# F-22 Raptor makes historic flight with Blue Angels

BEAUFORT, S.C. (AFNS) -- In a historic moment for aviation, the F-22 Raptor Demonstration Team flew alongside the U.S. Navy Blue Angels in a rare formation over the skies of Beaufort, South Carolina, April 25.

The two aerial demonstration teams joined together during the Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort air show to showcase never-before-seen images of both the F-22 Raptor and F/A-18 Hornet.

"This formation represents more than just the seven jets captured on camera," said Maj. Paul Lopez, F-22 Raptor Demonstration Team commander. "It is a representation of the professionalism and excellence that every service member portrays in the United States military."

The concept for this unique formation began as an idea between two former

squadron-mates who both share a passion for aviation. Douglas Glover, 3G Aviation Media co-founder and the mastermind behind coordinating this dissimilar formation, reached out to U.S. Navy Maj. Jeff Mullins, Blue Angels #4, about the possibility of getting the two teams together.

"What started as a 'what if' between myself and Blue Angels #4, took months and months of back and forth, matching aircraft capabilities to the images requested by both teams," Glover said. "All of the hard work, the late nights and the elevated levels of stress briefing a room full of top-tier pilots was worth it when the ramp dropped behind the photoship, followed closely by the F-22 and the Blue Angels' diamond."

Seeing the world's premier fifth-generation fighter alongside the iconic blue and gold of the U.S.

Navy Blue Angels is a sight many wanted to see but never thought would happen. The end result, seven fighter jets from two separate services flying over the skies of South Carolina, involved a joint effort that will be cherished for years to come.

"I would like to thank the maintainers that fix, service and maintain the aircraft. They are vital to our mission and making a flight like this happen," Lopez said. "Flying alongside the Blue Angels was an incredible experience and seeing it all from the cockpit of the F-22 is something I will never forget."

# Air Force Global Housing Symposium aims to correct housing issues

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-LACKLAND, Texas (AFNS) --

"Families First" is the mantra behind the Air Force's Housing Privatization program improvement plan which is taking front and center attention at the Air Force's Global Housing Symposium, which kicked off May 7, in downtown San Antonio.

The plan, which includes five major lines of effort, outlines 27 initiatives to correct housing issues identified following a servicewide review of health and safety concerns.

Col. Michael Beach, Air Force Housing Program chief, said ensuring Airmen and their families live in safe, quality homes is not a fire-and-forget mission.

"Our most important resource is our people," he said. "We've listened to residents, reviewed survey feedback and have taken a top-to-bottom look at our processes, policies and procedures to identify what's broken, and fix it."

Beach is taking that same message to the Global Housing Symposium. There Air Force housing management staff and base civil engineers from across the Air Force are gathering alongside project owners to discuss the current, worldwide status of Air Force housing under one roof.

Commencing with a keynote speech from Hon. John Henderson, assistant secretary of the Air Force for installations, environment and energy, the symposium is slated to update, train and inform attendees on topics that

keep them up to date and able to serve the Airmen of their installations with the highest service level possible.

The agenda boasts experts speaking on "everything you wanted to know about mold," and panel discussions where attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions of the program leaders concerning policy changes, roles and responsibilities and manpower. Included in the agenda is a daylong project owners' meeting where Air Force leadership and the project owners will discuss the best course of action moving forward for the privatized housing program, with Airmen and their families' health and safety at the center of the conversation.

The symposium is a biennial event organized by the Air Force Civil Engineer Center to bring Air Force housing professionals together to improve housing services for Airmen and their families. This year's event is an opportunity for program leaders to discuss "Families First" and address some of the health and safety concerns they're working to overcome.

"The Air Force is committed to restoring trust in the privatized housing program and providing military families safe, quality and well-maintained base housing," Beach said.

The Air Force began to utilize housing privatization in 1996 as a quick and effective vehicle for transforming the

**CARE for Air Commandos;  
AFSOC POTFF hosts fourth  
annual resilience summit**

GATLINBURG, Tenn. (AFNS) -- Air Force Special Operations Command's Preservation of the Force and Family hosted a caregiver and resilience education, or CARE, summit at a resort in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, April 22-27.

The summit promoted a whole-family approach to resilience and readiness for AFSOC's wounded, ill or injured service members and their caregivers.

