Commentary: The Greatest Generation

INOT AIR **FORCE** BASE, -- When I arrived bright-eyed and bushy-tailed to my first duty station Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota as a photojournalist in the world's greatest Air Force, I was eager to tell peoples? stories. While tackling what I believed to be one of my first real, in-depth features, I was told by my supervisor to track down a World War II veteran who could add to the story.

My current project was a fact-heavy history piece about the 8th Air Force's involvement in WWII. I thought my story was good as it was, but I humored my supervisor and started making calls.

A week later and I was driving downtown to pick up the 89-year-old B-17 Flying Fortress ball turret gunner who was supposed to add value to my "already perfect" article. I had always been good talking with senior citizens. My grandfather, who also served during WWII, lived with us growing up, so conversation and interaction was natural and comfortable. In fact, in many ways he reminded me of my grandfather, which allowed me to take to the gentleman instantly. Almost four hours later without a single dull moment, I knew Leo was someone I wanted to spend time with again. So I did.

Leo and I spoke often. We had dinner and met with him and his friends for breakfast. We exchanged Christmas gifts and I brought him as my date to base events. As often as my schedule allowed, I made a point to spend time together. When he told me stories about the war or just life in general, I was like a sponge, eager to soak up every ounce of information. He quickly became one of my favorite people in the world.

Over the next four years our friendship grew strong and I began to consider Leo family. He appreciated me involving him in militarylife things like the Air Force Ball or Air Force Association banquets. I cherished his company and stories. Little did I know, throughout those years, he was teaching me a lesson I wasn't able to learn earlier in life.

My grandfather had always wanted to share war stories. He would comment, "When I was in the Navy..." but instantly I tuned out. I was a teenager who didn't care much for history. When I was 18 years old and leaving for college my grandpa passed away. I was deeply saddened and mourned his death, but never realized what I lost until I met Leo nearly a decade later.

Leo taught me that history does matter and those stories are important. He taught me that we make choices in life today, especially as

service members, because of those who paved the way for us. He showed me what resiliency is and how courage and perseverance can overcome all. But most importantly, he taught me how to cherish the people in our lives.

A few weeks ago, when I received the news Leo had passed, I was initially regretful. I was ashamed I didn't call or spend more time with him. Part of me thought back to my grandfather's death, and how Leo enlightened me with what my grandfather's stories could have given me, if only I had listened. I felt a twinge of pain then too.

But, as I sat in the church and watched the American flag being folded and handed off to Leo's children, the sadness and regret washed away with pride. I was proud of all that Leo had accomplished throughout his 92-year-long life. Most importantly, I was proud and honored to call him a friend.

Leo is responsible for making my time in Minot special. He made my very first feature article immeasurably better than what it was without him. He made my life better. The men and women like Leo who have seen and survived things we can't even fathom live to share their stories with us. Let them. Listen. We call them the Greatest Generation. Leo taught me why.



Good sleep promotes a successful mission

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- A buzzing alarm can feel overwhelming, especially when you didn't get enough rest the previous night. Without adequate sleep, fatigue occurs, which in return decreases an individual's work capability.

According to the Air Force, many mishaps have cited fatigue as a contributing factor.

The Minot Air Force Base health promotions department conducts sleep assessments to help with fatigue and getting enough sleep.

A typical person should get between seven to eight hours of sleep a night. However, as people age, the need for more sleep is decreased, according to the Center for Deployment Psychology. Many factors affect sleep, including sleep stage and circadian rhythm.

"We have different things at our fingertips: Facebook, Amazon, video games and Netflix," said Maj. Danielle Tuttle, 5th Medical Operations Squadron health promotions flight commander. "All of these things are harboring us from falling asleep."

Getting a better night's sleep is not only important to be alert during the work day, but also for avoiding health

"We give people tips on how to balance their sleep schedule with their family time on their days off," said Tuttle. "We also help individuals with eating and exercising habits, and other factors that are contributing to their lack of sleep.'

According to AFI 51-902,

Political Activities by Members of the U.S. Air Force, section 3: Permitted Activities, members may display a political bumper sticker on their private vehicles. However, the following section states that members will not display a large political sign, banner or poster on a private veĥicle.

These instructions allow an Airman to have political bumper stickers, but only up to a certain size.

"It's important to avoid the appearance that the Air Force is supporting a certain cause or business,"

North Dakota Department of Health **Urges Caution During Tick Season**

ISMARCK, N.D. – Spring has arrived, and with the warmer weather comes the emergence of ticks, which can carry a variety of diseases. The North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) encourages all individuals to take precautions against tick bites when outdoors.

"The key to preventing tick-borne diseases, such as Lyme disease, anaplasmosis and Rocky Mountain spotted fever, is to avoid tick bites and find and remove ticks promptly," said Laura Cronquist, an epidemiologist with the NDDoH. "Areas that are heavily wooded or have tall grass or brush are more likely to be infested with ticks, especially between April and September, with the highest risk of disease transmission occurring during the warmer months."

The NDDoH offers the following tips to help reduce the chance of ticks making contact with your skin:

• Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)registered insect repellent. To find EPA-registered products, go to www.epa.gov/ insect-repellents/find-insectrepellent-right-you. Always follow label directions.

