



No Bake Peanut Butter Granola Cups



INGREDIENTS:

- 2 ½ cups granola
- 1 cup peanuts-chopped
- 3 Tablespoons peanut butter 3 Tablespoons honey (or more if needed)

- 1 cup peanut butter-melted

- 12 oz. dark chocolate-finally chopped

- 4. Finally, melt dark chocolate and coconut oil and spoon melted chocolate on top of peanut butter. Chill until chocolate has set.
- 5. Store in the fridge in air-tight container., or freeze for longer storage.







North Dakota Engineers Assist YMCA Camp

NORTH DAKOTA NATIONAL GUARD

GARRISON, N.D. - Recently, about twenty-five Soldiers of the North Dakota National Guard's Wahpeton-based 188th Engineer Company (VERTICAL) assisted the Minot YMCA by improving the grounds of the Triangle YMCA camp near Garrison. The area is owned by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and is leased to the YMCA.

The camp was hampered by debris in three old shelter belts consisting of dead, rotting trees. This rubble impeded the YMCA's camp staff's ability to have sufficient area to properly conduct youth activities. The YMCA asked for the Guard's assistance under the auspices of DoD's Civil-Military Community (CMC) project. The CMC is an unfunded civil-military community assistance program meaning the National Guard will not be reimbursed for costs incurred while participating in this project.

"This type of project is why the CMC program exists," said Maj. Gen. Al Dohrmann, North Dakota adjutant general. "It allows our Army engineers the opportunity to get quality training on important skills while simultaneously addressing a need within our communities".

The unit used this clearing and grubbing project to exercise their horizontal, or earthworking skills. Although the Engineer Company's consist of mostly vertical, or construction-skilled Soldiers, there is a section with earthmoving equipment.

"This project was successful for our Soldiers and for the YMCA," said Capt. Joe Johnson, commander of the 188th Engineer Company. "We were able to conduct quality training to improve our skill sets while achieving the camp's expectations for the project. As always, our mission success was ensured thanks to the great support provided by our families and civilian employers of our Guard Soldiers.'

The engineers worked on this project during their 2019 Annual Training (AT) Aug. 1 to 13 and are expected to complete the work during their next AT in 2020.

"We look forward to returning

next year to complete the project," added Johnson.

There's a process to gain authorization for National Guard assistance. Similar to other projects, environment and other assessments on the project are required. Finally, the project must provide a military unit quality training of the tasks they must be able to accomplish as part of their mission.

Once requirements were satisfied, the project plan moved up the chain for approval at the Department of Defense



Good numbers of smaller walleye with better success around the west side of the lake than east side. Work 30 to 40 feet and deeper with leadcore for larger fish.

• Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Lots of small walleye. Work spinners and bottom bouncers with nightcrawlers along any of the highways in 20 to 25 feet with larger fish in deeper water. Try along the tower rock piles.

Swan Hunt Lottery Held, Licenses Remain

North Dakota's swan lottery has been held and 185 licenses remain. Only hunters who do not have a swan license for the 2019 season can apply, as regulations limit hunters to one license per year.

Beginning Aug. 28, all remaining licenses will be issued on a firstcome, first-served basis. Resident and nonresident hunters must apply online at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov. The license fee is \$10 for residents and \$30 for nonresidents.

The statewide tundra swan hunting season is Sep. 28 – Dec. 29, 2019.

Hunters should note that Game and Fish will not mail swan licenses to successful applicants until after they purchase a valid 2019-20 hunting license. All swan hunters, regardless of age, are required to have a general game and habitat license. In addition, residents age 16 and older need a small game license and nonresidents must have a waterfowl license.

Fall Turkey Season Set

North Dakota's fall turkey season is set, with 3,660 licenses available to hunters, 50 fewer than last year.

Fall turkey hunters, including gratis applicants, who are interested in applying for a 2019 license can submit an online application through the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's website,

Applications are also accepted at the department's toll-free licensing line, 800-406-6409. A service fee is added for license applications made over the phone.

The deadline for applying is Sept. 4.

Only North Dakota residents are eligible to apply in the first lottery. Nonresidents can apply for fall turkey licenses that are still available following the first lottery.

As per state law, a resident who does not want to receive a

fall turkey hunting license but would like to accrue a bonus point, can purchase a point on the application for the same fee as the turkey license. The bonus point fee is allocated to the department's Private Lands Open to Sportsmen Program.

Hunting units 21 (Hettinger and Adams counties) and 47 (Sheridan, Wells, Eddy, Foster, Kidder and Stutsman counties) will be closed to fall turkey hunting again this year because of low turkey numbers.

The fall wild turkey season runs from Oct. 12 through Jan. 5, 2020.

Deer Archery Season Opens Aug. 30

North Dakota's deer archery season opens Friday, Aug. 30 at noon, and continues through Jan. 5, 2020.

Bowhunters can buy a license online at the state Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd. gov; by calling 800-406-6409; or at vendors linked to the Game and Fish Department's online licensing system. Hunters who purchase bow licenses at a vendor location will receive a tag at time of purchase; otherwise, hunters who purchase their license over the phone or personal computer should allow for several days to receive their tag in the mail. A general game and habitat license is also required for archery hunters, and must be purchased prior to receiving the archery tag.

Bowhunters must follow all regulations of the managing agency when using tree stands, ground blinds and game cameras on public hunting areas, including displaying equipment an registration number, or the owner's name, address and telephone number, on all equipment left unattended on Game and Fish wildlife management areas.