"I'm really proud of the CARE summit efforts," said Lt. Gen. Brad Webb, AFSOC commander. "This is focused on the caregivers. For those of you who participate in this, this is a labor of love. When you get to see the difference it makes with the families who are attending

these kinds of summits, this is an area where Air Commandos are taking care of Air Commandos and I am particularly proud."

More than 20 of AFSOC's Air Commandos and their caregivers attended the summit, receiving numerous resilience resources and networking.

Katie Dean, wife and caregiver of Staff Sgt. Jason Dean, 20th Special Operations Squadron special missions aviator who was injured in a helicopter crash last year, commented on the summit.

"We love the abundance of resources that are available," Dean said. "I learned about resources that I hadn't even heard of before. As Jason moves forward with surgeries, and if he can fly again or if he gets out, I know there's a lot of resources we can tap into and see what benefits are there and available for us."

Staff Sgt. Dean previously tried pain management and physical therapy to recuperate from the crash, with little success.

"Some of my bones were broken in the crash and it injured my back and neck really bad," said Staff Sgt. Dean. "Kaye Creasman, AFSOC Wounded Warrior program manager, was one of my case managers as I was seeking treatment. She helped me get into the (Preservation of the Force and Families) program and receive more individualized treatment."

As Staff Sgt. Dean continues with a tailored treatment plan, he and Katie learn more about the process and make connections with families in similar situations.

"This summit is super beneficial," Dean said. "We've learned about the

groups out there to help us. Then there's also just the bonding; talking to other guys that are hurt or have some type of illness or something like that. To be able to sit, talk, share and meet new people is great. It's also great to talk to the other members that are the caregivers."

At one point during the summit, all the caregivers gathered together in a conference room to share their stories.

"When the caregivers were together, just being able to listen and hear that other people have similar struggles is enlightening," Dean said. "It's like, 'Oh, there's somebody battling that too!' We have a great support system at Cannon (AFB) and of course we talk about our struggles and what we've dealt with. It's just nice to really be able to have someone that can say, 'I definitely understand where you're coming from. This happened to me too.' From a caregiver standpoint, it's nice to have that other caregiver to lean on and say, 'Well, my husband went through this and this is how I helped him.'"

The Dean's linked up with other caregivers they met at the summit. "There's several couples we've really gotten close to and we can see ourselves hanging out with them in the future," Dean said. "We plan on keeping in touch with them. Programs like POTFF are instrumental; there's so many stresses

# Hill AFB fighter wings conduct combat exercise

HILL AIR FORCE BASE, Utah (AFNS) --

The active duty 388th Fighter Wing and Reserve 419th FW conducted an integrated combat capability exercise April 30-May 2 at the Utah Test and Training Range.

The friendly and enemy forces were made up of F-35 Lightning IIs from Hill AFB, F-16 Fighting Falcons from the 311th Fighter Squadron at Holloman AFB, New Mexico, and 80th FS at Kunsan Air Base, South Korea, and a team of contracted aggressor pilots from Draken International, at Nellis AFB, Nevada.

"Planning and carrying out the mission as part of a large, integrated force, at a high ops tempo is always valuable training," said Col. Michael Ebner, 388th FW vice commander. "Whenever fourth- and fifth-generation platforms train together it's beneficial for everyone. It was a great learning opportunity, especially for younger pilots."

More than 40 aircraft participated. The training provided by this type of joint exercise is usually only available during large-force exercises like Red Flag. The airspace at the Utah Test and Training Range provides Hill AFB the ability to host such a large force.

The defensive counter-air

exercise was designed to simulate a combat operations tempo to test the capabilities of maintainers to provide aircraft and pilots to protect the airfield from a large enemy force.

"We were severely outnumbered, we had a five to one aggressor ratio and we were tasked with defending a list of assets over an eight-hour tour time block," said Maj. Thomas Meyer, 34th Fighter Squadron weapons officer. "We had aircraft sitting in alert status to respond to whatever enemy threats were presented."

Aircraft rotated into the fight on a continual basis for more than eight hours. If the enemy was successful in making it through the defenses and hitting a target, the friendly force was penalized by losing time to generate aircraft as maintainers took cover.

"One of the principle directives we've been given in the F-35 program is to integrate, and generally we only fly against other F-35s here," said Maj. Jondavid Hertz, 421st FS weapons officer. "This is a great opportunity for us."

