he 48th Rescue Squadron from Davis-Monthan Air Force Base participated in exercise Razor's Edge April 8-18.

Razor's Edge is a twoweek long exercise in which pararescuemen train to be better prepared for unilateral and joint combat search and rescue operations in any situation and environment. To meet these expectations they endure rigorous training deal with a multitude of reflective of real-world scenarios that they may encounter downrange.

This Razor's Edge included combat rescue officers, pararescuemen, survival, evasion, resistance and escape specialists and multiple combat mission support personnel from the 48th RQS, members from the 943rd Aerospace Medical Squadron and 60th Medical Group critical care air transport and tactical critical care evacuation teams and support from the 79th RQS, 88th Test and Evaluation Squadron, 563rd Operations Support Squadron Aerial Delivery Support Branch and 71st Special Operations Squadron.

we do a thorough mission analysis of the combat zones they'll be deploying to," said Master Sgt. Sean Herlihy, 48th RQS Guardian Angel flight chief. "We look at the most probable courses of action with regard to (infiltration) and (exfiltration) platforms that the teams will most likely be using."

With this information, the 48th RQS sets up scenarios to test the team's abilities. This iteration of Razor's Edge had the pararescuemen distance problems that required personnel and heavy equipment parachute drops and water extractions.

"We have teams who are capable of parachuting into the water and we have helicopter teams who are capable of recovering isolated personnel in a maritime environment,"

Herlihy said.

Going through these exercise scenarios prior to their deployment helps the team establish a clear vision of what's to come and arms them with the skills to successfully execute their core function of personnel recovery downrange.

"It's a fantastic effort from both operations and logistics, and a tremendous amount of man hours goes to it from all sides," Herlihy said. "It's pretty awesome to watch it all come together in the course of two weeks.'

Even after many days out in the field, the 91st Missile Security Forces Squadron Airmen still have responsibilities left.

Once getting back to base, Airmen have a check list of items to complete before getting to go home to rest.

"The Airmen drop off all their personal gear to their cars, then they need to account and return all other gear to the appropriate locations," said 1st Lt. Megan Duenas, 91st MSFS team member. "The last step is to get debriefed from their leaders.'

The process can take several hours to complete.

Duenas said each Airmen is assigned a weapon and it is the same one they use every time they trip out to the field. A card associated with every item in the armory informs them which weapon belongs to which Airmen.

"It is the Airmen's responsibility to take care of their weapon," said Duenas.

The accountability doesn't end there. Airmen are issued gear they are responsible for during the 84 to 120 hours they spend out in the field.

'We invest in the equipment the Air Force gives us," said SSgt. Christopher Swanson, 91st MSFS team member. "We take the time to carefully inspect all the gear Airmen return.

The gear is thoroughly examined when it is returned, so it is ready for the following trip out.

"Each vehicle is washed, inspected and stored for the next time it is needed in the field," said Swanson. "The winters can get harsh here and washing our vehicles helps maintain them for as long as we can."

After the process is finished and every item is checked off the list, Airmen get debriefed and go home for a full day off.

"Airman are given documents to know about personal appointment and the next training cycle before they go home to get their rest," said Duenas.

1st WXG's virtual training brings real benefits

Airmen assigned to the 1st Weather Group are rolling out virtual reality training tailored to the needs of the Air Force Weather community, allowing them to train faster and smarter.

Delivered in March, 1st WXG's NextGen **Environmental Weather** Training System simulates setting up and assembling a tactical meteorological observation system known as a TMQ-53.

The TMQ-53 is a portable, automated weather station that can take observations in up to one-minute intervals, enabling flying missions around the world. The data it produces can be utilized by a weather observer in the field or by the Air Force Weather community using satellite communications.

The TMQ-53 simulation complements other weather virtual reality training products that an Airman might face being developed in parallel by the 3rd Weather Squadron at Fort Hood, Texas; the 18th WS at Fort Bragg, North Carolina; and the 93rd Air-Ground Operations Wing at Moody Air Force Base, Georgia. Coordination on the development maximized the innovation while eliminating a duplication of efforts.

"The realism of the VR was incredible," said Capt. Matthew Perkins, 1st WXG science officer. "I could make out tiny labels and serial numbers on equipment and aircraft even flew overhead during the simulation. Virtual reality brings unprecedented realism to our training ability when the physical equipment is unavailable. Our deployed Airmen will have greater familiarity with these tools than ever before."

The TMQ-53 kit ships in several hard travel cases, containing approximately 80 separate pieces. Setting up the weather station correctly and in a short amount of time can be challenging. To this end, the already certified can use it company that created the VR

models replicated every component of the TMQ-53, down to the plugs of the wires used to connect the weather station's components.

When a trainee puts on the headset, they are tasked to set up the TMQ-53. The software trains them to not place equipment too close to a building or other obstacles that might interfere with the station's accuracy. The simulation can also either guide the trainee as a tutorial or test their system knowledge.

The VR system will not completely replace the initial equipment training during certification, but it will be used to provide familiarization as well as refresher training. The virtual world also allows variables such as inclement weather and equipment problems to be thrown at the trainee.

According to Tech. Sgt. Robert Thomas, 1st WXG Systems and Training noncommissioned officer in charge, VR cuts down on the need to purchase additional equipment, eliminates some temporary duty travel and lowers the potential for equipment breakage. The real savings come from Airmen not being taken away from their missions.

