MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

"Yesterday, December 7th, 1941, a date which will live in infamy, the United States of America was suddenly and deliberately attacked by naval and air forces of the Empire of Japan."

With those words, President Franklin Roosevelt ensured America would never forget Pearl Harbor.

Betty Anderson was only 15 years old, but this would be a day she and her family would never forget.

"I was out Sunday afternoon with a couple of girls [when it happened]," said Anderson, sister to Navy Fireman 1st Class Lawrence Fecho. "[At the time] we didn't think too much of it."

Lawrence was assigned to the USS Oklahoma in Pearl Harbor. His ship was struck by nine Japanese torpedoes,

causing it to capsize. 429 sailors and marines were trapped, giving the ultimate sacrifice, their life.

"I thought it was impossible he was dead," said Anderson. "We all thought maybe he went to town and stayed overnight. We just received Christmas cards from him. [But] a few days after, we were told he was killed."

In 1943, the Oklahoma was removed from the ocean and the bodies were recovered. Due to the lack of technology at the time, many were buried without being identified. They were laid to rest with a shared memorial stone.

Lawrence was still missing.

72 years after recovery and with the advance in technology, the Department of Defense announced plans to identify the originally unidentified remains of those killed and buried.

Lawrence was one of the missing who were identified.


He was finally returned home to North Dakota, on Aug. 13, 2017. He was

laid to rest at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Willow Creek.

Lawrence was welcomed by Willow City natives, Minot Air Force Base

streets for Lawrence's return.

"I think this community has answered the call pretty well," said Bill Fecho, Willow City mayor and Lawrence's nephew. "The amount of support we're getting is unbelievable."

Support came from not only the community, but also military members from Minot AFB.

"I supported the memorial to serve those who served before me, especially those who lost their lives while serving," said Tech. Sgt. Matthew Knight, 5th Force Support Squadron NCO in charge of officer and enlisted promotions, retirements and separations. "I will try to attend as many of these returns as possible,

they deserve it."

The funeral also brought Lawrence's extended family together. Approximately 40 relatives from all over the country attended the return.

"We would never get together without something of this magnitude happening," said Bill. "It brought the family close."

The memorial was an example that those who serve and lose their life live on to this day.

"I feel it's our duty as Airmen and as Americans to support those who answer the call to protect this country and to pay our respects to them and their families," said Knight. "I ensure that the member and their families know that they are not forgotten."



Twentieth Air Force Prepares for Inaugural Olympic Flag Exercise

F.E. WARREN AIR FORCE BASE, Wyo. --

The 20th Air Force will hold its first week-long, Olympic Flag exercise at F. E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming, to bring ICBM operators from the three missile wings together to demonstrate their expertise and to collect best practices across the ICBM force.

"I'm really excited about our new approach to Olympic Flag," said Maj. Gen. Anthony Cotton, 20th AF commander. "Similar to Flag Exercises seen across the Air Force, this one meets two of my objectives; witnessing the readiness of our line missile combat crew members and all the activity from mission planning, instructing and debrief in a simulated operational environment. Olympic Flag is about tapping the shoulder of certified crews and instructors and seeing them showing off their stuff. And like other Flags, we can garner best practices to incorporate across the Numbered Air Force."

Cotton randomly selected the operators from each missile squadron to participate in the exercise.

"Eligible members were missile combat crew commanders and deputy missile combat crew commanders that aren't marked as experienced, and instructors assigned to the missile squadrons," said Capt. Bryce Acres, 20th AF ICBM Nuclear Command, Control and Communication operations chief. "We established criteria to select younger operators to provide them with a unique training experience that they can build upon as they move forward in their careers. These are the Airmen who are out doing the mission every day and will provide the opportunity to gather lessons learned that can then be applied to the whole crew force."

Let's Harvest Apples for Good Health

used as the symbol for health for good reason. Eating more apples as part of an overall healthful diet may help lower our risk for diabetes, heart disease, stroke, cancer and even asthma, according to some studies. Apples are a good source of fiber,

pples

often

are

vitamins and minerals. In the U.S., we often have many types of apples to choose from in grocery stores. Apples are "onthe-go" snacks with less than 100 calories per medium apple. Visit www. ag.ndsu.edu/fieldtofork and click on "Learn More ...," then "Apples" for more information about selecting, preparing and preserving apples. Check out all the other fruit and vegetable links, too.

Try These Tips:

 Add apples to your recipes. Rinse apples under cool, running water. Slice into prepared oatmeal, over lettuce salads or blend into smoothies. Grate some apple into your favorite muffins or quick breads.

• Bake apples as a quick dessert (with fewer calories than apple pie). Remove the core to create a "well" in each mediumsized apple. For each apple, mix 1 tablespoon brown sugar, 1 tablespoon rolled oats, and a sprinkle of cinnamon and nutmeg. Pack mixture into the apple "well" and add 2 to 3 tsp. of butter or margarine to the top of the stuffed apple. Place apples in baking dish. Add a small amount of hot water in an 8- by 8-inch baking dish (1 cup for four apples). Cover the top of pan with aluminum foil and bake at 375 F for 40 to 50 minutes (until apples are tender).

• Make homemade applesauce. Select fullflavored apples. Wash apples, peel if desired, core and slice. To each quart of apple slices, add a cup of water; cook until tender. Mash or puree (in blender) and add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar, if desired, for each quart of hot puree, stirring until dissolved. Cool and package in freezer containers or bags. Seal and freeze. For easy stacking, freeze the bags of applesauce on a tray.

• Freeze apple slices.

