A Walk Through Time

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- A tradition believed to have started during the Cold War is still in full swing sixteen years into the new century.

The Air Force Ball commemorates the day in history, Sept. 18, 1947, that the U.S. Air Force became an individual military service after 40 years of association with the U.S. Army. Then President, Harry S. Truman, signed the National Security Act of 1947 to restructure the government's military, thus creating the Department of the Air Force.

Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, hosted their gala on Sept. 17, 2016 to celebrate 69 years of air power.

"The theme for this year's event, 'A Walk Through Time', celebrates Air Force Heritage from 1947 to modern day," said Capt. Elizabeth Jovanovich. medical logistics flight commander assigned to the 5th Medical Support Squadron and chair of the Air Force Ball committee. "The theme allowed us to capture each time period in Air Force history and allows each group an

opportunity to decorate a piece of the hangar."

Seven groups assigned to Minot AFB were slotted a different section of the Dock 8 hangar to decorate to a theme to specific time period and highlight their group's heritage.

"Allowing the groups to decorate a section of the hangar gets the whole base involved in the ball", said Tech. Sgt. Erin Kirby, public health flight chief assigned to the 5th Medical Operations Squadron and decorating chair of the Air Force Ball committee. "There is no better way than by commemorating major events through our Air Force history and giving each group the opportunity to show how they contributed to this heritage."

The Air Force Ball committee dedicated five months to planning this event, from fundraisers and flyers to photographers and decorations.

We hosted a lot of car washes and bake sales,' said Jovanovich. "We also received donation from several private organizations on base. We had enough money for the ball and some money left over for next year's

committee, which was our goal from the beginning."

In addition to fundraisers, an Air Force Ball Expo was provided to attendees at the Combined Community Complex by Christina Giannone, spouse to Maj. Lance Giannone, wing chaplain assigned to the 5th Bomb Wing.

"The Air Force Ball Expo advertised the ball, showcased the Cinderella Boutique, and highlighted different talents we have on base," said Jovanovich.
"Mrs. Giannone had volunteers model dresses from the boutique, and volunteers that did hair and make-up specific to each time period. The Expo showed that you do not have to spend a lot of money to go to the ball. You can go for the price of dry cleaning at the boutique, and doing hair and make-up at home."

The event is not only open to active duty personnel assigned to the base.

"Anyone can attend the ball that has an affiliation with the men and women of Minot AFB," said Jovanovich. "We have several people that are bringing their family to the event including grandparents and parents!"

Many came home...some did not

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

There are hundreds of thousands of people who have been affected by the tragedy of service members becoming prisoners of war or missing in action.

To pay respect for these individuals, military bases across the U.S. have been hosting commemorations annually on the third Friday of September known as National Prisoner of War/Missing in Action Recognition Day.

This day was established by an Act of Congress, by the passage of Section 1082 of the 1998 Defense Authorization Act and it is one of only six days that the POW/MIA Flag can be flown.

Master Sgt. Kyle Bookhardt, 5th Contracting Squadron construction flight noncommissioned officer in charge, was the head of this year's event at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota.

Bookhardt has been at Minot AFB for more than a year and considers it an honor to be able to recognize the service members who came before

"I've always liked the POW/MIA event," said Bookhardt. "The idea is to remember our brothers and sisters who were POWs and also to pay tribute to those that are still missing in action."

The planning for this year's commemoration began in February and more than 700 people have been involved with it.

Tech. Sgt. Shelby Bird, 5th Communications Squadron intrusion detection systems NCOIC, has also been greatly

involved with this year's event. She incorporated things that were done for the POW/MIA event at her last base and added them to this year's event at Minot.

For instance, the biker escorts and the 24 hour name reading were events that Bird added in order to make this year's event even bigger than it was in past years.

Bird said she wanted the event to be something that signifies the amount of people who are still POW/ MIA and the struggles that they've gone through.

"These events are huge for awareness and getting people to realize that we still have hundreds and thousands of prisoners of war and missing in action," said Bird. "The flag says right on there, 'not forgotten' and I think that that's our responsibility to make sure they are not."

The event began with a lone runner carrying the POW/MIA flag while being escorted by 30 bikers.

"The lone runner signifies that we have people out there all by themselves still fighting for our freedom," said Bird.