During the exercise F-35A maintainers were working to generate sorties at a steady rate, safely and efficiently.

"We're testing everything associated with generating

a combat sortie, from our weapons loading to aircraft production," said Chief Master Sgt. Scott Spraberry, 34th Aircraft Maintenance Unit superintendent. "We're doing everything on a much more compressed schedule,"

On a normal flying day at Hill AFB, there may be eight to 10 aircraft that take off at once, then eight to 10 more jets several hours later. During this exercise, four-ship sorties launched every 30-45 minutes throughout the day.

Maintainers had to be ready for the jets to land, refuel, reload and take off again, generating a total of 44 sorties a day. They worked in "cells." Each cell was made of crew chiefs, weapons and avionics technicians and overseen by a senior non-commissioned officer responsible for keeping up to four aircraft ready for flight.

"Normally our maintainers have two to three hours to turn an aircraft, so having

to do so every 30 minutes really tests their skill," said Capt. John Goodwin, 419th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron maintenance operations officer. "These exercises are an extremely effective and essential way to ensure our overall readiness."

The 388th and 419th FWs are the Air Force's first operational combat-capable F-35 units, having received the first jets in October 2015. They fly and maintain the jet in a Total Force partnership, which capitalizes on the strength of both components. By the end of this year, Hill AFB will be home to 78 F-35s.

base housing inventory and improving the quality of life for Airmen and their families.

Over the past two decades, the housing privatization program aimed to eliminate inadequate housing and expand services for residents, such as community centers and updated shared facilities.

While the program has successfully improved the inventory of homes and community amenities overall, the Air Force is aware that new challenges will continue to surface and is working closely with the project owners to shift the focus to address resident concerns and improve the customer experience.

In response to Airmen families' concerns and to ensure the long-term success of the privatized housing portfolio, the Air Force Privatized Housing program developed five major lines of effort to provide safe and healthy housing for Airmen and their families: employing and revamping resident empowerment, oversight improvement, leadership engagement, improved oversight and policy standardization.

The five major lines of effort are in response to the 100 percent "boots on the ground" health and safety resident survey conducted by wing leadership in February 2019 to fully gauge resident concerns and housing conditions.

Initial data gathering efforts included a health and safety review involving 57,453 active duty members living on base. Base leadership visited 9,861 homes as a major part of an extensive review of policies, procedures and best practices.

The Air Force's campaign to improve privatized housing is already underway. A 24-hour, seven-day-a-week, toll-free helpline for residents to call about their privatized housing concerns, went live on May 1 and can be reached at 1-800-482-6431. A few of the 27 "Families First" initiatives include: a Resident Bill of Rights to inform the lessee of their rights under a lease agreement, a more transparent work order process and a revised performance incentive fee plan.

The Air Force is using every tool at its disposal to ensure that the housing program, both state-side and abroad, puts its best foot forward this year and the years to come with the one key phrase in mind, "Families First."

that are involved with seeking treatment and having that supportive community is a huge help to both personal life, marriage, work and wherever you are.”

Col. Thad Allen, U.S. Special Operations Command POTFF director, commented on the importance of the program’s focus.

“AFSOC and SOCOM looked at themselves and asked what they needed to do for our families,” Allen said. “I can’t think of anything more important than caregivers. What we need to afford to do is take care of our families. Three times a year, I get the chance to talk to all of the new commanders coming into SOCOM. The one thing they need to know is that families really do help fuel service members and are the foundation for everything that we do and without that foundation, you’re going to fail.”

On a similar note, Air Force Vice Chief of Staff Gen. Stephen Wilson commented on the importance of family readiness.

“If the family’s not ready, it affects everything,” Wilson said. “Gen. Goldfein’s laser-focused on the families. Invisible wounds of war is one area he’s determined that it’s (seeking help) going to be normalized across the Air Force. We look at how we can strengthen that and make sure there’s no stigma and people are seeking out that help, both for members and families. We owe this to them; we ask people to serve and this is what we owe back to our force.”

