



WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- The X-37B Orbital Test Vehicle mission 4 (OTV-4), the Air Force's unmanned, reusable space plane, landed at NASA's Kennedy Space Center Shuttle Landing Facility May 7, 2017.

"Today marks an incredibly exciting day for the 45th Space Wing as we continue to break barriers," said Brig. Gen. Wayne Monteith, the 45th SW commander. "Our team has been preparing for this event for several years, and I am extremely proud to see our hard work and dedication culminate in today's safe and successful

landing of the X-37B."

The OTV-4 conducted on-orbit experiments for 718 days during its mission, extending the total number of days spent on-orbit for the OTV program to 2,085 days.

"The landing of OTV-4 marks another success for the X-37B program and the nation," said Lt. Col. Ron Fehlen, X-37B program manager. "This mission once again set an on-orbit endurance record and marks the vehicle's first landing in the state of Florida. We are incredibly pleased with the performance of the space vehicle and are excited about the data gathered to

support the scientific and space communities. We are extremely proud of the dedication and hard work by the entire team."

The X-37B is the newest and most advanced re-entry spacecraft. Managed by the Air Force Rapid Capabilities Office, the X-37B program performs risk reduction, experimentation and concept of operations development for reusable space vehicle technologies.

"The hard work of the X-37B OTV team and the 45th Space Wing successfully demonstrated the flexibility and resolve necessary to continue the

nation's advancement in space," said Randy Walden, the director of the Air Force Rapid Capabilities Office. "The ability to land, refurbish, and launch from the same location further enhances the OTV's ability to rapidly integrate and qualify new space technologies.'

The Air Force is preparing to launch the fifth X-37B mission from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. Florida, later in 2017.

## **Cyber Squadron Initiative: Arming Airmen** for 21st century battle

**J**ASHINGTON (AFNS) -- The Air Force cyber landscape of today is not the same as 10 or even five years ago; every Air Force core mission is impacted and connected by cyber. In response, the

service has created the Cyber Squadron Initiative.

The initiative trains small teams from existing manpower that focus on defensive cyber operations of Air Force weapons systems. In order to meet the

"Air Force core missions are cyber dependent, and the complexities and threats in this environment have grown exponentially," said Lt. Gen. William J. Bender, the Air Force chief information dominance officer and chief information officer. "We are leaning forward to tailor the cyber force by leveraging industry partners and the joint information environment to perform basic IT services, thereby enabling Airmen to move away from a unitary focus on IT service delivery toward a holistic cyberspace approach that includes active mission defense and mission assurance."

The Cyber Squadron Initiative enhances the capabilities of cyber Airmen to defend, assure and optimize unit missions in, through and from cyberspace.

Currently, 15 initial cyber squadrons called pathfinder units have been organized, trained and equipped to deploy cutting-edge applications to provide mission assurance to their wing's critical missions. They are being joined by 30 new pathfinder units that were recently announced and have already begun training while identifying their key terrain in cyberspace.

Ultimately, pathfinder Airmen will present commanders with a more complete understanding of the risks military operations face in cyberspace. Pathfinders identify a wing's specific mission threats in order to determine cyber implications, Lt. Col. Billy Pope, from the Air Force Chief Information Office



## Trump presents CINC Trophy to USAFA

ASHINGTON (AFNS) -- The U.S. Air Force Academy football team received the Commander in Chief's Trophy from President Donald Trump during a visit to the White House May 2, 2017.

The trophy is awarded to the winner of the annual service academies' football triangular series between the U.S. Military Academy, U.S. Naval Academy, and U.S. Air Force Academy.

The three-sided, 170 pound, two-and-a-halffeet tall trophy was first awarded by President Richard Nixon in 1972.

The Air Force Falcons claimed the award for a record-setting 20th time, following a 31-12 victory against the Army Black Knights in November 2016.

"It is a great privilege for me for the first time to present you the Commander in Chief's

Trophy," said President Donald Trump. "As the United States Air Force celebrates its 70th birthday this year, this trophy will serve as a point of pride when the Academy's cadets graduate and (for) all of the members past and present of the United States Air Force."

During the ceremony, team captains Jacobi Owens and Weston Steelhammer presented the president with his own Falcons jersey and helmet.

"I am honored I was a part of the team that could win the trophy for the 20th time," Owens said.

