AGE: Flight line surgeons

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

On a mere 20-degree morning, Airmen walk through the doors of an illuminated building containing massive pieces of equipment ready for maintenance.

An Airman opens his locker and puts on a pair of coveralls and safety glasses. After opening the toolbox and letting out a deep breath, he looks at his project and begins the four-day "heart" surgery.

As a heart pumps blood throughout the human body, a -86 diesel generator produces and distributes power to equipment. Senior Airman Dustin Holmes, 5th Maintenance Squadron aerospace ground equipment technician, starts by excising a skeletal frame protecting the generator, much like ribs protecting the heart.

"Generators are used on the flight line by maintainers to power the aircraft," said Master Sgt. Brian Steele, 5th MXS AGE flight chief. "We provide the equipment so crew chiefs can begin their pre-flight inspections and get the aircraft ready to depart."

These Airmen, AGE technicians, are responsible for equipment used on the flight line.

"Our job is critical to the mission on the flight line," Holmes said. "We provide generators and other servicing equipment to maintainers working handson on the aircraft. We ensure they have the equipment they need at the drop of hat in order to keep aircraft mission-capable."

As "jacks-of-all-trade", AGE technicians provide equipment to units from both the 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing.

While temperatures stay below zero for multiple days during the winter months at Minot Air Force Base, this does not stop AGE technicians from supplying heaters to the flight line and missile complex so other

Airmen can stay warm while completing their mission.

Aerospace ground equipment technicians also maintain and inspect over 600 pieces of equipment.

"We maintain equipment that is 30-40 years old," Steele said. "We break equipment down to the core to replace generators and engines, and we also fix electrical and hydraulic issues."

After a successful transplant, Holmes and his team begin to reconnect wires and replace bolts. As they restore the generator to its original form, the rejuvenated piece of equipment is inspected and placed back in line ready to power-up a B-52H Stratofortress.



Slow Cooker Honey Garlic Chicken



4 Large bone-in Chicken Breasts, skin removed

/2 cup low sodium soy sauce

/3 cup honey

1/3 cup hoisin sauce

2 tablespoons rice vinegar teaspoon sesame oil

2 teaspoons fresh ginger, minced 1/4 teaspoon red chili flakes


5 cloves garlic , minced 1 small onion , finely diced

2 tablespoons cornstarch

INSTRUCTIONS:

Combine soy sauce, honey, hoisin sauce, rice vinegar, sesame oil, fresh ginger, garlic, chopped onion and chili flakes. Place chicken breasts in slow cooker and pour sauce on top. Cook on low for 4-5 hours. Remove chicken from slow cooker and shred, set aside. In a small bowl, combine 3 tablespoons of water and cornstarch. Place liquid from slow cooker into a saucepan and bring to a boil. While stirring the liquid, add cornstarch mixture a little at a time and stir until thickened. Let boil 1 minute. Pour sauce over shredded chicken and stir to combine. Serve over rice with desired toppings.








Congratulations To Our Super Sunday Prize Winners

Why WIC: linking families to nutrition

She sat in the doctor's office, 26 weeks pregnant with her second child. Time seemed to stand still as the doctor walked in and gave her a diagnosis she never expected: cancer.

Through countless weeks of treatment, and a radiation session, she counted down to the birth of her child. After a few more weeks, she was called back in for more radiation. That appointment marked the beginning of her child's formula days.

"Just the small containers that last about three days are \$16, which can add up to about \$300 a month," the mother said. "You can imagine the toll it takes on you when you still have to buy diapers, wipes and clothes for the baby, as well as everything else for your family.'

Upon confiding in a friend about her financial struggle, she was informed about assistance she may qualify for: Women, Infants and Children (WIC).

As a nutrition and education program, WIC is designed to assist qualifying pregnant and breastfeeding women, new moms, infants and children under five. The program may also assist any other legal guardian who takes care of a qualifying infant or child under five.

"Once we determine a family is incomeeligible for the program, we do a health screen to determine if the family is nutritionally-eligible," said Jackie Cenis, WIC program leader at Minot Air Force Base and international board-certified lactation consultant. "From there, we create a nutrition plan and carry-out education during each visit depending on the family."

After every appointment with the WIC office, the family-in-need receives a voucher or check designated for certain WICapproved foods. Families may use these vouchers or checks in stores that accept them, including the base commissary.

The vouchers can be given for more than just formula for infants, as the mother in the story needed. Cenis works with families to develop a WIC-approved food list that includes fruits, vegetables, milk, whole grains, eggs, peanut butter, cereal, formula and baby food. Accepted foods on shelves at the commissary are marked with an orange sticker.

"In a household with my husband working and me going to school, we don't make a lot," said the mother. "WIC has helped us tremendously with ensuring we can afford food for our family. They also educated us on what is needed for each stage of growth with our children.'

Pamphlets with additional information and recipes can be given during every appointment, said Cenis. New recipe pamphlets containing only WICapproved foods are released every week and include the serving amount and nutritional facts.

"We provide a nutrition

education piece to help families," said Cenis. "We want to teach moms, dads and legal guardians how to feed their children so they may grow up healthy. We want them to know what works and what doesn't."

The WIC office also has access to many resources in order to refer families to different agencies they may qualify or need.

"Right now, my oldest is five and youngest is 16 months, and we still receive help from WIC," said the mother. "The biggest struggle was actually making the call to see if we qualified. Don't be afraid of being embarrassed or judged, it's there for a reason: to help."







The Workforce Recruitment Program connects federal and private sector employers nationwide with jobseeking college students and recent graduates with disabilities. The program is sponsored by the Defense Department and the Department of Labor.

In support of this initiative, the Air Force **Equal Opportunity** office works with the major commands and individual bases to raise WRP awareness among managers and hiring officials.

"Each year, the Air Force provides summer or temporary jobs to

more than 35 motivated interns with disabilities who are eager to prove their abilities in the workplace," said Kendra Duckworth, Air Force EO disability program manager. "Our goal is to double the number of internship opportunities this year, so we can increase the representation of persons with disabilities in the federal workforce."

WRP recruiters conduct interviews with interested candidates from accredited colleges and universities from across the country. Candidates represent all majors and range from college freshmen to graduate and law students. Information from the interviews is loaded into a searchable database for hiring officials, who can register at www.wrp.gov to review candidates and rank top selections.

WRP internships run

from Jan. 15 to Sept. 30 each year and are funded by the DoD at no cost to the unit. If desired and if a vacant position is available, the Air Force organization may convert the intern into a permanent position without a competitive

announcement at the end of the internship.

"The Air Force takes pride in striving to be a model employer for individuals with disabilities and is committed to maximizing their opportunities while supporting the overall mission," said Mary Villarreal, Air Force Personnel Center human resource specialist.
