

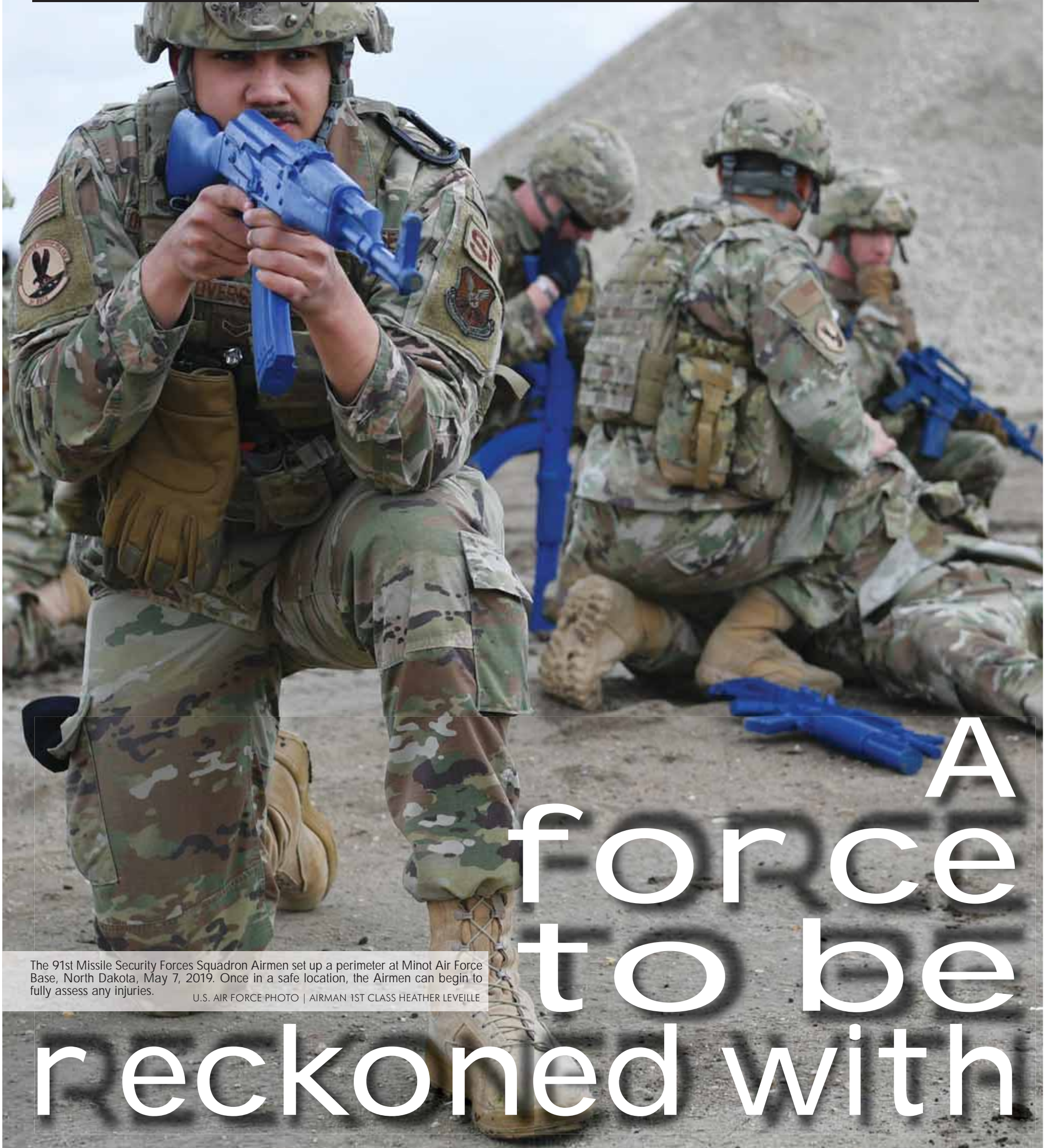

Air Force's top recruiter climbs even higher

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas (AFNS) --

In what's believed to be a first, Air Force Recruiting Service's top recruiter received an incentive flight with the U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds as a congratulations for all of his hard work.