Their accomplishments on the field are not the only highlight for the cadets this

"We are so proud that in only three weeks, under (the president's) command they will become commissioned 2nd lieutenants in our United States Air Force," said

Calhoun. "What they will bring is courage, integrity and boldness."

The Air Force Academy graduates approximately 800 - 1,000 cadets each

"Whenever an Air Force crew flies you'll always find a powerful symbol of American strength and American prestige," Trump said. "I know that each and every one of you will continue to make your country proud."

## Total force development services now in a single-point center

ASHINGTON (AFNS) -- The Air Force has consolidated all total force development services and resources to a single-point center. All Airmen (active duty, Reserve, Guard and civilian) will now be able to fully utilize all force development resources

through the virtual force development center.

The online center acts as a single-point depot that links Airmen to numerous professional force development resources. It is a comprehensive portal for self-paced training, education and other force development tools.

"All these resources are

designed to professionally develop Airmen in their self-development journey," said Barry Waite, the chief of Air Force Workforce **Development Division** at the U.S. Air Force Personnel Professional Development School. "The virtual center has the tools to shrink proficiency

gaps and maximizes our total force's skills."

The virtual force development center provides access to professional resources generated from both the Air Force and the private sector which are easily transferable to the workplace. The virtual center connects members to information on foundational learning, professional education, Air Force e-Learning and other resources to include seeking a mentor.

"Developmental opportunities to broaden and strengthen an individual's foundation are essential for the future of our workforce," Waite

The virtual center, through AF e-Learning, also offers hundreds of no-cost selfpaced courses, books, audiobooks, videos, simulations, challenges, summaries, case studies, exercises, learning tracks, and live events to support Airmen's continual development.

"The fundamental goal of force development is to provide Air Force members the skills, knowledge and abilities to excel in their organizations. I encourage all of us across the total force to check out the virtual center. Challenge yourself and learn something new every day," said Russell Frasz, the director of Force Development at Headquarters Air Force.

The virtual force development center is located on the Air Force portal site under the career and training tab.

Cyberspace Strategy Branch and leader of the program, explained.

The initiative will mitigate risk to the wing's portion of the Air Force's core missions: air and space superiority; intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance; rapid global mobility; global strike; and command and control.

As these pathfinder units

activate, all Airmen will see more integration of mission defense teams throughout the mission planning phases all the way to execution.

"Our adversaries understand that cyberspace offers a potential asymmetric advantage," Pope said. "We must develop capabilities, culture, and organizational structures to safeguard our

Air Force core missions against cyber threats." An updated program

action directive and Air Force policy are scheduled to be implemented this year, with funding for new training in cyber school houses for officer, civilian and enlisted in fiscal year 2018. Implementation of all changes is expected by 2026.





### PRAIRIE ADVENTURES



"You've all heard of bird walks and birding trails. But this is pothole country in North Dakota, where the refuges and prairies are so expansive the birding resources call for drives rather than

- Birding Drives Dakota website, (www.birdingdrives.com).

The fine art of birding encompasses many levels from folks who simply enjoys feeding and watching their backyard feathered friends to those traversing across the world in search of a "lifer", a treasured avian species they want to observe personally.

A "lifer" could be an exotic species in an exotic country. Or it could be an elusive grasslands sparrow, which draws many birders to North Dakota in search of Sprague's pipit or Baird's sparrow, for example.

North Dakota's large U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Wildlife Refuges (NWR) offer nature trails for birders and anyone wanting to soak up the Great Outdoors. Oftentimes, they have bird checklists so it's worth a stop at refuge headquarters to see what information is available.

A person can bird in a state park, a refuge, or a N. D. Game and Fish Department Wildlife Management Area, for example. Really, a person could bird just about anywhere.

For many serious birders, city lagoons are treasured for the amount of wetland birds and waterfowl they at-

Seriously, city lagoons.

The fine folks in southeast North Dakota took birding to a different level several years ago by enlisting biologists and ornithologists to design six drives allowing birders of all levels to experience the state's potholes and prairie.

Birding Drives Dakota offers maps and a booklet so folks can take the selfguided tours at their leisure.