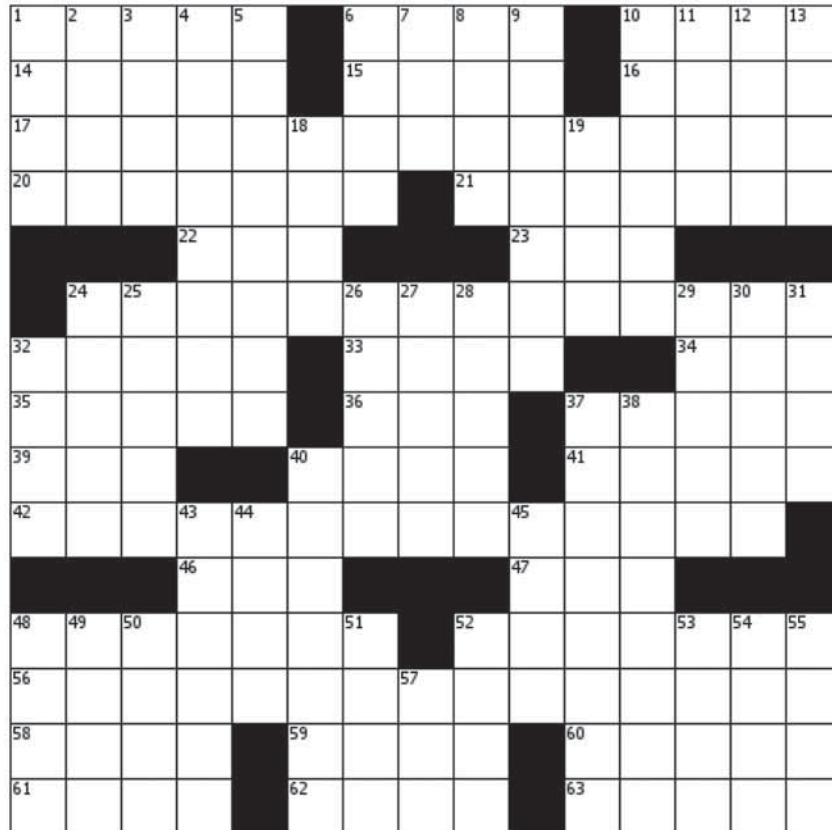

## Crispy Honey Chipotle CHICKEN TACOS



**INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 1/2 pounds boneless and skinless chicken breasts, sliced into strips
- non-stick spray
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 eggs, whisked
- 3/4 cup panko bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup plain bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 cloves of garlic, pressed through a garlic press
- 3 tablespoons ketchup
- 3 chipotles in a adobo sauce, pureed in a food processor until smooth
- 2 tablespoons hot sauce
- 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tablespoon + 1 teaspoon cornstarch
- 1 cup uncooked rice, cooked per manufacturer's instructions
- 1/4 cup fresh cilantro (plus extra for garnish)
- 1 tablespoon fresh lime juice
- 1 teaspoon lime zest
- Ranch dressing, for drizzling (optional)
- 10-12 corn or flour tortillas, warm

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

Preheat your oven to 450 degrees F, and spray a large baking sheet with a non-stick spray. Set aside. In one shallow bowl, whisk together the flour, salt, black pepper, and cayenne. In another shallow bowl, add the eggs. In a third shallow bowl, combine the panko and plain bread crumbs. Taking each chicken strip, dredge in the flour and then shake to get rid of any excess. Place in the egg and douse to coat. Let any excess drip off. Then transfer the chicken strips to the bread crumb mixture, evenly coat and press down so that it adheres. Place the chicken strips on the prepared baking sheet, and drizzle the melted butter on top. Bake at 450 degrees F for 8-10 minutes on each side or until the chicken has cooked through and is crispy. Remove from oven. While the chicken is baking, prepare your sauce. In a large, heavy-bottomed saucepan, combine the honey, brown sugar, garlic, ketchup, pureed chipotles, hot sauce, apple cider vinegar, onion powder, and a dash of salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, whisking throughout. In a small bowl, whisk together the corn starch and water until the corn starch has dissolved. Add it to the saucepan, continuing to whisk until the sauce has thickened, about 3-4 minutes. Reduce the heat to low. Submerge each chicken strip in the sauce, and place on a plate to the side. Prepare your rice by, combining cooked rice, cilantro, lime juice, lime zest and a dash of salt and pepper. Assemble your tacos by layering on rice, chicken, a drizzle of ranch dressing (if you are using) and a sprinkling of cilantro onto a warmed corn or flour tortilla. Serve immediately, and enjoy!

