Kelley assumes command of the 576th Flight Test Squadron

.E. WARREN AIR FORCE BASE, Wyo. --Col. David Kelley assumed command of 20th Air Force's 576th Flight Test Squadron, the only U.S. intercontinental ballistic missile test launch squadron, during a change-of-command ceremony at Vandenberg Air Force Base, California, June

"To the men and women of the 576th Flight Test Squadron, I am incredibly proud to be your commander and promise to you my unwavering dedication to our mission and taking care of you and your families," Kelley said. "We are the only test unit in the United States military entrusted with launching intercontinental ballistic missiles. Each and every test operation we conduct has a global impact, by providing assurance to our allies that our nation's nuclear umbrella is viable and by providing a visible deterrent to potential adversaries.'

In support of the 'deter

and assure' mission, the 576th FLTS determines the effectiveness and accuracy of the ICBM force by planning, preparing and conducting ICBM ground and flight tests. The test launches provide performance data and demonstrate the capability of the ICBM force. The information is shared with the Department of Energy, Department of Defense, U.S. Strategic Command, Headquarters Air Force and Air Force Global Strike Command.

Prior to assuming command of the 576th FLTS from Col. Craig Ramsey, Kelley served as the Director of Operations, 20th AF, F.E. Warren AFB.

Ramsey now heads to a position as the 91st Missile Wing vice commander, Minot

"I've been very proud to have witnessed all of the success of the men and women of the 576th Flight Test Squadron, and it has been my honor to represent them every day while in command," Ramsey said.

Supervision Guidelines for Children

INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --School is out! During summer break, outdoor

activities naturally increase for children in the military community. Therefore, parents, sponsors and adults are asked to familiarize themselves with North Dakota's and Minot Air Force Base's Supervision Guidelines for preventive measures to protect children from neglect and injuries.

Child Neglect is a continued failure to provide a child with needed care and protection. Examples of this are:

- -Inadequate supervision
- -Inadequate nutrition
- -Inadequate clothing and hygiene
- -Failure to protect
- -Abandonment
- -Medical neglect

In the military community whether you live on- or offbase, the child's welfare and safety is the responsibility of the parent, guardian or sponsor - NOT the child's.

The table below presents the minimum supervision guidelines. Remember, each child is different. As a parent and sponsor, in addition to the minimum supervision guidelines, you have to consider childspecific factors such as personality, developmental progress, environment and maturity when making the decision to determine if the child is ready to accomplish activities with little or no supervision.

The Air Force Family Advocacy Program's mission is to build healthy communities by implementing programs designed for prevention and treatment of child and adult abuse. The Family Advocacy Program at Minot AFB offers various

prevention and treatment classes such as parenting, stress/anger management, Change Step and couples' classes.

Remember, ensuring child safety is the responsibility of the parents, adults and sponsors. Child supervision is the key to a healthy and safe child!

2.42. Unattended Children in Vehicles. Children 11 years and younger must not be left alone in a vehicle. If left alone, the child should be in direct view of the caregiver at all times. The child(ren) should be in a seat restraint and be unable to put the vehicle in gear.

2.42.1. If children (11-years old or younger) or animals are left unattended in a vehicle, DD Form 1408 will be issued and 6-traffic points will be assessed. If the children or animals were left in dangerous conditions in vehicle, i.e., in hot weather where interior temperatures may reach dangerous levels, keys left accessible to children or where conditions are deemed hazardous by a reasonable person an AF Form 3545 will be accomplished by Security Forces and a 30-day driving suspension package will be completed by % SFS/S5R for 5 MSG/CC

5th MXG implements innovative training

The 5th Maintenance Group Training Section has combined efficiency and readiness by merging ancillary training, CPR, Green Dot and resiliency training into an allencompassing two-day training session offered every week.

Tech. Sgt. John M. Silva, 5th MXG training instructor, along with three other 5th MXG members, collaborated to reduce the time of Computer Based Training and other required training.

The new maintenance initial orientation training was implemented May

1st and cuts the previous training time by 75 percent. The training teaches Airmen topics such as wing and emergency medical support, power-based personal violence, and psychological resilience.

"We consolidated it into a plan where you get everything required throughout the year and we don't have to worry about them being overdue [with training]," said Silva.

The training instructors also reduced CBT time to one hour rather than four hours annually. This plan will save about 5,100 hours a year across the group and will also reduce scheduling, travel and classroom time for Airmen.