- Use products that contain permethrin on clothing and gear such as boots, backpacks and tents.
- Wear light-colored clothing to make the ticks easier to see.
- Wear long pants, and tuck the legs into your socks or boots.
- Keep your shirt tucked in.
- Bathe or shower as soon as possible after coming indoors (preferably within two hours) to wash off and more easily find ticks that are crawling on you.
- Carefully examine gear and pets for ticks.
- Place clothes in a dryer on high heat for 10 minutes to kill ticks on dry clothing after you come indoors.

"The best way to prevent tick bites is to avoid habitats where ticks can be found, or use repellent if tick-infested areas cannot be avoided," Cronquist said. "It is also important to conduct a fullbody tick check as soon

possible. Use tweezers to remove ticks that have attached to your body."

According to Cronquist, the best way to remove a tick is to use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp it as closely to the skin's surface as possible and gently pull upward with steady, even pressure until it is free. Avoid twisting, jerking or crushing the tick during removal. Make sure to wash your hands and the site of tick attachment with soap and water after removal.

The most common symptoms of tick-borne diseases include fever, chills, headache, fatigue, muscle aches and joint pain. Early detection of tick-borne diseases is important to prevent potentially severe complications, so people should seek medical care if they develop symptoms suggestive of a tick-borne disease after spending time outdoors.

Best Ever Carrot Cake



CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

softened

1 (8 oz) package cream cheese,

1/2 cup salted butter, softened

1 tsp vanilla extract

4 cups powdered sugar

INGREDIENTS:

- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup applesauce 2 cups (13.8 oz) granulated sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 cups (10 oz) all-purpose flour 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda*
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon 1/4 tsp ground nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp ground ginger 3 cups (12.3 oz) lightly packed finely grated carrots** 1 recipe Cream Cheese Frosting, recipe follows
- 2/3 cup chopped pecans

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line 2 9" round cake pans with aluminum foil, leaving an overhang on two side. Grease foil and dust with flour, set aside. (This cake can also be made in a 9x13 dish just increase baking time to 40 - 50 minutes until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, I have even halved the recipe and baked it in and 8x8 dish). In a mixing bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg and ginger. In a large mixing bowl, with an electric mixer, combine vegetable oil, applesauce, eggs, granulated sugar and vanilla. Slowly stir in dry ingredients and mix until well blended. Stir in grated carrots. Divide mixture evenly into 2 prepared cake pans. Bake cakes in preheat oven for 35-39 minutes until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean. Remove from oven and allow to cool 5 minutes in cake dishes before removing to a wire rack to cool. Lift cakes out of pan with foil overhang and allow to cool on wire rack completely before frosting (once cool I cut about 1/4" off the tops to even them out before frosting, you'll notice the centers don't rise as high as the rest). This is usually 6-7 medium carrots.







INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- On March 24, 2017, North Dakota governor Douglas Burgum signed a bill granting residents Constitutional Concealed Carry. The new legislation will allow North Dakota residents with a valid driver's license or ID card to carry concealed without a concealed weapons license.

The new law, which goes into effect Aug. 1, 2017, doesn't change Minot Air Force Base's Integrated Defense Plan.

While the carry of concealed weapons is not authorized, members residing in base housing

are allowed to store their privately owned weapons in their home. However, weapons must be registered with the 5th Security Forces Squadron armory.

Dormitory, visiting quarters and temporary lodging facility residents who wish to keep their weapons on base are required to store them at the armory.

Team Minot members who wish to concealed carry off base, the following criteria is required:

• Must be 18 years of age (21 to purchase a handgun)

• Must be a North Dakota resident for one year, with valid driver's license or ID card

• Must not be prohibited by state or federal laws from possessing a firearm

 Must carry drivers license or ID card (or have a digital image of the license or ID)

• Must inform law enforcement officer upon in-person contact

• Must comply with restricted locations

You must have a concealed weapons license to carry concealed in the state of North Dakota until the new law takes effect.

said Mishima-Baker. While there are specific guidelines for bumper stickers with political messages, regulations for other types of bumper stickers currently don't exist. Regardless, there are

many regulations concerning an Airman's demeanor toward racist or sexist content.

"It is important to be mindful of what is added to your vehicle for the base populous to see," said Tech. Sgt. Amber Hastings, 5th Bomb Wing equal opportunity director. "If the bumper sticker is perceived to be offensive, the member may be asked to remove it from the vehicle so it does not negatively affect base personnel."

Failure to follow the regulations listed above may be grounds for punishment under Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military

Justice, Failure to Obey an Order/Regulation.

If an NCO orders an Air Force member to remove a bumper sticker and they fail to do so, they may also be punished under Article 91 of the UCMJ, Insubordinate Conduct toward a Warrant Officer, NCO or Petty Officer.

"Punishment could be as simple as asking you to remove certain things, or it can go as far as receiving non-judicial punishment, said Mishima-Baker.

It's important to remember that we are members of the military at all times, added Mishima-Baker. The punishments that would be given for word-of-mouth may also be given for stickers on vehicles.

"If someone looks at your vehicle and it makes them uncomfortable, don't put on your car," said Mishima-Baker.




