## CGOs experience Killdeer battlefield

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D., --

Twenty Team Minot company grade officers took a staff ride to Killdeer Mountain Battlefield State Historic Site, North Dakota, to learn about leadership and historic military operations.

A staff ride is when an organization chooses a battlefield and members study leadership habits, military operations and campaign results to brief other members the information they have learned.

"Staff rides focus on leadership qualities, combat tactics and campaign logistics from a specific time frame and compare those things to how we approach battles today," said Lt. Col. James Slaton, 91st Security Forces Group deputy commander.

The 1864 Battle of

Killdeer Mountain was a civil war between a union force, led by U.S. Army brevet Brig. Gen. Alfred Sully, and multiple tribes of Indian forces who were led primarily by Native American chief, Sitting Bull. The battle was the largest engagement between U.S. forces and Indian forces; there were 2,200 U.S. troops and 1,600 Indian warriors.

"We completed this staff ride because it is a great hands-on example of war, without physically going into combat," Slaton said.
"You can really dissect the campaign and learn different aspects. We take officers who haven't experienced combat and talk about leadership qualities during combat then versus now and lessons learned from the outcome of the battle," Slaton said.

From a first-hand

perspective, 1st Lt. Ariana Maldonado, 91st SFG executive officer, felt she learned things applicable to

her career field.

"We talked about the tactical movements of both General Sully and Sitting Bull's armies and the different approaches they took and why they were successful or unsuccessful," said 1st Lt. Ariana Maldonado, 91st SFG executive officer.

Members completed indepth studies of the two separate leaders and acted as subject matter experts as they taught their comrades about them.

"I acted as Sitting Bull

and studied his approach," Maldonado said. "When we stopped at each place I told his perspective and what he decided to do, and told the perspective of the natives in combat."

Although the approach the Native American warriors, and even the Army soldiers, took is different than today, the same concepts still apply.

"Sitting Bull's warriors were determined and sacrificed themselves," Maldonado said. "(The staff ride) taught me to find something worth fighting for, and to have loyalty toward your leaders and your people. We don't fight the same way, but we do deploy

and put our lives on the line; and although we don't expect the worst to happen, we are prepared for it and we still go out and fight.

Slaton hopes to continue this tradition and incorporate senior NCOs and other individuals in leadership positions to improve their skills as leaders.

"I think it's important to know our history, see how tactics have evolved, and also to learn from mistakes made by others and try not to make them in the future," Maldonado said. "It's important to learn those things and pass on that military history so we can move forward successfully."

## **Behind the scenes: 5th LRS** deployment plans

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

Since December 2016, the 5th Logistics Readiness Squadron deployment and distributions flight Installation Deployment Readiness Cell at Minot Air Force Base planned and executed all logistics operations in preparation for a U.S. Central Command deployment.

Leading up to the deployment, the IDRC hosted at least three meetings every month with key personnel from around the base, according to 2nd Lt. Nicholas Chapman, 5th Bomb Wing installation deployment officer.

"Our role is to communicate, coordinate,

facilitate and follow up," Chapman said. "When we learn that 5th BW Airmen are deploying, we bring functional experts from across the wing together to ensure all deployment requirements are identified and met."

Chapman added when the unit began building the mission format, it was identified they needed a variety of personnel, to include pilots, mission planners, combat systems officers, maintainers, etc.

"This deployment was larger and more intricate than any the 5th BW has seen in the last twelve years," Chapman said. "We had to ensure multiple units had all the personnel

and equipment needed to support sustained combat operations in USCENTCOM, to include more than 400 personnel and 290,000 pounds of cargo."

The IDRC, 5th Force Support Squadron installation personnel readiness and the unit deployment managers are also responsible for ensuring deployers completed all requirements leading up to their departure.

"The PDF is one of our last checks before we send deployers out the door," Chapman said. "Leading to this point, Airmen get

## Sextortion: Don't be a victim

A recent trend in online crime is targeting Airmen via social media and dating applications. It is being called "Sextortion."

