Minot rescue crew saves man trapped from flood

Members of the 54th Helicopter Squadron at Minot Air Force Base responded to a search and rescue call involving a man trapped in his cabin, surrounded by rising flood water in Savage, Montana, March 24, 2018.

At approximately 2 p.m. the crew received a phone call requesting a hoistequipped aircraft to respond to the scene.

"We quickly came together and thoroughly discussed our objective, fuel considerations, timing, coordinates and communication," said Capt. Vicente Vasquez, 54th HS UH-1N Iroquois pilot. "By the time we got in the aircraft, there was no doubt in my mind that we were going to get this guy out safely.

Vasquez, the aircraft commander during the flight, said upon their arrival they saw the individual stranded in the center of the flood waters, standing on the deck of his cabin as the water steadily rose.

"Thanks to our accurate coordinates, we found the guy really quickly," said Vasquez. "We analyzed the winds and realized we wouldn't be able to land next to his house and walk him to the helicopter so we needed to hoist him up instead. We

then established our hoist and lowered the doctor onto the house's deck from about a 120-foot hover."

After being lowered onto the deck, Maj. Jared Brinkerhoff, 23rd Bomb Squadron flight surgeon, immediately assessed the situation.

"When I got to the individual I quickly evaluated him to ensure he was in good condition," Brinkerhoff said. "My main focus was to confirm he was alright and get him onto the hoist as efficiently and safely as possible."

Brinkerhoff, who trains with the crew at least once a month for search and rescue missions, said his familiarity with how things work during exercises reassured him that things would go well during this particular mission.

"There's a lot of planning and communication we do during training because safety is our top priority," Brinkerhoff said. "When it comes to real-world situations we want to have that musclememory of ensuring everyone knows what to do and are aware of each other's responsibilities."

Likewise, Vasquez mentioned the crew's prior training and mission readiness is what guaranteed the success of their search and rescue.

"We constantly train for

live hoists, search scenarios and evaluating conditions at locations we're unfamiliar with," Vasquez said. "We train countless hours for searches before we even get to our operational units, so we're all familiar with the concepts of search and rescue, which really helps us out there."

The team transported the survivor to a nearby hospital where emergency responders and the individual's family were waiting.

"The most rewarding moment was being able to see the man's wife picking him up at the airport after we dropped him off," Vasquez

said. "We could see on her face that she was so grateful that he was alright."

Vasquez added that the entire operation went well due to the combined effort from several men and women across Minot AFB.

"It was awesome to go out there and execute, but we

had a lot of support around us that helped make it all a success," Vasquez said.

"There were several Airmen and contractors involved with a lot of the mission planning, maintenance, fuels and aircrew flight equipment. We wouldn't have been able to do this without them."





Mini Oreo Cheesecake Cupcakes



INGREDIENTS:

- 12 Oreo cookies whole 6 Oreo cookies chopped
- 16 ounces cream cheese softened
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 large eggs lightly beaten 1/2 cup sour cream

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 300°F. Line a standard 12-cup muffin pan with paper cups. Place one Oreo cookie into each paper cup. In a medium bowl, beat cream cheese, gradually adding sugar, vanilla, eggs, sour cream, mixing well after each addition. Stir in chopped cookies by hand. Spoon batter into muffin pan, filling each to almost the top. Divide batter evenly among cookie-lined cups, filling each almost to the top. Place in the lower third of the oven and bake for 25-30 minutes until firm in the middle. Remove from oven and transfer to cooling racks. Serve and enjoy!



Northwest Arts Center Grand Opening set for April

MINOT, N.D. – Minot State University will commemorate completion of the new Northwest Arts Center, the Walter Piehl Gallery, and the Native American Artifact Collection with a grand opening celebration from 5 to 8 p.m., Thursday, April 19, in the lower level of Gordon B. Olson Library. The dedication program will start at 6:15 p.m.

Mandan-Hidatsa storyteller/ musician Keith Bear, New Town, N.D., and cowboy poet/singer-songwriter D.W. Groethe, Bainville, Mont., will participate in the dedication of the center's Walter Piehl Gallery and the new exhibit space for MSU's Native American collection.

Piehl, who recently retired from a 50-year career teaching art at MSU, is donating a major body of his work to the center's permanent collection. The grand opening exhibit, "Retrospective: Covering 1962-2018," is an overview of his work.

"As far as having a gallery with my name on it, I didn't push it, but if they wanted to do it and thought it would help in promoting the art center, I was happy to go along with that," Piehl said. "I am also happy to be donate a major collection of my work as a permanent display in small parts and large parts here at the center. There is some pride involved with having my name on it, but it's more of my way of saying thank you to the university that has been good to me for, now, going on 48 years. They have encouraged my work and have been helpful in promoting my work outside of the class room."

Heavily influenced by his early experiences on the rodeo circuit, Piehl's works have earned the admiration of collectors across the United States and abroad.

Piehl has said he didn't have access to art museums when he was growing up in rural North Dakota and that he became a teacher not only to pursue his love of painting, but to teach and share his appreciation of art with others. With the creation of the new Northwest Arts Center, MSU now has a museum-quality exhibit space accessible to students, area residents, and people throughout region.

"For our region to have a facility like this one that passes the muster of being a major museum with the kind of climate controls to receive first-class exhibitions was very important to me," Piehl added. "That is the real importance of a project like this."

