ir University's Air Command and Staff College Department of Leadership hosted its second annual Leadership Education Development eXperience, or LEDx, last week, promoting the theme of "Diversity at the Intersection of Leadership, Strategy and Innovation."

The two-day conference provided attendees with a blend of keynote addresses, TED Talk-style speaker presentations and interactive small-group lab sessions designed to promote an environment that fosters innovative and diverse thinking from a leadership perspective.

When not engaged in one of the formal events, participants were encouraged to continue the conversation and share their thoughts on what the theme's message means to them.

"This year's theme was intended to spark conversations and generate ideas," said Col. Evan Pettus, ACSC commandant. "We invited speakers who could help (attendees) challenge their assumption about what each of these ideas mean. We believe that cognitive diversity and collaboration are critical components to helping us build leaders capable of adapting to future challenges."

The event was intentionally designed with an unorthodox format, giving those in attendance the opportunity to build their own schedules to match their interests.

"Rather than sticking

to a very military minded traditional format of sitting in a large auditorium for hours, we really wanted to build in opportunities for both the speakers and attendees to engage in discussions, possibly have respectable debates on topics and share ideas," said Maj. Gregory Strong, ACSC instructor and lead coordinator for LEDx.

"The word 'leadership' is difficult for some to define explicitly, and it means something different to people both in and out of uniform and across all ranks," Strong said. "LEDx provides a mode for people to come together and understand that varying perspectives is a good thing and we can all learn from each other."

Straying away from a traditional military-style format, LEDx aimed to open the minds of participants and encourage diversification of thought at all levels.

"We want people to come away from LEDx with an enhanced understanding of the value of varying perspectives related to leadership, innovation and strategy," Strong said. "We see LEDx as a conduit to allowing

people a few days to really step back, assess, engage and digest varying topics under the overarching theme of leadership. Specifically, there may be a topic or perspective that someone heard and completely disagreed with, but there is still tremendous value that can be gained from that perspective."

Although hosted by AU, this event wasn't only attended by Air Force personnel, but also members of all sister services, as well as many international officers and local civilian attendees, which created a unique forum for joint leadership collaboration.

"The very nature of this makeup serves to add value at the forefront; the Air Force gains a huge benefit from building relationships and partnerships while simultaneously engaging in conversations regrading topics related to leadership," Strong added. "Obviously, all of us that serve receive a heavy dose of professional military education no matter what rank and each of those PME sources certainly offer great opportunities to expand on leadership-related topics. However, LEDx seeks to build on those foundational

focal points and allow people the opportunity to really hit the pause button on the daily vigor of ops and share ideas. There is no exam, final paper or briefing to pass LEDx. It is truly a reciprocating experience in that you really get out of it what you put into it."

LEDx truly embodies the chief of staff of the Air Force's three primary focus areas of revitalizing squadrons,

strengthening joint leaders and teams and advancing multidomain command and control, he said

"In order to revitalize, strengthen and advance, we must be able to come together with different perspectives and synergize in order to lead, innovate and strategize," Strong added.

makes maj or changes for 2019

WRIGHT-PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE, Ohio -- The Air Force Marathon opened registration for their 2019 event Jan. 1, with major changes designed to improve the experience for more than 12,000 annual

Marathon staff have added a 1K kids' run, the Tailwind Trot, and extended the Fly! Fight! Win! Challenge that debuted in 2018 to include an option to run either a half or full marathon in addition to the 5K and 10K races.

"We've never had an event specifically for the kids and we think it's time to offer that," said Brandon Hough, Air Force Marathon race director. "Running is an amazing activity that brings so much to people's lives; there's no better way to celebrate that than by inspiring our youngest runners.'

Beyond the new events, other changes include redesigned full marathon, half marathon and 10K courses as well as new start times for the events. The 10K race is now scheduled for 6:30 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 21 listened to all of their followed by the full and half marathons at 7:30 a.m. The Tailwind Trot and 5K race presented by Wright State University are scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. and 6:30 p.m., respectively, Friday, Sept. 20.

