

Reserve Citizen Airman key in Florida veterans court

TAMPA, Fla. (AFNS) -- Joseph Stickle thanked the arresting officer when he was picked up for heroin possession in his hometown of Tampa, Florida, earlier this year.

"He saved my life," said Stickle, Navy veteran with a 35-year history of drug and alcohol abuse.

The arrest cost him his marriage and kids but led him to Senior Master Sgt. James Salgado and the 13th Judicial Circuit Veterans Treatment Court, which helped him keep his job of 19 years at the Department of Veterans Affairs, rebuild his life and avoid a felony conviction.

Salgado, an Air Force Reserve Individual Mobilization Augmentee at U.S. Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida, is one of the senior mentors and the operations director for the Tampa-area Veterans Treatment Court, both volunteer positions; he served as Stickle's mentor while the vet went through the rehabilitation program.

A Veterans Treatment Court is a non-adversarial, problem-solving court dedicated to helping veterans who were honorably

discharged or separated and, thru commission of a misdemeanor or felony offense, became involved with the criminal justice system. VTCs are often affiliated with the local VA and bring together specially trained judges, case workers and volunteer mentors to rehabilitate veterans and reintegrate them with their communities. Instead of a jail sentence, veterans are placed into a recovery program. In many cases, if they graduate, they are free to go and leave the program with charges dropped. The 13th Circuit Court's VTC was established in 2013, one of nearly 500 in the nation, and has served as a model for other courts nationwide.

"It's an incredibly unique courtroom and process that brings all sorts of specialties to bear on veteran rehabilitation," said Michael J. Scionti, 13th Judicial Circuit VTC judge, also an Army Reserve judge advocate.

According to the Justice For Vets website, a national non-profit that works to promote the VTC model, veterans suffering from service-related mental health issues, such as post-traumatic

stress disorder and traumatic brain injury, often fall into patterns of substance abuse or criminal activity after leaving the support network they had in the service. Nearly half of veterans suffering from PTSD and TBI never seek treatment and there are currently over 180,000 incarcerated veterans.

Prior to gaining access to the rehabilitative services available through the VTC, veterans must appear before the judge, who does discovery and confirms they are eligible based on their service record and the type of crime committed. Once they are enrolled in the program, which ranges from 6 to 18 months depending on the crime, the veteran is connected with a mentor, like Salgado, who keeps them accountable and helps them connect the dots on the numerous resources available through the VA and community organizations. The Tampa VTC even

provides access to chaplains and therapy dogs.

"It's a complete, end-to-end solution," said Salgado, who related the story of one veteran who was able to successfully stand in front of the judge only after a local organization provided him with a therapy dog that helped him cope with his PTSD.

Scionti said the VTC model keeps veterans from serving jail time for issues that stem from their time in the service. Instead of delivering punishment, the program helps address the root issues, such as PTSD and military sexual trauma, which brought the veteran into contact with the law in the first place. The judge added that the court is made up of a whole cadre of volunteers and professionals who are there to help veterans rehabilitate and reintegrate into society.

As the third largest city in Florida and home to two of the heavy lifters in the

global war against terrorism - U.S. Central Command and USSOCOM - Tampa has a large veteran population. Retired Army Col. Darryl Reyes, who has been involved with the local VTC from its beginning, said they have witnessed and handled countless cases of post 9-11 combat veterans who committed criminal acts that were service related to such VA diagnosed disorders as PTSD, TBI, substance abuse and military sexual trauma.

"If there were ever a venue where a VTC was needed, I would say that Tampa is that place," he said.

The 13th Circuit Veterans Treatment Court has one of the largest dockets in the country and enjoys an 80 percent success rate, said Reyes, who was responsible for building the mentor program when the VTC was launched in 2013.

Snow control

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- Last winter, Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, received a record-breaking 52 inches of snow.

Although this amount doesn't fall every year, Team Minot stays ready through the Minot AFB Snow and Ice Control Plan approved by base leadership.

"We have a snow and ice control plan that's routed up through both wings," said Tech. Sgt. Marcus Hines, 5th Civil Engineer Squadron NCO in charge of pavement and construction equipment. "We are given their mission requirements, then develop the plan accordingly."

Every year, this plan is reviewed for accuracy and sent up to both 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing commanders for approval before the end of the fiscal year. This date is set to ensure the plan is in place before the first snowfall of the season.

Additionally, pavement

and construction equipment Airmen, aka "Dirtboyz", attend a one-week snow school.

"We receive training on the loaders, sanders, blowers, and anything else we'd be using through the winter," said Airman 1st Class Christopher Schroeder, 5th CES Dirtboy. "We also go through how to set-up for the winter."

