Hawkeye: Eyes, ears of the RQ-4

BEALE AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AFNS) --An aircraft accelerating down the runway with 8,500 pounds of thrust and a wingspan greater than a Boeing 737 is inherently dangerous. The danger is amplified when the pilot isn't even located on board the aircraft. Trailing behind pursuing the aircraft is "Hawkeye" ensuring the remotely piloted aircraft ascends from the surly bonds of Earth.

The RQ-4 Global Hawk, serves as the Air Force's high-altitude intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance, long endurance RPA. Global Hawks are loaded with an integrated sensor suite and cameras capable of providing global allweather, day or night ISR, however while on the ground visibility for pilots operating the aircraft from within the Mission Control Element is limited. That is where Hawkeye fulfills its role.

"Hawkeye is any RQ-4 pilot who performs preflight inspections no differently than a typical pilot would conduct a preflight inspection," said 1st Lt. Jeffrey, a 12th Reconnaissance Squadron RQ-4 pilot. "The pilots in control at the MCE have limited visibility; Hawkeye is the eyes and ears of

RQ-4 Global Hawks on the ground. While maintaining a safe distance, Hawkeye pursues the aircraft at 40 mph down the runway until takeoff."

Prior to engine start Hawkeyes reviews a checklist with maintenance personnel verifying the functionality of the aircraft.

"We guide them from a maintenance perspective during their walk arounds," said Staff Sgt. Josh Reynolds, a 9th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron RQ-4 crew chief. "We provide a second set of eyes and answer any maintenance related questions the pilots may have."

According to Jeffrey, he has personally witnessed multiple occasions where a Hawkeye prevented a potential incident. "Hawkeye has prevented various incidents from bird strikes, runway incursions, located leaking hydraulic fluid and damaged aircraft," he said. "While deployed serving as Hawkeye I once identified an engine fire on another jet." Aside from locating potential hazards and serving as the eyes and ears of the aircraft, Hawkeyes are also responsible for communicating critical information to the pilots

coordinating with the air traffic controller before takeoffs and landings.

"When the air traffic controller gives clearance to land, Hawkeye is on the taxiway visually locating the jet, ensures the airfield has no debris or obstructions, and serves as a secondary source to the tower notifying the pilot the aircraft is cleared to land," Jeffrey said.

Global Hawks possess the capability to fly nonstop for 28 hours. Occasionally. the pilots and their aircraft are geographically separated. Although pilots and their aircraft are sometimes separated, technology and mission elements such as Hawkeyes, enable missions to be accomplished. "Hawkeye conducts those firsthand checks," Jeffrey said. "When we fly, the Hawkeye is there for every single takeoff and landing."

Salted Caramel Chocolate Chip Cheesecake



INGREDIENTS:

Sauce:

- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 6 tbsp salted butter, cut into 6 pieces
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 1 tsp salt

Cake:

- 1/2 cup Oreo cookies, finely crushed
- 3 tbsp unsalted butter, melted
- 3 (8 oz) packages of cream cheese, softened
- 1 (14 oz) can sweetened, condensed milk
- 3 large eggs, room temp
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 cup mini chocolate chips (plus more for topping)
- sea salt (optional-for topping)

INSTRUCTIONS:

Make the caramel sauce- in a small saucepan, heat sugar over medium heat. Use a heat-resistant spatula to continually stir the sugar. It will start to melt and from brown clumps. Keep stirring! Once the sugar is melted, add the butter. Be careful to keep stirring as the caramel will bubble up when you add the butter. Stir the butter until completely melted, 2-3 minutes. Continue stirring as you slowly drizzle the cream in. Keep stirring again, because the caramel will bubble up again when you add the cream. Allow the mixture to boil for 1 minute, then remove pan from heat. Immediately stir in the salt. Set sauce aside and allow to cool before using. Store in a glass jar for ease of use, keep sauce in the fridge. Preheat oven to 300°. Thoroughly grease a 9-inch springform pan. Set aside. In a mixing bowl, combine Oreo's and butter. Press mixture evenly into the springform pan. Prepare the fillingplace cream cheese in a stand mixer or mixing bowl to use an electric beater on in. Beat the cream cheese until fluffy, 2-3 minutes. Beat in the condensed milk. Beat in the eggs, one by one until thoroughly mixed. Mix in the vanilla, Add chocolate chips to the bowl, and gently with a spatula. Pour filling into springform pan. Top with a handful of mini chocolate chips. Bake in preheat oven for 40-50 minutes, or until the cheesecake is set and jiggles slightly in the center. Run a thin knife around the edge of the cheese cake (but leave it in the pan) and place on a cooling rack. Allow cheese cake to cool before chilling in the fridge in the springform pan overnight. Before serving, heat caramel sauce in the microwave for 10-15 seconds. Pop springform pan off cheesecake. Pour enough caramel sauce over the top of the cheese cake to cover it. Top with more chocolate chips and a sprinkle of sea salt, if desired. Slice, and serve immediately. *A note about the caramel sauce- Caramel is extremely temperamental during the spring and summer months when the humidity is high. A more experienced baker than I told me that they never make caramel sauce in the summer because it almost always seizes. I can testify to that. A good work around for me in the summer is to cheat with the caramel sauce. I take a bag of packaged caramels (like Werther's), place them in a saucepan, and add 2-3 tbsp of heavy cream. Heat the pan over medium heat, stirring constantly. When the caramels have melted and the cream is incorporated, add the salt to taste. Start with 1/2 tsp. Only add another 1/2 tsp of salt if you need it. Use as you would the other sauce.

