Tech. Sgt. John Chapman inducted into Hall of Her oes at Pentagon



WASHINGTON (AFNS) --"Chapman, John A. Technical Sergeant, USAF" is now permanently inscribed in the Hall of Heroes at the Pentagon following an induction ceremony Aug. 23,

Nearly two decades after the gallant actions that cost him his life and earned him the nation's highest military award, Chapman's name was unveiled by his widow, Valerie Nessel, Secretary of the Air Force Heather A. Wilson, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein and Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright.

'Our nation endures and continues to be the land of the free because of brave men and women – because of John Chapman," said Wilson.

Chapman's name is now memorialized on the walls inside the Hall of Heroes



amongst fellow service members who have been recognized for combat valor.

"It's a story that will be told and retold for generations, the 'John Chapman story' joins the ranks of other legends like John Levitow and Bud Day," said Goldfein. "This incredible warrior who inspires all of us to be better Airmen."

Chapman is the first Airman since the Vietnam War to receive the Medal of Honor for actions taken.

"Those who knew him knew of his devotion of helping others. He would give anything in his power to help someone," said Wright. "So it's no surprise to any

of us that he be the fourth enlisted Airman, since the Air Force became an independent service, to be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor. John died exactly the way he lived – doing anything in his power he could to help those in need."

Following remarks made by Air Force leaders, Chapman's family was presented with

a memorial plaque and the Medal of Honor Flag.


"I could go on and tell you all kinds of stories about John, but I don't have to...I think you already know what he was like," said his mother, Terry Chapman. "I'm ever so grateful to those who made this possible – I can't tell you how much it means to me and my family."

Chapman was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for actions on Takur Ghar Mountain in Afghanistan March 4, 2002. An elite special operations team was ambushed by the enemy and came under heavy fire from multiple directions. Chapman immediately charged an enemy bunker through thigh-deep snow and killed all enemy occupants. Courageously moving from cover to assault a second machine gun bunker, he was injured by enemy fire. Despite severe wounds, he fought relentlessly, sustaining a violent engagement with multiple enemy personnel before making the ultimate sacrifice. With his last actions he saved the lives of his teammates.

AFCENT changes command in historic ceremony

U.S. AIR FORCES CENTRAL COMMAND PUBLIC AFFAIRS

AL UDEID AIR BASE, Qatar (AFNS) ---

t. Gen. Joseph T. Guastella Jr. assumed command of U.S. Air Forces Central Command from Lt. Gen. Jeffrey L. Harrigian Aug. 30, 2018.

Army Gen. Joseph L. Votel, U.S. Central Command commander, presided over the ceremony, which was held at AFCENT's forward headquarters at Al Udeid Air Base for the first time. AFCENT's headquarters is at Shaw Air Force Base, South Carolina.

"In the coming era of great power competition, it will be our people and our leaders that will be the difference makers as they direct and enable the military operations and activities in support of our enduring national interests," said Votel. "And we will prevail because of the edge they give us. Lt. Gen. Guastella, I have full faith and confidence in your leadership and capabilities."

Guastella was promoted to lieutenant general prior to the ceremony. As AFCENT commander, he will provide the fullspectrum of air component capabilities in air, space

Guastella entered the Air Force in 1987 as a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He has flown the F-16 Fighting Falcon and A-10 Thunderbolt II, served as the wing commander of the 455th Air Expeditionary Wing at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan, has had multiple combat tours and instructed at the U.S. Air Force Fighter Weapons School. Army Gen. Joseph L. Votel, U.S. Central Command commander, stands with

enemies while promoting security and stability in the region.

As the Combined Force Air Component commander for the CENTCOM area of responsibility, he will work closely with coalition, joint and interagency partners across Southwest Asia to ensure stability and defense of a 20-nation region spanning from Egypt to Afghanistan.

"It goes without saying that I am deeply honored to have the opportunity to lead the men and women of AFCENT and to be a partner of this great coalition," said Guastella. "To our Airmen, joint warfighters, and men and women of coalition who get the job done: it's our youngest Airmen who have signed up to serve our nation who inspire me. From aircrews flying missions to maintainers on the flight line in extremely hot temperatures to logisticians moving

fight to support Airmen, you guys are why I continue to serve, so I'm honored to be your new commander and to be a partner with you in this fight."

Most recently, Guastella served as Headquarters Air Force Space Command's director of integrated air, space, cyberspace and intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance operations at Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado.

"Just over two years ago, I was honored by Gen. Votel, our partner nation's delegates, our coalition, joint and interagency partners and the men and women of U.S. Air Forces Central Command," said Harrigian. "It has been an incredible two years.

