

### **Bull Session**

### Minot man, veteran enjoys volunteering behind the scenes at the Minot rodeo

**MINOT Y'S MEN'S RODEO** 

Minot, N.D. (September 26, 2019) – A former B-52 bomber pilot now works behind the scenes at the Minot Y's Men's Rodeo.

Pat Travnicek, who spent 28 years on active duty with the U.S. Air Force, volunteers his time at the Y's Men's Rodeo each year.

As a member of the Y's Men, he helps with the group's main fundraiser, the rodeo, which takes place this year October 4-6 at the North Dakota State Fair Center. He's one of the several dozen volunteers behind the scenes; Travnicek's job is to work the "stripping chute," where the saddles, riggings, flank straps and bull ropes are stripped off the bucking horses and bulls after they compete.

It's an exciting place to be. The horses and bulls weigh anywhere from 1,100 to 1,500 pounds and Travnicek and the other three volunteers have to work quickly and carefully, so as not to be in the way of the animals. A few years ago, it got exciting really fast: a bull, plus the two pickup men (the men on horseback who help usher the bulls out of the arena) all came into the small holding area where Travnicek was, at the same time. Travnicek found himself on the ground, knocked down by a horse, underneath a bull. He was unscathed but "it was a pretty exciting thirty seconds of my life," he said.

Travnicek joined the Air Force in 1978 and served three tours at the Minot Air Force Base. In addition to Minot AFB he was stationed at Laughlin (Texas) AFB, Castle (Calif.) AFB, and Offutt (Nebraska) AFB. He returned 2006, he now works at Minot AFB in a civilian role. He also helps run

He joined the Minot Y's Club about a dozen years ago and loves being involved with the group. "It's a great organization. I enjoy the camaraderie and the cause they work for, the Triangle Y Camp." Through the rodeo, the club raises funds for the Triangle Y Camp on the shores of Lake Sakakawea, near Garrison, N.D.

Travnicek also loves the support that the rodeo offers to the military. On the last day of the rodeo, October 6, tickets for active military and veterans and their immediate families are

reduced. As a veteran, Travnicek is thankful for the recognition. "It's nice to be appreciated." The wing commanders from MAFB are invited to the rodeo, and they are recognized during the performance.

He doesn't get to see much of the rodeo, but what he gets to see is great. "I probably have the best seat in the house," he said. During the bareback riding, saddle bronc riding, and bull riding, it is hectic. "You have one horse coming in (the stripping chute) when the other is being ridden. The horses and bulls come through the chute, we take their equipment off, and

off they go."

Travnicek has been married to his wife Jean for forty-one years. They have two daughters and two grandsons.

The 65th annual Minot Y's Men's Rodeo is October 4-6 at All Seasons Arena at the North Dakota State Fair Center. Performances are at 7 pm on October 4, 1 pm and 7 pm on October 5, and 1:30 pm on October 6. Tickets range in price from \$8 to \$33 and can be purchased online www.MinotYsMensRodeo. com. 

# No Bake Pumpkin Cheesecake

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

Pumpkin Cheesecake

- 2 cups pumpkin puree, or use a 15oz can
- 2/3 cup heavy cream,
- 33% MF or more • 24 oz cream cheese,
- brick-style, full-fat cream cheese
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Graham Cracker Crust

- 1 1/2 cups graham crumbs
- 2 tabelspoons brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter,

### INSTRUCTIONS:

### Graham Crust

- In a medium bowl stir together the graham crumbs, sugar & cinnamon. Then stir in the melted butter.
- Press the mixture into the bottom of a 9-inch springform pan.
- Place in the freezer as you make the filling.

### Cheesecake Filling

- Blot the pumpkin with a paper towel and squeeze out the excess liquid. I do this many times to remove as much liquid as possible.
- In a large bowl beat the heavy cream until stiff peaks form.
- In a separate large bowl beat the cream cheese until soft. Then beat in the sugars and pumpkin pie spice.