"Saving costs is what everyone wants to hear, but opportunity cost is today's enemy, particularly time,' Thomas said. "A trainee can be immersed and familiarize him or herself without ever seeing the equipment and a member towards refresher training."

Strauberry CINNAMON ROLLS



INGREDIENTS:

- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/3 cup margarine or butter (softened)
- 3 1/4 cups all-purpose flour • 1 .25 ounce package of instant yeast - 2 tsp
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup water

- 1 cup strawberry jam (+/-)
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 cups sliced strawberries
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/4 tsp cinnamon
- 1-2 tbsp milk

INSTRUCTIONS:

Heat the milk in a small saucepan until warm. Mix in the butter until melted. Let cool to lukewarm.

In a large bowl combine 2 1/4 cup flour, yeast, sugar, and salt. Mix well. Stir in egg and 1/4 cup of water. Mix well. Now stir in the milk mixture until dough

Stir in another cup of flour. When dough comes together, flip it onto a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth.

Return the dough ball to the bowl, cover with a damp towel, and let rest for 10

Roll out dough into a 15x10 inch rectangle. Spread the strawberry jam all over the dough. Sprinkle with cinnamon. Then evenly cover with the chopped strawberries. Roll up the dough and pinch the seam to seal. Cut into 12 equal size rolls. Place rolls cut side up in a greased 11x13 baking dish. Cover and let rise until doubled (30 mins). While waiting, Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes or until golden brown.

Mix the powdered sugar and cinnamon with 1 tbsp of milk. Stir until glaze forms. You may need to add up to another tablespoon of milk for desired consistency. Drizzle glaze over finished rolls.

Substitute almond milk, coconut milk, etc., and a dairy free margarine.







5th MXS CPI: Teamwork makes the dream work

members of the 5th Maintenance ✓ Squadron began planning a way to decrease the time it takes to maintain in addition to our quality a B-52H Stratofortress in between every 450 flight hours, known as a phase inspection, at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota.

Known as the continuous process improvement (CPI), the plan will increase efficiency throughout a phase operation, which will shorten the time it takes to complete it.

"For previous aircraft, we've taken 24 and a half days to complete a phase process," said 2nd Lt. Joshua Trosen, 5th MXS maintenance flight commander. "Our goal is to voted on which ideas would gradually cut that time down make the biggest impact to 21 days in six months, 19 days in a year and then 17 days in two years. This will hopefully give Airmen more time for training and increase morale across the squadron."

For an entire week, various sections within the squadron came together to discuss how they can decrease the time it takes to properly complete a phase

operation.

"We have flight chiefs, subject matter experts and Airmen from fabrication, maintenance, avionics, accessories, and aerospace ground equipment flights assurance team and production superintendent," said Trosen.

During the meetings, the 5th MXS members created a flow chart and had a group discussion on any potential ideas to help make the CPI happen.

"We've been trying to figure out what ideas will have a high impact and the amount of effort it's going to take to get those ideas to work, said Senior Airman Pfeenix Tramill, 5th MXS crew chief. "We laid all our ideas out on a graph, then and positively affect our efficiency."

During the week-long CPI, squadron has been a big the planning team discussed potential obstacles they may face while lowering the phase time and how to counteract them.

"We're using an eight-step and create a collective problem solving method and we'll be developing countermeasures on how we can improve the phase

efficiency and then turn those countermeasures into action items," said Trosen.
"For example, we've thought of a way to realign our equipment to eliminate waste."

With all of the different sections working together as a team, it also gives everyone an opportunity to communicate and strengthen the bonds between them.

"It's cool to see the different sides of the phase process and the organization that goes into it," said Tramill. "It's nice to actually see the bigger picture on what's going on instead of just fixing the aircraft. It's also great to be a part of such an important change and I think it's going to be very beneficial for our squadron."

Likewise, Trosen added that getting several opinions from all the sections within the help going forward.

"Ît's been a great process to get everyone together," said Trosen. "Having everyone help each other solution while bonding together as a group has been interesting and very influential to see."

Limited professional gear allowed

s the permanent change of station peak season approaches, Air Force officials are reminding Airmen to review the Department of Defense policy on transportation of professional gear to avoid costly charges.

"We highly encourage Airmen get one-on-one counseling with their personal property processing office to learn exactly what is and what isn't considered professional gear," said Kevin Kennedy, Personal Property Activity deputy director. "Travelers should also carefully read through the Joint Federal Travel Regulation."

As of May 1, 2014, the amount of professional books, papers and equipment, or PBP&E, shipped in household goods during a PCS move is limited to a maximum of 2,000 pounds and is not charged against the authorized household goods weight allowances.

This includes items such as instruments, tools and equipment unique to

technicians, mechanics, medical professionals, musicians and members of the professions; and specialized clothing, such as diving suits, astronauts' suits, flying suits and helmets, band uniforms, chaplains' vestments; and other specialized apparel and unusual uniforms or clothing for the performance of official duties at the next duty assignment.

Issues arise when Airmen claim items as PBP&E that are not, which could cost them.

"An article which loses its identity as PBP&E continues as household goods, which can lead to excess weight charges for which an Airman is still financially responsible," Kennedy said.

Policy excludes items of a professional nature that will not be necessary at the next duty station, such as text books from schools and personal books, even if used as part of a previous professional reading program, and some previously allowed categories such as personal computer equipment and memorabilia.