Select firm, crisp,

full-flavored apples. Wash, peel and core. Slice medium apples into twelfths and large sizes into sixteenths. To prevent apples from darkening during preparation, dissolve ½ teaspoon ascorbic acid (found in the canning section of grocery stores) in 3 tablespoons water. Sprinkle over the fruit. Place treated slices in a single layer in a steamer basket; steam 1½ to 2 minutes, depending on thickness of the slices. Cool in ice cold water; drain. Pack apples into freezer bags or containers. Press fruit down and leave about ½ inch at the top to allow for expansion during freezing. Seal and freeze. See "Freezing Fruits" (FN182) at www.ag.ndsu.edu/ foodpreservation/freeze for more information.

• Dry apples or make fruit leather for snacks. See "Drying Fruits" (FN1587) and "Making Fruit Leathers" (FN1586) at www.ag.ndsu.edu/ foodpreservation/dry for free directions.

PRAIRIE ADVENTUR

A few opening hunting seasons can be checked off the "to do" list – archery

deer and dove in particular. Now it's time to focus on what seems to be drawing less attention in recent years – sharp-tailed grouse and partridge. Oh, and don't forget ruffed grouse season for those who love North Dakota's forested tracts, albeit as limited as they are. And tree squirrel season gets underway, as

Yup, those seasons open Sept. 9.

To honor those species, let's test one's knowledge of the critters hunters will seek as they trek the prairie – and maybe hills and forests:

Let's play trivia: *Trivia Question Number One: What upland game bird has occupied North

Dakota's prairie grasslands the longest?

*Answer: Sharp-tailed grouse. Native to the state, sharptails have lived on the prairie for thousands of

*Trivia Question Number Two: What is it about a sharptail's tail that distinguishes it from other North Dakota grouse species?

*Answer: It's pointed tail. Hmmm, maybe that's why it's called "sharptail"?

*Trivia Question Number Three: This is, admittedly, a tough two-part question...what year did the N.D. Game and Fish Department first stock Hungarian partridge and what country did they directly acquire them from?

*Answer: The department purchased about 100 pairs of partridges directly from Czechoslovakia in 1923, housing them at the former Grafton Game Farm until released in 1924. Boanyone getting this answer correct.

*Trivia Question Number Four: What year was North Dakota's first partridge season?

*Answer: The Game and Fish Department allowed

partridge hunting for the first time in 1934.

*Trivia Question Number Five: Are ruffed grouse native to North Dakota?

*Answer: Yes. Just as sharptails have been on the prairie for thousands of years, ruffed grouse – ruffie is its nickname – have been on the North Dakota forest landscape the same amount of time.

*Trivia Question Number Six: True or false ruffed grouse "drum" on logs or brush piles in groups of multiple males during spring courtship rituals.


*Answer: False, solitary males "drum", unlike other grouse where several males gather at sites known as

*Trivia Question Number 7 (can't forget those squirrels): Another true and false question – both grey and fox squirrels are native to North Dakota.

*Answer: False, grey squirrels are native, although they've expanded their historic range. It's believed they only occurred in woody southeastern North Dakota areas in the early 1900s. Fox squirrels, however, likely arrived in the southeast sometime in the 1940s, perhaps from Minnesota and South Dakota. They, too, have expanded their range across the state.

OK, now that everyone is armed with either newfound knowledge about some of the state's huntable critters - or confirming one's expertise - it's time to take to the field when the seasons open.

Just a final word about the early hunting seasons - beware of blue-green algal blooms and the potential for blue-green algae. Also be sure to rest dogs nus points are awarding to often, don't hunt them in hot weather, and carry water. If a hunter is hot and thirsty, hunting dogs will be many more times as hot and thirsty. Heat exhaustion and heat stroke is real for humans and dogs, alike.



- ½ onion, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 3/4 pound ground beef, 80:20 ratio of lean to fat 3/4 pound ground sweet Italian sausage

- 1 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 28 ounces tomato sauce

- 15 ounces ricotta ½ cup shredded Parmesan ¼ cup basil,chopped

- 1 egg 18-20 cooked lasagna noodles
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella ½ cup marinara sauce, to serve

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C). In a large pot over high heat, add oil, onions, and garlic, and cook until they begin to brown, stirring occasionally. Add the beef, sausage, salt, and pepper, cooking until all of the moisture has evaporated and the meat is starting to brown on the edges, breaking the meat up as you stir. Add the tomato sauce, then reduce heat to a simmer, cooking the sauce down until the mixture becomes extremely thick, almost paste-like. Remove from heat and set aside. In a bowl, combine the ricotta, Parmesan, basil, and egg, mixing until smooth. Set aside. Slice 6 of the lasagna noodles in half. These will serve as the layers in between the meat and the cheese mixture. Spray a bundt pan with nonstick cooking spray, then lay about 10-12 noodles into the bottom of the pan, fanning them out in an overlapping pattern. One end of the noodles should be just as tall as the center of the pan, and the other end of the noodles should hang over the sides of the pan. Sprinkle half of the mozzarella into the bottom of the pan on top of the noodles. This will help bind the noodles together when cooked. Spread half of the meat mixture evenly in a ring over the top of the mozzarella, then lay half of the cut noodle pieces over the top to create a noodle layer. 10. Spread all of the ricotta mixture over the noodles in an even ring, then layer with the rest of the noodles and the rest of the meat sauce. Fold the edges of the lasagna noodles hanging over the sides of the pan back towards the center, creating another overlapping pattern. Sprinkle the rest of the mozzarella evenly on top. Bake for approximately 45 minutes, or until the cheese is a deep golden brown. Cool for about an hour, then carefully invert the ring onto a cutting board. Slice the ring, then top with any extra Parmesan and basil. Place a small bowl filled with marinara at the center of the ring, for dipping. Serve!