Master Sgt. Gervacio Maldonado, a former Health Professions recruiter and now flight chief with the 318th Recruiting Squadron, was surprised and ecstatic when he learned winning the 2018 Maj. Gen. A.J. Stewart Top AFRS Recruiter award would take him even higher.

"I was blown away," Maldonado said after hearing about the opportunity to fly. "The news stopped me in my tracks."

The flight, with Thunderbird pilot #8, Maj. Jason Markzon, was a first for Maldonado in any fighter aircraft.

"I'd always wanted to fly in a fighter aircraft, however I never thought it would come to fruition," Maldonado said. "I was so pumped to fly with the Thunderbirds."

According to Maldonado's supervisor, he is more than deserving of this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

"His selection for this flight is an honor for all recruiters and Airmen," said Senior Master Sgt. Aaron Akridge, 318th RCS Production superintendent. "I'm honored to see the Thunderbirds bestow this opportunity to a hardworking Airman such as Gervacio Maldonado."

The top recruiter said he appreciates the opportunity of being the face of the Air Force at many local events where the Air Force doesn't normally have a presence.

"Anyone selected for recruiting duty during the

Developmental Special Duty process should embrace the opportunity," Maldonado said. "Whether it is representing the Air Force at your local fairs or on larger stages, like the NBA All-Star game or the Super Bowl—you will have plenty of chances to enjoy these unique experiences."

He recalls attending his first NFL game—an opportunity he had because of his recruiting duties. "I was on the 50-yard line! It was awesome."

His production superintendent also shared many interesting things he has learned about the top performer since they began working together.

"He's an entrepreneur and a thrill seeker," Akridge said. "He's built a successful

Changes to Post-9/11 GI Bill transfers effective July 2019

445TH AIRLIFT WING PUBLIC AFFAIRS

WRIGHT-PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE, Ohio (AFNS) --

The transferability option under the Post-9/11 GI Bill allows service members to transfer all or some unused benefits to their spouse or dependent children. The request to transfer unused GI Bill benefits to eligible dependents must be completed while serving as an active member of the Armed Forces. The Department of Defense determines whether or not you can transfer benefits to your family. Once the DoD approves benefits for transfer, the new beneficiaries apply for them at Veterans Affairs.

The option to transfer is open to any member of the armed forces active duty or Selected Reserve, officer or enlisted who is eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill and meets the following criteria:

- Has at least six years of service in the armed forces (active duty and/or Selected Reserve) on the date of approval and agrees to serve

four additional years in the armed forces from the date of election.

- Has at least 10 years of service in the armed forces (active duty and/or Selected Reserve) on the date of approval, is precluded by either standard policy (by service branch or DoD) or statute from committing to four additional years and agrees to serve for the maximum amount of time allowed by such policy or statute.

- Transfer requests are submitted and approved while the member is in the armed forces.

- Effective 7/12/2019, eligibility to transfer benefits will be limited to service members with at least 6 years but not more than 16 years of active duty or selected reserve service. So service members with more than 16 years of service should transfer benefits before 7/12/2019.

Reserve and Guard build expeditionary medical skills during Joint Medic exercise

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-CAMP BULLIS, Texas --

More than 70 military members, including Reserve Citizen Airmen, Army and Navy Reservists and Texas Army National Guardsmen combined to sharpen their expeditionary mass-casualty stabilization and aeromedical evacuation skills May 4-5.

Operation Joint Medic, provided comprehensive hands-on training on the capabilities of expeditionary medicine including point-of-injury/role 1 care, medical

evacuation via rotary wing aircraft, expeditionary medical support/role 2 care, en-route patient staging and aeromedical evacuation according to Lt. Col. Luis Berrios, 433rd Aeromedical Staging Squadron chief of education and training and officer in charge/lead planner for this exercise.