Harrigian, assumed command in July 2016. He led U.S. and coalition air operations for Operation Inherent Resolve, the mission to

he 2019 National Defense Authorization Act was recently signed, which included a measure that will allow fully-disabled veterans the ability to utilize Space-Available travel.

Under the Disabled Veterans Access to Space-A Travel Act, veterans with a service-connected. permanent disability rating of 100 percent will be able to travel in the Continental United States or directly between the CONUS and Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, and American Samoa (Guam and American Samoa travelers may transit Hawaii or Alaska); or traveling within Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or the U.S. Virgin Islands on flights operated by Air Mobility Command.

Prior to this authorization, only military retirees, meaning those with a blue DD Form 2, and current service members were entitled to this benefit. This particular piece of legislations was originally introduced by the House Veterans Affairs Committee in 2016.


According to lawmakers, this proposal will allow travel on Space-A at no additional cost to the Department of Defense and without aircraft modifications. Additionally, data from the Government Accountability Office noted that roughly 77 percent of space-available seats in 2011 were occupied by

only 2.3 percent of the 8.4 million eligible individuals for the program.

Travelers should contact their local Passenger Terminal for further details and review travel information found on the AMC Travel Page for specific details on the Space A travel program.



Teriyaki Chicken Ramen noodles



Teriyaki Chicken Ramen made in one pot. Everything you love about this takeout favorite, stir-fried with ramen noodles.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb or 2 medium pieces boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 1/8 teaspoon sea salt 1/4 teaspoon black pepper, or to taste
- 3 teaspoons sesame oil divided
- 2 packets dried ramen noodles, seasoning packet discarded (or you can use fresh ramen noodles or for low carb, use shirataki noodles)
- 3 tablespoons olive oil divided
- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 1/2 teaspoon grated or minced fresh ginger
- 2 cups broccoli florets
- 1/2 cup grated carrots

- 1/2 bell pepper cut into thin strips
- 1/2 cup shelled edamame beans thawed if using frozen
- 1/2 cup low sodium soy sauce or gluten free tamari
- 3 tablespoons coconut sugar or brown sugar packed (for lower carb option, use sweetener of choice)
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch or arrowroot starch
- 1/2 2/3 cups water plus more as needed to thin out sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon red chili flakes or Sriracha sauce optional, to taste
- Toasted sesame seeds for garnish and thinly sliced green onions for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1) In a large wok or skillet, prepare the noodles according to package directions. Drain and set aside. Meanwhile, season chicken with salt, black pepper and 1 teaspoon sesame oil. Set aside.
- 2) After the noodles are finished, drain pan and wipe down with a clean damp towel. Heat over medium-high heat. Add 1 1/2 table-spoons olive oil and saute chicken until cooked through, about 4-5 minutes. Transfer to a plate.
- 3) Return pan to heat and add remaining olive oil. Add the garlic, ginger, broccoli, grated carrots and edamame beans. Cook until the vegetables are just crisp tender, about 2-3 minutes.
- 4) Meanwhile, whisk together the soy sauce, brown sugar, remaining 2 teaspoons sesame oil, rice vinegar, cornstarch and water. Stir into pan along with the cooked chicken and prepared ramen noodles. Allow sauce to bubble and thicken up and toss to coat well. Adjust seasonings with salt and pepper as needed plus chili flakes or Sriracha if desired.
- 5) Serve hot topped with sesame seeds and green onions, if desired.

PATRICK AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. (AFNS) -n 1976, esteemed historian and author Laurel Thatcher Ulrich wrote a book entitled, "Well-Behaved Women Seldom Make History." The premise of her work was to shine a light on famous women throughout history who challenged the way

things were done. While the title may seem to be a modernday rallying cry for women to go out and break the rules through misbehavior, that was not the

premise of her message. Ulrich's emphasis was to encourage women to do more – to break with convention, make a mark on history and prove that ordinary people, including women, can have a lasting impact on the world by doing the unexpected.

Today, women from all walks of life are taking Ulrich's words to heart and finding ways to break those proverbial molds as they seek out careers in positions traditionally held by men.

Women make up half the current U.S. workforce, but only 26 percent of them are in STEM – science, technology, engineering and math. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 61 percent of women in STEM are in the social sciences (communication, education, public health, etc.), and only 13 percent are in a hard science field such as engineering.

From an Air Force perspective, 64,367 of the nearly 321,000 Airmen currently on active duty are women. Of that 20 percent,

even fewer are in STEMrelated fields. Air Force leadership is trying to break that cycle.

In a live session with The Washington Post's David Ignatius last month, Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson discussed new Air Force initiatives aimed at inspiring more women to enter scientific

> career fields. During the interview, Wilson elaborated on steps the service is taking to recruit more women.