Make your stuffing. TID An unstuffed turkey can be easier to cook than a stuffed one

STUFFING Place the pre-cooked stuffing in the oven to warm up

MASHED POTATOES Mash up the potatoes and cover with foil to keep warm.

GRAVY Make the gravy using

drippings from the turkey

5-10 MINUTES **BEFORE DINNER**

TURKEY Assign someone to carve the turkey.

STUFFING, GREEN BEANS, ETC. Take out everything from the oven when fully cooked and place in serving dishes.

> CRANBERRY SAUCE Don't forget to take it out of the fridge

*A note about baking time- My oven is a convection oven, which bakes about 20% faster than a normal oven. If you are using a regular oven, baking time may take longer, about 60-70 minutes. Check your cheesecake every 5 minutes or so after 50 minutes by jiggling the pan.

"Do you like puzzles?" veteran U.S. Treasury director Ray King (J.K. Simmons) asks newbie analyst Marybeth Medina (Cynthia Addai-Robinson) as he introduces her to one last big, baffling case he wants to crack before he retires.

King wants to reel in the mystery man behind an international string of dirty-money laundering, an American who seemingly moves with ease through the slime of the world's underbelly of gangsters, cartels and drug kingpins as well as regular billionaire businessmen who need to tidy up their "financials" quietly and quickly-and H&R Block is out of the question. King calls him simply The Accountant.

"Who survives this kind of clientele?" King muses. "Coming in cold, cooking the books and getting out alive?'

Puzzles play a significant role in The Accountant, which starts out with a familiar cops-and-crooks, espionage-movie feel but quickly corkscrews into something with more twists, turns—and pieces.

Ben Affleck plays Christian Wolff, a mathematical savant whose bland "day job" as a nondescript, pencil-pushing accountant is his cover—his disguise for wide-ranging contract work, zipping around in his Chevy pickup and his totally tricked-out 34-foot-long Airstream trailer. Because he ventures in and out of some dicey, dangerous situations, Wolff has also developed a highly specialized skillset in other areas, too. When things take a turn for the worse or run afoul of his strict moral/ethical code, he does whatever it takes to set them straight. Bullets fly, blood flows, bodies crumple. He's like a laser-focused cyborg, a walking lethal weapon—a hulking superhero without a costume. In fact, his "origin sto-ry," told in flashbacks, might remind you of how Bruce Wayne became Batman (another role, as you probably know, currently played by Affleck in DC's big-screen franchise) or

how other superheroes got started down their paths.

When we first meet young Christian as a boy, he's working on a jigsaw puzzle.

But here's where The Accountant takes its first turn. Christian has autism, which explains much about how he grew up and became gifted with numbers, but not so tuned in to people. There's a whole subplot about how his domineering military dad (Robert Treveiler) further shaped and steeled—rather than coddled—him, helping shift his neurological condition from a liability to an asset.

A stint at a minimumsecurity prison introduces Wolff to an organizedcrime bookkeeping snitch (Jeffrey Tambor) who takes him under his wing, teaches him basic socialization skills and schools him in the 'dark-money" arts. When Wolff is hired to

find the source of \$62 million leak at a high-tech robotics firm, it puts him and a perky young employee, Dana (Anna Kendrick), on the hit list of an assassin (Jon Berthal) and his crew hired to stop them and cover their tracks.

The original screenplay, by Bill Dubuque (who also wrote The Judge), craftily keeps you guessing—although some viewers will probably see the movie's biggest "surprise" twist coming long before it arrives—and plants several puzzle pieces along the way

to be picked up and set in place later.