Despite all this training and preparation, Dirtboyz still experience some difficulty during winter when personnel and dependents drive during base closure.

"Some people don't realize that when the base is closed due to weather, we still have a job to do," added Schroeder. "If they're out and about, it slows us down."

Improperly parked cars also pose a problem.

"If you're going to park your car while assigned to an alternate duty location, have a plan to move your car during the winter," said Hines. "Parked cars make it difficult for us to complete

our job. If it's not moved, any car will get covered in snow and could affect future snow removal."

According to Minot AFB's Snow and Ice Control Plan, cars in uncleared lots are required to be moved to cleared lots.

In dormitory parking lots, the central dorm management team will be notified three days prior to snow-removal operations to ensure all vehicles will be moved. Any vehicles still located in parking lots will be ticketed by the 5th Security Forces Squadron or towed at the owner's expense.

For Airmen at an alternate duty location, or on leave for longer than a week, the squadron mobility NCOs or squadron orderly rooms will verify if the individual has taken care of their vehicle by parking it in the temporary duty location parking lot or leaving a key with someone who can move it.

There are three designated TDY parking lots, each with a clearly-marked sign

designating them as such.

At 220 Tanker Trail, Airman Leadership School, vehicles owned by missile field security Airmen may be parked in the row closest to the road and part of the next row. Other dormitory residents may park their cars in the remaining spots.

At 587 Tanker Trail, softball field parking area, vehicles may be parked up to the first two light posts.

At 455 Summit Drive, Pride Building, vehicles may be parked in the east parking lot.

To stay ahead of inclement weather, download the free Team Minot mobile app from the Google Play Store or iTunes.

Installation status updates will be sent as push notifications directly to a smartphone.



North Dakota Department of Health seeks to raise awareness during National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week

BISMARCK, N.D. -- To raise awareness about preventing lead poisoning in children, the North Dakota Department of Health is participating in National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week October 22-28, 2017.

Lead is a highly toxic metal that can cause adverse health effects for both children and adults. Approximately half a million U.S. children ages 1-5 have blood lead levels above 5 micrograms per deciliter--the level at which the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend corrective action.

With no obvious symptoms, lead poisoning often goes unrecognized. Lead poisoning in children can result in flu-like symptoms, learning and behavior problems, lower IQ, slowed growth, neurological problems and even death at very high levels.

Preventing a child's exposure is the best way to avoid lead's harmful effects. The most common source is lead-based paint used in buildings before

1978. However, lead can also be found in soil, dust brought home from a workplace, certain types of plumbing, and even some older or imported toys.

Children spend most of their time at home and at school. Both environments can be potential sources of lead hazards.

Parents can reduce a child's exposure to lead in the home by taking the following steps.

- **Understand the Facts.** To reduce children's exposure, lead hazards must be identified and controlled or removed safely. More information can be found at www.epa.gov/lead/protect-your-family-exposures-lead.

- **Get Your Home**

Tested. Before you buy or remodel a pre-1978 home, ask for a lead inspection by a North Dakota-certified, lead-based paint risk assessor or inspector.

- **Use Lead-Safe Work Practices for Renovations.** Hire an EPA-certified renovation, remodeling and painting general contractor to use lead-safe work practices

on any renovation which may disturb known or assumed lead-based paint.

- **Get Your Child**

Tested. Even if your young children seem healthy, ask your doctor or local public health nurse to test them for lead. Children 6 years and younger are most at risk since this is the age of greatest development and growth.

- **Test the Drinking Water in Older Homes.** Plumbing in some older homes, mainly built before 1930, may contain lead which could leach into drinking water. Learn more at www.epa.gov/ground-water-and-drinking-water/basic-information-about-lead-drinking-water.

To help schools determine any lead risk, the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction and the North Dakota Department of Health have begun a voluntary assessment program. Information can be found at www.ndhealth.gov/MF/leadinschools.html.

PRAIRIE ADVENTURES

North Dakota Big Game Records Book, 7th Edition, published 2017.

Archery season is nearing the midway mark for deer; pronghorn is a wrap, bighorn sheep season opens Nov. 3, moose and elk seasons are underway, and the regular deer gun season opens Nov. 10.

It's definitely a busy time of year for hunters even if upland hunting was far from what it's been in the past.

For hunters, this is the trophy time of year.

When it comes to hunting, the definition of a trophy is truly in the eyes of the beholder. For some, when it comes to big game, it has to be big antlers or nothing. Yet for many others, the big game experience is just that, a trophy of an experience.

