A life-size figure of Chapman, a hand-drawn portrait and a replica of his Medal of Honor were unveiled and placed on permanent display at the Benini Heritage Center, a nationally-recognized museum that is part of the 352nd Special Warfare Training Squadron, home of the Combat Control Apprentice Course. ## 40th HS, I ocal for ces r escue man

MALMSTROM AIR FORCE BASE, Mont. (AFNS) --

n Air Force helicopter crew rescued a man June 3 near Monarch, Montana, concluding ground and air search and rescue groups around 11 p.m.

The 40th Helicopter Squadron received the request June 3 around 10 p.m. to assist the Cascade County Sheriff's Department in rescuing the man after he fell from a steep cliff and was holding on to a tree root approximately 250 feet from the ground.

A UH-1N Iroquois helicopter assigned to the squadron departed Malmstrom Air Force Base with four aircrew at approximately 10:20 p.m.

The aircrew included 40th HS pilots Maj. Jeffrey Miser and Capt. Kyle Lenz, and flight engineers Master Sgt. Joseph Cox and Tech. Sgt. Joshua Makepeace.

After approving the request for assistance, the crew departed Malmstrom AFB and flew approximately 22 miles to Monarch where local ground crews were already on scene.

The aircrew began working logistics and passed information to the on-scene commander. The pilots then flew over and hovered approximately 100 feet above the man to begin extraction.

Makepeace operated the rescue hoist and lowered Cox down on a forest penetrator, rescue strap in hand, who then secured the man with the strap.

The crew then transitioned the aircraft down to the landing zone marked by ground teams while Cox and the man were lowered down via hoist. The man was Joint Chiefs of Staff National passed down to the ground

team and evaluated for injuries. He was not injured.

"As a long-time first responder's wife and (mother of a first responder), and as a citizen who owes so much to those that sacrifice their lives daily for my family, I am truly grateful," said the man's mother-in-law. "Thank you so much to the incredible Malmstrom AFB chopper crew that saved my son-inlaw Monday night and to all of our first responders on scene. I'm so happy to say he is doing well."

The responding agencies included the 40th HS, Belt Rural Volunteer Fire Department, Belt Ambulance, the Cascade County Sheriff's Office, Cascade County Search and Rescue, Mercy Flight and Great Falls Emergency Services.

"The mission last night resulted in a quick and successful rescue, made to look easy because of the exceptional helicopter crew and great partnership we have with our local civilian partners," said Lt. Col. Bryan Tuinman, 40th HS commander.

This event marks the 428th save the squadron has made to date.

The 40th HS ensures strategic security by providing flexible, rapidresponse helicopter airlift support to the 341st Missile Wing. The 40th HS also performs aerial surveillance of Department of Defense strategic weapon convoys and short notice emergency security forces responses; supports emergency war order taskings and priority personnel and logistical transportation.

The 40th Helicopter Squadron has a proud rescue history and currently conducts search and rescue missions in support of the Search and Rescue plan.

## Flight equipment redesigned to better fit femal e aviator s

light equipment is on its way through a major overhaul. The to the equipment is it is being designed with measurements from female aviators.

Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia, held a Female Fitment Event, June 4, where Air Force and Navy female aviators gathered to have their measurements taken, which will be used to design new prototypes for female flight equipment.

"We wanted to bring together a large enough group of women to get our different sizing both in our uniforms, helmets and masks," said Lt. Col. Shelly Mendieta, plans and requirements officer. "When you go to a squadron to go to a fitment event, there's usually only a couple of women, so to get a full spectrum of what is going to work for women aviators, we needed to bring them all together in one place."

In the past, flight equipment has been designed to the measurements of males because there are statistically more male aviators. This means more male measurements were

used as opposed to their female counterparts. Department of Defense leadership hopes to change that.

"The chief of staff of the biggest change coming United States Air Force is committed to seeing us make progress and better integrate humans into the machine environment mix," said Brig. Gen. Edward Vaughan, Air Force directorate of readiness and training, assistant to the director. "What has happened over the years is that a lot of our data and information we use to design these systems have traditionally been based on men."

Female aviators using flight equipment designed to the specifications of males presents a problem for their combat effectiveness. When it comes to the mission, the tools Airmen use play a big role in mission success.

Vaughan explained that if flight equipment, from harness straps to flight suits, does not meet the needs of the human, as well as of the various machines used for our missions, then service members are not going to be as effective and ready for combat.

The information gathered from the event is going to be crucial

in the development of not only female flight equipment, but female aviators as a whole across multiple branches.

"The goal is to ensure that the equipment that we are developing is going to fit properly, so that we have a safe that we get this word out," and ready force," Mendieta Vaughan said. "It's not just said. "By measuring a spectrum of women at different the fact that we are going to stages in their career, we can ensure that we have better equipment."

Many officers participating in this event are hoping

to be able to disseminate information to other bases regarding female flight equipment.

"When I look across the enterprise, this is an historic event and it's important Vaughan said. "It's not just the data that we are collecting and improve the equipment we use in combat, it's also important to make people aware that this is one of the challenges that we are facing right now. It's an take it for all it's worth."

For many female aviators, this marks a monumental push to ensure they are combat ready and their opinions are being heard.