"One of the things we're trying to do is to encourage more young women to go to engineering school,' said Wilson. "Sometimes the way in which we



talk about engineering is not resonating with our daughters, and it is with our sons. We found that if you look at teenagers, more boys are satisfied by solving the problem. They get satisfaction out of fixing something. A disproportionate number of girls want to know why the problem matters. So, if we say, 'Come be an engineer and you can do cool stuff,' we're talking to

disposal technician communicates with her team, using specialized equipment to render the scene safe. As the training operation concludes and the device is removed from the scene and the Airman removes their helmet.

While many would consider the lifestyle of an EOD Airman a stressful and arduous task to undertake, to Tech. Sgt. Jaqueline Risley, 386th Expeditionary Civil Engineer Squadron EOD equipment non-commissioned officer in charge, this is everything she has ever dreamed

feel I was being challenged enough," said Risley, who is deployed from Seymour Johnson Air Force Base, North Carolina. 'When I was younger, my cousin and I always talked about joining the military. He led the way when he joined the Marine Corps, and I followed suit a few years later when I first visited an Air Force recruiting office.' While her cousin inspired her

I was going to college and didn't

entry to the enlisted force, her older sister inspired her to simply do great things in life. Although she passed away at a young age, Risley said her sister told her to chase down her goals, no matter how impossible they seem and to never follow the status quo.

"The recruiter went over a list of positions," said the Chester, Illinois, native. "After the recruiter explained what EOD was all about and watching the recruiting video, I was convinced it was the job I wanted. If I was seeking a challenge, it was very clear that EOD was going to offer just that.'

Sometimes people get exactly what they ask for. Immediately after her basic training graduation, Risley was flung directly into the 169-day EOD technical school, where she would complete a flurry of physical training requirements and competency tests. This is also where course failure is commonplace.

However, this is exactly the challenge she envisioned, and remembering her sister's words, she rose to the occasion. The mental and physical challenge of EOD is the best part of her job, where according to Risley, the training, technology and tactics are rarely the same from one week to the next.

"The career field is always evolving," said the nine-year Air Force veteran. "We are always training and working toward not only adapting to the ever-changing environment, but finding ways to navigate through those changes with success. Those moments with your team are the most rewarding.'

The moments with her team often include days of clearing and processing explosive materials, providing hazardous material response or developing operations plans. Risley said each task possesses a sense of camaraderie that extends beyond the battlefield, and even helping each

other with the task of wearing their bomb suit often becomes a mini-roast session. However, when duty calls, the team knows they can count on each other; their lives depend on it.

According to Risley, there are more challenges in EOD than insurgent-created explosives, including the obstacles that come along with being a female EOD technician.

She is hopeful some of the stigma can be quelled with the slated implementation of the Air Force's Tier-II physical fitness program. The program establishes a shared baseline fitness standard for Airmen, regardless of their age, rank or gender.

Risley believes there are many people who have preconceived ideas about females being in predominantly male career fields, but she still feels the positive experiences outweigh the negative. She attributed her resilience to her wife, Katie, her 3-year-old son, Jamison, and the supportive supervisors and wingmen throughout her career.

"I have met and worked with some of the most amazing people throughout my career, and I am thankful for each and every one of them," Risley said. "I'm also grateful for those who have mentored me along the way. I owe so much to them, and hope I can repay them by passing on their words of wisdom to others.'

The mentorship she received has helped her succeed in her career thus far, helping her combat the dated mindset some individuals may hold.

"I strive to be identified as an EOD tech first, and a female second when it comes to my career," she said. "The other technicians I have worked with have all been extremely supportive and have done just that. To them, I am not just a female, I am an explosive ordnance disposal technician."



defeat the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria, and against the Taliban and terrorist networks as part of Operation Freedom's Sentinel in Afghanistan.

During his tenure, Harrigian flew multiple combat sorties in the F-22 Raptor as part of OIR.

Over the last two years, the international coalition to defeat ISIS achieved multiple milestones enabled by airpower, including the 2017 liberations of Mosul and Raqqah. Air strikes against ISIS and air operations in support of Coalition and partnered ground forces have devastated the terrorist group, and enabled the final phase of the Defeat-ISIS campaign, Operation Roundup.

Under Harrigian's leadership, the air component supported the Afghan government by striking the Taliban and training, advising and assisting Afghan National Defense and Security Forces, especially the Afghan Air Force.

