MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Ask any Airman what their dream base is and not many would respond with, "Minot Air Force Base!" But for one young Airman, that was

Although they both find it convenient to always have a friend nearby, it's about more than just talking or grabbing dinner. They both know family bonds are stronger than most, and it isn't something they take for granted.

"The best part about being stationed with my brother is having someone I can trust here," Todd said. "I can ask for an opinion or not be worried about what they think about me."

With their futures still uncertain, one thing the Nave brothers know is they both want to end up back in Wichita, Kansas where most of the family currently resides. Whether they make the Air Force a career or use their learned technical skills to help their dad run his electrical company, one thing is certain according to them; their time spent together here has only made them closer.

Play by the rules

The peaceful transition of power in this nation is one of the hallmarks of our great Republic.

While the 2016 election has passed, there are still rules that govern how active duty service members conduct themselves in regards to politics and political activities.

Military members cannot participate in activities in uniform which could imply the Air Force or Department of Defense consent such activities. Examples include unofficial public speeches, interviews, picket lines, marches, rallies or any public demonstration.

Gen. Joseph Dunford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, wrote in in Joint Force Quarterly's July issue reminding troops not to politicize the election.

"What we must guard against is allowing our institutions to become politicized, or perceived as being politicized, by how we conduct ourselves during engagements with the media, public or in open forums."

Earlier this year, an active duty service

member from Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona, attended a rally for president-elect Donald Trump. The member was allowed to attend as a spectator and not in uniform. However, during the event the service member punched a protester who was being led out of the rally.

The service member was in civilian clothes, but was quickly identified as an Airman in the media coverage that followed.

"Air Force policy encourages active duty members to carry out the rights and responsibilities of U.S. citizenship, which includes participating in the political process in their personal capacity," said Roxanne McMahon, 5th Bomb Wing Staff Judge Advocate civilian attorney. "However, they must be aware their actions can and often will be tied to their military affiliation."

It is also important to understand the consequences of participating in political activities while in uniform.

Engaging in prohibited activities could subject a service member to prosecution under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

These rules are in place to maintain good order and discipline and avoid conflicts of interest or the appearance of improper endorsement in political matters.

As some civil unrest continues to surround the election results, remember participation in uniform is unauthorized, shouldn't take place on base, and must be peaceful and only be done in a personal capacity.

Active duty service members may express their personal views on public issues or political candidates on social media, however, if a social media site or post identifies the member as active duty, the entry must clearly state the views expressed are those of only the individual and not the DOD.

Furthermore, a service member may not post or make direct links to a political party, partisan political candidate, campaign, group or cause. Doing so is equivalent to distributing literature on behalf of those entities or individuals, which is also prohibited by the DOD.

A service member may not post or comment on political parties or causes' Facebook or Twitter accounts, however, a

service member may "follow" their accounts.

Service members must also refrain from engaging in social media activities that would constitute as political activity. This would include suggesting others "like," "friend," or "follow" the political party, partisan political candidate, campaign, group, or cause, forwarding an invitation to others.

Ash Carter, Secretary of Defense, echoed the words of Dunford, when he recently stated, "I am very proud of the way each and every one of you conducted yourselves during this campaign by standing apart from politics and instead focusing on our sacred mission of providing security."

Let's continue that tradition.

Weapon Safety: Knowing your responsibilities

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Firearms helped found this nation and are an integral part of both our constitution and the lives of many in the military. Whether for work, recreation or for protection, the safe use

of firearms is critical.

The Center for Injury Research and Prevention reports there are more than 310 million guns in circulation in the United States, which is approximately 90 guns for every 100 people.

While gun ownership is a constitutional right, it's also imperative that owners act responsibly in the care and ownership of their weapons.

In 2013, 1,670 children, age 0 to 18, died from a gunshot and another 9,718 were injured.

While we are required to have specialized training to drive a car, states vary on their requirements for gun purchase and ownership. Some states require safety training and a license, some only require a license and others require neither. It's incumbent upon all Airmen to learn and practice gun safety, even if not required by law.

There are four basic rules to follow to help keep safety paramount:

First, treat every gun as if it was loaded. Never assume a gun isn't loaded or handle it in a careless fashion.

Second, be sure of your target and what is beyond it. It goes without saying that you should have a clear view

of what you intend to shoot, nothing should be nearby.

Third, keep your firearm pointed in a safe direction. Never point a gun at anything you are not willing to shoot. We all know the devastating consequences of an errant bullet. Do not play with guns by pointing them at any living thing.

Finally, keep your finger off the trigger until the gun is lined up on target. Typically a gun will not fire unless the trigger is depressed. Keeping your finger off the trigger until you have safely determined your target can help prevent accidental shootings, injuries and possibly death.

