

Kentucky Air National Guardsmen deploying for Hurricane Harvey rescue operations

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AFNS) -- Eighteen Airmen from the Kentucky Air National Guard's 123rd Special Tactics Squadron departed Louisville, Kentucky Aug. 27, 2017, for Texas, where they will assist with rescue and recovery efforts in the wake of Hurricane Harvey.

The Airmen are deploying to Robert Gray Army Air Field at Fort Hood, Texas.

Among the deploying personnel are 14 Airmen who will comprise of two Personnel Recovery Teams. These Airmen have expertise in swift-water rescue, confined-space operations and emergency medical care. They will deploy with a variety of equipment suited to hurricane recovery operations, including inflatable motor boats.

Also deploying are four

Airmen who will stand up and staff an Austere Special Tactics Operations Center.

The 123rd STS has extensive experience with hurricane rescue and recovery operations. Following Hurricane Katrina in 2005, members of the unit established and operated a helicopter landing zone on a highway overpass in New Orleans, helping evacuate nearly 12,000 residents.

"These Airmen are some of the most dedicated and professional special operators in the entire United States Armed Forces," said Col. David Mounkes, the Kentucky ANG 123rd Airlift Wing commander. "Our thoughts and prayers are with them as they work to assist residents who have been stranded by Hurricane Harvey and the historic flooding in Texas."

State Health Department Reports First West Nile Virus-Related Death in 2017

NORTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

BISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) announced today the state's first West Nile virus-related death in 2017. The individual was a woman who resided in central North Dakota and was older than 60 years of age. She had underlying medical conditions and died while hospitalized.

Most people infected with West Nile virus experience no symptoms or have only mild symptoms, such as fever and headache. In more severe types of infection, the virus can cause high fever, severe headache, stiff neck, altered mental state, and death. People with these symptoms should see a healthcare provider immediately.

"People older than 60 years, or those who have underlying health issues are at the greatest risk of developing a severe illness due to West Nile virus infection. This death is a tragic reminder of how dangerous West Nile virus can be," said Laura Cronquist, an epidemiologist with the North Dakota Department of Health. "West Nile virus transmission typically peaks in late summer in North Dakota. Until there is a hard frost to get rid of the remaining mosquito population, people should continue to take steps to protect themselves from mosquito bites."

To date, 29 human West Nile virus cases have been reported in 16 counties this year. Twelve of the 29 cases were hospitalized. In 2016, North Dakota had 85 cases and two West Nile virusrelated deaths. Twenty-eight cases were hospitalized last year.

Because the evenings are getting cooler and it has been a dry year, people may be inclined to skip mosquito protection. It remains critical, however, to reduce the risk of being bitten by mosquitoes that may carry West Nile virus. The NDDoH recommends the following precautions:

• Use insect repellents containing ingredients registered with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) – such as DEET, picaridin, or IR3535. Always follow the directions on the manufacturer's label for safe and effective use. Do not use insect repellent on babies younger than two months old.

• If you are also using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and EPA-registered insect repellent second.

• When possible, wear long pants, long-sleeved shirts, and socks while outside.

• Treat items, such as boots, pants, socks, and tents, with permethrin or buy permethrin-treated clothing and gear.

• Limit outdoor activities between dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most likely to bite.

• Eliminate stagnant water and leaf debris in containers around homes where mosquitoes can lay their eggs (e.g., gutters, buckets, flowerpots, old tires, wading pools and birdbaths).

• Keep mosquitoes from entering your home by installing and maintaining screens in windows and doors.

• Keep the grass around your home trimmed.

There is a song that talks about Christmas being the most wonderful time of the year.

While that's extremely difficult to deny, many hunters will likely argue that autumn is the most wonderful time of the year.

Just think, already several hunting seasons get underway Sept. 1. For the ever-increasing multitude of archery hunters - some probably taking to bows after becoming increasingly disgruntled over yet another year of being denied a deer gun lottery license – archery deer season begins on that day.