In the middle of the action is another story entirely, a tale of family, siblings, daddy issues, kids who are "different," and the relationship between Wolff and Dana, which doesn't necessarily go where another, more conventional movie might have taken it.

It's so cannily drawn in its characters, backstory and detail, it sometimes feels like the pilot for a new TV series or the setup for another movie. I guess we'll have to wait and see: Where The Accountant will turn up next is a puzzle with a piece that's always missing.

Bismarck, N.D.—In Conjunction with Get Smart About Antibiotics Week, November 14-20, 2016, the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) is spreading the message that "antibiotics aren't always the answer," says Faye Salzer, HAI Activities Coordinator.

The Centers for Disease **Control and Prevention** (CDC) and the NDDoH want to remind everyone this cold and flu season: antibiotics don't work on viruses-never have, never will! "This isn't new news. It's a longdocumented medical fact. Antibiotics can only treat illnesses caused by bacteria. Colds, the flu, most sore throats, bronchitis, and many sinus and ear infections are caused by viruses, not bacteria," states Salzer.

If you or your child has a viral infection, antibiotics won't help anyone feel better or get well sooner. In fact, they can even be harmful. Taking antibiotics when they are not needed is fueling an increase in drugresistant bacteria, which cause infections that are more

difficult, and sometimes even impossible, to cure. Almost all types of bacteria have become less responsive to antibiotic treatment. These "superbugs" can quickly spread to family members, schoolmates, and coworkers, and threaten our communities with illnesses that were once easily treatable. Antibiotic resistance is a growing problem, and the main cause of this problem is the misuse of antibiotics. CDC estimates that more than two million antibiotic resistant infections occur annually in the United States.

"We need to be better stewards of our antibiotics," said Salzer. "This can be accomplished by making sure you take antibiotics only when they are needed and used as they should. When diagnosed with a viral illness, ask your doctor what you can do to feel more comfortable. Your provider may suggest you drink plenty of fluids, get a lot of rest, use overthe-counter medications as directed, use a cool mist humidifier, or gargle with salt water. Do not ask or pressure your provider for antibiotics."

Antibiotics can also lead to side effects, such as diarrhea or an upset stomach. Some side effects can be quite serious, or even life-threatening. An example is Clostridium difficile (C. difficile or C. diff) infections - these are bacterial infections that cause severe diarrhea. In the past, most C. difficile infections were connected to a recent hospital stay. Studies show that children in the general community – without a recent hospital stay – account for as many as seven out of 10 pediatric C. difficile infections. Many children who got sick with C. difficile had recently taken a course of antibiotics for a respiratory infection — infections that are usually caused by viruses and therefore not even helped by the antibiotics.

The CDC Get Smart program focuses on common illnesses that account for most of the antibiotic prescriptions written for children and adults in doctors' offices and other outpatient settings. The table below shows when antibiotics are necessary for common illnesses.

The 2016 North Dakota pronghorn season is officially in the books.

Big game managers will have a sense of success when they finish analyzing hunter harvest surveys and aging jaw samples from the harvested animals later this winter.

Each year, many hunters voluntarily submit pronghorn lower jaws, which helps track harvest success and get an estimate of the population's age structure. It's important to maintain an appropriate buck-to-doe ratio and help to manage populations, N.D. Game and Fish Department big game supervisor Bruce Stillings explained.

Biologists can identify the age of a big game animal based on tooth replacement – much as humans get permanent teeth at certain ages. "You can go confidently to 3 1/2 years old," Stillings described. Teeth are cross-sectioned for most accurate age determination, though, once all adult teeth are in. Crosssectioning teeth is much like reading tree rings.

North Dakota's pronghorn population is rebounding from three consecutive winters that saw numbers plummet. "It's been a slow recovery," Stillings added. Hunting seasons were closed from 2010 through 2013 and their population bottomed out in 2012.

The season re-opened in 2014 in one unit, 4A, in far southwestern North Dakota with 250 licenses. Two additional units opened in 2015. This year hunters enjoyed 730 licenses throughout seven units.

North Dakota has 16 pronghorn management hunting units, Stillings continued. While it's too early to peak into any crystal ball for the future of pronghorn, unseasonably warm October and November weather means that for each day of warm temperatures there is one less day of potentially

biting wind, cold, and snow pronghorns and other wildlife must endure to make it to spring. "It's sure starting off as a nice winter but that could change," Stillings reminded hunters.

Typical of many wildlife management strategies, North Dakota takes a conservative approach when determining the number of available big game hunting licenses, especially when dealing with a historically limited population like pronghorn.

