Changes to Post-9/11 GI Bil I transfers effective July 2019


he transferability option under the Post-9/11 GI Bill allows service members to transfer all or some unused benefits to their spouse or dependent children. The request to transfer unused GI Bill benefits to eligible dependents must be completed while serving as an active member of the Armed Forces. The Department of Defense determines whether or not you can transfer benefits to your family. Once the DoD approves benefits for transfer, the new beneficiaries apply for them at Veterans Affairs.

The option to transfer is open to any member of the armed forces active duty or Selected Reserve, officer or enlisted who is eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill and meets the following criteria:

• Has at least six years of service in the armed forces (active duty and/or Selected Reserve) on the date of approval and agrees to serve four additional years in the armed forces from the date of election.

- Has at least 10 years of service in the armed forces (active duty and/or Selected Reserve) on the date of approval, is precluded by either standard policy (by service branch or DoD) or statute from committing to four additional years and agrees to serve for the maximum amount of time allowed by such policy or statute.
- Transfer requests are submitted and approved while the member is in the armed forces.
- Effective 7/12/2019, eligibility to transfer benefits will be limited to service members with at least 6 years but not more than 16 years of active duty or selected reserve service. So service members with more than 16 years of service should transfer benefits before 7/12/2019.

"I have never trained at Camp Bullis," Minor said. "This is more in-depth. We learned how the system would work if there was a mass casualty situation and what our roles would be and how we would take care of the patients."

"Especially with everybody coming together as a team to get things taken care of," Minor said. "Actually learning how to take care of a patient that is out on the field or a mass casualty situation."

Berrios echoed Minor's sentiments.

"It was an outstanding collaboration between the participants from 10 jointsignificantly increased readiness skills through using clinical practice guidelines," he said.





*Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, 6-Mile Bait & Tackle, Garrison: East end of Lake Sakakawea remains generally slow for walleye with better success north of the New Town bridge. Try the east end islands and bays for walleye and some nice bass on Lake Audubon. Work shallow in 3 to 10 feet pitching jigs with a slow retrieve. Also try sitting with floating jigs and minnows. Try casting for bass with occasional nice walleye mixed in.

*Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Resort, New Town: Some nice pike shore-fishing success in the Van Hook Arm. Try fishing off the bottom with smelt. Water temperatures remain cool for walleye, yet, in the Arm.

*Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Water temperatures remain cool with generally slow walleye success. Work farther west, north of the New Town bridge. Bait now available at the bait shop.

`Lake Sakakawea/Missouri Kiver, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Inconsistent walleye bite down river on the Missouri River. Try early morning, pre-dawn hours from shore for walleye. East end of Lake Sakakawea remains quiet with cool water temperatures yet and a post-

*Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Good walleye success from Lewis & Clark State Park to White Earth Bay on Lake Sakakawea. Try spinners or jigs with minnows in 5 to 12 feet. Yellowstone and Missouri rivers starting to produce walleye. Trenton Lake producing a few crappie but other lakes generally quiet.

*Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: Scattered success from a

*North-central/central N.D. lakes, Towner Hdwe. Hank, Towner: Mouse River still producing scattered walleye and pike success. No reports from area lakes although George Lake suffered some pike winter kill.





while Maldonado was a firefighter, he directly responded to over 360 fire, rescue and medical calls, and he still volunteers as a firefighter in his offduty time. Also, being a recruiter is a natural fit for Maldonado's entrepreneurial spirit after spending the first part of his career as a weapons specialist.

"Being a recruiter is very business-like," Maldonado said. "It lets you operate your very own Air Force franchise. You will have quite lifetime—and that's pretty a bit of autonomy to conduct the business as you see fityou will not find that in many career fields within the Air Force."

Maldonado continually reminds himself it's all about the opportunities. Most recruiters focus solely on the goal and not the experience, he said.

"As a recruiter you are the face of the Air Force, the gatekeeper," he continued. "You are a beacon of opportunity and will be sitting in the most opportune position to mentor and directly change lives. Just like any job there are





GRAND FORKS AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. (AFNS) --

ecretary of the Wilson announced the re-designation of the 319th Air Base Wing at Grand Forks Air Force Base, North Dakota, as the 319th Reconnaissance Wing, joint warfighters around the May 11.

The re-designation, initiated by Gen. Mike Holmes, Air Combat Command commander, aligns Grand Forks AFB's host wing and the 69th Reconnaissance Group. The 69th RG, which flies the high-altitude, remotely-piloted RQ-4 Global Hawk aircraft, has been aligned under the 9th Reconnaissance Wing at Beale Air Force Base, California, since it initiated operations as a tenant at Grand Forks AFB in 2011.

Although there won't be any changes to aircraft or operations at Beale AFB, changes at Grand Forks AFB Pringle.

are expected to begin this summer.
