INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. - It was her first day on the job and she was taking me out on our first walk as a team. She grabbed my leash lightly, so I had to mess with her. Don't underestimate my strength. I lunged forward and she let go of the leash instantly. It was too easy. She chased me for a good 10 minutes. Does she even know what she's doing? Finally, she yelled, "Loose dog!" signaling the other handlers in the kennels to come out and chase me. They finally caught me and she had learned her lesson. This was going to be an interesting partnership.

"He's a goof ball," said

Senior Airman Amanda Puryear, 5th Security Forces Squadron military working dog handler. "Since he is so old, he doesn't do much, but he likes attention."

MWD Dax will soon retire from the U.S. Air Force after 10 years of honorable service.

"Dax is retiring for medical reasons. It was discovered that he has arthritis," said Tech Sgt. Christopher Averill, 5th SFS MWD kennel master. "That paired with him being 10 years old, the best thing to do is to let him live a normal life while he can." Dax, a Belgian Malinois, started his distinguished career in 2006 at the Department of Defense Military Working Dog Training and Breeding Program at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. MWDs train to detect drugs, explosives and accompany handlers on patrol during their training.

All military working dogs and handlers are trained at the 341st Training Squadron at Lackland AFB, which is fondly called the "Dog School."

When the dogs are first purchased by the training squadron, each puppy is given to a foster parent, volunteers from the 341st TRS, who will keep them for the first 10 months to socialize the puppies and observe them.

After one year at Lackland AFB, specializing in explosive detection, Dax was sent to his first and only duty station, Minot Air Force Base, N.D., where he ended up serving nine years.

Dax served a long, distinguished career in the Air Force and will now get the chance to enjoy his retirement with his last handler, Puryear, who started training with him in February of this year.

"I haven't had him very long compared to the other handlers who had him before me, but we bonded from the beginning," said Puryear. "I feel like him and I do very well together.

The most expensive drink: What will a DUI cost you at Minot AFB?

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. To date, one can purchase a fine bottle of Cristal champagne for around \$200. For the big spender, a bottle of Kentucky's ultrarare Pappy Van Winkle Bourbon will set you back around a cool \$3,000. These are steep prices for most Airmen, but how do they compare to the cost of an arrest for drinking and driving?

Minot Air Force Base is one of the most secure military installations in the world thanks to the hard work of defenders acting as our security forces personnel. The main their command to address gate of Minot AFB is a 24-hour/365-day a year DUI check-point. There are few guarantees in life besides death and taxes, but one more certainty

is that each and every individual attempting to gain access to Minot AFB will be screened by security forces for signs of impairment, regardless of the time of day or the weather. DUIs are an unfortunate and completely preventable offense committed by Airmen each month.

"We've seen so many Airmen who express the long-lasting financial consequences of a DUI," said Capt. Jasmine Dixon, Chief of Military Justice.

So what will a DUI cost you as an Airmen? The bottom-line is shown in the chart depicted below. Airmen can, at the very least, expect this misconduct through Nonjudicial Punishment under Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. While each individual case is

assessed on the facts and circumstances unique to it, the frequent punishment for a DUI is a hard bust of one pay grade, some forfeiture of pay, and extra duty or restriction to the limits of the base. Though officers are not included on the chart below, it can be expected that an officer DUI will significantly impact an officer's career.

It is important to mention some of the secondary effects of a DUI as well. Driving privileges on base are typically revoked for at least a year for any military member found to be driving under the influence. Additionally, a DUI places a member's career in serious jeopardy as the Air Force continues to trim down the size of the force. DUI offenders often find themselves under the microscope for involuntary separation,

especially when the DUI follows other disciplinary misconduct. Also, don't forget the increased insurance premiums that will undoubtedly accompany your next bill.

DUI offenses are preventable. **Operation Safe Ride** (701 - 7232 - 7233)operates specifically to provide Airmen who have enjoyed a bit too much alcohol with an option to get home safely. So the next time you close your tab and see the bill, think about the massive costs and risks awaiting you if you make the decision to get behind the wheel after drinking. It's your money and life on the line.