"We've altered the courses to not only improve the runners' experience as they make their way through the rich, historic backdrop of Wright-Patterson's military community, but also to ensure proper separation of the different races to make it excitement in the running safer and easier to maintain whatever pace runners chose throughout the event," Hough changes we've made this said.

Runners can also expect changes at the race start with the addition of a corral system with staggered starts based on previous race times or on predicted times. The corral system is intended to create a faster and safer running environment for all participants.

"We can't wait for runners to experience all of the

input on previous events and are excited to see how they enjoy the improved race experience.' Additionally, the Sports and Fitness

Expo held at the Wright State University Nutter Center will now feature more vendor booths, a relocated New Balance Dayton Apparel store and a mobility clinic for disabled runners.

"There is a lot of community for our 23rd race," said Hough. "The year are certainly driving a lot of that excitement.

That excitement was evident as marathon registrations opened with a 22-percent increase over the same date from the previous year. Hough says that while he's encouraged by the numbers, the focus of the Air Force Marathon is. and always will be, on creating the best possible experience for runners.

The 2019 Air Force Marathon is presented by Northrop Grumman, USAA and Boeing and is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 21, 2019. The Sports & Fitness expo is scheduled for Thursday, Sept. 19, and Friday, Sept. 20. The Breakfast of Champions is scheduled for Friday, Sept. 20, from 8 to 10 a.m. and the Gourmet Pasta Dinner is scheduled for Friday evening, starting at 5:30 p.m. For more information about the Air Force Marathon, go to www.usafmarathon.com.





Chinese **CHICKEN SALAD**



INGREDIENTS:

ASIAN DRESSING

- 2 tbsp light soy sauce (Note 1)
- 3 tbsp rice vinegar (aka rice wine vinegar, or use cider vinegar)
- 1 tbsp sesame oil (toasted)
- 2 tbsp grapeseed oil (or canola or any other neutral flavored oil)
- 1 tsp sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp fresh ginger, grated or very finely chopped
- 1 garlic clove , minced
- 1/2 tsp black pepper

SALAD

.....

- 4 cups Chinese cabbage (Nappa Cabbage), finely shredded (Note 2)
- 1 1/2 cups red cabbage , finely shred-
- 1 cup carrot , finely julienned (see video)
- 2 cups chicken , shredded
- 1/2 cup shallots / scallions , finely sliced on the diagonal GARNISHES
- 1/2 to 1 cup crunchy noodles (I use Chang's) (Note 3)
- 1 2 tsp sesame seeds

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Combine the Dressing ingredients in a jar and shake. Set aside for 10 minutes or so for the flavours to meld.
- Place the Salad ingredients together in a large bowl along with half the crunchy noodles. Drizzle over dressing then toss. (Note 4)
- Divide between serving bowls. Top with more crunchy noodles and a good sprinkle of sesame seeds. Serve immediately!

SOUTHWEST ASIA -nyone who serves, or has served, in the United States Air Force will eventually get asked the same question: "What kind of plane do you/ did you fly?" It's a question that evokes myriad reactions from an eye-rolling chuckle to a head-dropping sigh.

It's an understandable assumption, since the Air Force's mission is to "Fly, Fight and Win." However, less than 4 percent of Airmen rotate in and out to provide are pilots. Even if navigators service 24 hours a day, seven and weapons system officers days a week. The pre-, thru-, are added in, the sum is still around 5 percent of the total range in length, and include force. There are a handful of checking the airframe for other tactical specialties, such cracks and defects, adjusting as combat control and cyber fluid levels, making sure warfare, but the majority of Airmen serve in supporting

One of the largest support structures here at the 332d Air Expeditionary Wing can be broadly defined as aircraft Everything is documented. maintainers. This not only includes those individuals who perform pre-flight, thru-flight (where an aircraft returns from a mission then embarks on another mission within a couple hours) and post-flight safety and function checks, but also several "back shops" which specialize in a certain aspect of the aircraft's function such as weapons, guidance or propulsion systems. All in

all, the ratio of maintainers to triple checking," said Senior are performing the way aircraft here is over 25-to-1.