It might be those much-sought-after big antlers.

Or it might be a young hunter's first deer – and a doe, at that.

The Boone and Crockett Club established minimum standards for big game species antlers and horns, not to mean that a big game species with large antlers is the only way to define "trophy".

Instead, it established the standards as a means to encourage hunters to take older, mature animals at a time when wildlife as a whole was in its deepest, darkest days in terms of populations.

It didn't matter what species – wildlife populations had plummeted and part of the reason was commercial hunting taking big game animals regardless of size and method.

In the process, the Boone and Crockett Club developed the tradition of Fair Chase. The club required hunters with animals qualifying for their record book adhere to Fair Chase rules.

Fair chase is the guiding principle behind the Boone and Crockett Club and its big game record books, regardless of the species.

It's also the guiding principle of the "North Dakota Big Game Records Book, a compilation of qualifying North Dakota's big game

species submitted by hunters who verify fair chase by signing the Boone and Crockett Club scoring form used to qualify for entry.

Theodore Roosevelt helped found the Boone and Crockett Club in 1887 and sought a way to separate legitimate hunting, which was being lumped with commercial market hunting.

The concept of Fair Chase helped to provide separation while connecting hunters with conservation.

The concept of Fair Chase served as the foundation for many game laws in place in today's society.

While Fair Chase is an unwritten rule, a moral compass, the Boone and Crockett Club defines Fair Chase as "The ethical, sportsmanlike, and lawful pursuit and taking of any free-ranging wild, native North American big game animal in a manner that does not give the hunter an improper advantage over such animals."

The club also laid down standards: Hunters would obey all applicable laws and regulations and respect customs of the locale where the hunt occurred.

Hunters would exercise a personal code of behavior reflecting favorably on one's "abilities and sensibilities" as a hunter.

Hunters would attain and maintain skills necessary to make a quick and certain kill.

Hunters would not bring dishonor to the hunter, the hunted, or the environment.

And, finally, hunters would recognize these standards are meant to enhance the hunting experience of the relationship between predator and prey, one of the most fundamental relationships of humans and their environment.

Fair Chase truly is a hunter's moral compass. The question today is how many possess that compass and apply it in their hunting experience, whether pursuing feather or fur?





Handmade children's books at Northwest Art Center

Minot State University senior art student Maroah Lowry will exhibit a collection of her handmade books, "Children's Stories from Around the World," at the Northwest Art Center's Gordon B. Olson Library Gallery November 7 through 28, 2017. An opening reception with the artist will be Thursday, November 9 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. at the gallery.

For the project, Lowry selected seven children's stories, each representing a culture from one of the world's continents, created illustrations, and then crafted each story into a handmade book. Lowry used different art media,

papers, book binding techniques, and illustration styles to reflect the origins of each tale.

"The stories our parents tell us shape our formative years, teaching us right from wrong, introducing us to concepts such as guilt, empathy, and courage, as well as forging bonds between the storyteller and the listener," said Lowry. "I hope that bond can be felt in this setting, even though the original storytellers are separated from us by miles and generations."

Lowry is a native of Livermore, CA and moved to Berthold, ND in 2006. She currently resides in Minot with her husband Ryan. She is in pursuit of a

Four surprising ways shorter days affect your budget

NDSU EXTENSION COLUMN

For many people, autumn is a season of low energy bills. The air conditioner is no longer running nonstop, and days when the heater will be constantly on are yet to come.

However, another well-known characteristic of autumn (days getting shorter) can lead to higher bills in other areas of life.

Home Lighting

When it gets dark earlier and the sun rises later, electric lights stay on longer. Even if no one is home, security may require keeping the house from looking empty when everybody is out past sunset, which is a strong

possibility in "9 to 5" households this time of year.

What you can do:

- Use light bulbs that return the most electricity for your money, not necessarily the ones with the cheapest per-bulb price. (Consumer Reports has an online section on choosing the best bulbs.)

- Turn off the lights in any room you aren't currently using. If you've been leaving every light on all day even in summer, don't wait any longer to change that habit!

- Install a timer, so you can come home to a well-lit house without burning the bulbs all day.

Take advantage of natural light when it's available. Open your curtains! If you worry about heat leakage or privacy, there are many inexpensive window coverings that insulate and shield while still letting in sunlight.

- Use lamps with adjustable brightness when you need light in only part of a room.

- Enjoy dinner by candlelight now and then!

Medical Bills

Chances of injury and extra medical bills increase when you can't see where you're going.