Head Start Program officially begins on MAFB

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- The funding, personnel and equipment requirements were recently met in order for Minot Air Force Base to have a pre-kindergarten Head Start program on base.

While in past years, parents who wanted their children to attend Head Start had to take them downtown, the program will now be available at Dakota Elementary on base this school year.

"It's just another aspect of Dakota Elementary," said Karen Knowles, Minot Head Start program director. "Now they'll actually have a preschool classroom and the proper equipment."

In order to get the funding, Knowles wrote a grant with a downtown bank which they accepted and funded the equipment purchases. Knowles and her small team headed a similar project with a downtown preschool last year and despite strict rules and regulations, were able to build a successful program. different," Knowles said. "We have to have ageappropriate equipment and at least 6 inches of peat gravel spread, and our playground has to be fenced in."

With help from her staff, a few base volunteers and Airmen from the Civil Engineer Squadron, Knowles was able to install all the new equipment in just a day, to include musical and art gear, a sand and water table and all the playground equipment. As part of Knowles' interactive initiative, a new outdoor interactive classroom helps with getting kids out and moving.

"There's a lot of research about sensory and self-regulation and not being outside enough, and the outside classroom will help with that," Knowles said. "It will help with sensory issues. It's my initiative." The outdoor equipment allows the children to learn in an integrated way, stimulating senses and exercising all at the same time. some of the things they've learned inside and bring it outside," Knowles said. "They'll be able to do science experiments with the tables and music and art. They'll have an outdoor block area. It just brings things from inside outside and allows them to get interactive and out more."

In addition to all the great things the interactive classroom will bring, simply having a Head Start program available at Dakota Elementary will be convenient for students, teachers and parents. Never mind the shorter commute, the added benefits of establishing a comfortable environment for the pre-kindergarten kids is enough to be excited about, Knowles said.

"That relationship between Head Start and kindergarten will be built right away with this school," Knowles said. "The kids who attend Dakota for kindergarten will be familiar with the school and the teachers will be familiar with the kids, so it's just a nice working relationship."

No Shots? No Record? No School!

NORTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

BISMARCK, N.D. -The beginning of the new school year is here, and the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) would like to remind parents to make sure their children are up to date on immunizations! North Dakota state law requires students in grades kindergarten through 12 to meet a minimum number of required immunizations before they are allowed to attend school. If children are not up to date within 30 days of the start of the school year, they will be excluded from school. It is important to get your child vaccinated now in order to protect them and other students from preventable diseases and so they do not need to be excluded from school.

According to Lexie Barber, epidemiologist with the NDDoH, "vaccines are the best way to keep students protected and stop the spread of infectious diseases such as pertussis, mumps, and measles. Vaccines are especially important for school settings where outbreaks can occur easily and quickly. If you haven't done so already, check with your healthcare provider to find out which vaccines your child needs. Once your child is up to date on vaccinations, please be sure to submit their immunization record to your school."

Before entering school in North Dakota, children must have:

• five doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus and acellular pertussis)

• four doses of IPV (polio)

• three doses of HBV (hepatitis B)

• two doses of MMR (measles, mumps and rubella)

• two doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine In addition, students entering 7th grade will need:

one dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis)
one dose of MCV4

(meningococcal disease)

The cost of immunizations should not be a concern. If your child is uninsured or your insurance does not cover vaccines, children can receive vaccine at no cost through the Vaccines for Children Program (VFC). Speak to your health care provider or local public health unit if you believe your child would be eligible for VFC vaccines.

A s the 2016 archery deer season unfolds, it will be interesting to see if North Dakota hunters purchase another record number of archery licenses.

So far, the trend for increasing archery license sales remains among resident hunters. N.D. Game and Fish Department wildlife division chief Jeb Williams said 22,226 North Dakotans bought archery licenses along with 1,545 resident youth archery licenses.

The number of nonresident archery hunters increased slightly in 2015 compared to 2014: 1,822 white-tailed and 202 "any" licenses, which allow nonresidents to hunt mule deer.

That compares to 1,960 total nonresident archery licenses in 2014.

