

Wright eyes indefinite enlistment, awards program changes for enlisted force

ORLANDO, Fla. -- The Air Force's top enlisted Airman provided updates on the status of issues affecting the enlisted force Oct. 27, 2017, at the 2017 Airlift/Tanker Association Symposium in Orlando, Florida.

Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright addressed hundreds of mobility Airmen, current and former Air Force leaders, joint and combined forces partners and industry representatives, as part of the three day professional development event focused on the rapid global mobility enterprise and the Airmen who execute the mission.

Wright's remarks highlighted initiatives nearing completion and fielding, such as adjustments to awards program timing and process requirements. He also brought news of options, like a possible indefinite enlistment timeline, which are earlier in the consideration process.

He began by addressing the culture of Air Force units and how leadership and the establishment of positive culture impacts retention. Retention of enlisted aircraft maintainers and other Airmen with skills key to operational success remains a significant challenge and focus in the Air Force and in Air Mobility Command specifically.

"My question to you is, 'how do we keep them?!" Wright said. "Not just how do we retain them, but how do we keep them motivated, how do we keep them encouraged, how do we keep them inspired? Because that's how they come to us. They come to us motivated, encouraged, inspired, agile, innovative, ready to roll. They come to us feeling a sense of connection. They come to us feeling a sense of purpose."

"But, somewhere along the way, something happens," he said. "Some of it has to do with the nature of our business; some of it has to do with our extremely high ops tempo, which I don't perceive decreasing any time soon. Some of it has to do with what we as an Air Force have to get after: some of the additional duties, computer-based training, and moving things out of the way. We are doing a lot of work in that arena. But most of it has to do with the level of leadership and encouragement you provide... the environment you create as leaders in our Air Force. That's how we get Airmen to stay, how we keep them motivated and inspired. That's how we keep them resilient; how we utilize them and keep them thinking and being innovative."

Wright then provided updates on the ongoing changes intended to reduce administrative burden, increase mission focus, give Airmen time back and enhance quality of life. Noting that upon return to the Pentagon, one of the first things he has to do is arrange to reenlist, Wright received a round of applause from the gathered Airmen.

"Don't clap," he said with a smile. "I've been in the Air Force 28 years, almost 29. And every four years, I've got to go through the 'Yeah, I'm still here.' Now, it's a time-honored tradition; I love it, but I think we'd like to get to once you hit your 15-year mark, then you're an indefinite enlistment -you're good until your high year of tenure. If you have a selective reenlistment bonus or something, we'll make sure you have the right active duty service commitment. Because I believe at 15 years of service, most of us are plugged in, dedicated and ready to roll. We're still doing the research. We like to go slow to go fast to make sure we understand all of the benefits." A topic closer to fruition is reduction of the time needed to produce an awards nomination, as well as adjusting the weight of mission focus and job performance on the forms. "We're really close on our goal of reducing the number of lines on our [awards packages] for the annual awards program," Wright

said, noting the current number of 27 bulleted accomplishments required for a nomination. "So we'll get that down to about 16. I like 12 and four. So 12 in job performance and then four in the 'Whole Airman' concept. That gets us to the point where 80 percent of what you're evaluated on is your job and primary mission, and 20 percent is the other things that we ask you to do as Airmen."

Once that change is official, Wright said he hopes major commands and other earlier levels of competition will follow suit and mirror the requirements at the Air Force level.

As Wright expressed his commitment to looking for ways, along with Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein and Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson, to recruit, train, motivate and retain the Airmen critical to conducting operations and delivering hope around the globe, he challenged the A/TA audience members as well.

"Here's one thing I would ask you to focus on: be committed. Be committed to our Airmen, be committed to our Air Force, be committed to being great leaders. Be committed to being great Wingmen. Reach deep down inside and recommit yourself to this Air Force and to these Airmen," Wright said. "They need you and they deserve you. Because they want to be committed to you. And so of all the things that I can ask you to do, and there's a lot -- the one thing I would ask you is to decide. You can't be on the fence. Because Airmen know it and they see it. At the end of the day. attitude truly reflects leadership." In conclusion, Wright channeled the Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius with a slight adjustment of the emperor's famous quote. "Don't waste your time arguing about what a good Airman should be. Be one!"