"That's 5,100 hours of time that these maintainers can turn a wrench instead of sitting at a computer doing CBTs," said Master Sgt. Steven A. Boyer, 5th MXG Unit Training Manager. "It also reduces scheduling time for our scheduling personnel, travel and idle classroom time. The reason it works so effectively for maintainers is because they don't have access to many computers."

The training not only saves time, but also allows Airmen to work hand-inhand and learn to be more interactive with their fellow

wingmen. "With our experience as instructors, we're able to give that human aspect back and actually tell the audience 'Hey, these are the warning, cautions and notes of what actually can happen," said Silva. The classes range between 25-35 MXG personnel a day. 15 of these seats are open for other squadrons so they can complete Green Dot, resiliency and other required training. "We had a great

consideration.

turn-out," said Silva. "We had about 35 people show up and the class went great. We actually had other instructors come in from Green Dot and Resiliency training to help us teach."

In the next year, they're hoping to train about 50 percent of the wing. By the end of this year, a projected 1,735 people will have attended these classes.












NORTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

ISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) reminds residents that preventing mosquito bites is the most effective way to avoid West Nile virus disease. While there have not been any human cases of West Nile virus reported to the NDDoH so far this year, the department expects that it will be only a matter of time before the first case is identified.

Most people infected with West Nile virus experience no symptoms or have only mild symptoms, such as fever and headache. However, the more serious form of the illness, West Nile neuroinvasive disease, can cause high fever, severe headache, stiff neck, altered mental status and death. People over age 50 or those who have underlying health issues are at greater risk for developing the neuroinvasive disease.

"West Nile virus disease can affect anyone and cause serious illness regardless of age," said Laura Cronquist, epidemiologist with the NDDoH. "In 2016, 85 North Dakota residents tested positive for West Nile virus. Cases ranged in age from younger than ten years to older than 60 years. Twentyeight of the cases were hospitalized, and two people died."

There is no human vaccine for West Nile virus, and there are no specific treatments for the disease. NDDoH recommends residents take these precautions to avoid mosquito bites:

Use insect repellent registered with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) that contains ingredients such as DEET, picaridin, IR3535, oil of lemon eucalyptus (or PMD) or permethrin. Always follow the directions on the manufacturer's label for safe and effective use.

Wear long-sleeved shirts, long pants and socks when outdoors.

Limit outdoor activities between dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most likely to bite.

Eliminate stagnant water in containers around homes where mosquitoes can lay their eggs (e.g., gutters, buckets, flower pots, old tires, wading pools and birdbaths).

Keep mosquitoes from entering your home by installing or repairing screens on windows and doors.

In addition to human surveillance, the NDDoH West Nile virus surveillance program includes trapping and testing mosquitoes, reporting and testing sick animals, monitoring illness in humans and reporting and testing dead birds. New to the program this year is an iNaturalist project called Mosquitoes in North Dakota. The general public is encouraged to participate in the project by recording observations of mosquitoes found within the state. PRAIRIE ADVENTURES

Just because the North Dakota legislature pass a bill and it's signed by the Governor, doesn't mean that's the end of the process for creating a new rule and regulation.

In the case of the N.D. Game and Fish Department, several new bills signed into law means the agency has been busy rewriting some existing agency administrative rules to conform to the new laws.

And the public still has time to comment before they're eventually sent onto the legislature's Administrative Rules Committee for final approval.

Game and Fish Dept. Deputy Director Scott Peterson described the process: First the agency issues a public notice for the proposed changes and a public meeting is held. Meeting and written comments are reviewed and responses are submitted to the N.D. Attorney General's office.

Next, the agency applies to the Legislative Council, requesting that the proposed changes be placed on the legislature's Administrative Rules Committee hearing calendar, which for the upcoming proposed changes is set for September. The committee then reviews the proposals and either approves or denies the changes.

All of the proposed changes for the upcoming 1:15 p.m. June 15 public meeting at the Game and Fish Department's Bismarck office, 100 N. Bismarck Expressway, essentially update current rules to reflect the new laws passed in the 2017 session.

For example, one proposed change deals with public use of a Game and Fish Department Wildlife Management Area (WMA). New legislation prohibits the use of drones on WMAs and the administrative rule change simply puts it into agency policy.

When it comes to the increasing use of technology

for things such as drones and game cameras, "we're trying to be proactive rather than reactive," Peterson explained.

Another proposed rule change addresses the use of game cameras on WMAs as their popularity soars: If finalized, it would treat the use of game cameras on WMAs similar to ground blinds and tree stand – they're OK to use but "you can't leave them up year-around," Peterson described. In addition, they can only be used for a period of time before and after hunting seasons.