"(Maintainers) have more responsibility than the majority of Airmen in the Air Force," said 1st Lt. Tate Ashton, 391st Fighter Squadron Sortie Generation Flight commander. "Nobody else is held to a higher level of accountability than they are."

On the flightline, each aircraft has at least one maintenance crew chief and several crew members that and post-flight checks can the landing gear functions properly, the flight controls roles for the entire enterprise. work, checking the tires for structural soundness and running diagnostics on the electrical systems.

"It's a constant double and

parts, and if you don't take your time it's easy to miss something. We have to be 100 percent positive the plane is mission capable."

After an aircraft has surpassed a certain number of flight hours (think of it like miles on an automobile) it is put into "Phase," which Ashton described as "getting a physical checkup." The maintenance crew disassembles the aircraft and conducts an in-depth inspection of all the systems and components. This is a round-the-clock process involving more than 800 maintenance actions which can consume more than 1,500 working in cold weather, and shops are all dedicated to man-hours to complete.

Job satisfaction is the driving force, said Tech. Sgt. Terrance Reese, aerospace propulsion craftsman. It is his responsibility to make sure the aircraft's engines

they should. To do this, the aircraft is secured so it can't move and the engines are run through their various settings.

"It can get very taxing," Reese said. "It's physical work, and you have to battle the elements, but it's worth it. When I see the plane possible." There are several other

specialties and maintenance shops. The Armament Maintenance shop ensures the function and reliability of the weapons systems; Aerospace Ground Equipment provides equipment for use on the flightline such as generators, (maintains aircraft ejection flood lights, heaters for lifts to load munitions onto the aircraft; and the Crash and Recovery unit not only serves as first responders if

there's an accident, but also maintains the equipment to recover incapacitated aircraft all while being the experts with the landing gear, flight controls and aircraft's tires.

The supply shop maintains a massive inventory of nuts, bolts, washers, and other parts used in maintenance while the support section take off I think, 'I made that issues equipment and tools. AL DHAFRA AIR BASE, United Arab Emirates (AFNS) --

he 380th Expeditionary Civil Engineer Squadron Fire Department and Emergency Management flights conducted an outdoor hazardous material exercise at Al Dhafra Air Base, Jan. 4.

The exercise was designed to be a Department of Defense-level HAZMAT certification for three Airmen in the fire department and an annual refresher training for the emergency management flight. The Airmen were instructed to contain leaks on a pressurized chlorine cylinder, a one-ton cryo-tank, and a rail car, all after donning a Level-A suit.

The Level-A suit is a defensive suit designed to protect personnel from chemicals. The 380th ECES Airmen also wore overshoe boots, rubber gloves, and a self-contained breathing apparatus underneath.

With the combination of possible difficulties and problem solving, the teams learned that communication and team work gets the job done.

"Team-oriented training like this only bolsters our capability to respond," said Senior Airman Adam Theriault, 380th **Expeditionary Security Forces** Squadron force protection emergency manager. "The intricacies of communication are impossible to train on without actually putting on the suit and diving in. Communication always takes a nose dive when we get locked in a zip-lock bag while wearing a 16-pound tube on our back, while wearing a mask, and our visibility is restricted. It's a unique situation where we quickly learn how to communicate properly.'

Staying ready comes natural to this dedicated team, as they're always conducting various types of training.

"In order to be a warrior, one must train," said Tech. Sgt. Christopher Dugger, 380th ECES firefighter and HAZMAT custodian. "The fire department does lots of training in all areas that range from fire ground tactics, airfield emergency operations, medical emergencies, rescue and confined space drills, vehicle extrication, HAZMAT operations, and of course, physical fitness drills. In order for the fire personnel to respond to any given emergency situation, we must train and continue to enhance our

readiness."

Members of the collective team brought specialized skillsets coming from different jobs, installations and experiences.

For the 380th ECES as a whole, training always plays a critical role amazing to work with," said in their daily mission to stay ready and protect Al Dhafra AB and its people.