"Women have been flying in the Air Force for a very long time," Mendieta said. "We have made progress but this is the first time in my 20-year career that we have had the kind of momentum that we have to get this right. We have the opportunity to get this right and we have to grab that and

## Air Force Recruiting sets the pace at Indy 500

INDIANAPOLIS (AFNS) --



\*Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Fair to good for walleye. Try slip bobbers or spinners and leeches in shallow water less than 10 feet. Work deeper with spinners. Try Pelican Lake or Howard's and New Mil bays. \*Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Not much activity around Baker's Bridge with low water

levels. OK success for walleye and

pike on Lake Darling. \*Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Good pike success. Bluegill just starting to move into shallower water with generally slow success yet. Occasional walleye.

\*Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Improving walleye activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. Try back bays and the mouth of bays in 3 to 15 feet using a variety of presentations as it transitions into a typical summer bite. Lake Audubon remains fair for walleye along with some nicesized bass Water temperatures warmer than on the east end of Sakakawea. Remember to release any muskie taken from Lake Audubon. No Missouri River reports.

\*Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, 6-Mile Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Mixed walleye success on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. Try minnows yet around Douglas Bay. Lake Audubon remains fair for walleye using leeches or nightcrawlers.

\*Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Walleye starting to move eastward with improving success around Deepwater and Parshall bays. Look for better success closer to Indian Hills as water temperatures continue to warm. Try minnows and nightcrawlers with some success now coming on leeches.

\*Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Good for walleye throughout the Van Hook Árm and surrounding area. Try a variety of presentations.

\*Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Resort, New Town: Van Hook Arm good for walleye in 8 to 24 feet. Work structure and move around with success throughout the Arm pitching jigs in shallow water. Also ry nighterawler harnesses or slow death hooks in deeper water.

\*Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River producing some walleye activity during the day in the spillway channel. Try jigs or pulling crankbaits. Look for better success in the chutes with higher eleases. Iry casting crankbalts in the morning or evening for walleye from the rocks. Not much activity in the wing walls or down river. Try pitching jigs up shallow with nightcrawlers or plastics along the north shore of Lake Sakakawea on the east end. Also try slow death

hooks. Continued pike success casting crankbaits from shore.

**OUTDOOR NOTES:** 

\*Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Continued good walleye success on Lake Sakakawea around Lewis and Clark State Park, Lund's Landing, and White Earth Bay but the lake is high in elevation and rising as mountain runoff comes into the system. For the Air Force, being a part of Indy means a full month and represented the Air Force of events leading up to the big race.

"The investment with Conor Daly and the No. 25 car running in the Indy 500 was successful before the green flag dropped," said Maj. Ross McKnight, AFRS branch chief of special events. ## Best with what they've got: A new I ife for old parts

ust like every other aircraft, parts on a B-52H Stratofortress age, get damaged and become unserviceable.

One detachment at Barksdale Air Force Base has developed a way to take those unusable parts and create hands-on training opportunities for maintainers.

"Normally, we have to coordinate with the maintenance squadron to find an aircraft that's not being flown or worked on and ask if we can get a block of time to go out and perform training tasks," said Master Sgt. Michael Farrar, 372nd Training Squadron Field Training Detachment 5 superintendent. "Training is important and everyone understands that, but vou have actual missions being completed out there on the flight line. So, there is always a chance for us to be in the way or even not being able to get the aircraft to do our training and that is where the unserviceable parts come in."

By utilizing aged or operationally condemned parts, the Air Education Training Command detachment assembles trainers that allow for a safe and focused environment for their Airmen to learn in.

For example, the detachment has a functioning landing gear trainer, which allows them to show maintainers step-by-step how to complete tasks such as replacing hydraulic fluid or change a tire without the worries of damaging operational aircraft, outside distractions or the fastpaced actions being conducted on the flight line.

"We want to provide effective training, so if using an operational aircraft is better, we would certainly like to do that over a trainer," said Tech. Sgt. Dylan Drake, 372nd TRS FTD 5 crew chief instructor. "However, having the trainers here is certainly more convenient and

gives us the ability to do it over and over if we need to."

Currently, the detachment is trying to get a section of a B-52H tail from the boneyard to use for drag chute training, which will alleviate one of their most difficult training scenarios to set

up. "The reason the training is problematic to organize is because the chutes are only deployed after a flight, so trying to coordinate a time where we have the students and also have an aircraft land can sometimes be tough between the communication and timing," Drake explained. "Having that tail section here that we can load whenever we need to would be a great addition to our capabilities.<sup>3</sup>

This hands-on experience has proven to be effective to students when it comes to absorbing the information.

'This form of instruction is a lot better because when you're actually doing it yourself, it's a lot easier to retain," said Airman 1st Class Chase Guggenbuehl, a student at the detachment and 11th Aircraft Maintenance Unit crew chief. "It makes you want to pay attention. It's not just words on a screen. The actual tools and parts of the jet are right in front of you to help you see how it actually works.'

The feedback from the courses at Barksdale AFB and Minot AFB, North Dakota, have been so positive that it is now being used as a model for maintenance field training across the Air Force.

"It's awesome to be a part of this capability and help other maintainers get the training they need to be effective and ultimately getting the aircraft off the ground and completing the mission," Farrar said. "That is only possible when you have a team who is dedicated to what they do, care about their students and who are always looking for ways to be more impactful.'