In addition, hunting big game over bait is prohibited on both public and private land in deer hunting units 3A1, 3A2, 3A3 north of U.S. Highway 2, 3B1, 3C west of the Missouri River, 3E1, 3E2, 3F1

Hunters should refer to the 2019

deer hunting guide for season information and regulations.

Federal Duck Stamp **Required Sept. 1**Waterfowl hunters age 16 and

older are reminded a federal duck stamp is required beginning Sept. 1. Waterfowl includes ducks, geese,

swans, mergansers and coots.

This year's 2019-20 federal duck stamp is available for electronic purchase through the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's website, gf.nd.gov, instant licensing telephone number, 800-406-6409, or at license vendors registered with the department's licensing system. Physical stamps are not available at North Dakota license vendors, but they can still be purchased at many U.S. Postal Service offices.

The electronic stamp is a purchase item like any other hunting or fishing license. When the purchase is completed the electronic stamp is valid immediately. The words "Federal Duck Stamp" will be printed on the license certificate, along with an expiration date 45 days from the date of purchase. The actual physical stamp will be sent by postal mail.

The physical stamp is processed and sent by the official duck stamp vendor in Texas, and should arrive to the individual buyer well before the expiration date printed on the electronic license. The physical stamp must remain in possession of the hunter after the 45-day electronic stamp has expired. Individuals who have questions regarding the status of their physical stamp can contact the federal duck stamp vendor customer service number at 800-

The federal duck stamp has a fee of \$25. An additional \$1.50 fee is added to cover shipping and handling costs of the actual physical stamp.

Oh Man! Travis Gerjets Baking Bread and Building Community

When Travis Gerjets moved to Minot in 2014, he wanted to carry on the ideas of community he and his wife, Brandy, were a part of in Europe. He didn't know then that a sentimental feeling toward bread would be his way toward that community.

"I'd been a serious home baker for probably five years knowing in the back of my mind that I love doing this and, at some point, it might be fun to take a shot and open a bakery not having any idea what that really meant at that point," Travis says. "If I would've known then what I know now about what it takes to open a bakery, I might have thought a lot harder about it when we started this journey."

That journey began with about a dozen loaves of bread, baked in Travis' home kitchen, to be sold at a friend's vegetable stand during the early season of Minot's farmers' market.

"The next week, people came back and they really enjoyed the bread and some of the bread that I made reminded them of their grandmother's bread or bread that they had when they were abroad. There were just some taste memories that people had,

and we started sharing stories and then this little community kind of got built around this bread, and that was really the start of Prairie Sky Breads," Travis recalls.

Those memories of a grandmother and ties to Europe that brought people back for Travis' bread were also reasons he's continued baking bread. While living in overseas — London, Liverpool, Israel, and Palestine — Travis and Brandy spent time visiting intentional living communities, places where people with shared beliefs choose to live together or choose to have a shared way of life. In one of those communities, they were introduced to a bread making event for the community. People came in to bake two loaves of bread — one was for the communal meal and the other

was for the baker to take and hopefully share.

'The intention was that maybe more often than not, you'd find ways to give that away, to share that bread. Whether it was a good excuse to go visit a friend or relative you haven't seen for a while or to give to somebody who was hungry, that was bread to share," Travis says.

When Travis made his first loaf of bread in that community, it sparked his senses and memories of his grandmother, Nana, which inspired him to learn some of her recipes that no one else in the family had carried on. Upon

returning to the States, he did pick up those traditional recipes, which became some of the early bread recipes for Prairie Sky Breads.

BREAD SUBSCRIBERS

Today, Travis and Brandy, along with their new business partners Jazmine and Zach Schultz, are preparing to open a café in downtown Minot. What started as a humble offering at the farmers' market transformed into a delivery service for bread subscribers, which grew into a healthy social media following in a short five years.

"It's opened so many doors and built so many connections for me in the community; that there's this community that's formed around it including all of our amazing supporters that it's a fun place to be, it's a really humbling and gratifying place to be," Travis

When Travis first began offering a subscription and delivery service for his breads and other baked goods like cookies and scones, he wanted to ensure everyone in Minot who wanted a taste of Prairie Sky Breads could afford his products, so he introduced a "pay what you will"

"We were kind of taking a risk because if everybody got a threemonth bread subscription and paid \$5 for it, that would have been a huge hit to our business, but if we had some people that paid under and some that paid over, then it would all work out and that's exactly what happened. It was a beautiful thing to be a part of on our end to see folks being generous and paying it forward to folks who maybe couldn't afford (the subscription)," Travis

A SLICE OF HAPPINESS

As the business owners prepare to move into their café, they want to continue making their

loaf it forward" type of program. Through recent pop-up cafés at the Minot Area Council of the Arts office, Travis has had a glimpse of what running a café will involve.

"There's just something about baked goods that people come in and they're in a good mood. They sit down and they're in a good mood. They're laughing and talking with friends over a cup of coffee. It's just been a really positive space. It's a communitybuilding space," Travis says.
While hours are brutal and the

work is hard and physical, Travis says he's met incredible people along the way — other local

business owners, independent bakers in other cities, and local supporters — who've helped take the bakery in a new direction.

Prairie Sky Breads plans to be in its new bakery at the corner of Central Avenue and First Street SE later this year.