Leftover Stuffing Waffles



INGREDIENTS:

4 cups crumbled leftover stuffing
Leftover cranberry sauce, for serving
2 large eggs
Leftover gravy, for serving
Chicken broth or turkey stock, as needed

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat the waffle baker and grease it with cooking spray. In a large bowl, stir together the leftover stuffing and eggs. Add 1/4 cup of chicken broth and mix until well combined. Continue adding chicken broth as needed until the mixture is well-moistened. Scoop half of the stuffing mixture into the prepared waffle baker, spreading it evenly. (The stuffing will not spread or expand like regular waffle batter as it bakes, so it's important to arrange it in an even, thin layer.) Close the lid and let the waffle bake until golden brown and the egg is cooked throughout. Transfer the waffle to a serving plate then repeat the filling and baking process with the remaining stuffing. Serve the waffles with leftover cranberry sauce and warm leftover gravy. This recipe for leftover stuffing waffles works best with basic stuffings that don't include large pieces of vegetables or meats such as sausage. It also helps to warm the stuffing slightly prior to mixing it with the eggs and broth so that the mixture is easier to stir. Don't repeatedly open the waffle baker while the waffle is baking or it'll lose its shape. Stuffing waffles take longer to cook than regular waffles, as the egg must be completely cooked throughout. Don't be afraid to let the waffle bake until it's golden brown and crispy.

Warm Turkey Sliders



INGREDIENTS:

1 frozen turkey breast
1 (16 ounce) package soft rolls
6 tablespoons of desired spread (anything from bacon onion jam, cranberry sauce, or mustard)
6-12 ounces sliced provolone
4 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon minced garlic
1 teaspoon poppyseeds

INSTRUCTIONS:

To cook the turkey breast, use either a slow cooker or an electric pressure cooker. If using a slow cooker, follow the directions here. If using an electric pressure cooker, add one can chicken broth, one whole yellow onion (peeled and quartered) and two stalks celery (chopped) to the bottom of the electric cooker. Place completely thawed turkey breast on top. Cook on high pressure for 22-30 minutes (for 2-6 pound breast) and allow to release the pressure slowly once done. Insert an instant read thermometer and if it is not yet at 165 degrees F, continue to cook for several more minutes on high pressure. Once turkey has finished cooking, slice against the grain to desired thickness. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Set the rolls in a baking dish and split the rolls with a knife and remove the tops. Cover with spread, turkey, and cheese. Replace the tops of the rolls. Melt butter in microwave and add garlic and poppy seeds. Brush mixture on top of rolls. Bake in preheated oven for about 20 minutes until heated through.

Downtown business owners and city representatives joined the Minot Area Chamber of Commerce Ambassadors in cutting the ribbon on Main Street today, to mark the completion of 2016 work on the Downtown Infrastructure Improvements Project Phase II. Nearly seven months of construction work nears an end with today's event, as the general contractor, Keller Paving and Landscaping, completed underground and aboveground work in 13 blocks and 6 intersections this year.

"The impact and size of this year's phase on Main Street and surrounding streets was substantial, to say the least," said Lance Meyer, city engineer. "We are very appreciative that the downtown businesses and their patrons were patient and willing to work through the tougher times with us. The high-quality final product, both below ground in the form of new water, sanitary sewer and storm water mains and aboveground, with new concrete roads, street lights, streetscape elements, and sidewalks will serve our community well for decades to come."

The amount of new, shared city infrastructure is a critical component of the overall Downtown Improvements Project. The work accomplished on Phase II in 2016 included the following items:

- 4,000 linear feet of water main
- 2,600 linear feet of sanitary sewer main
- 2,600 linear feet of storm sewer main
- 4,000 cubic yards of concrete street pavement (approx. 450 truckloads)
- 1,000 cubic yards of concrete sidewalk (approx. 110 truckloads)
- 6,900 linear feet of concrete curb & gutter
- 18,000 linear feet of electrical conduit

- 56,000 linear feet of copper wire
- 75 LED street lights
- Connect more than 100 separate domestic water and sanitary sewer service lines

The Phase II construction portion of the project was awarded to Keller Paving and Landscaping at a cost of \$8.88 million. In total, the three years of construction will likely cost between \$28 million and \$32 million. The three-year project is being funded by multiple sources, including the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) in the form of an \$18 million disaster recovery grant, storm sewer and street lighting district special assessments, Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery funds, utility bonds, the State Water Commission, sales tax flood control and general obligation bonds.

Two blocks of work that were scheduled to be completed under the

Phase II (2016) contract on North Main Street and one block of First Avenue SW, by Bremer Bank and the Federal Courthouse, are being delayed until 2017 due to uncertainty of whether the project could be completed before the winter weather arrives.

The final phase of the Downtown Infrastructure Improvements Project is scheduled to be bid out in early 2017, with a contractor in place prior to the spring start for construction. That work in 2017 will focus primarily on First Street SW and Third Avenue SE/SW.