The issue with hunters leaving private property on public land is that it can create the perception of exclusive use. Many North Dakotans won't intrude in an area where someone else set up a tree stand, game camera, or ground blind. Yet on public land such as WMAs, the use of blinds, stands, and cameras doesn't give that owner the sole right to hunt in the area where they're in place.

Currently, several Game and Fish administrative rules address how special license raffles are conducted. A proposed change – again because of new legislation approved this session – combines moose, mule deer, elk, and antelope raffle procedures into one clear-cut administrative rule. "What this does is it adds a level of accountability for these organization... the rules are already in place for many but not all, so this standardized everything," Peterson explained.

Typically, the administrative rule change process isn't controversial, Peterson added, but the agency will oftentimes receive comments, which are then addressed and taken into consideration.

It's all part of making the rules and regulations process as transparent as possible and applies to all state agencies.

Chicken Stir Fry with Rice Noodles




INGREDIENTS:

- 12 oz rice noodles
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil 2 skinless boneless chicken breasts, sliced into bite-size strips 1 red bell pepper (or 1/2 red and 1/2 green), sliced
- 1 cup broccoli, chopped
- 4 oz shiitake or portabello mushroom, sliced
- 1 tablespoon peeled and shredded fresh ginger 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 1 teaspoon cornstarch few drizzles of sesame oil

INSTRUCTIONS:

Bring medium size pan of salted water to a boil. Add noodles and cook them on medium heat for about 2 to 4 minutes (depending on thickness of noodles), or until barely tender. Drain and stir in 1 tablespoon of vegetable oil. In a large wok or skillet, heat 2 tablespoons of vegetable oil over high heat, add chicken and stir-fry for about 3 minutes. Remove from the skillet and set aside. Add bell peppers, broccoli and mushrooms and saute 1 minute then add ginger to the skillet and stir-fry for another 2 minutes. In a mixing bowl combine chicken stock, soy sauce, ketchup and cornstarch. Add chicken, noodles, and broth mixture to the skillet and stir-fry for 3 minutes or until chicken is cooked through. Summer exhibits at the Northwest Art Center treat gallery visitors to contrasting

"artist's-eye" views of life on the prairies and high plains via the work of two regional

The Gordon B. Olson Library Gallery features vibrant, impressionistic landscape and still life paintings by Nicole Gagner of Bismarck in "Prairie Impressions," on display through June 16.

Works such as "Looking Back on Stormy Skies" describe the Dakota landscape in bright dabs of color, while domestic still life studies such as "Rows of Preserves" and "Stocked Pantry" speak of familiarity with a close-to-theland lifestyle.

Working primarily in oil, Gagner says she is inspired by "texture, saturated color, unique plays of light and form, and (perhaps most importantly) my grandmother's pickles."

From farther to the west come "Views from the High Plains," the traditional watercolors of Leith Howard DeWeese, St. Marie, MT. Growing up in the west, DeWeese said she developed "a sense of place and a reverence for nature, responding to sites with open vistas and clean air." Tumbled barns, weathered outbuildings

and abandoned, rusted tools give evidence of hands and lives from a now-past era, as DeWeese commemorates historic homesteads.

The DeWeese exhibit is on display in the Northwest Art Center's Hartnett Hall Gallery until June 22, when it will close with a reception with the artist from 6:30 to 8 p.m. at

the gallery.

DeWeese was born in Logan, Utah. She graduated from the University of Arizona with a B.F.A. in Art Education, and has worked as a graphic designer, jewelry maker, and art educator in a career spanning over thirty years. She has exhibited widely in North Dakota, Montana and Arizona.



MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

The 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing personnel at Minot Air Force Base have teamed up to ensure mission readiness at the missile alert facilities throughout North Dakota.

Since May 22, Minot AFB personnel have traveled to all MAFs for "Blitzkrieg," the operation in which the 5th Civil Engineer Squadron, 91st Missile Maintenance Squadron, and other units complete work orders that have accumulated through the winter months.

"This is the first time we've ever done this," said Tech. Sgt. Daniel Corcoran, 5th CES structure craftsman and MAF Blitzkrieg NCO in charge. "The two wings are working together so we can knock these work orders out and get the MAFs running smoothly."

Record-breaking snow from last winter created a few issues at the MAFs. Due to several days of road closures, teams couldn't drive to fix the minor issues as they occurred.

"The base was unable to complete some work orders through the winter due to the snow, so we're trying to complete them through the summer," said Corcoran. "Additionally, we're installing a new vent system on the roof to help alleviate snow buildup."