However, Stillings admitted that it is "somewhat of a "use it or lose it" situation with pronghorn. Some areas of the state have a number of older bucks - the ones that tend to be worn down after the rigors of the rut and could come into winter in weakened condition, therefore potentially more vulnerable in severe weather. North Dakota's wildlife managers don't want hunters to lose opportunities to harvest those animals.

Yet they don't want to overharvest a population in any given unit. That's why when looking at lower jaw sets, they hope they see a high percentage in the age class that requires cross sectioning and not just being able to identify permanent or baby teeth.

North Dakota's pronghorn population last took a severe dive after the winter of 1996-1997. It took about 5 years for the overall population to rebound to more typical numbers. While wildlife managers saw pronghorn numbers tumble, it didn't warrant completely closing hunting seasons.

Based on recovery from the '96-97 winter, Stillings anticipates it could take a similar amount of time to recover from the winters of 2008-2010. Toss in last year's mild winter, and at least for now arrows are pointing up once again for North Dakota's pronghorns.

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

Recently purchased a firearm? Do you plan on transporting or storing it at Minot Air Force Base? Here's what you need to know about the rules and regulations of being a firearm owner while living on base.

1. Getting Started If you live on base, filling out an AF Form 1314 Firearms Registration and DD Form 2760 Oualification to Possess Firearms or Ammunitions form is required. All personal and weapon information must be secured must be typed, with the exception of your "wet" signature.

2. Where to store your weapons depends on where you live

If you live in base housing, you are authorized to store YOUR unloaded firearms safely in your home. Ammunition should be stored separately. Airmen living in the dorms are NOT authorized to store weapons in their rooms, visiting quarters or temporarily lodging facility. Read the next step to find out where else an owner can store a weapon.

3. Keeping them safely stored

The base armory can keep our weapon safe. When going to the 5th Security Forces Squadron armory, don't forget to bring the cleared firearm(s), any separately stored ammunition and your military ID. The armorer will give you an AF Form 1297 temporary hand receipt. The hand receipt is necessary to access your firearm.

4. Driving them around

To transport weapons on base, they must be stored in the rear-most compartment of the vehicle. Ammunition separately.

It is the owner's responsibility to follow the rules and regulations for owning a personal weapon. In addition, members must also comply with requirements outlined in AFI 31-101 and AFMAN 31-125 for Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act credentialed individuals. If regulations aren't followed, consequences will depend on the severity of the infraction. For further information, contact the 5th SFS at (701)723-6568. INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D.. -- The Health and Wellness Center at Minot Air Force Base is scheduled to host a 5K race in honor of the Great American Smokeout on Nov. 17, 2016.

The Great American Smokeout is an annual event hosted on the third Thursday of November to encourage tobaccoo users to quit for a day and promote a smoke-free lifestyle.

"The goal behind this event is that if people can go 24 hours without tobacco, maybe they can the event. go a little bit longer," said Lori Halvorson, 5th Medical Operations Squadron health promotion coordinator.

The 5k's theme is "Cold Turkey Trot" to encourage smokers to

quit tobacco-use "cold turkey." Although the race is

primarily coordinated to inspire tobacco users to quit, friends and family participation is also encouraged.

"Anyone who is interested in improving their own or their loved one's health can

participate," said Halvorson.

Free turkey soup samples, Gatorade slushies and information about tobacco cessation will be available during

A carbon monoxide smoke analyzer will also be available to detect carbon monoxide levels in smokers and people exposed to second-hand smoke.

"People can blow into

the machine and in less than a minute get their results," said Halvorson. "The machine can tell if someone is a light, heavy or addictive smoker."

The race will be conducted around the McAdoo Fitness Center, however, if inclement

weather arises it will be at the indoor track.

According to the American Cancer Society, tobacco-use and cigarette smoking remains the largest preventable cause of disease and premature death in the world.

"Tobacco users

typically start using when they're bored or stressed," said Halvorson, "So exercise is a great alternative to take your mind off those factors."

Chewing gum, sunflower seeds and alternate distractions are key methods in tobacco cessation,

said Halvorson.

"One method to quitting smoking is rate reduction," said Halvorson.

"For example, if you smoke one full pack a day simply reduce it to 16 or 14 cigarettes a day and continue to reduce daily."

Quitting smoking has immediate and long term benefits.

"What most people don't know is that

within 20 minutes of your last cigarette your blood pressure and pulse rate have already decreased," said Sheena Swanner, 5th Medical Support Squadron dietician. "After one full year, your chances of developing coronary artery disease is reduced by 50%."

The race is one way to jump-start quitting tobacco-use.

Halvorson concluded with additional benefits to quitting, such as exercise improves attitude, job performance and physical fitness standards, said Halvorson.