North Dakota Property Listed in National Register of Historic Places



BISMARCK, N.D. – A former church building in Lakota has been listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The National Register of Historic Places is the federal government's list of properties it considers worthy of preservation and recognition.

The Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd in Lakota was designed by George Hancock with close collaboration from Bishop William D. Walker and built between 1884 and 1886. This stone church is an excellent example of the High Victorian Gothic/ Second Gothic Revival architectural style. In addition to its architecture, this church represents the progressive cultural presence of the British gentry who promoted the town and sponsored building the first school in Lakota along with this church.

Contrary to some misconceptions about the National Register program, listing in it does not prevent owners from altering their property, restrict the use or sale of the property, or require establishing times that the property must be open to the public. Entry into the National Register of Historic Places does give a property prestige, provides protection from adverse effects in federally assisted projects, and provides eligibility for certain preservation financial incentives.

"It's just being smart when you handle wild game."

Deer season for 40,000plus hunters gets underway Nov. 10 and the milliondollar question is...how well are you up on your safe game handling procedures?

OK, a person has a clean cutting surface and clean knives.

However, safe handling of wild meat goes far beyond keeping things clean and deer hair out of sausage trimmings.

Part of the reason is to ensure tasty meat.

The other reason is that some wildlife diseases are transmittable to humans. Consider bovine tuberculosis (TB), which originated in domestic livestock. It can be transmitted to wildlife species such as coyotes, deer, and elk.

And, if one isn't careful, it can be transmitted to humans handling infected animals. "Basically, what it comes down to is there are diseases (in wildlife) to be aware of," explained N.D. Game and Fish Department wildlife veterinarian Dan Grove.

As an example, Grove only has to point to neighboring South Dakota: A recent outbreak of bovine TB occurred in several livestock in northwestern South Dakota, prompting S.D. Game, Fish, and Parks Department to test an array of wildlife species in the region. None of the animals – coyotes, raccoons, pronghorn, and deer – tested positive for the disease.

Over in North Dakota, the Game and Fish Department has tested for bovine TB over the course of many years and it has never been identified in wildlife in North Dakota.

Tuberculosis is an example of why it's important

transportation, keeping the carcass elevated from the metal of a pickup box.

Wash hands with warm water and use clean equipment and knives when field dressing. Try not to have clothing, which also can carry bacteria, contact the carcass.

Wear disposable gloves and in the event you cut yourself, immediately clean the cut.

Wash knives after field dressing or if cutting through anything "oddlooking"," Grove described. Grove offers his washing

Grove offers his washing technique when he works with wild game: Use hot, soapy water, rinse, soak utensils with a solution of 10 percent bleach – or hand sanitizer – for 5 to 10 minutes, and rinse.

He also suggests using knives with plastic or metal handles. Being porous, wooden handles can harbor things a person doesn't want harbored, plus they're harder to clean. Havel's makes a knife system with disposable, surgical quality blades with plastic or metal handles and are Grove's go-to choice when cutting and processing wild game.

Hunters – and the public – should stay away from sick or dead animals. People can report such sightings to a local game warden or the Game and Fish Department.

In many instances, it's difficult to find a sick animal again or determine cause of death when carcasses aren't fresh, however.





Caramel Apple Pie Bombs



INGREDIENTS:

8 oz. can of refrigerated crescent rolls (8 crescents) 8 unwrapped caramel candies (one for each crescent) 8 Tbsp.chopped apples from apple pie filling (1 Tbsp. for each crescent)

Cinnamon sugar mixture

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat the oven to 350 F, line baking sheet with baking paper and set aside. Unroll crescent roll dough and separate the triangles. Place one caramel and about 1 Tbsp. chopped apples from apple pie filling on each triangle, roll the dough tightly, seal the edges, then roll between your palms to form the ball. Roll each ball into cinnamon sugar mixture and arrange onto baking sheet leaving 2 inch space apart. Bake for 12-15 minutes until the bombs are golden brown. Serve warm.