For the fortunate number of hunters receiving pronghorn, elk, and moose licenses, those opting for a bow as their method of take can also go afield beginning Sept. 1.

Ănd don't forget about dove season, which opens Sept. 1.

Oh, and then there is mountain lion season.

You guessed it, that also begins Sept. 1.

The following week, sharp-tailed and ruffed grouse, partridge, and tree squirrel seasons open Sept. 9.

It would be interesting to compare the number of sharptail grouse hunters to the number of archery deer hunters in 2017 to, say, 1977. That was before deer gun licenses became more difficult to attain in several units across North Dakota. It was also before pheasant populations benefited from increased habitat through Federal Farm Bill Conservation programs, such as the Conservation Reserve Program.

It almost begs the question – do more North Dakotans now hunt deer with waterfowl.

Toss in swan, turkey, deer, elk, moose, and pronghorn - for those lucky enough to draw licenses plus waterfowl and pheasant seasons and it shapes up to be a busy fall.

In the flurry of activity that always seems to accompany the array of hunting seasons, several things shouldn't be forgotten. For starters, licenses.

For those hunters stashing licenses in a "safe" place, the burning question is whether or not they can remember where that "safe" place was.

On the immediate horizon is also the issue of weather. Typically seasons opening in early to mid-September tend to be warm.

This year, even though August provided a bit of a reprieve from high winds, dry conditions, and heat, the danger of fire can still be a concern. Be careful, stay on trails – which hunters should do, anyway – be aware of local fire restrictions, the current fire danger index, and have a fire extinguisher in a vehicle.

This year brought more concerns regarding bluegreen algae toxins and it likely won't go away with the coming of September. As waterfowl and upland seasons approach, it's still wise to keep hunting dogs out of any water with potential blue-green algal blooms. Avoid discolored water, as well.

Hunting dogs are going to want to go to water to cool down and drink because they're the ones working umpteen times harder than the hunter. Be sure to carry water with you, stop and rest the dog frequently, and keep it out of any potentially dangerous

But back to upcoming hunting seasons: Come mid-September and beyond, hunting kicks into full gear with youth-specific opportunities for species such as deer, pheasants, and

water. Avoid hunting in the heat of the day, as well.

Hunting seasons are soon upon us. While some may debate it, to many it really is the most wonderful time of year.

Enjoy. Be smart. Do the right thing and be safe.





INSTRUCTIONS:


Place chopped pickles in between layers of paper towels and let sit for 10-15 minutes, or until drained. Mix together cream cheese and sour cream together in a medium bowl, then stir in pickles, pickle juice, garlic powder and onion powder. Season with salt and pepper, then serve immediately or refrigerate until ready to serve.

Alternate States of Reality Double Feature - Photo Exhibitions at the Taube

TAUBE MUSEUM OF ART

The Taube Museum of Art Main Gallery is featuring Clint Saunders' photographic installation Alternate States of Reality: Finding Harmony in Chaos from September 5 - October 14. Please join us for the artist reception on Thursday, September 7th from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm.

Three main factors drive Saunders' art: Photography = reality, Perception vs. reality, and ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder). Saunders is enticed by the idea of being able to use photography like a pencil where he can create the alternate realities, concepts, and images that are in his mind using a medium that was meant to capture and record things that already existed. Saunders spent years using film and darkroom techniques to create photo montages before finally switching to a digital darkroom in 2003, and eventually a digital camera in 2004.

Saunders says, "One of the things he loves about photography and art is that it gives us an opportunity to view the realities of others. Artists share their perceptions of reality with the world through

their art. They offer us an opportunity to see the reality through their eyes. Even with photography, which is supposed to be a deceptive medium, we have no truth. If you gave ten photographers cameras and put them in the same scene, the end result will be ten completely different photographs depicting different realities."

About ADHD Saunders states, "one aspect of having ADHD is the feeling of having a TV turned on to all the channels at the same time. Random imagery constantly flies through my mind at a rapid pace. Still images, montages, concepts and art ideas continually appear, disappear and reappear again. Along with the images comes a compulsive need to create the images and get them out of my head where I can further explore them visually and try to understand what they mean and why they are there."

