
















MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

As the lights dim and the bays grow silent, he crawls into his neatly-made bed. He hoped for some well-earned rest, with his body covered in sores and bruises. Just as he succumbed to sleep, 30 men's voices pierce the air in the tune of happy birthday. This was the first moment he felt connected to his new brothers-in-arms.

Just three days before he turned 40, Senior Airman Richard J. Cabak, Maintenance Management Analyst for the 5th Maintenance Group, left for Air Force Basic Military Training.

When the company he worked for fizzled out, he was posed with several choices. He could either travel to a different state and work for a new company, or he could try something new. Cabak chose the latter.

"The question I always get asked is 'why did you join so late?'," said Cabak. "It has always been a lifelong dream of mine."

Cabak said he received a few odd looks here and there, but he wouldn't let that stop him. The recruiters helped push him to BMT as fast as possible, and he accepted the first job offered to him: maintenance management analysis.

He says his leadership was curious when he first arrived at Minot.

"They gave me some looks, but to be honest I wasn't phased by it," said Cabak. "They welcomed me and I'm very happy with the result." Cabak. "What's stopping me?" His actions have even incite his son Hans to follow in h

Cabak says he has three major goals in life: serve in the military, become a pilot and later on a doctor. Having enlisted and received his pilot license, he says becoming a doctor is only a few years away.

"I joined because I was inspired," said Cabak. "Simple as that."

Cabak has done many things since he has enlisted. He is a member of Airmen Against Drunk Driving, and is very proud to be a spokesperson for the group.

"Life might be a struggle every day, but I power through it," said His actions have even incited his son Hans to follow in his footsteps and enlist; he is now currently finishing tech school in California as a cryptologic

in California as a cryptologic linguist. They have a running joke and competition to see who can make the rank of chief master sergeant first.

"He has blossomed; my wife and I are so proud," said Cabak.

Cabak often thinks back to that night in BMT when his wingmen sang for his birthday. He says he is extremely grateful to have amazing leadership and wingmen and wants to thank everyone who has given him a chance and helped to achieve his lifelong goal.

Blueberry Cheesecake Crumb Cake



Crumb Cake:

- 3 and 1/3 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2/3 cup butter-cold and cut in
- cubes
- Grated zest from 1 lemon(optional)
- 1/3 cup light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

INSTRUCTIONS:

• Preheat the oven to 350 F. Line the bottom of 9 inches springform pan with parchment paper, spray bottom and sides of the pan with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.

I • n a large bowl stir together flour, baking powder, salt, brown sugar, sugar and lemon zest.

• Add butter in dry ingredients mixture. Now, you can work it with hands, or press with a fork, or you can use the mixer. Work it until it's grainy.

• Add eggs and vanilla and mix to combine. The mixture should be crumbly. If it's to sandy squeeze it with your fingers to make pea size crumbs.

• Press about 2/3 of the mixture in the bottom and side (about 1 1/2 inch height) of the pan. Place the pan and remaining crumbs in the fridge.

• To make the filling mix together cream cheese, mascarpone, vanilla, sugar and corn starch just to combine. Add eggs and mix just to combine, do not overdo it.


• Pour half of the cheesecake mixture in chilled crust, scattered about 2/3 cup of blueberries over the filling. Spread remaining cheesecake mixture. Top with

blueberries and remaining crumbs. \bullet Bake at 350 F until golden brown and toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 65-75 minutes. If it starts browning too much tent the top with

aluminum foil • To make the glaze stir together powdered sugar and milk or cream. If it's too thin add powdered sugar, if it's too thick add more milk.

September: Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

MINOT AFB VIOLENCE PREVENTION

One life lost to suicide is too many. There is no single cause. Suicide most often occurs when several stressors and health issues converge to create an experience of hopelessness and despair. Suicide is one of the most significant public health issues facing the United States today. Families are losing loved ones; workplaces are losing talented employees and communities are losing valued members. How much of a concern is suicide? And just who are the victims? The statistics are staggering!

• Since 1990, the rate of suicide has increased 33%.

• Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States for all ages. The suicide rate for men is 3.6 times that of women.

• Since 2016, suicide has been ranked the second leading cause of death for ages 10-34 and the fourth leading cause for ages 35-54 in the United States.

• In the United States, more people die by suicide each year than by homicide and HIV/AIDS combined.

• Since 2011, suicide has surpassed motor vehicle injuries as a cause of death.