What you can do:

- If your home has stairs,

Candy Corn Cheesecake



INGREDIENTS:

Crust
2 cups graham crackers, crushed
2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
6 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
1 pinch salt

Filling
32 oz cream cheese
1 1/3 cups sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
1 cup sour cream
1 cup heavy cream
4 large eggs
1 pinch salt
Red food coloring
Yellow food coloring
Candy corns, for decoration

INSTRUCTIONS:

For crust, pulse graham crackers in a food processor until they are ground. Then stir in with sugar, cinnamon, a pinch of salt and melted butter. Find a plastic cup and a slightly larger plastic bowl or container that you can cut apart. Set the containers in your springform pan before you add your crust to the pan. Don't cut out the bottoms yet though for the cup and bowl. Make filling by adding cream cheese and sugar to a stand mixer (or use a hand mixer). Beat the cream cheese until it is light and fluffy. Add in eggs one at a time, followed by sour cream and heavy cream. Then add the vanilla and pinch of salt. Pour filling into your pan without the crust and divide it evenly between the center cup, the middle layer, and outer layer. This is just to make sure you have the correct amount of filling for each layer. Remove the layers and keep the amount of filling separate for each part. Leave the center layer (in the cup) white. Color the filling that is in the middle layer (bowl) with mostly yellow, but a few drops of red until it reaches a deep orange color. Color the outer filling with just yellow. You'll need a lot of yellow to get a really rich color. Clean out your springform pan now, dry it well, and press your crust into the bottom of the pan. Bake it at 350°F for 10 minutes. Then let it cool. Now take your plastic cup and bowl and cut the bottoms out of each. Set them on your cooled crust. Pour the layers into each section. White in the very center, orange in middle, yellow on the outside. Since you already measured the layers, they should be perfect. Remove the dividers in each layer being careful to scrape down the sides of each divider. Then spread out the filling to it's even. Try not to mix the colors though. Wrap the springform pan tightly in foil and bake the cake in a steaming water bath for 90 minutes at 325°F. Check it and if the cake isn't mostly firm then bake it for another 20 minutes. When cake is firm, turn off oven heat, and slightly crack the oven door. Let the cheesecake cool slowly in the oven for one hour. Remove cheesecake and let cool at room temperature, then chill for 30 minutes. Remove springform pan and decorate with candy corns.

install light switches at both top and bottom so you can turn the stairway light on and off as needed.

- Wear shoes with good traction. When sidewalks are frosty, consider keeping strap-on cleats handy (a pair in the house and a pair in the car).

Many people feel "down" when days grow short. Many even develop full-blown seasonal depression. Too often, the "solution" chosen is to spend extra money on not-particularly healthy snacks and similar indulgences.

What you can do:

- Try healthier means of cheering up.
- Spend extra time with loved ones.
- Make yourself a cup of herbal tea or a bowl of

nutritious soup.

- Exercise or practice yoga.
- Listen to some happy music or watch a comedy program.
- Soak in a hot bath.
- And if "down" feelings are particularly painful and persistent, see a doctor.

Home Entertainment

Chances are you spend much of your post-daylight time at home, often in the company of a television or other "screen." There are options for enjoying indoor evenings without putting additional kilowatts on the electric bill.

What you can do:

- Read a book (the old-fashioned kind) together as a family.

Play board games.





He added that the VTC program currently saves the county tax payers almost \$6 million annually. The court is currently tracking approximately 200 veterans and maintains a bi-weekly docket of more than 80, a number that continues to grow as word spreads about the program's success.

"It's the only court where expanding the docket is a good thing," said Scionti.

Salgado said his drive to help other veterans stems from his father, a World War II combat veteran who came back with PTSD and struggled with drug and alcohol dependencies for many years.

"I always had it in me to help veterans," said Salgado, who has mentored veterans from his father's generation to the present one.

As a senior mentor in the Tampa VTC, Salgado supports the five to ten veterans, like Stickle, who are assigned to him at any given time; he also manages the other volunteer mentors. His team of mentors keep the veterans accountable and connect them with community services, including transportation. They were giving out bus passes but found the veterans burned through them at an unsustainable pace. Salgado had a solution - bicycles.

The Reserve Airman, who has ridden bikes his whole life, began collecting donations of used bicycles, mostly 26" men's mountain bikes, tuning them up and then donating them to the VTC veterans who needed transportation. Not only were the bikes a more affordable, long-term solution to transportation, they also provide the veterans with an avenue to fitness, another important aspect of the treatment process. Salgado said that most of the buses in Tampa have bike racks, anyway, so the rider can easily combine modes of transportation.