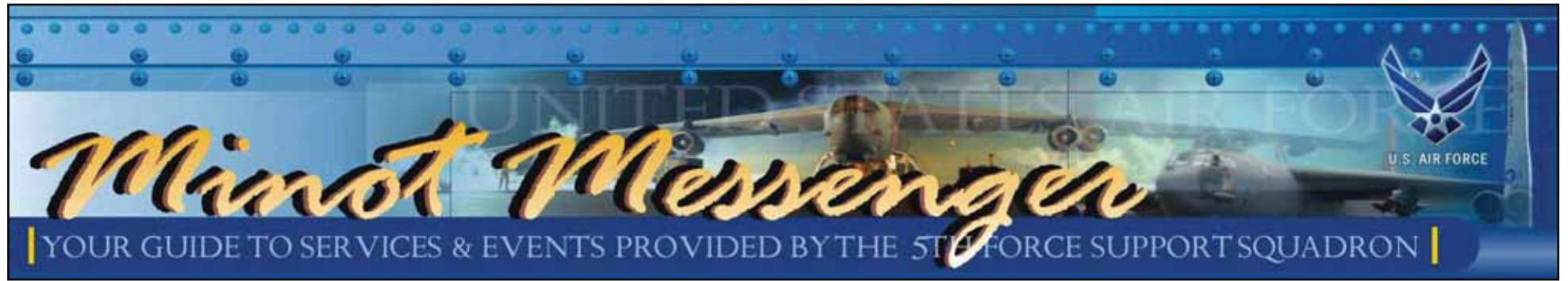

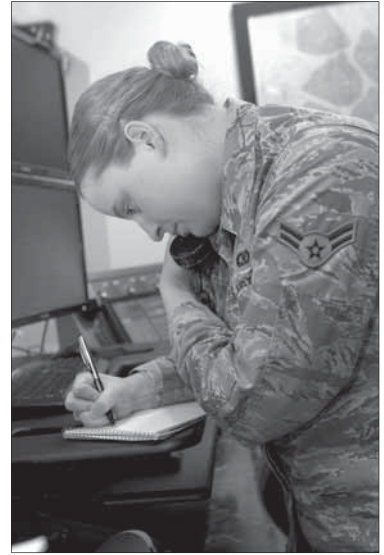
and housing must register their firearms with a point of contact in their orderly rooms. The individual will fill out the Air Force form 1314 Firearm Registration and Department of Defense form 2760 Qualification to Possess Firearms or Ammunition. Non-military personnel renting on base housing will register their firearms through Balfour Beatty Communities using the AF form 1314.

Once a firearm has been registered, dorm and billeting residents will store it in the security forces armory. Base housing residents can keep their firearms in their home, preferably stored unloaded and in a locked container separate from ammunition.

When transporting a firearm on base, it must be unloaded, placed in the trunk or rear most compartment of the vehicle. The firearm must be cleared, on safe and a tamper-resistant mechanical lock or other safety device is recommended. They cannot be stowed as to appear concealed. Firearms may not be stored in a vehicle overnight.

Additionally, even if you have a state-issued permit, concealed carry is prohibited on base except for federal, state, or local law enforcement for official duty purposes.

Also, Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act credentialed personnel may carry concealed firearms except in the workplace, Rockers Grill and Bar and Jimmy Doolittle Center, any controlled, restricted, limited, and exclusion areas and the 5th Medical Group facility.

Maintaining aircraft structural integrity

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

When an aircraft at Minot Air Force Base is damaged, the 5th Maintenance Squadron aircraft structural maintainers take charge in the repairing process.

These Airmen ensure the aircraft is fixed and ready to fly, through methods like sanding, corrosion and tubing to either build or install replacement parts.

Trained to perform maintenance on any aircraft, such as B-52H Stratofortresses and F-16 Fighting Falcons, these maintainers restore the structural integrity to help maintain a safe and serviceable aircraft.

“Our main job is to keep aircraft structural integrity up to par so they can fly without issues and the pilots can do their job,” said Senior Airman Mikal Joyce, 5 MXS aircraft structural maintenance journeyman.

Joyce, one of approximately 44 Airmen in the shop here, also talked about how their job is critical to the Air Force mission.

“As aircraft structural maintainers, we’re like the bloodline of maintenance,” Joyce said. “Every

maintenance unit is important, but without structural maintainers, the planes cannot fly and will also fall apart.”

Joyce also noted a unique thing about the aircraft structural maintenance shop here compared to other bases. Maintainers here work on specific types of metal compared to Airmen at other bases.

“This is the best base to come for our career field because we get a lot more sheet metal experience,” Joyce said.

Airman 1st Class Dustin Pace, 5 MXS aircraft structural maintenance apprentice, added that as a new Airman, the extensive work with sheet metal has given him a skillset that would usually take longer to achieve at other bases.

“This unit is the heart of sheet metal,” Pace said. “This is exactly the type of place to learn the job as an aircraft structural maintainer inside and out.”

Joyce noted how the job can also be challenging in various ways.

“It definitely gets tough at times,” Joyce said. “For instance, drilling a hole may seem easy, but when you have

to drill hundreds of holes that must be lined up correctly, it is more difficult than what it sounds.”

Despite these challenges, Joyce noted the best way to overcome them is to strive through.

Joyce and Pace also mentioned that their sense of pride comes from persevering through daily challenges and performing their structural maintenance duties.

“To know that our repairs help get the aircraft back in the air so pilots can complete their mission is what gives me more than enough pride to say I love what I do,” Joyce said.