The six routes go from Carrington to Chase Lake NWR, Carrington to Arrowwood NWR, Jamestown to Chase Lake, Jamestown to Arrowwood, the Lake Juanita area, and the Jamestown

Birding Drives Dakota didn't stop there, creating

the Potholes & Prairie Birding Festival in 2003.

Headquartered in Carrington, the 2017 festival is slated for June 14 – 18 at the Chieftain Conference Center. It features guided birding tours of the Drift Prairie Region, Chase Lake NWR, Horsehead Lake and Kidder County, and Sully's Hill NWR near Devils Lake.

Several seminars are on tap, as well, and birders have time to – you guessed it – bird on their own.

Just be sure to register early for the festival.

While bird walks and birding trails are do-able at one's own speed and on one's own time, the Theodore Roosevelt Nature and History Association (TRNHA) has led a bird walk long before bird walks became trendy.

June 4 marks the 63rd annual TRNHA Bird Walk at Theodore National Park South Unit in Medora. Archives show folks trekked the bird walk every year since its inception regardless of weather.

## Jalapeno Popper Macaroni Salad



#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 lb dried elbow macaroni pasta

1 cup canned jalapeños, chopped I prefer the mild version (can substitute with fresh chopped jalapeños as well)

1 cup cheddar cheese, cubed small (or shredded) (monterey jack or Colby jack are good as well)

8 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled

1/2 cup mayonnaise (I like to use the canola oil mayo for a less calo-

1/2 cup sour cream

2 Tbsp cream cheese, room temperature

2 Tbsp lemon juice fresh is best

3/4 tsp salt

1/2 tsp garlic powder

generous pinch of black pepper fresh parsley, minced for garnish (optional)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Bring large pot of water to a boil, add generous pinch of salt and boil pasta per package directions. Drain, and rinse pasta with cold water until cooled. To a small mixing bowl, add mayo, sour cream, cream cheese, lemon juice, salt, garlic powder and black pepper and whisk until smooth and creamy. To a large mixing or serving bowl, add cooked and cooled pasta, jalapeños, cheese, and most of the bacon. Pour dressing over pasta and toss to combine. Sprinkle with remaining bacon, cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes to allow flavors to fully combine. Serve cold. If desired, add a bit of melted butter to some panko breadcrumbs and cook in a dry skillet over LOW heat until fragrant and toasty. Before serving pasta salad, sprinkle the toasted breadcrumbs over the top.

# First group of enlisted Airmen complete RPA training program

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas (AFNS) -- The first three NCOs have completed the Air Force's undergraduate remotely piloted aircraft training program here May 5, 2017, and one was a distinguished graduate.

Master Sgt. Mike was in the top 10 percent of his 20 classmates academically and shared top honors. He is one of 12 enlisted candidates that were selected from the Air Force after Dec. 17, 2015, for a bold initiative called the enlisted pilot initial class. In EPIC, enlisted Airmen were included with commissioned officers during RPA pilot training.

In its 70 years as a separate service, the Air Force has relied almost exclusively on commissioned officers for its pilots.

Last November, as part of their initial flight training (IFT) near Pueblo Memorial Airport, Colorado, each student soloed a DA-20 Katana aircraft just like all other pilots, fellow RPA pilots, and combat systems officers.

Mike was the first EPIC student to solo at IFT and he was confident that fellow enlisted Airmen can succeed at IFT and URT.

"If there is something you really want, it's achievable. You just have to put in the effort," Mike said.

Mike and his classmates continued URT on Jan. 6, 2017, at Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph for the second and third phases of the pipeline that produces all Air Force RPA pilots. Phases 2 and 3 of URT lasted about four months and consisted of RPA instrument qualification and RPA fundamentals training.

"What makes this

accomplishment even more extraordinary is the quality of the students who make up this URT class 17-10," said Lt. Col. Jason Thompson, the 558th Flying Training Squadron commander, who is responsible for training pilots and sensor operators at JB San Antonio-Randolph.

Almost 90 percent of URT 17-10's students are recent college graduates and one is the Air Force's first RPA pilot physician, Maj. Joe. Second Lt. Brianna, Mike's fellow distinguished graduate, is one of the best pilots to have completed URT in recent memory, Thompson said.

After URT, Mike and his fellow enlisted pilots Master Sgt. Alex and Tech. Sgt. Mike, advance to formal training at Beale Air Force Base, California, for a basic qualification course where pilots qualify on the RQ-4 Global Hawk. The Global Hawk is a long-duration intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance weapon system that supports

missions worldwide.

