Together, one team one fight

She skimmed by the crowds of people in the narrow hall, moving her eyes rapidly to each door she passed at the Air Force Academy in Colorado. Her eyes fell on the training grounds for the Drum and Bugle Corps.

A myriad of people spoke to her, but there was one snare drummer that stood out.

"He was the only upperclassman that wasn't a jerk," Col. Catherine Barrington, 91st Operations Group commander, said with a smile. "There wasn't anything romantic, he was just a really nice person."

A year and a half passed as friends until their relationship was tested.

"I had a death in the family and a lot of trouble getting to them," said Cathy. "When I told him, he not only let me borrow his car, but was really supportive of me. It was kindness that you don't find often."

After this incident, they grew closer. During a trip to Aspen, Colorado, to perform a parade, he took a leap of faith and asked her on a date. Although she was hesitant, she agreed.

"After another week of being around one another and him asking me out on another date, I couldn't deny that there was something about him that made me want to be with him," said Cathy.

A few months before his graduation, they began dating.

One May evening, the couple was walking through the streets of the Academy. Their eyes fell on the chapel, bringing questions to their minds. The Air Force Civilian Force Development Program offers more than 25 programs to help civilians develop leadership skills and expand their overall knowledge. They include the Civilian Associate Degree Program, Squadron Officer School, Education with Industry, Air Command and Staff College (in residence or the online master's program), Air Force Legislative Fellows Program, Air War College (in residence), National War College, the Defense Senior Leader Development Program and more.

Three new courses are slated for the 2019 academic year: the White House Leadership Development Program (open to GS-15s), Leading Effectively Through Change (open to GS-14s and GS-15s) and Leading Strategically (open to GS-15s). Leading Strategically is a one-week course that recently replaced the Leadership Development Program.

"These programs provide education and leadership opportunities that help prepare Air Force civilians to successfully meet

across a wide range of operations and missions," said Esther Chavarria, CDE program manager at AFPC. "Professional education enhances one's skills and knowledge and is central to the



Green Goddess Mac and Cheese



INGREDIENTS:

- 8 ounces baby spinach
- 1 bunch parsley, tough stems removed, about 1 cup packed of leaves
- 1/2 pound (2 cups) dry elbow macaroni pasta Salt for pasta water
- 1 Tbsp cream
- 3 Tbsp butter
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 3 Tbsp flour
- 2 1/2 cups milk
- 1 1/2 cups shredded white sharp cheddar cheese

1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese 1 teaspoon herbs de provence (or dry tarragon or Italian herb mix)

- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce and/
- or 2 finely chopped anchovies
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard 1 teaspoon lemon juice

Salt to taste

INSTRUCTIONS:

Blanch spinach and parsley: Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add the spinach and parsley and blanch for 1 minute. Use a slotted spoon to remove the wilted spinach and parsley to a bowl of ice water. (Do not discard the blanching water, you will use it to cook the macaroni.) Strain the spinach and parsley. Wrap in paper towels and squeeze out excess moisture. Use blanching water to cook macaroni: Return blanching water to a boil. Add salt to the pasta water, 1 Tbsp salt for every 2 quarts of water. Add the macaroni pasta and cook until very al dente. (If the box of macaroni says to cook it 7 minutes, cook it 5. It will continue to cook and absorb moisture once you mix it with the sauce.) Drain the macaroni, rinse with cold water to stop the cooking, and set aside. Purée spinach with cream: While the macaroni is cooking, in a food processor, purée the cooked spinach mixture with the tablespoon of cream until smooth. Set aside. Make roux with butter, garlic, flour: Melt 3 Tbsp butter in a thick-bottomed pot on medium high heat. Add the minced garlic and cook for 20-30 seconds. The butter should bubble and foam. Add the flour and whisk to form a paste. Lower the heat to medium and cook for 1 to 2 minutes. Slowly add milk: Slowly add the milk, whisking as you add it to break up any clumps of flour. Increase the heat to medium high and let the mixture come to a simmer, continue to whisk. Lower the heat to medium low and let cook until the sauce is thick enough to coat the back of a spoon. Add dry mustard, pepper, herbs, Worcestershire: Stir in the dry mustard, black pepper, herbs, and Worcestershire sauce if using. Add the cheeses: Whisk in the 1 1/2 cups of grated white sharp cheddar and 1/2 cup grated Parmesan. Stir until the cheese has melted and the sauce is smooth. Add puréed spinach and parsley: Stir the puréed spinach and parsley into the sauce. If using finely chopped anchovies, you can add them in now. Taste the sauce for salt. Add more if needed. Add cooked macaroni: Stir in the cooked drained macaroni pasta. The pasta will continue to absorb liquid as it sits in the sauce, so don't be alarmed if the mac cheese seems really loose (the macaroni will continue to absorb moisture as it sits). Stir in lemon juice. At this point you can eat as is, or you can put into a casserole, top with a little more cheese and broil it for 5-10 minutes.