Participants included the 433rd Medical Group, 433rd Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron, 301st Medical Squadron, Navy Expeditionary Medical Facility Dallas, Army 7454th Medical Backfill Battalion and the Texas Army National Guardsmen from Company C, 2-149 Aviation from Martindale Army AirField.

"The purpose of this exercise was to practice our expeditionary skills," Berrios said. "It was also so we can collaborate with other agencies so that we know how to work with each other when we deploy. By putting everybody together we learn to communicate and how to improve our collaboration. It enhanced knowledge of joint-medical operations while increasing readiness posture and morale."

Participants spent the first day learning about the scenario and mission objectives then met with their teammates and took a tour of the exercise area.

Meeting prior to the exercise and learning about her teammates skill sets was important

to Tech. Sgt. Alecia Lovci, 433rd Aeromedical Staging Squadron health services administrator.

"It's important so that we can establish roles so that way we are not confused about who is in charge of what portion of the patients' care," she said.

Some participants, like Lt. j.g. Brittany Minor, Navy Expeditionary Medical Facility Dallas critical care nurse, looked forward to learning new skills.

"I have never trained at Camp Bullis," Minor said. "This is more in-depth. We learned how the system would work if there was a mass casualty situation and what our roles would be and how we would take care of the patients."

"Especially with everybody coming together as a team to get things taken care of," Minor said. "Actually learning how to take care of a patient that is out on the field or a mass casualty situation."

Berrios echoed Minor's sentiments.

"It was an outstanding collaboration between the participants from 10 joint-service organizations that significantly increased readiness skills through the use of realistic, hands-on clinical scenarios using clinical practice guidelines," he said.

