and embody similar capabilities.

Lancers, also known as "Bones," are multi-role heavy bombers able to deliver long-range strikes, offer persistent presence and can carry up to 75,000 pounds of payload. And much like the B-52, it's not new to the battlefield.

"The B-1 force is coming back to the Pacific, bringing years of combat experience from Iraq and Afghanistan with them," Bailey said.

For the time being, examples of every strategic bomber will be seen operating from the same location within PACOM's AOR.

But regardless of platform, "the Mighty Eighth will continue to provide combatant commanders the necessary tools to assure our allies, deter our adversaries and enhance regional security within the Indo-Asia-Pacific region," Clark said.