Saunders is usually able to find meaning in the work, but he rarely discovers why the images are there in the first place. However, he finds the process both therapeutic and necessary. Saunders' primary goal with this installation piece, that incorporates 15

years of his photomontage work, is to invite the viewer into his mind and share a small piece of his reality. It is his hope that the viewer will get a sense of what it is like inside his ADHD mind, as he tries to sort through the chaos of constant stimulation in hopes of finding harmony in the random images and ideas.

"Those who do not have the gift of ADHD will likely feel a little overwhelmed with the barrage of stimulation, while those with the gift will probably feel right at home," Saunders said.

The Lower Gallery features local photographer Kim Whittemore's creative photo composites and digital illustrations. Her exhibition is titled What's Your Story, which allows the viewer to participate in her work by starting or finishing the story that Whittemore sets before them in her seamlessly layered and nuanced images.

An artist reception will be held Thursday, September 7th from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm, with the artists in attendance and available for discussion with the attendees. The reception is free and open to the public with appetizers and wine served.





NEWS RELEASE: USAF awards contracts for new nuclear missile to Lockheed, Raytheon

AIR FORCE NUCLEAR WEAPONS CENTER PUBLIC AFFAIRS

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- The Air Force is on track to replace the aging AGM-86B Air Launched Cruise Missile with modernized weapon capabilities designed for its nuclear bomber fleet, to include the B-21.

Today, the Air Force awarded contracts to Lockheed Martin Corporation and Raytheon Company to mature design concepts and prove developmental technologies for the new Long Range Standoff weapon.

"This weapon will modernize the air-based leg of the nuclear triad," said

Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson. "Deterrence works if our adversaries

know that we can hold at risk things they value. This weapon will enhance our ability to do so, and we must modernize it costeffectively."

Each company was awarded a contract of approximately \$900 million, with an approximate 54-month period of performance. Upon successful completion of the contracts, the Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center will choose a single contractor for the Engineering and Manufacturing Development and Production and Deployment phases of the program.

The current Air Launched Cruise Missile was first fielded in the early 1980s

with a 10-year design life, and Lockheed and Raytheon are charged with developing the technologies and demonstrating reliability and maintainability of a replacement weapon. The aging ALCM will continue to face increasingly significant operational challenges against emerging threats and reliability challenges until replaced. The Air Force plans to start fielding LRSO in the late 2020s.

"Secretary Wilson and I are responsible for organizing, training, equipping, and presenting ready nuclear forces to the Strategic Command commander," said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein. "The Long Range Standoff is a

critical capability required to support Gen. John Hyten's war plans."

"The LRSO will be a reliable, long-ranging and survivable weapon system and an absolutely essential element of the nuclear triad," Gen. Robin Rand, commander of Air Force Global Strike Command, told the House Armed Services Committee's Strategic Forces Subcommittee in May. "The LRSO missile will ensure the bomber force continues to hold high-value targets at risk in an evolving threat environment, including targets deep within an areadenied environment."

"These contract awards mark another important step in replacing our aging

Air Launched Cruise Missiles," said Maj. Gen. Scott Jansson, commander of the AFNWC and Air Force program executive officer for strategic systems.

"Continued competition will help ensure the bomber leg of the nuclear triad is cost-effectively modernized with a survivable, reliable, and credible standoff capability."

The LKSO program office, located at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida, is part of the AFNWC Air Delivered Capabilities directorate. Headquartered at Kirtland AFB, AFNWC is responsible for synchronizing all aspects of nuclear materiel management on behalf of Air Force Materiel Command, in direct support of Air Force Global Strike Command. The center has more than 1,100 personnel assigned to 17 locations worldwide, including at Hanscom AFB, Massachusetts; Hill AFB, Utah; Eglin AFB, Florida; Tinker AFB, Oklahoma; and at Ramstein AB, Germany.