Each squadron created teams of multiple career fields to visit the MAFs for the jobs. One of these teams, the Electromagnetic Team, arrived early to H-01 to complete their respective work orders in a timely and effective manner.

"Our main goal is to restore the capsules to excellent condition," said Tech. Sgt. Randy White, 91st MMXS EMT assistant NCO in charge. "We need to make sure our equipment is reliable and the location can remain operable and withstand any kind of attack."

With anywhere from twoto-four work orders at each site for each team, Team Minot will likely be working on these discrepancies throughout summer, said White.

"Right now, we have three teams focusing on Oscar, Delta and Hotel MAFs," said Corcoran. "Once they're done, we will move on until there are no more work orders."







INOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -General John E. Hyten, Commander of U.S. Strategic Command (USSTRATCOM), will present the 2016 Omaha Trophy to the 5th Bomb Wing at Minot Air Force Base Tuesday, June 6.

In February the 5th Bomb Wing was named the 2016 Omaha Trophy recipient for the fifth time, in the Strategic Bomber category, as the command's premier strategic bomber wing.

The Omaha Trophy is awarded annually to five outstanding units that represent USSTRATCOM's mission areas, their role in global operations and USSTRATCOM's continued emphasis on strategic deterrence. Selections are based on formal evaluations, meritorious achievement, safety and factors such as community involvement and humanitarian actions.

The Omaha Trophy, which dates back to the U.S. Air Force's Strategic Air Command, was originally created by the Strategic Command Consultation Committee in 1971. At the time, a single trophy was presented annually as a

token of appreciation to the command's best wing.

In an article by U.S. Strategic Communication, U.S. Air Force Gen. John E. Hyten was quoted as saying, "These awards are a direct reflection of the hard work and tireless effort demonstrated by the men and women, in and out of uniform, who support the command. USSTRATCOM is a powerful, dominant warfighting command whose ultimate strength is its people, joint and allied warfighters officers, enlisted and civilians."

Gen. Hyten's career includes assignments in a variety of space acquisition and operation positions and serving in senior engineering positions on both Air Force and Army anti-satellite weapon system programs.

USSTRATCOM, of which he currently commands, is one of the nine Unified Commands under the Department of Defense.

Shantelle R. Carey, An Individual Exploration of Spirituality

NORTH WEST ART CENTER MINOT STATE UNIVERSITY

inot State University art student Shantelle R. Carey will present a solo exhibit, "An Individual Exploration of Spirituality," at the Northwest Art Center's Gordon B. Olson Library Gallery at Minot State University June 26 through July 28, 2017. Opening reception is June 29 from 5 to 6 p.m. at the gallery.

The exhibit — featuring mixed media paintings on animal hides as well as symbolic objects and sculptures fashioned from natural materials — studies the unification of religion and spirituality. It traces Carey's formation of a new set of beliefs combining principles from Christianity, Buddhism, and Native American culture.

After hearing what she describes as "an especially odd sermon," Carey experienced a conflict between her beliefs and the beliefs of the church, and so set out to find "more comfortable spiritual territory."

For many of the works in the exhibit, Carey

created her own canvases by stretching rabbit hides. She then painted on them scenes symbolic of her unified belief system. Other objects created for the exhibit include hide pouches and pseudo-ceremonial "weapons." A centerpiece of the display is "The Gift," a 7-foot by 9-foot painting on a bison hide.

The exhibition recognizes the importance and influence of spiritual beliefs. It focuses, said Carey, "on the idea of finding your own religious and spiritual home whether it is one religion or an assemblage of beliefs." Religion has always been a sensitive area for society, said Carey, but she hopes that the exhibition will help to reinforce the idea of religious freedom and acceptance.

Carey is a painter and sculptor born in Springfield, MO in 1993. She currently works in Minot, ND, and attends Minot State University, pursuing a Bachelor of Arts degree in painting. She creates paintings and sculptures inspired by the natural world. Her creations allow her

to explore new places, techniques, and a variety of art forms.

Exhibitions to date include: 3D Show, Cirque Nocturne One Night Show, and Everything but the Kitchen Sink Show at the 62 Doors Gallery; and the Minot State Annual Juried Student Art Show in 2015, 2016, and 2017. Carey's work was published in the MSU literary magazine The Coup in 2015 and 2016. She also has painted group murals in Buffalo, MO. After attaining her degree, Carey intends to pursue a long-term career in painting. When she is not painting, you can find her at the animal shelter petting all the cats.

The exhibition and reception are free and open to the public. The gallery is open regular library hours. For hours, call 858-3200. Parking in university lots is unrestricted after 4:30 p.m.