The Air Force is strongly committed to preventing suicides among our service members and their families. Effective prevention requires a comprehensive approach that involves every member of the community. The Air Force Suicide Prevention strategy embraces holistic and data-driven components and is rooted in public health.

Team Minot's Violence Prevention Team assists in implementing a multi-faceted public health approach to suicide prevention. Violence Prevention Implementers provide annual training for the installation focusing on Suicide Prevention. This training emphasizes a number of Suicide Prevention strategies as identified by the Department of Defense:

• Create protective environments

• Identify and support people at risk

• Teach coping and problemsolving skills

• Promote connectedness Additional strategies include:

Strengthen economic supports
Strengthen access and delivery of suicide care

• Lessen harms and prevent future risk.

At the foundation of this training is the belief and understanding that "in order to prevent suicide, a systemic cultural change is essential, and our community must be unified in its commitment to prevention."


À key protective factor for everyone is "connectedness," a concept or idea that makes us feel like we belong. The Minot Violence Prevention Team is dedicated to spreading this message across our installation and committed to letting our people know, "You Matter." Feeling connected to or belonging to someone or someplace helps us realize we are not alone: we can lean on others and it is okay to ask for help.

Minot's Violence Prevention team has already been out across the installation spreading the word and reminding people about the importance of Suicide Prevention.

On Wednesday, September 4th, team members stood, greeting at the gates as people were coming in to work. The Team had an opportunity to meet with an outstanding group of youth at the Youth Center to talk about the importance of belonging and feeling valued. Over the next few weeks, Implementers will be engaging with folks within their units to hand out Crisis line cards/treats to remind people about Suicide Prevention and how every single one of us are an integral part of our installation's efforts to prevent suicide.

Suicide Prevention starts in the home, in the workplace, and in our community.





Peterson Airmen save life

In the beginning of August, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David Goldfein ordered all wings to stand down for a day and focus on resiliency and suicide prevention due to the alarming increase of suicide rates in the U.S. Air Force in 2019.

Eighty-nine Air Force Total Force Airmen had taken their own lives this year.

Two Airmen from the 21st Operational Medical Readiness Squadron dental lab, successfully responded to a friend from another Air Force base with suicidal thoughts.

August 7, 2019 was a normal day for Airman 1st Class Brittany Wright. She was planning on going to bed early that night when she answered a phone call from a friend she met in technical school.

"It wasn't unusual he was calling to talk," Wright said. "But after about an hour he said something I never thought I would ever hear."

Wright said she was shocked to hear her friend say that he didn't want to live anymore.

She knew she had to do something, and do it quickly. While still talking on the phone with her friend, she messaged her co-worker and friend for help at 8:54 p.m.

"I didn't know exactly what to do either," said Duffus. "I didn't know who he was or who I should call but I picked up the phone and got in contact with my first sergeant."

Duffus immediately called her first sergeant and worked with Wright to get as many details as possible about the Airman. She was able to provide Master Sgt. Jonathan Eckley, 21st Medical Group first sergeant, with the Airman's name and career field to speed up the process of getting in touch with the Airman's first sergeant through the base's command post.

To explain how both the Airmen and first sergeant were feeling, Eckley gave the analogy of a duck swimming on a pond.

"Calm on the surface, but paddling like crazy below,"



Eckley said. "This was new to all of us, but we all have been through training to get the help this Airman needed."

Eckley was able to get in contact with the endangered Airman's first sergeant within minutes.

The Airman's first sergeant immediately responded and went to the Airman's dorm room with his supervisor and security forces members. During this time, Wright was able to keep her friend talking on the phone to prevent him from having a chance to take his own life. His first sergeant and the defenders knocked on his door at 9:31 p.m.

"The Air Force focuses on resiliency more and more each year," Eckley said. "We have produced effective training several times a year. Wright and Duffus are a strong example of this. The training they receive in their short time in the service was so ingrained in themselves they didn't even realize they were using the provided training." Without even realizing it, Wright and Duffus used ACE to help Wright's friend. ACE — ask, care, escort — is a resiliency tool used to prevent and respond to the crisis of suicide. Wright specifically asked her friend if he was going to hurt himself. She was able to continue to keep him talking on the phone while she enlisted help to get to him. Although she herself wasn't able to escort him, she got the help he needed to be escorted properly.

General John W. "Jay"

Raymond, Air Force Space Command and Joint Force Space Component commander, presented Wright and Duffus the Air Force Achievement Medal. It is awarded to Air Force personnel for outstanding achievement or meritorious service rendered specifically on behalf of the Air Force.

