CMSAF Wright gets 'up close and personal' view of OSI

QUANTICO, Va. (AFNS) -- Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright received an indoctrination to the Air Force Office of Special Investigations during a guided tour of its headquarters Aug. 14, 2017.

The orientation fortified the impression the Air Force's top enlisted leader has maintained all along.

"I've always believed Air Force OSI is an extremely professional counterintelligence and criminal investigations organization," Wright said. "All of my dealings with them have been amazing. All the information and situational awareness I'm provided has been fantastic. To get to see it up close and personal is a treat."

Wright was immersed with briefings covering OSI's criminal investigations, fraud, counterintelligence, cyber, special projects and anti-terrorism specialty team missions.

Those mission sets showed how OSI will advance the new Air Force priorities recently endorsed by Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein and Wright.

"OSI will play an integral role, particularly in restoring our readiness," Wright explained. "I think the Airmen in OSI and the things they do for us from a counterintelligence standpoint ensure the Air Force will always be ready to go. A lot of the work they do most Airmen and Americans don't see. The amount of counterintelligence and advance-type work they do that allows us to set the conditions to be successful in a lot of these countries is just masterful."

Wright then underscored why all Airmen should understand how important OSI is to their Air Force.

"If there's one theme I want every Airman to know is that Air Force OSI plays a huge role in helping keep all of us safe on many fronts," he said. "They keep us honest with all their criminal dealings, their role of investigating sexual assaults and in the area of fraud, they save money."

Wright also noted the legacy of the OSI Hall of Heroes which honors 16 fallen members.

"It would have been one thing to walk down the Hall of Heroes and read some of the plaques," he said. "But (Hall of Heroes guide Staff Sgt. Aaron) Coleman really explained to me what happened to each of those heroes. I was also extremely pleased to see two (of the enshrined) security forces members and Master Sgt. (Tara) Brown, an administrative member, are recognized as heroes alongside the agents. That was pretty powerful."

Wright's visit also included a tour of the OSI Enlisted Heritage Hall, a luncheon and an all call.











Medical Airmen must be prepared to deploy on short notice to provide life-saving and performance-enhancing healthcare in diverse, austere, and isolated locations, and all Airmen must be medically ready to deploy. To achieve this readiness mission, the Air Force Medical Service operates 76 military treatment facilities around the world, which serve as

the primary readiness and training vehicles.

The 12 hospitals and 64 clinics within the AFMS serve as dual readiness platforms, ensuring that all Airmen meet medical readiness standards to deploy, and that all medical Airmen have the training and skills necessary for deployment. The MTFs are the foundation of our expeditionary medical capabilities, providing a population of patients that drives the workload, case diversity and acuity necessary to maintain

clinical currency that is essential for readiness.

Every Air Force MTF is aligned with an operational Wing to enhance the medical readiness of warfighters and their families. Medical group commanders tailor the care and training offered at their MTF, ensuring the medical readiness of the operational wing they support. No two air bases have exactly the same mission portfolio, so each has unique medical support requirements.

An excellent example of how MTFs support the installation's operational mission is the 19th Medical Group at Little Rock Air Force Base, Ark. The 19th Aerospace Medicine Squadron High Altitude Airdrop Mission Support Center is housed at Little Rock, so medics from the 19 MDG are experts in the care of high-altitude operators. This includes unique oxygen monitoring and physiologic performance requirements for these Airmen. This type of expertise, like others organic to Air Force Medicine, isn't required at every installation, nor would it be efficient to deploy it at all 76 AFMS facilities.

The knowledge, skills, and abilities gained at these fixed facilities translate into outstanding care in a deployed environment. A valuable tool for the AFMS to extend this care downrange is our **Expeditionary Medical** Support Health Response Teams (EMEDS-HRT). **EMEDS-HRT** allows medical Airmen to rapidly deploy a mobile tent hospital that can provide emergency care within an hour of arrival on the scene of a disaster or other casualty situation. This gives us the capability to deliver surgery and critical care within six hours, and full hospital capability

within 12 hours of arrival. Properly training medical Airmen to deploy and operate EMEDS-HRT requires a specialized MTF readiness platform. Four Air Force MTFs are presently staffed to deploy and train EMEDS personnel, including the 633rd Medical Group at Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Va., devoting time and resources to a critical deployment platform that other MTFs are not resourced to deliver.

At the 633rd, the Global Response Force coordinates with Air Combat Command to run annual training exercises on EMEDS-HRT. Medics from the 633rd practice rapid deployment and simulated casualty care with a wide assortment of patient scenarios. These well-trained Airmen from

the 633rd deploy in support of a variety of mission types around the world, from combat operations support to humanitarian assistance and disaster relief.

Once fully operational, EMEDS-HRT can provide surgical and trauma care, prevention, acute intervention, primary care and dental service to a population of more than 3,000. Our expert teams continue to find innovative ways to decrease the size and weight, while increasing the speed of deploying these mobile hospitals. They can also be tailored to a specific mission, adding specialty care such as obstetrics/gynecology and pediatrics for humanitarian assistance, disaster relief or other missions involving populations with special healthcare needs.

Medics at most MTFs rotate through EMEDS training, but may not receive the in-depth training available to Airmen at Joint Base Langley-Eustis. This tailored mission support is critical to building and sustaining an agile and flexible force, capable of completing a myriad of healthrelated missions around the globe at once.