Additionally, Salgado is also the program operations director for the VTC, a role he estimates takes him about 30 hours a week to fulfill. He maintains all of the administrative functions, including processing the weekly docket and assigning mentors. He is also in court with the veterans every two weeks.

Reyes, who recruited the individual mentor augmentee into the program, said Salgado's senior rank, leadership, operational experiences and people skills not only made him the ideal veteran mentor but also facilitated his quick rise in the VTC ranks to his current position.

"He has earned the praise and the respect, not only from the Judge, judicial

support staff and supporting organizations, but also from his fellow mentors and the veteran defendants in the program," said Reyes.

When he's not helping rehabilitate veterans, Salgado is on duty with USSOCOM, where he is assigned as an Air Force Reserve Individual Mentor Augmentee and also serves on active-duty orders as a foreign disclosure officer in the intelligence directorate. He is responsible for brokering information with partner nations and works closely with other military organizations, as well as government agencies in Washington, D.C., Salgado is the only Airman with letter-granting authority for disclosure approvals.

Individual mentor augmentees are part of Air Force Reserve Command's Individual Reserve program, which also includes the participating individual ready reserve. Augmentees are assigned to active-component organizations and government agencies all around the world, augmenting their full-time counterparts and providing a way for an organization to plus-up on manpower when the need arises.

Salgado said his chain of command at MacDill AFB is very supportive of his work with the VTC and he often recruits new mentors, something the VTC is always looking for, from the senior non-commissioned officer corps on base. Salgado added that the reward is well worth the investment for anyone giving their time to support the court.


"We make (the veterans) work, this is not an easy road," said Salgado. "But, when you see them graduate, that's the bread and butter for mentors - you've given them their lives back."

Navy veteran Stickle said he started using drugs at the age of 13 but put that on hold when he entered the service in 1986. Then, during Desert Shield and Desert Storm, he witnessed a ferry boat accident in which 21 sailors died. This took an emotional toll that led him back to his old habits. He left the Navy in 1992 and things went downhill from there.

The former drug addict described himself as being at rock bottom when he walked into his first VTC hearing. But, through the support of his mentor and the resources made available to him, such as Alcoholics Anonymous and the VA, he has started living a life he didn't know was possible. He credits Salgado's mentoring and friendship as key pieces of his success.

"Without VTC, I'd be a dead man," said Stickle. "By offering me something I could follow, it made all the difference in the world."

Hill AFB maintainers support F-35A first Asia appearance during Seoul ADEX 17

HILL AIR FORCE BASE, Utah (AFNS) -- Twenty-seven Hill Air Force Base maintainers and accompanying support equipment loaded into a C-17 Globemaster III Oct. 13, 2017, bound for Northeast Asia's largest air show to support the F-35A Lightning II's first time

on Asian soil. Seoul International Aerospace and Defense Exhibition, also known as Seoul ADEX 17, offers a venue to deepen U.S. relationships with South Korea and enhance regional security while also giving 388th and 419th Fighter Wing maintainers a sense of interoperability and cultural awareness by working in another country.

"With this temporary duty, we gain an increased understanding of how other platforms and countries conduct maintenance and daily operations," said Lt. Col. Jennifer Phillips, 388th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron commander. "Boots on ground in a location other than home gives us breadth and increased understanding we're able to pass onto peers, subordinates and leaders alike for application in future movements."

In preparing to take the F-35A to Asia for the first time, the maintenance team focused on daily requirements such as upgrade training, maintenance discipline and

operational risk management practices.

"We train like we fight," Phillips said. "We pride ourselves on by-the-book maintenance, safety and wingmanship. Living these principles everyday prepares us for any assignment and complying with our maintenance directives and guidance will always ensure success."

Air Force officials said participating in Seoul ADEX 17 indirectly supports theater engagement goals

and objectives, while further enhancing relations with other Pacific nations. It also provides a unique opportunity for the U.S. to showcase its aviation expertise and promote strong military-to-military ties with South Korea allies and friends.

Besides the F-35A, other U.S. assets supporting Seoul ADEX 17 include the Air Force F-22 Raptor, A-10 Thunderbolt II, C-17 Globemaster III, C-130 Hercules, B-1 Lancer, KC-135 Stratotanker, E-3 Sentry,

U-2 and RQ-4 Global Hawk. Additionally, the Navy is supporting with one P-8A Poseidon and the Army is supporting with one CH-47F Chinook.

The first operational F-35As arrived at Hill AFB in October 2015. Hill currently has 27 F-35As and will eventually be home to 78 aircraft and three operational squadrons by the end of 2019. The active duty 388th Fighter Wing and Reserve 419th FW fly and maintain the aircraft in a total force partnership.