The Air Force Personnel Center continues to plan and fill the RPA pilot training pipeline with enlisted Airmen and commissioned officers.

"There are a lot of opportunities that could become available to enlisted Airmen," Mike said.

## Senate Confirms Wilson as Air Force Secretary

**SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS** 

ASHINGTON (AFNS) -- Heather Wilson will be the next secretary of the Air Force, following her confirmation by the Senate May 8, 2017.

Wilson, who is stepping down from her position as the president of the South Dakota School of Mines & Technology to take the post, is expected to be sworn in within a week.

"We live in a remarkable country, protected by innovators and intrepid Airmen who take great risks on our behalf," said Wilson. "I look forward to getting to work, focusing on readiness, modernization, development of leaders and research for the future."

Wilson graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in the third class to include women. After graduating from USAFA in 1982, she earned masters and doctoral degrees as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University in England. She served as an Air Force officer in Europe during the Cold War and on the National Security Council Staff under President George H.W. Bush during the fall of the Berlin Wall, and the collapse of the Warsaw Pact. She has also worked as an advisor to several large defense and scientific organizations both before and after serving for a decade in the U.S. Congress.

The daughter and granddaughter of aviators, Wilson is an instrument rated private pilot.

Wilson becomes the second confirmed appointee in the Defense Department and will be responsible for organizing, training and equipping the U.S. Air Force of 660,000 Active-duty, Guard, Reserve and civilian Airmen, as well as managing its \$132 billion budget.

Wilson replaces Lisa Disbrow, who has been Acting Secretary of the Air Force since Jan. 20, 2017.



## North Dakota Urges HIV **Testing Amid Increase in Reported Infections**

ISMARCK, N.D. -State health officials are advising high-risk audiences of the importance of HIV testing, along with information about preventative and treatment methods, given a recent spike in the number of HIV infections in North Dakota.

The public health alert comes in response to a recent and rapid increase in the number of HIV infections, specifically among an at-risk population of male samesex partners who have anonymous, unprotected sex. Traditionally, the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) interviews all individuals who test positive for HIV in order to identify any at-risk partners who also need testing. The growth of social media has also resulted in an increase of individuals meeting same-sex partners anonymously. This anonymity is a concern for NDDoH officials because patients are often unable to identify or contact these partners for follow-up.

Twenty-eight men whose primary risk factor for HIV infection is sex with male partners have been reported to have HIV in North Dakota since the beginning of 2016. Prior to 2016, North Dakota reported an average of eight new HIV cases of this type each year. Ten new HIV cases of this type have already occurred in 2017. Some of the cases are believed to be recent infections, within the last 12 months.

"We believe that this group may be at increased risk for HIV," said Lindsey VanderBusch, NDDoH HIV, STD, TB and Viral Hepatitis Program Manager. "The increase in reports is concerning, so we strongly encourage all who don't know their status to get tested."

It is recommended that all people with risk factors be screened for HIV and other STDs at least annually, and every three to six months if engaged in unprotected sex, or sex

with multiple partners. People diagnosed with a sexually transmitted infection should have an HIV test with every new infection. Other risk factors for HIV infection include any person having unprotected sex (risk is increased with multiple sex partners) and injecting drugs.

Acute HIV infection can present with symptoms. Symptoms may include fever, swollen glands, sore throat, rash, muscle and joint aches, and pains and headache. Symptoms usually present within 2-4 weeks from the time a person is exposed to the virus. All individuals at high risk for HIV infection should contact a health care provider about getting tested as soon as possible. If there is concern about the cost of testing, there are clinics that offer free or low-cost testing through the NDDoH's HIV Testing Program. Visit gettested.cdc.gov for clinic locations.

"The first step to taking care of your health is knowing your status. There are many resources for people who test positive for HIV to be able to manage their infection going forward," VanderBusch said. "Also, for those who are negative and at high-risk, HIV preventive therapy known as PrEP would be an excellent option to prevent infection in the future."

HIV Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) is a preventative medication, and if taken as directed, it can reduce the risk of HIV infection by more than 90 percent. PrEP is a safe and powerful tool that can be combined with condoms and other preventative methods to provide even greater protection than when used alone.