## Women in space: Enhancing capability through diversity

PETERSON AIR FORCE BASE, Colo. (AFNS) -- Lt. Gen. John Thompson, Air Force Space and Missile Systems Center commander, sat with six of his most senior space program managers during a media panel at the 35th Space Symposium, April 11, he noted how similar they were in age, race and gender and expressed his desire to have more diverse representation amongst space professionals. Thompson isn't the only one who sees the value of diversity in space-related jobs.

The symposium featured its third Women's Global Gathering in Colorado Springs, Colorado that included Brig. Gen. Deanna Burt, Air Force Space Command director of operations and communications, Ms. Krista Paquin, former NASA deputy associate administrator

and Dr. Michelle Parker, vice president and chief engineer for space and launch at Boeing Defense Space and Security.

This annual event brings together women across multiple military and commercial space organizations to share personal experiences and to inspire future generations of women in the workplace.

Burt, who is one of only three (soon to be four) female general officers in AFSPC, candidly spoke during the event about her struggles and successes navigating a career in which she was frequently the only woman in the room. She challenged the audience to create a 'good ole girl' network as a support system for each other.

Rather than feel like there is only room for one woman at the table, Burt said, "It's important that we find one another, celebrate each other and

know that all of us can be successful."

When asked by an audience member what advice she would give herself at 20 years old, Burt said, "I would tell myself to stay authentic to who I am, make bold choices and keep driving. I have learned, as a leader, it is impossible to please everyone. You'll never make a decision if you are so concerned of what other people think of you."

While Burt highlighted the unique aspects women bring to the workplace, she also emphasized the importance of promoting all avenues of diversity.

"It is easy to surround yourself with like-minded people," Burt said. "But leaders must intentionally seek out different opinions than our own and encourage people to share their ideas. I'm amazed of what I learn when I get outside of my comfort zone and engage with people who don't necessarily look like me."

# Air Force stopPED all new Tyndall rebuilding efforts starting May 1

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --

The Air Force will be forced to stop all new rebuilding efforts at Tyndall Air Force Base, Florida, starting May 1 because of the absence of Congressional funding.

Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson announced the pending work stoppage March 27 at a public event, citing a critical need for supplemental funding to recover from the natural disasters that struck Tyndall and Offutt Air Force Bases.

Hurricane Michael inflicted \$4.7 billion of damage to Tyndall AFB in October 2018. Hurricane Michael was recently upgraded and recognized as a Category 5 storm. It was one of only four Category 5 hurricanes to make recorded landfall in the continental United States. The rare magnitude of destruction damaged nearly 700 buildings and forced the Air Force to relocate 11,000 personnel and 46 aircraft.

Then, in March 2019, a historic flood inundated Offutt AFB, Nebraska. Flood waters submerged dozens of buildings and much of the flightline under eight feet of water.

"Homeowners and businesses purchase insurance to protect themselves from these kinds of disasters, but that's not an option for the military," said Wilson. "When unavoidable catastrophes strike our

facilities, supplemental funding from Congress is our only recourse. If they don't step in, our communities, our readiness, and our security all pay the price."

Wilson said the work stoppage would prevent new contracts from being started, including new rebuilding efforts. The work stoppage does not apply to contracts already funded for clean-up and repair efforts.

Wilson previously announced the deferral of

61 critical infrastructure projects across 18 states and five overseas locations worth a total of \$272.4 million as the Air Force prioritized funds to ensure the safety and welfare of its people and equipment while waiting on supplemental funding.

"The supplemental funding and budget reprogramming requests are about more than just Tyndall and Offutt," said Wilson. "We're robbing other projects to fund minimal

recovery efforts because Congress hasn't moved forward yet with recovery funding. The lack of funding now for these projects is impacting all of our bases."

Wilson warned of more impacts rapidly approaching in the absence of a supplemental appropriation to recover Tyndall and Offutt. The Air Force expects to stop intensive depot-level aircraft repairs starting mid-May, which would ground five bomber aircraft later this fall and

create a long-term backlog for E-3 Airborne Warning and Control System aircraft maintenance. Offutt AFB recovery efforts and flying operations are also at risk if delays in funding continue.

"We'll continue to face natural disasters but we can't set the precedent of not rebuilding our bases following a storm like Hurricane Michael," Wilson said. "A natural disaster shouldn't decide whether our communities keep their bases."