The Pursuit, an ever-growing, Minot-based church is took a big step last Sunday, celebrating the grand opening of moving into a permanent home. The new building is located at 515 20th Ave SE in the former Magic City Harley Davidson building and services will be held at regular times Sunday, 9 a.m., 10:45 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Last Sunday's gathering celebrated the newly renovated space and welcomed key individuals from the project, city officials and everyone from the community to come experience a service in the new building. All are welcome to attend.

The Pursuit is just shy of its 5th birthday. In April 2013, it made a splash in the local news with billboards announcing the first service for the new church that read "New Church in an Old Strip Club." While that downtown building, the former Chicago Club, served well for a time, the church quickly outgrew the space and began meeting in locations across town.

Each Sunday for the past few years, volunteers have set up and tore down "church" in hotel ballrooms, city parks and even the state fair grounds. Over time, the church grew to more than a 1,100 attendees per Sunday, making it one of the fastest growing churches in ND, and making it increasingly difficult to find a local space that could accommodate the crowd.

"We are excited to focus all of the time and energy we have put into setting up and tearing down in various locations into ministry," Nick Bawden, Executive Pastor said. "We will be able to invest in people's lives and Minot in a greater

Acquiring the building came with challenges. Once leaders decided to purchase the building, they had six weeks to raise the money necessary to move forward with the project. Between community

partnerships and member contributions, the funds were raised and the project began June 2017.

The completed building has a dynamic, flexible space that can support the church's ministries as they function.

"We brought in many mobile concepts we learned along the way to have a building that can be stewarded well for maximum impact," Bawden said.

As has become the culture within the church, the completion of the building project is a culmination of the efforts of many.

"We are blown away at the radical generosity of people given and sacrificed to make this project happen," Bawden said. "We want to thank all those who have given to this project over the last year. We also want to thank our local city officials, Hight Construction, and Prairie Engineering for working with us to make this happen.'

While the church continues to grow and flourish in this new space, Bawden said the focus remains on helping people in Minot connect in small groups outside of large Sunday gatherings.

"We believe that when people are connecting relationally in a meaningful way, real life change can happen," Bawden said. "Groups focus on being there for each other, praying for each other, and encouraging each other to take the next steps in their faith regardless of where they are at.

"Our hope is that as we reach more people we can continue to get people connected relationally and see groups continue to drive our mission in North Dakota.'





AF officials announce creation of Info Ops tech school

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- Air Force officials have announced the creation of a new Information Operations technical training school, which is expected to open in fiscal year 2019.

The standup of a dedicated training school at Hurlburt Field, Florida, follows the Air Force's creation of the **Information Operations** career field and Air Force specialty code in late 2016.

"Information Operations is not new to the Air Force," said Col. Ziggy Schoepf, 14F career field manager. "However, this is the first time that the Air Force has codified this capability in a dedicated officer career field. With the creation of the career field and a dedicated schoolhouse, the Air Force is acknowledging the importance of Information Operations to the future of warfare."

Prior to the creation

of the 14F Information Operations AFSC, Airmen from various AFSCs served in IO positions as career broadening experiences for a limited period. Because these Airmen returned to their core AFSC following their service in IO positions, the Air Force was limited in its ability to sustain institutional knowledge and practice of IO tactics, techniques and procedures.

Creation of the 14F AFSC enabled the service to standardize education and training for Airmen, building a foundation to cultivate IO expertise and improve a commander's ability to operate in more pervasive and connected information and operational environments.

The 14F Initial Skills Course will consolidate and integrate content from multiple IO-related training courses, such as

IO intelligence integration, military deception, operational security and psychological operations. The 14-15 week-long courses will begin late fiscal 2019. Until the schoolhouse is fully operational, IO students receive training through a variety of Air Force and joint courses that cover the required subjects.

"Although our Airmen currently receive training on the same subject matters, standing up the 14F AFSC allowed us to create a continuum of learning to develop expertise and experience within the Air Force," said Schoepf. "The course will provide students with cohesive training rooted in social science. Graduates will have the skills to build strategies and plans that sustain or change perceptions and attitudes driving the behavior and decision making of relevant actors."