With the exception of 2011, the number of resident archery licenses has steadily increased at a rate of about 5 to 6 percent annually since 1998. However, that rate jumped about 10 percent in 2015, Williams said.

The continued increase in archery license sales has the state's wildlife managers pondering the reasons why:

Could it be an increased interest in archery and archery hunting in general? Could it be because today's technology makes it easier to get started in archery? Could it be because of an amazing increase in youth archery programs, such as National Archery in the Schools Program?

Or could it be because it's just darn hard to get a deer gun license for the regular November hunting season? And with the number of available muzzleloader licenses based on a percentage of the previous year's total gun whitetail licenses, getting a muzzleloader license is about like winning the Powerball lottery. first time in several years. However, about 13,000 of the 49,000 available deer gun licenses are allocated as gratis landowner licenses, making only about 36,000 up for grabs in the lottery.

But, still, it's an increase in gun licenses.

So will people still buy an increasing number of archery licenses?

Only time will tell.

Archery license sales trends also have wildlife managers pondering the mindset of those buying archery licenses. Are they new to archery?

Will they be dedicated to archery, taking the time and energy to spend as many days afield as they can?

Will they be casual hunters, going out occasionally if the weather or moment suits their fancy?

Will they even go afield, only buying the license on the off chance they decide to hunt?

Understanding the mindset of state's deer hunters is part of a recent deer hunter human dimension study the University of North Dakota conducted for the Game and Fish Department, Williams explained. The detailed survey asked a variety of questions, including whether or not people bought an archery license because they didn't draw a deer gun license.

North Dakota archery hunters enjoyed a 33 percent harvest success rate in 2015, Williams said. "The majority of deer (about 75 percent) that are harvested are still bucks," he added.

Biologically, the high success for bucks doesn't seem to affect the state's buck-to-doe ratio and re-

The question, he added, is the social issue of some hunters receiving multiple licenses – archery, regular gun, and even muzzleloader licenses – while other hunters can't get a deer gun licenses.

Bourne Killer Matt Damon returns as memory-challenged spy in grim, glum Jason Bourne

For espionage fans, Jason Bourne has always been the spy who can't remember. Based on the character created by novelist Robert Ludlum, he's appeared previously in three movies (2002-2007) played by Matt Damon, who now returns to the role (after sitting on the sidelines for the oddly Bourneless The Bourne Legacy, starring Jeremy Renner, in 2012).

A former brainwashed CIA killing machine who went rogue as his head began to clear, Bourne, has been wandering the Earth for the past decade (apparently) in an existential quest to distance himself from the murderous, amnestic murk of his tortured past.

When his old colleague Nicky Parsons (Julia Stiles) hacks into a government computer, she discovers files suggesting that Bourne's late father might have been involved in the clandestine government program that 'indoctrinated" his young son into the CIA and erased his previous lite. She tracks the line between "good" guys and "bad" guys gets plenty blurry.

There's also a plotline about a gigantic new cybertech company, Deep Dream, and its charismatic owner (Riz Ahmed), whose ties to the CIA bring up some timely, troubling concerns about privacy and governmental policing.

A generous amount of globetrotting culminates in a slam-bang Las Vegas crescendo involving a hotel sniper, a brutal back-alley brawl and a colossal downtown chase, dozens of smash-ups and a "jackpot" of a crash inside the Riviera casino.

Paul Greengrass, who also directed two films of the original Bourne trilogy, is behind the camera again—but can't seem to hold it steady for a single scene. The director's penchant for woozy, wobbly "shakycam" shots is meant to convey edge, movement and action, but man, it sure gets old. Even when characters are having a calm conversation, the camera is fidgeting like it can't wait to split. And spy flicks have always been about thrills, danger and even deathbut this Bourne feels and looks especially grim, glum and grungy, especially given the tenor of the times. Gunmen on rooftops, bombs, civilians dying in the fray, government corruption, a mopey Matt Damon—there ain't no escapist sunshine here, folks. "I remember... I remember," Bourne intones at the beginning of the movie. By the end, the audience may remember, too-that there were other, not-quite-sodowner choices at the multiplex.