In 2017, the U.S. began

a deliberate air campaign to strike Taliban revenue sources to pressure them to reconcile with the Afghan government. Earlier this year, in line with the new South Asia strategy, AFCENT re-aligned A-10 Thunderbolts, KC-135 Stratotankers and MQ-9 Reapers to Afghanistan as part of a refocus on operations in Afghanistan.

"What this team is accomplishing every day is something we all should be proud of," Harrigian said. "With over 70 nations and over 21,000 Joint and combined Airmen, it's clear to me the coalition remains strong. Our mission was clear: to deliver the world's most decisive air, space and cyberspace effects for United States Central Command and for our partners."

Harrigian turns over AFCENT to Guastella, who has plenty of experience in the region.

"Lt. Gen. Harrigian, I can't be more proud to follow in your footsteps," said Guastella. "You've taken this very difficult job

as Combined Forces Air Component Commander and taken it to another level. I'm deeply honored to hopefully build on your tremendous success."

Guastella previously served as the director of operations for AFCENT and the Combined Air Operations Center from 2006 to 2007. He also commanded the 455th Air Expeditionary Wing at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan, from 2012 to 2013.

Guastella has flown the F-16 Fighting Falcon and A-10 Thunderbolt II, served multiple combat tours, and instructed at the U.S. Air Force Fighter Weapons School. He has flown more than 4,000 flight hours including combat missions in support of operations Just Cause and Desert Storm. He previously commanded at the flight, squadron and wing levels.

Guastella commissioned in 1987 after graduating from the U.S. Air Force Academy. He thanked his family for their support throughout his career and Harrigian for setting such a high standard.

Harrigian's next assignment will be as the deputy commander, U.S. Air Forces in Europe – Air Forces Africa, at Ramstein Air Base, Germany.

the boys. If you say, 'If you want to make a difference in someone's life; if you want to have clean water or save the life of a family member you love, or make the environment cleaner, or provide energy to the world, be an engineer.' Then we're talking to both boys and girls."

One Air Force entity has made great strides on making Wilson's STEM goals a reality. The Air Force Technical Applications Center, headquartered at Patrick AFB, Florida, is a highlytechnical organization made up of scientists, technicians, engineers and analysts whose role is to detect, identify, analyze and report nuclear detonations underground, in the atmosphere, underwater or in space. It is the sole organization in the Defense Department charged with this vital international mission. Despite its vital role to national decision makers, AFTAC's pool of employees skews heavily male. Of its more than 1,000 members who make up the center's workforce, only 160 are military or civilian women. Even fewer are in STEM positions.

One of the ways AFTAC is looking to increase the number of female employees in technicallyskilled roles is hosting its annual Women in Science and Engineering Symposium. For the past four years, AFTAC has invited the best speakers from various industries academia, defense, corporate and commercial to share best practices on how to recruit, engage, employ and encourage women into hard science career paths.

Rose Day, AFTAC's chief of civilian recruiting, believes the best way to "break the mold" is to expose girls at an early age to the sciences.

"One of the messages
I like to relay to students
when we travel for
recruiting efforts is very
simple: I tell the girls, 'You
are needed.' Everyone
wants to hear those words
because it makes them feel
like they are a valuable,
needed contributor," Day
explained. "We have to be
advocates, we have to set

the example and we have to collaborate. But we can't do this alone. We also have to partner with the men in the room because their advocacy is a critical part to the partnership. That's how we break the mold."

Parveen Kapoor, 23rd Analysis Squadron Atmosphere and Space Operations Flight chief, also believes talent in STEM fields must be groomed early in the school system.

"Recently, there has been a major emphasis placed in this area for young girls, and while I'm completely on board with that, I believe there needs to be encouragement across the board for both boys and girls in STEM," Kapoor said.

When AFTAC celebrated National Pi Day March 14, Tech. Sgt. BreAnne Groth's section was amazed when she picked up a dry-erase marker and began writing out Pi in decimal form from memory. With ease, she surpassed 100 decimal points and stopped only because she ran out of room on the white board.

Math and science have always been a passion of hers, and she applies her knowledge in her everyday responsibilities at AFTAC. As the center's satellite technique alert officer, she is a qualified national expert in analyzing and reporting global nuclear detonations to national decision makers in accordance with ratified nuclear treaties. She is also responsible for monitoring state-of-the-art health and configuration control of more than 200 sensors on 38 orbiting space vehicles.

"This means I'm not only concerned with ensuring and optimizing current sensor performance; I also advise the treaty monitoring community of future constellations and make recommendations for sensors that will be used well after I retire from the Air Force," Groth said. "Any career field may seem like a challenge, but the secret is to embrace and learn from the differences. STEM has so many different kinds of people, including really smart women, but the one thing that we all have in common is our passion for science."