How many times have we received emails about winning the lottery or that a deceased member of a royal family is our distant relative and we need to wire money to get our inheritance?

The way crime chooses to target military personnel continues to evolve as fast as the advancing world of technology allows it.

We as Airmen need to be aware of these trends and protect ourselves and our wingmen from the possible harm that it can bring about.

An Airman who is looking to date or connect could be contacted via Facebook or any other popular app by what appears to be an attractive person. The requester will often do research using social media to find familiar names or acquaintances to put the unsuspecting Airman

at ease. Over time, the conversation turns to video chat requests and invitations for the Airman to undress or perform sexually explicit acts. What these Airmen don't know is the video coming from the other side is often fake and they are being recorded.

Suddenly, the screen goes blank; the requester informs the Airman about the recording and threatens to release the video unless they send money or enter their credit card information into a recorder, which is often a subscription to a pornographic site.

Though cases of this most often involve male Airmen, the same situation applies whether the victim is male or female.

"This is actually happening to our Airmen," said Maj. Carlos De Dios, 5th Bomb Wing deputy staff judge advocate. "We are seeing people swindled out of thousands of dollars."

Another similar strategy being used lures Airmen into thinking they have accidentally committed a

crime. However, this time after explicit comments, pictures or videos are shared, the perpetrator puts on a guardian role and tells the Airman the person they were communicating with was underage.

The perpetrator will then instruct the Airman to send money to be used to "cancel phone contracts" or other such purposes in order to protect the alleged underage person. The hope is that the Airman will be too nervous to recognize that the scheme is false or too nervous to seek help.

Don't be a victim to one of these schemes! Just knowing these strategies to steal money from you is a start, but you should still take other precautions to prevent this from happening to you.

Here are some tips to further protect yourself:

- Adjust your social media privacy settings. - Avoid engaging in

sexually explicit activities/ sharing compromising

photos and videos online.

- Make sure that your computer antivirus software is upto-date
- If you are not using your devices, make sure that the camera is disabled.
- Most of all, use your common sense. If you are victim of

this type of targeting: - Stop all communications with

- the sextortionist - Don't send any money
- Save all the conversations and information you have
- contact your commander, AFOSI and base legal office.

Finally, watch out for your wingman. We all have a responsibility to watch out for one another so we can accomplish the mission. Spread the word and let's not let this sort of thing continue to happen.

Always There Cotton began by footstomping the ICBM mission's impact on Air Force operations. He emphasized the fact that nuclear deterrence ensures strategic stability and

"This is something you do every day," he said. "You allow American troops around the world to operate without contest through global vigilance, global reach and most significantly, global power."

He highlighted the challenges the service faces as it continues to execute the mission with the smallest numbers in history, along with aging weapons systems. However, Cotton explained that the Air Force is set to add 10,000 Airmen this year and to reach 324,000 in the coming

With the increase in manpower, Cotton also discussed the need for nuclear modernization and investment in the force's upcoming ground base strategic deterrent, set to completely replace the existing Minuteman III weapon system.

Moving forward, Cotton expressed his support for Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth Wright's theme that the Air Force is "Always There," to ensure that every U.S. military mission is successful.

"The ICBM force provides global power at a moment's notice, everywhere at any time," he

Next, Cotton discussed **USSTRATCOM** Commander Gen. John E. Hyten's priorities of strategic deterrence, combat-ready forces and decisive response. ICBMs provide a decisive response capable of strategically deterring potential adversaries. he said.

He then introduced Hyten's four areas of intent, which include deliberate planning, providing decisive response, embracing strategic deterrence and developing professionals and capabilities. Next, Cotton explained how this warfighting framework relates to the Numbered Air Force's own mission and vision.