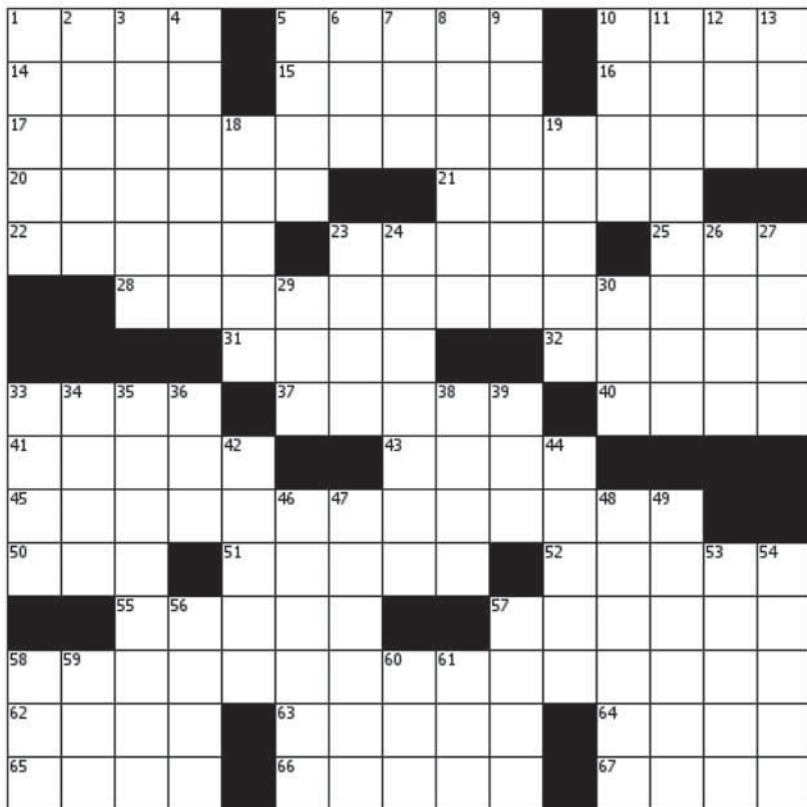

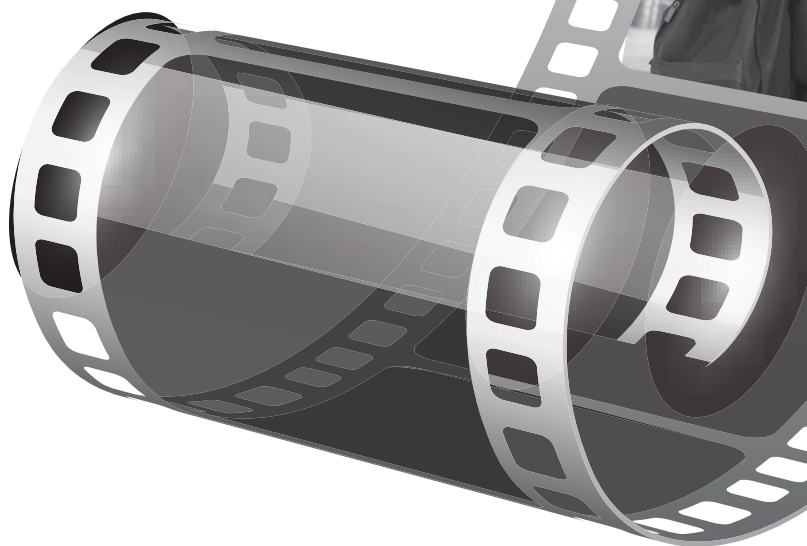

Coconut Cream Delight

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup walnuts/pecans, chopped and divided
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened
- 1 (12oz.) Cool Whip, divided
- 2 cups milk
- 2 (3.5 oz) coconut cream instant pudding mix

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
 Layer 1: Mix the flour, butter and half of walnuts/pecans together. Press into 9x13 pan and bake for 15 minutes at 350 degrees, cool it well.
 Layer 2: Mix the cream cheese, powdered sugar and 1 cup of the cool whip, pour over cooled crust. Place into the refrigerator while you prepare the next layer.
 Layer 3: Mix the milk and pudding mix until it becomes smooth. Put it over the cream cheese layer.
 Place into the refrigerator and chill until set.
 Layer 4: Spread remaining cool whip over the top, and sprinkle with remaining walnuts/pecans. Cool for the minimum of 3 hours.

*Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, 6-Mile Bait & Tackle, Garrison: East end of Lake Sakakawea remains generally slow for walleye with better success north of the New Town bridge. Try the east end islands and bays for walleye and some nice bass on Lake Audubon. Work shallow in 3 to 10 feet pitching jigs with a slow retrieve. Also try sitting with floating jigs and minnows. Try casting for bass with occasional nice walleye mixed in.

*Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Resort, New Town: Some nice pike shore-fishing success in the Van Hook Arm. Try fishing off the bottom with smelt. Water temperatures remain cool for walleye, yet, in the Arm.

*Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Water temperatures remain cool with generally slow walleye success. Work farther west, north of the New Town bridge. Bait now available at the bait shop.

*Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Inconsistent walleye bite down river on the Missouri River. Try early morning, pre-dawn hours from shore for walleye. East end of Lake Sakakawea remains quiet with cool

water temperatures yet and a post-spawn walleye lull.

*Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Good walleye success from Lewis & Clark State Park to White Earth Bay on Lake Sakakawea. Try spinners or jigs with minnows in 5 to 12 feet. Yellowstone and Missouri rivers starting to produce walleye. Trenton Lake producing a few crappie but other lakes generally quiet.

*Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: Scattered success from a few area lakes.

*North-central/central N.D. lakes, Towner Hdwe. Hank, Towner: Mouse River still producing scattered walleye and pike success. No reports from area lakes although George Lake suffered some pike winter kill.

*Lake Darling, Upper Souris Nat'l. Wildlife Refuge, Foxholm: Fair to good walleye success with pike mixed in. Perch remain slow. Lots of anglers getting out with warmer weather along with canoers and kayakers on the Beaver Lodge Canoe trail.