Both Airmen were also asked to attend the Air Force Association National Convention in Washington, D.C. in September. The convention connects brave Airmen 1st Class Brittany Wright and Tiffany Duffus, 21st Operational Medical Readiness Squadron dental lab technicians, tell their story of successfully responding to a friend with suicidal thoughts Aug. 22, 2019 at Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado. Both Airmen received the Air Force Achievement Medal and were asked to attend the Air Force Association National Convention in September.

Air Force releases 2019 Artificial Intelligence Strategy

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --The Air Force released the Artificial Intelligence Strategy Sept. 12, highlighting the importance of artificial intelligence capabilities to 21st century missions.

The strategy provides definition, context and purpose for artificial intelligence in the Air Force, and is the service's annex to the Department of Defense Artificial Intelligence Strategy.

"The Air Force is charged to provide the nation with Air and Space Superiority, Global Strike, Rapid Global Mobility, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance and Command Control," said Acting Secretary of the Air Force Matthew Donovan and Air Force Chief of Staff General David Goldfein in the dual-signed annex. "Al is a capability that will underpin our ability to compete, deter and win across all five of these diverse missions. It is crucial to fielding tomorrow's Air Force faster and smarter, executing multi-domain operations in the high-end fight, confronting threats below the level of open conflict and partnering with our allies around the globe."

The strategy serves as the framework for aligning Air Force efforts with the National Defense Strategy and the Department of Defense Artificial Intelligence Strategy as executed by the Joint Artificial Intelligence Center. It details the fundamental principles, enabling functions and objectives necessary to effectively manage, maneuver and lead in the digital age. "In this return to great power competition, the United States Air Force will harness and wield the most representative forms of AI across all missionsets, to better enable outcomes with greater speed and accuracy, while optimizing the abilities of each and every Airman," wrote Secretary Donovan and General Goldfein. "We do this to best protect and defend our nation and its vital interests, while always remaining accountable to the American public."



• Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Try jigging Raps with minnows in 20 to 25 feet but most anglers are working deeper in 40 feet. Try the south side.

• Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Scattered walleye success in 20 to 30 feet using Lindy rigs or jigs and minnows.

• Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Resort, New Town: Try minnows or creek chubs with jigs in deeper water around Shell, Independence, or 8-Pound for walleye.

 Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River continues producing decent walleye activity from shore in the morning and evening. Try slow death hook or Lindy rigs and bottom bouncers in the spillway channel or down river. Good numbers of smaller walleye in the spillway. Chutes producing a mix of catfish, salmon, and walleye. Lake Sakakawea spotty for walleye. Try slow death hooks and nightcrawlers in 30 feet or jigs and minnows around Steinke

Bay, 7 Sisters, Alcatraz or Douglas Bay. Salmon still somewhat spotty. Some downrigging yet but more fish coming along the face of the dam or even Douglas Bay longlining crankbaits in 30 feet. Work deeper down to 60 feet during the day. No large numbers of salmon, yet.

• Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Scattered walleye activity. Try 10 to 25 feet with spinners and minnows. Missouri River producing catfish.

• Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: No new reports.

• North-central/central N.D. lakes, Towner Hdwe. Hank, Towner: No new reports from the Souris River or area lakes.

<u>Hunting:</u>

• Archery deer: Fair early season success with hunters generally seeing more deer, although not that much movement yet.

• Upland: Fair success around the midsection of Lake Sakakawea.

• Waterfowl: Look for nice numbers of local birds in the northwest.

Pink Shirts Minot woman designs fundraising t-shirts with signature from former Miss Rodeo America

Minot, N.D. – There's a special style of t-shirt going around Minot these days.

Since the campaign began with the rodeo in 2007, over \$717,00 has been raised and more than 550 people have been helped.


This is the first in a series of t-shirts that will have the signatures of different North Dakota personalities on them.

INGREDIENTS

12 Large Eggs 3 Jalapeños

2 Tbsp chopped Chives

1) Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add eggs and cook for 9 minutes. Remove and rinse in cold water. Once cool enough to handle, peel the eggs, and slice in half.

2) Preheat grill with lid open for 5-10 minutes, then set to smoke. Place eggs, yolk side up, on an aluminum perforated sheet, along with jalapeños. Allow to smoke with lid closed for 1 hour. Remove from grill.

4) In medium to large bowl, carefully remove yolks from eggs. Add the jalapeños, 2 slices of minced candied bacon, mayo, vinegar, mustard, chili powder, and cayenne pepper. Mix together until relatively smooth. Add salt if needed.