The 6,730 square-foot facility is transitioning to be the permanent home for the Northwest Arts Center, replacing the gallery located in MSU's Hartnett Hall. The new gallery, display cases, and storage areas are climate controlled, providing protection for MSU's permanent collections and artifacts. Climate control also makes it possible for the Center to exhibit national and international touring exhibits.

"This new arts center will help MSU further promote the arts and be a wonderful source of pride, not just for students, faculty, staff, and friends of MSU, but a great source of pride for Minot and our entire region," said MSU President Steven Shirley.
"Further, within this new center, I can think of no one more deserving than Walter Piehl to feature with a gallery and addition to the permanent collection. What an exciting new addition to the Minot State University campus!"

"It's such a step forward from what we have had here," added Northwest Arts Center Director Avis Veikley. "We were limited in what we could have as shows in the past because of the space. We now have a climate controlled exhibit area and just the shear space we have now is great. I have more lights than I've ever had. There is a great reception area for entertaining people, and we are much more accessible to the general public here than where we were before.'

The Northwest Arts Center will also be the permanent display space for MSU's premier Native American artifacts collection, including the Ralph Hubbard Collection, the Harold Robinson Collection, the Clarence Parker Collection, the Wilson Collection, and the Miller-Tibbs Collection, and as well as other MSU art collections

The gallery hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. Parking and visitor entrance are on the south side of the library. Exhibits at the Northwest Arts Center are free and open to the public.



An Airman's musical journey

Musical notes danced around him as he closed his eyes. He kept his head on a steady nod and tapped his fingers to the beat, letting the melody carry him through a journey he's never been on.

For Airman 1st Class Zane Smith, 5th Force Support Squadron customer support technician, music is his escape.

"Every song has a story to tell and a journey to follow," said Smith. "Music creates an atmosphere that you can't seem to get away from, it's everywhere."

Music has always been a part of his life, but it wasn't until he was 13 that it truly changed his world.

"The night my friend introduced me to the drum and bass genre, it felt like my mind was blown – I wanted to learn more and hear more," said Smith. "It felt like falling in love with someone."

He spent the next few years expanding his horizons and refining his musical tastes. He never turned down a song request from a friend or family member, including his grandmother, who supported him at every turn.

However, his life took a dark turn in the ninth grade when his grandmother died.

"At that time, I felt like I was alone and that no one else could feel how I felt," said Smith.

He relied on music through

that troubling time, to both pick himself up and remember his grandmother.

"It's been a bumpy road, but I realized that if I want to remember her, I have memories of her that I tie with music," Smith said.
"Even though she's gone, she will always be here because of music."

By his senior year in high school, Smith ventured into composing. He purchased a computer program, after months of saving, and reached out to a friend, who happened to be a worldfamous producer, for help. After graduation, he

enlisted in the Air Force. While he couldn't listen to music through basic military training, Smith realized that he had another form of support – his Air Force family.

"Not only do I have music to fall back on, but the family that I have gained over the past seven months," said Smith. "The Air Force has supplied me with great opportunities."

Smith has picked up the necessary skills to not only create music, but also teach others to do the same.

"Music has helped me get through tough times, so I made it my goal to help others do the same – whether it's creating music or just listening to it," he said.

Since then, he has helped another friend produce an album, which led to show bookings and features in other songs.

"It's fantastic that I helped him achieve that," said Smith. "I've always been one to help others grow and succeed.'

Smith's goal is to create impactful and meaningful songs that can convey the emotions he feels, regardless of whether they're good or

"Every day I strive to make a project that not only means something to me, but also to someone else," said Smith.

"I want to save anyone from making a bad decision by listening to a song that really touches them. I want them to know that everything is going to be okay, just like I was okay."

Music is everywhere, from the everyday sounds you hear to the newest releases by popular artists, said Smith. Letting it in can take people through a journey they will never forget, leaving their toughest struggles in the past.

Weather keeps missileers on alert for 72 hours

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

Before dispatching to the field, the crews held a mission-planning meeting where they assessed the weather and prepped for what they expected to be a two-day shift.

"The hardest part for me was not knowing when we were going to go

home," said 1st Lt. Davis White, 741st Missile Squadron missile combat crew commander. "We just kept getting calls saying they were extending our shift for 12 hours, and then another 12 hours, and another."

Because the alert exceeded their typical 24-hour shift, procedures allowed each member of the crew to go above ground to take care of hygiene needs and catch some sunlight every day.

"Getting to go upstairs for sun and conversing with others really made a difference. It was nice to get to talk to someone else besides this guy," said 1st Lt. Miguel Barrios, 741 MS missile combat crew commander, nudging White who sat next to him.

"It can get pretty stuffy in the capsule because there isn't a whole lot of room," added White. "It helps when you're friends with the guy you're downstairs with.'

Although the tour made things like child and pet care a challenge for some crews, White said their wingmen on Minot AFB worked hard to ensure they were taken care

"We felt really supported by the people back on base," added Barrios. "We kept getting calls from people who knew we were going to stay on alert asking if they could help us with anything back home."

Barrios and White said the mindset of other crews they communicated with also helped them get through their shift.

"When we talked on the phone with others at different squadrons they maintained

a positive attitude which really kept us going," said Barrios. "They kept cheering 'lets go for 96 hours!"

To commemorate any lengthy stay, crew members receive a small metal pin with the consecutive alert shift hours on it. White and Barrios, along with the others who worked those three long days, will now get to proudly wear their uniforms with a "72" on their shoulder.