Bothun-Peterson Post 213 of Sherwood, ND, will be hosting a Memorial Day Service on the US/Canadian border. The event will include members of the American Legion along with Royal Canadian Legion members. Activities will begin the morning of Monday, May 27, 2019, just south of the border station.

The Memorial Day Border Service begins at 10am when members peacefully cross into each other's borders. It will then continue with both countries Legion members marching to Sherwood school. while Maldonado was a firefighter, he directly responded to over 360 fire, rescue and medical calls, and he still volunteers as a firefighter in his off-duty time. Also, being a recruiter is a natural fit for Maldonado's entrepreneurial spirit after spending the first part of his career as a weapons specialist.

"Being a recruiter is very business-like," Maldonado said. "It lets you operate your very own Air Force franchise. You will have quite a bit of autonomy to conduct the business as you see fit—you will not find that in many career fields within the Air Force."

Maldonado continually reminds himself it's all about the opportunities. Most recruiters focus solely on the goal and not the experience, he said.

"As a recruiter you are the face of the Air Force, the gatekeeper," he continued. "You are a beacon of opportunity and will be sitting in the most opportune position to mentor and directly change lives. Just like any job there are

challenges, but again, it is what you make of it. Stay positive and know that all your efforts are undoubtedly contributing to the betterment of people and the future of the Air Force."

Those efforts are what got Maldonado his flight with the Thunderbirds, something he described as breathtaking.

"I still can't believe people get paid to do this job," he said. "They told me as I was preparing for the flight to be ready for the ride of a lifetime—and that's pretty accurate!"

He praised the demonstration team members for their very high standard of professionalism and attention to detail.

"As a recruiter, my focus is on customer service and they provided that in very detail—from beginning to end," he said.

Both Akridge and Maldonado agree they hope the tradition of flying the top recruiter with the Thunderbirds continues every year since the aerial demonstration team is an extension of professional Air Force recruiters.

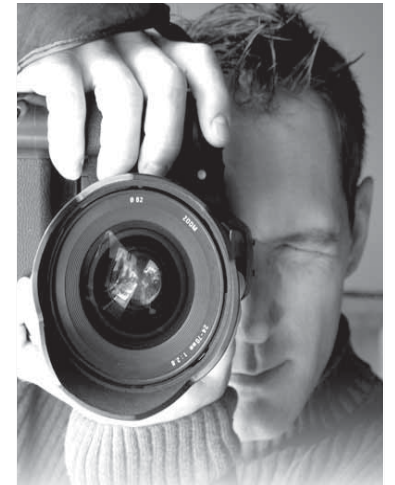

Secretary of the Air Force announces Grand Forks AFB re-designation

GRAND FORKS AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. (AFNS) -- Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson announced the re-designation of the 319th Air Base Wing at Grand Forks Air Force Base, North Dakota, as the 319th Reconnaissance Wing, May 11.

The re-designation, initiated by Gen. Mike Holmes, Air Combat Command commander, aligns Grand Forks AFB's host wing and the 69th Reconnaissance Group. The 69th RG, which flies the high-altitude, remotely-piloted RQ-4 Global Hawk aircraft, has been aligned under the 9th Reconnaissance Wing at Beale Air Force Base, California, since it initiated operations as a tenant at Grand Forks AFB in 2011.

Although there won't be any changes to aircraft or operations at Beale AFB, changes at Grand Forks AFB

are expected to begin this summer. Wilson stated, "You know some people talk about these as being autonomous, or talk about them as drones, but they are not. It is our Airmen, always on watch with their ingenuity, pushing the limits for our joint warfighters around the world."

When the 69th RG mission and personnel align under the 319th RW, the unit will be activated as the 319th Operations Group and the 69th Reconnaissance Group will inactivate. The 319th OG will continue to execute the Global Hawk's intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance mission in support of worldwide, full-spectrum operations.

The official re-designation ceremony is scheduled for June 28, in conjunction with the Grand Forks AFB change of command between Col. Benjamin Spencer and Col. Cameron Pringle.