MTFs also serve as platforms to evolve and implement new ways of caring for patients. Most patients interact most often with their health teams in primary care clinics, so these are a key area for readiness and innovation. Air Force MTFs utilize the Air Force Medical Home model, a team-based approach to care that embeds specialty providers into primary care clinics. This removes barriers to care and drives efficiency. Mental health providers, physical therapists, clinical pharmacists, social workers, and others augment or deliver primary care appointments in close coordination with the primary provider and other members of the team.
























sheet pan lemon parmesan garlic chicken & veggies



INGREDIENTS:

For The Chicken:

1 large egg

2 tablespoons lemon juice (or juice of 1/2 a lemon)

2 teaspoons minced garlic

1/2 tablespoon fresh chopped parsley 1/2 teaspoon each salt and pepper, to season

1/2 cup breadcrumbs

1/3 cup fresh grated parmesan cheese

4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts (or thighs)

For The Veggies:

8-10 (1 pound | 500 g) baby potatoes, quartered

1/2 cup butter, melted

2 teaspoons minced garlic

1 pound | 500 g green beans, cut into thirds

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to $200^{\circ}\text{C} \mid 400^{\circ}\text{F.}$ Lightly grease a baking tray / sheet with cooking oil spray, or a light coating of oil. Set aside. In a large bowl, whisk together the egg, lemon juice, 2 teaspoons garlic, parsley, salt and pepper. Dip chicken into egg mixture, cover and allow to marinade in the refrigerator for 30 minutes to an hour fifting of the control of (if time allows).* In another bowl, combine the breadcrumbs with the parmesan cheese. Dredge the egg coated chicken in the breadcrumb/ parmesan mixture, lightly pressing to evenly coat. Place chicken onto the baking sheet / tray and lightly spray with cooking oil spray. Arrange the potatoes around the chicken in a single layer. Mix together the butter, 2 teaspoons garlic and salt to taste, and pour half of the butter mixture over the potatoes. Toss to evenly coat. Bake in preheated oven for 15 minutes. Remove baking tray from the oven and flip each chicken breast. Move the potatoes to one side and place the green beans around the chicken on the other side of the baking sheet. Pour over the remaining garlic butter and return to the oven to broil (or grill) on medium-high heat for a further 10 minutes, or until chicken is golden and crisp, and potatoes are cooked through. Sprinkle with fresh chopped parsley (optional), and serve immediately.

Sheet Pan Chicken Fajitas

INGREDIENTS:

2 tsp chili powder (preferrably 1 tsp ancho chili powder 1 tsp regular)

1 1/2 tsp ground cumin 1 tsp ground paprika

1/2 tsp ground coriander

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

1 1/2 lbs boneless skinless chicken breasts, sliced into 1/2-inch thick strips (slice extra wide strips in half)

1 of each red , green and yellow bell peppers, cored and sliced into strips (3 whole total)

halved and sliced from top to root

2 cloves garlic , minced

3 Thsp olive oil 2 Tbsp fresh lime juice

3 Tbsp chopped cilantro

For serving 8 taco size flour tortillas

Sour cream , avocado slices or guacamole, diced tomatoes, Mexican cheese blend (toppings are optional)

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Spray an 17 by 12-inch rimmed baking

sheet with non-stick cooking spray.

For the seasoning: In a small mixing bowl whisk together chili powders, cumin, paprika, coriander, 1 1/2 tsp salt and 1/2 tsp pepper, set aside. For the fajitas filling: Spread bell peppers and yellow onion onto baking sheet. Top with chicken strips then sprinkle garlic and seasoning evenly over chicken strips. Drizzle olive oil over top then toss everything to evenly coat. Spread into an even layer working to toss everything to evenly coat. Spread into an even layer working to keep chicken from overlapping. Roast in preheated oven, tossing once halfway through cooking, until veggies are tender and chicken has cooked through, about 18 - 25 minutes (test a few of the larger pieces to make sure they are 165 in the center, careful not to over-bake it or the chicken may be dry). Wrap tortillas tightly in foil and warm in oven during last 5 minutes of fajita filling cooking.

Drizzle lime juice evenly over top of the chicken fajita filling, sprinkle with cilantro and more salt to taste and toss to coat. Serve filling warm in warm tortillas with desired toppings.


Kick Off The NFL Season During Tailgate Party At Rockers

Our Behavioral Health Optimization Program, which embeds mental health providers in primary care clinics, has been particularly beneficial. Building a mentally resilient force is a key to readiness, but stigma can sometimes create a serious hurdle to seeking mental health care. BHOP is an effective way to initiate mental health care, starting informal conversations with mental health professionals. Brief meetings in the context of a primary care appointment can lead to earlier treatment of a mental health condition, preventing a more serious problem.

The AFMH model also incorporates the Base Operational Medicine Clinic, an occupational medicine, flight medicine and deployment health focused clinic. BOMC is separate from primary and family care clinics at MTFs, focusing

resources on the readiness mission. Previously, flight and occupational medicine clinics required patients to visit different departments to get their pre-placement exams and exposure assessments. BOMC, centralizes all exam components in one clinic, and use standardized procedures. This model is especially valuable at MTFs that host fighter wings, or other units that call for a high volume of aerospace medicine services.

In our continuous efforts to provide a medically ready and ready medical force of Airmen for our nation's defense, the AFMS relies on the remarkable medical Airmen who are its providers, nurses, technicians and patients. The people I serve with, men and women of amazing compassion, skill, training, and creativity, continually inspire me. My job is to