"You provide the ultimate warfighting capability in support of strategic deterrence every day by operating, maintaining, securing, testing and supporting our weapon system,' Cotton said. "When called upon by the president of the United States, we stand ready to execute

The Fargo Film Festival (http://www. fargofilmfestival.org/) runs March 21-25 with most screenings at the historic Fargo Theatre. A wide genre of films will compete for various awards, including Best in Show, Competitive Category and Special Awards Category. Bismarck's Dakota Digital Film Festival (http:// dakotadigitalfilmfestival.org/) is held at the historic Belle Mehus Auditorium where the public can view screenings

With only a few weeks remaining in the 2017 North Dakota legislative session, the number of outdoor-related bills is winding down.

Some are still working their way through committees, floor votes, or awaiting Gov. Doug Burgum's approval.

Others ended up in File 13 and may or may not see the light of day in 2019.

Much of the session focuses on money, or given current financial issues, lack of money in state coffers.

When it comes to the N.D. Game and Fish Department, though, it's one agency not reliant on taxpayer revenue.

Hunters and anglers foot the lion's share of the department's revenue, whether through hunting, fishing, and trapping license sales, money earned through federal Wildlife and Sportfish Restoration programs, or even the Watchable Wildlife Check-off on an individual's state income tax refund.

Wildlife and Sportfish Restoration revenue comes from federal taxes hunting and angling manufacturer's pay and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service distributes funds to states.

The legislature and governor still approve the agency's budget, Game and Fish Department Deputy Director Scott Peterson described. The proposed 2017-2019 \$83.2 million budget is similar to its 2015 - 2017 budget with adjustments for slightly higher Restoration funding, he added.

However, recognizing the state's overall budget concerns, the Game and Fish Department didn't request any new full-time staff, even though it remains one of the smallest wildlife and natural resource agencies in the country.

Several bills geared towards older hunters didn't make it to Gov. Burgum's desk. Failed bills included a proposal allowing muzzleloader hunters 65 years of age and older to use

4-power scopes, 65-yearold and older archery hunters to use a crossbow during any legal archery season, or a proposal to establish a preference system for lottery drawings for hunters 70 years of age and older.

The concept of a lifetime license also didn't meet the muster among legislators this session, either.

The idea of tweaking nonresident waterfowl seasons failed in two different bills.

One bill still active, House Bill 1150, provides hunters with an option when it comes to applying for species involving preference points, such as mule deer, white-tailed deer, and pronghorn.

Currently, hunters apply and gain a preference point if they aren't drawn.

Hunters don't lose their points if they skip a year and don't apply.

Yet they don't gain a

The bill, which passed the House 50 - 42, would allow a hunter to pay the license fee (currently \$30 for deer and pronghorn) and forfeit it for a preference point. It benefits hunters who want to gain points but know they wouldn't have an opportunity to hunt in the upcoming season.

For example, a hunter with a Wyoming elk tag whose season runs consecutively with North Dakota's pronghorn season could pay the \$30 pronghorn license fee for North Dakota but check a box designating the fee go towards a preference point and not into the upcoming lottery.

HB 1150 was amended in the Senate and now goes to conference committee to iron out differences before going back to a vote.

Even though the legislative session is drawing to a close, outdoor enthusiasts can still voice their opinions and track legislation. It's easy – go to the Game and Fish Department website, (af.nd.gov), and click "Legislation".





## Easter Bunny Rolls



### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 3 cups bread flour
- 2 1/2 tsp Instant dry yeast
- 1 cup warm water
- 2 tbsp brown sugar
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 egg
- 1 tbsp coarse sea salt 2 tbsp softened butter