The runner then made his way to the outdoor track at the McAdoo Fitness Center and handed the flag off to the first volunteer for the 24 hour run. Volunteers participated by running in 30 minute intervals while carrying the POW/MIA

During the run, the names of POW/MIA service members were read and an alignment of donated boots were placed along the inside of the track to signify the people who are unable to stand with us today.

After the 24 hour run, the event concluded in a closing ceremony at the McAdoo Fitness Center with a guest speaker, retired Captain William Robinson, who was a POW for more than seven years.

The POW/MIA event also involved the help of approximately 500 volunteers. Bird said what made this event so unique is that the volunteers did it out of pure compassion.

"A lot of volunteer things have a personal benefit to them and this is one of those that doesn't," said Bird. "You don't get anything in return except for the satisfaction of knowing that you've supported such a worthy cause, so that's what I love so much about it."

Bookhardt, who plans on getting involved with this

event again in the upcoming years, said this event is bigger than ourselves and this is why we wear the military uniform in the first place.

Like Bookhardt, Bird also plans on being involved with the event in the future and says people should look forward to the bigger and better event next year because this event is just going to keep growing.

"I want every year for it to be known that on POW/MIA Recognition Day that this is happening and people are jumping at the chance to do it because it's become a staple at Minot Air Force Base."



In an era when the loss of public land recreational opportunities is resonating across many areas of western United States, a breath of fresh air is potentially coming from two U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Wildlife Refuges in North Dakota.

The Fish and Wildlife Service is proposing to open Des Lacs and Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuges (NWR) to hunters fortunate enough to draw a once-ina-lifetime moose license for the moose unit encompassing the two refuges. They're also looking at opening Upper Souris NWR for spring turkey license holders.

First, though, they want to hear from folks, so now is the time for hunters to stand up and voice support for more hunting opportunities on public land.

The draft plan is available for review on the refuge websites, (www.fws. gov/refuge/upper souris/) or (www.fws.gov/refuge/ des lacs/).

The Fish and Wildlife Service is accepting public comments on the proposal from Sept. 29 through Oct.

Comments can be sent to Att.: Project Leader, Upper Souris River Basin NWR Complex, 17705 212th Ave. N.W., Berthold, N.D. 58718 or Des Lacs NWR, 42000 520th St. N.W., Kenmare, N.D. 58746.

Des Lacs NWR is already open for turkey, deer, and upland bird hunting, while Upper Souris is open for deer and upland bird hunting, including archery, youth deer season, and muzzleloader season.

Both have special regulations, such as non-toxic shot only for bird hunting, and some closed areas within each refuge for safety purposes around building.

The two refuges fall within the N.D. Game and Fish Department's M10 moose unit, a large chunk of northwestern North Dakota.

Like Des Lacs and Upper Souris refuges, many of North Dakota's larger refuge complexes have allowed hunting for several years, with most opening for upland bird hunting the Monday following the closure of the deer gun season.

However, that hasn't always been the case for other refuges across the

Back in 1997, though, Congress passed the National Wildlife Refuge System Improvement Act. which established a set of standards and defined procedure for refuges to look at expanding public use opportunities on refuges in the U.S. The legislation specified six authorized uses - hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, photography, environmental education, and interpretation -if it's determined they're compatible with a particular refuge mission.

Over the years, the Refuge Improvement Act resulted in numerous additional public opportunities on refuges across the country, including fishing on Lake Alice in North Dakota. Most recently, South Dakota's Lake Andes opened to fishing.

Most North Dakota refuges were established to provide migratory bird nesting and migration resting areas. That's one reason they're typically not open for pheasant and grouse hunting during the early portion of the state's waterfowl season – to avoid pressuring migrating ducks and geese.

So hunters, there's a possibility more hunting opportunities could open for those lucky enough to get a moose tag.

But it first you need to speak up.

Let the Fish and Wildlife Service know your thoughts so when you get that M10 license you have the chance to hunt Des Lacs or Upper Souris NWR.

thing gets recorded—and I mean everything. We see the group drinking in the bar the night before they leave, eating weenies around a campfire, crawling into their tents to sleep. We get to watch as one pees on a tree.

On the upside, all the cameras "explain" why, and how, we're seeing what we see; this is this movie's "found footage."

