

WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- October is Energy Action Month across the federal government, and for the Air Force, it represents an opportunity to remind Airmen of the role energy plays in fulfilling the Air Force's mission.

The Air Force theme this year, "Protect the Power," calls on Airmen and the larger Air Force community to practice smarter, more efficient energy and water consumption behaviors to enhance mission assurance.

"With threats to our power infrastructure increasing -- in numbers and severity -enhancing mission assurance through energy assurance is critical to readiness. Now is the time to address these challenges; every kilowatthour, every gallon, and every idea counts," said Richard Hartley, acting assistant secretary of the

Air Force for installations, environment and energy.

"As we look to the future, improving resiliency through optimized demand and assured supply will play a key role in enhancing our combat capabilities. We need every Airman to play a part, reducing their demand for energy and innovating to bring resilient and efficient approaches to the table," Hartley said.

The Air Force consumes significant quantities of energy protecting the nation's interests. With so many of our missions operated from our bases, building resilience, reliability and efficiency into energy operations is vital to our combat capability. To achieve these objectives, Mark Correll, deputy assistant secretary of the Air Force for environment, safety and infrastructure,

encourages Airmen to participate, both at work and at home.

"Energy Action Month is an important reminder to everyone that energy is a critical aspect of all Air Force missions," said Correll. "Regardless of where or what the mission is, we require electricity and fuel to operate. By increasing their energy awareness and understanding, Airmen make energy a consideration in all they do and, in turn, increase our capabilities."

"Fuel consumes 82 percent Energy's Energy of the total Air Force energy budget, however increasing energy efficiency means more than just cost savings," said Roberto Guerrero, deputy assistant secretary of the Air Force for operational energy. "Making energy a consideration in future platforms and looking at current processes for ways to optimize energy use is the key to bringing greater combat capability, more training, and lower sustainment costs to the Air Force mission."

Airman making smarter energy choices and integrating energy efficient technologies and fuel optimization measures has a direct positive impact on combat capability. That is why the Air Force is challenging Airmen to increase their awareness of the energy and water they use, understand its impact on the mission, and continuously look for ways to better utilize these critical resources.

This means many Airmen taking small steps, such as turning off lights. And it means the Air Force making large enterprise-level moves, such as energy savings performance contracts that finance multimillion dollar energy saving infrastructure

improvements or optimizing fuel use and increasing training opportunities by adjusting aircraft training routes. No matter the size or complexity of the change, every Airman can take action to "Protect the Power."

Upcycled Custom Guitar Exhibition The Musical Journey Begins

he Taube Museum of Art Main Gallery will feature Williston artist Beau Theige's **Custom Guitars** October 17- November 17, 2017. Theige is a husband, father, and hobby rancher on the windswept plains of North Dakota and says, "Although I am not a guitar player myself, I was instantly intrigued by this varied and unique craft, and thus the journey began. If you want to get trendy, it's called "upcycling." Each guitar is handcrafted, inspired by everyday utilitarian objects, antiques, or plain old trash. Half art, half junk, but all guitar. Theige would also like to change the way you make

Born and raised in North Dakota and the oldest of eight children, Beau Theige became fascinated by art in all forms at a young age. He attended country school through eighth grade in Williston and then graduated in 1999 from Ray High School. While Theige has held various positions in the work force throughout the years, Beau Theige Custom Guitars

has since become his full-time occupation. His interests have taken on many forms over the years: woodworking and mixed media, pastels, and acrylics, Beau has found his calling with his most recent guitar adventure. Proud of his North Dakota heritage, Theige strives to infuse his guitars with true North Dakota spirit, incorporating barn wood and kitchen objects, which remind him of spending time in his grandmother's kitchen on their dairy farm north of Ray.

Since December 2015, he has created over 160 guitars and sold over 120. His guitars can be seen coast to coast from L.A. to Florida, and even as far as London. He's thrilled to have been featured in the Williston Daily Herald, Talkin' the Bakken magazine, Midwest Living (online edition), and on Prairie Public Radio. Theige resides in rural Williston with his wife of thirteen years, Larissa, and their three children. There will a public reception for the artist on October 19th from 5:30 to 7:00 P.M. with refreshments and acoustic guitar

music by local musician Leonard Haabak.

The Lower Gallery will feature Permanent Collection Staff Choices during the same time frame. Each member of the Museum staff has selected some of their favorite 'staff picks' from the Permanent Collection. The nineteen pieces are a sampling of the 206 pieces in the Permanent Collection, and both 2D and 3D pieces are represented, such as Hidden Man by Gary Kahle, Interaction by Carissa Schriock, and The Red Farm by Charles Beck.

Buffalo Chicken Mozzarella Bombs



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 3 oz cream cheese, softened
- 3 tablespoons mayo 1/4 cup buffalo sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- cup cooked and shredded chicken
- 2 oz crumbled blue cheese
- 2 green onions, chopped
- can (12 oz) Pillsbury Homestyle Butter Tastin' refrigerated biscuits 2 oz fresh mozzarella, chopped

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 375°F. Grease a 10-inch cast iron skillet with 1 tablespoon butter. Set aside.

In a medium bowl, combine cream cheese, mayo, buffalo sauce, salt, chicken, blue cheese and green onions. Stir until

Using your hands or a rolling pin, flatten each biscuit into a 4 inch round. Place a couple tablespoons of the buffalo chicken filling and a piece of fresh mozzarella in the center of each

Wrap dough around filling, pressing edges to seal. Place seam side down in prepared iron skillet, leaving a little room for spreading. Continue until all biscuits have been completed. Bake for 16 to 18 minutes, or until golden brown. Top with parmesan and serve warm!



responsibility and we own

The Air Force faces significant challenges in space because America's adversaries know how important space is to the U.S., Wilson said.

She added the Air Force is responsible for providing the world's first utility, which is the GPS system. This global system which the U.S. military uses is the same system that industry relies on. Whether it's the local ATM or the stock exchange, the GPS is at the center, Wilson said.

"A huge part of our economy is dependent on what's done in space," she

The Air Force must deter a conflict in space, and has an obligation to be prepared to fight and win if deterrence fails.

To that end, the 2018 presidential budget proposed a 20 percent increase for space, which Wilson said is the next frontier of global innovation. The Air Force remains committed to

gaining and maintaining space superiority across the spectrum of conflict in defense of the nation, she added.

"We need to normalize space from a national security perspective," said Wilson. "We have to have all of our officers who are wearing blue uniforms more knowledgeable about space capabilities and how it connects to the other domains."

Wilson added in the future, space will no longer be a benign environment, soon it will be a common domain for human endeavor. Accessibility to space is growing rapidly as launch technology evolves, the cost of launches will drop from thousands of dollars per pound of fuel to hundreds, the technology will get faster and smaller, and more nation-states and individuals will have greater access to

"Our most recent launch out of Cape Canaveral was a Space X rocket that launched, and then recovered using GPS guidance technology back on the pad from which that stage launched," said Wilson. "That wasn't possible 10 years ago, but it's being done by American innovation. It's an exciting time to be part of this enterprise."