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Pour warm (not hot!) water into the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the dough hook attachment. Sprinkle the yeast and 1/2 tsp brown sugar on top of the water. Stir it lightly with a spoon and allow to sit for a few minutes until the mixture is frothy and smells like yeast. (If that's not happening, start over with new yeast.) With the mixer running on low speed, add the remaining brown sugar, salt, oil, and 3 cups of bread flour. Knead on low-medium speed for 2 minutes, until a smooth dough forms. The dough should be thick, yet soft and only slightly sticky. When it pulls away from the sides of the bowl it's ready to knead. Place the dough in a greased bowl and turn the dough over to coat all sides. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and place it in a warm environment to rise until doubled, about 1-2 hours. Once doubled in size, punch the dough down to release any air bubbles. Remove dough from the bowl and turn it out onto a lightly floured surface. Divide the dough into 8 equal pieces. Heat oven to 350°F (180°C) Line your cookie sheet with parchment paper, a silicone baking mat or lightly grease the cookie sheet. Roll each ball of dough into a rope about 14 inches long. Cut a 1/2-inch piece off the end, and roll into a ball for the tail. Fold the dough rope in half, and loosely twist twice to form the body of the bunny. Place on cookie sheet and press down the overlapping ear a little bit to prevent it from rising too high. To make the bunny tail press ball of dough into folded end of the twist. Repeat with remaining dough to make 8 bunnies. Let the bunnies rise for 5-10 minutes. Brush the tails with egg wash and sprinkle with coarse sea salt. Bake the bunnies for 15-20 minutes until the tops are golden brown and the edges look cooked. Remove the rolls from the oven when they are done and brush butter onto each warm bunny.





weapons qualified, receive hands on training and are medically cleared by the 5th Medical Group Public Health office."

Planning a deployment of this size and scope also comes with various challenges.

"We do not conduct deployments of this scale regularly," said Tech. Sgt. Casey Wilson, 5th LRS logistics plans NCOIC. "We only have five logistics planners to facilitate the entire process."

Despite the challenges, Wilson expressed pride in knowing her team's hard work ensured the deployment went smoothly.

"There's a lot of pride knowing that such a small office facilitated a deployment of this scale," Wilson said. "I think everyone involved should be proud to have conducted this deployment with zero

movement delays."

Chapman also talked about how this entire process has been a team effort between every section within the 5th LRS.

"The deployment process becomes an entire LRS function," Chapman said. "The supply and equipment managers, vehicle operations, air terminal operations, traffic management office, fuels management and vehicle maintenance have all been heavily involved."

Like Wilson, Chapman is proud to know the importance of their role in this deployment.

"This deployment process has gone smoothly and it shows how well the deployment machine did in ensuring everything was ready to go," Chapman said. "When everything runs smoothly, it means we've done our due diligence."

strike operations."

Describing his force goals, Cotton expressed how, "caring for Airmen and their families" holds up the other three goals of "safe, secure and effective daily operations, commitment to our warrior ethos, and coaching, training and mentoring." He elaborated that the command will continue to advocate for family's professional and quality of life needs, provide an array of services and key spouse support, and strive to achieve stability for nuclear Airmen.

He stressed the importance for ICBM Airmen to see the mission firsthand by experiencing important operations, such as maintenance at launch facilities or touring a launch control center. In the coming year, he encouraged leaders to provide opportunities for Airmen to develop within the mission and in their professional goals.


Cotton expanded on command activities and progress of ongoing initiatives. 20th AF is developing a new twoweek Operation Instructor Qualification Course, which will focus on students executing multiple iterations of instruction in missile procedure trainers and classroom environments.

Next, he highlighted the ICBM Center of Excellence and their plan to send 800 Airmen from across the NAF to professional development

trainings and visits. Cotton drove his focus on continuous improvement as he explained the recent Olympic Sword, which will result in 4,800 changes in technical orders standardizing languages between operators and maintainers, and the hands-on demonstration of electronic TOs at the 90th and 341st Missile Wings.

Following the continuous improvement discussion, Cotton then focused on ways the command is implementing best practices in the field. This includes the Missile Security Operations Concept, which takes lessons learned from downrange force deployments and implements best practices for security forces missile field deployments. A tiger team recently assessed MSOC trials at the 91st MW and critically reviewed the concept of deploying units as a core squadron fighting force. Additionally, Cotton stressed the importance of enhancing security forces training across the board, not only in the nuclear mission, but across the entire Air Force.

In closing, Cotton fielded questions from Airmen and provided feedback on topics such as UH-1N training, the impact cyber will have on nuclear modernization, developments within the Guard and Reserve opportunities for 13Ns, and how to best implement the Chief of Staff of the Air Force's goal of revitalizing squadrons within the Air Force.