And when the scares start to roll in and ramp up, all the different shots—the jumpy, jerky cuts between cameras, the glitches and bleeps as audio and video signals cut in and out—add to the sense of extreme disorientation, especially when things get all weird and time-warpy. But the gotchas aren't anything novel, particularly frightful or ghastly, or anything you haven't seen before; they just come via new gadgetry.

Important takeaways:

Don't get too attached to any of the characters. Beware, as always, of the "stick men," the Blair Witch's handmade calling cards. Don't go wandering off at night by yourself. Take proper care of all puncture and slash wounds, lest something hideously creepy happen to them. Keep hands and fingers away from the whirring blades of drones lodged in the tops of tall trees. In eerie, deserted houses in the middle of haunted forests, for God's sake, stay out the attic and the basement. And never look directly at the Blair Witch: "No one's ever seen her and lived to talk about it," warns one character. That may indeed be true.

But after seeing how upset she particularly seems to be at this group of kids invading her ancient dark space with their arsenal of hightech recording devices, I'm wondering if the grumpy ol' gal just simply isn't in the mood to be photographed and uploaded to Facebook, Instagram, YouTube or anything else. She doesn't strike me as the social media type.



Shredded Chicken & Rice Stuffed Peppers Halloween Style



INGREDIENTS:

Slow Cooker Shredded Taco Chicken:

Slow Cooker Shredded Taco Chicken:

Add chicken to the bottom of the slow cooker, sprinkle seasonings on top and then cover with diced tomatoes. Cook on low for 6-8 hours or high for 4-6 hours. Shred chicken and allow it to remain in sauce.

Stuffed Peppers:

Bring a large pot of water to boil. While you are waiting for the water to boil, rinse peppers, slice off the tops and hollow out the insides, be sure to remove any seeds and the white part inside. If desired, use a small paring knife to cut out a jack-o-lantern face. When water is boiling, put the peppers and tops in and allow to cook for about 5 minutes until peppers are tender. Remove from water and set aside to cool. Mix the cooked rice, shredded chicken, cheddar cheese, and black beans together in a large bowl. Fill each pepper with the chicken and rice mixture and top with extra cheese, if desired. Replace pepper top back on top. Bake at 350 for 30 minutes until cheese is melted and pepper is done to desired tenderness. Alternately, once peppers are stuffed, wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate, when ready to cook, preheat oven to 350, remove plastic wrap and bake for 1 hour.







Looking Glass: USSTRATCOM's Airborne Command Post

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- A U.S. Navy E6-B Mercury visited Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, Sept. 19-21, 2016. The visit allowed members of Team Minot to tour the inside of the Airborne Command Post (ABNCP) and learn about how it supports U.S. Strategic Command's mission.

In addition to the tour, the aircraft and its mission, historically codenamed Looking Glass, came to Minot AFB for another mission-related reason as well.

"We're here to accomplish a Simulated Electronic Launch-Minuteman (SELM)," Lt. Col. Deane Konowicz, 625th Strategic Operations Squadron commander. "The SELM is an end-to-end test, demonstrating the ability to command and control intercontinental ballistic missiles at Minot, from the aircraft."

According to Konowicz, the ABNCP is dual purposed. While it primarily functions as a communications relay platform for submarines with its two trailing antenna wires, it also serves as an Airborne Launch Control System (ALCS). The ALCS is joint-manned by eight U.S. STRATCOM battle staff mission members.

"In addition to the battle staff, the 13 U.S. Navy member crew keeps the aircraft self-sufficient for day-to-day maintenance," said U.S. Navy Lt. Andrew Holder, VQ-4 aircraft and mission commander.

"This gives the E6-B the capability to land at any airfield, in addition to the ability to fly for 72 hours before refueling."

The crew and aircraft's abilities allow the ABNCP to be on alert at all times. The ALCS serves as an around-the-clock standby in the event that U.S. STRATCOM or launch control centers on the ground become incapacitated.

"Our focus is to provide survivable, mobile command and control capability," said Maj. Gen. Richard Evans III, U.S. STRATCOM acting deputy commander. "U.S. STRATCOM and the president know they have someone to pick up responsibilities."

Evans sits on alert as an Airborne Emergency Action Officer in command of the battle staff. He remembers first visiting Minot AFB was in the fall of 1986.

"The mission hasn't changed much and neither has its importance," said Evans.






Lefse Masters Celebrity Competition