Triple-Layer Cracker Toffee Bars



INGREDIENTS:

90 buttery rectangular crackers
1 can sweetened condensed milk (not evaporated)
1 cup packed brown sugar
1/2 cup butter
1/4 cup milk
1 bag milk chocolate chips (2 cups)

INSTRUCTIONS:

Line 13x9-inch pan with foil. Spray foil with cooking spray. Place 30 of the crackers in bottom of pan. In 2-quart saucepan, mix condensed milk, brown sugar, butter and milk. Cook over medium heat until butter is melted, stirring frequently. Increase heat to medium-high; heat to boiling. Boil 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Pour one-third of the caramel mixture over crackers in pan. Arrange 30 of the crackers over caramel. Top with one-third of the remaining crackers and caramel.In small microwavable bowl, microwave chocolate chips uncovered on High 1 to 2 minutes, stirring every 30 seconds, until melted and smooth. Pour over caramel; spread evenly. Refrigerate about 1 hour or until set. Cut into 6 rows by 8 rows. Store covered up to 4 days.

It's very cool to be his last handler."

The MWD's current handler has the priority to adopt the K-9 when the time comes for retirement, so Puryear was asked if she would like to adopt Dax. She gladly accepted.

"I will be very happy when Dax retires and I get to take him home." Puryear said. "Who doesn't want to adopt the first dog they ever worked with? It will be cool to see him be a normal dog."

Together, dog and handler make a team. The bond between dog and handler is like any other military relationship; it's all about wingmanship and only grows stronger over time.

"I chose Puryear as his handler based on both of their personalities," said Averill. "Dax has a very welcoming personality and just wants compassion in return from his handler."

Averill also added that they make a great team. With Puryear being a new handler, Dax was able to provide her with a good foundation that she could build on because of Dax's years of experience. He also believes their companionship goes beyond the duty day, which is why he's excited to see Dax clock out for the final time.

"Seeing Dax retire will be one of the highlights of my tenure as kennel master," said Averill. "The best thing we can do for him is to give him the opportunity to live a normal life as a pet and a veteran."

Dax will not receive a paycheck when he retires; however, he will receive a forever home.

Group deputy commander. "It's a variety of different things. They're doing trade missions, they're doing what they call Pacific Power Projection missions and operational sorties all across the Pacific. The bottom line is showing our enemies that our ability to employ if called upon to protect our interests and allies."

While the B-52 has been the exclusive bomber temporarily stationed at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam to support the CBP, this was the mighty BUFF's final trip for a while, as the B-1 has assumed the mission there.

Recently, the Air Force's three bombers, the B-52, B-1 and B-2, were all together in Guam for the first time.

"It was a huge demonstration," said Smith. "The fact that we were able to get all of the bombers participating at the same time in a fly-by demonstration of our capability, it sends a message both to any potential force as well as our allies; to show that we're ready at any time to project air power into the pacific theater and really anywhere around the world." Minot AFB B-52s have been continuously deployed to Guam for over a decade. With a small break before heading to their new deployment location, the Airmen will have time to recuperate and then prepare for their new mission with Central

Command.

"It gives us the opportunity to catch up and do some training, then we'll be back out the door," Smith said. "B-52s are in demand, so our next stop is going to be CENTCOM out in Al Udeid supporting their mission there."

Although 5th BW Airmen have enjoyed supporting the CBP in Guam, they are excited for the B-52's future missions.

"There's a lot of excitement with both the 23rd and the 69th getting ready to head out to the Middle East and get a chance to participate out there," Smith said. "The continuous bomber presence mission has been very familiar to us, it's challenging and we've enjoyed it, but CENTCOM is going to be a whole different flavor with nokidding combat time and dropping bombs on targets. There's a lot of interest and excitement to get out there and get on it." No matter what future missions the BUFFs are involved in, they'll continue to provide reliable air power to the force. "The B-52 continues to be the work horse of our nation's bomber force," Brooks said. "I'm tremendously proud of the missions we're executing today and excited for what the future holds for this amazing air craft and the Airmen who operate, maintain and support it."