- · Mix in the vanilla extract and pump-
- Gently fold the whipped cream into the cream cheese mixture using a rubber spatula.
- Take the crust out of the freezer. Spoon the cheesecake mixture over top and spread the top smooth.
- Place in the fridge to chill for at least 6 hours.\*
- When ready to serve, trace a very thin sharp knife around the edges of the pan, then unclamp the spring-

Top with whipped cream, slice into pieces & serve.

## **Catholic Health Initiatives Supports National #1 Thing** Movement

CHI's ND Violence Prevention Program is honoring October 2019 as Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM). Our dedicated staff will use DVAM as an opportunity to inform domestic violence victims and the community about available help and resources. This DVAM, we encourage everyone to do #1 Thing to show that violence and abuse have no place in our community.

The statistics associated with domestic violence are epidemic. On a typical day in the US, three women are killed by a current or former intimate partner and more than 20,000 phone calls are placed to domestic violence hotlines. According to CAWS North Dakota, the state sexual assault and domestic violence coalition, last year 5,172 new domestic violence victims received services; these included transportation, emergency shelter, planning assistance, information on the criminal justice system, and referrals for other services.

Domestic violence is a major health issue. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that women who have experienced domestic violence are 80% more likely to have a stroke, 70% more likely to have heart disease, and 60% more likely to have asthma. In addition, domestic violence can lead to long-lasting mental health consequences including depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, and issues with alcohol or drug abuse.

Eight Catholic Health Initiative facilities in North Dakota joined together to create the CHI ND Violence Prevention Program. This Program is working to end the stigma surrounding domestic violence in our communities by providing trauma-informed training to professionals and healthy relationship workshops to individuals. As part of our DVAM 2019 activities, our associates will be wearing purple pins and

our facilities will be displaying awareness materials to honor victims and survivors of domestic violence.

Domestic violence impacts millions of people each year, but it can be prevented. It requires the collective voice and power of individuals, families, institutions, and systems. CHI's ND Violence Prevention Program encourages everyone to do #1 Thing this month to end domestic violence. Each of these singular acts will add up to collective action that creates a strong foundation for a world without violence.





### **Wetland Conditions Good for Duck Hunting**

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department's annual fall wetland survey indicates goodto-excellent conditions for duck hunting throughout the state.

Andy Dinges, migratory game bird biologist, said the number of duck hunting wetlands are up about 65% statewide from a year ago, largely driven by record fall wetland conditions in the south central and southeast regions of the state. The northwest, north central and northeast regions have also seen 30-37% increases in the number of duck hunting wetlands compared to last fall.

"Fall wetland records for the south central and southeast regions were easily broken, and duck hunting wetlands recorded in these regions are up about 300% from average," Dinges said.

Wetland conditions had been declining for a few years now, Dinges mentioned, but adequate snowmelt and abundant rainfall throughout spring and summer have dramatically improved wetland conditions in the state.

"However, the north central and northeast regions of the state are still recovering from drought conditions experienced over the last few years, and the number of duck hunting wetlands in these regions remain slightly below average," Dinges said.

The quality of waterfowl hunting in North Dakota is largely determined by weather conditions and migration patterns. Dinges said good reproduction for ducks in traditional breeding areas this year also make for good fall hunting potential in North Dakota. However, he said given these wet conditions, hunters may encounter wetlands with extensive flooded vegetation, potentially making hunting difficult in some areas.

always "Hunters should scout because of ever changing conditions and distribution of waterfowl," he added. "Hunters should also be cautious driving off-trail to avoid soft spots, and while encountering areas of tall vegetation that could be a fire hazard."

The fall wetland survey is conducted annually in mid-September, just prior to the waterfowl hunting season to provide an assessment of conditions duck hunters can expect.

### **Youth Pheasant Weekend** Oct. 5-6

North Dakota's two-day youth pheasant season is Oct. 5-6. Legally licensed residents and nonresidents ages 15 and younger may hunt roosters statewide.

Resident youth hunters, regardless of age, must possess a fishing, hunting and furbearer certificate and general game and habitat license. Nonresident youth hunters from states that provide a reciprocal licensing agreement North Dakota residents qualify for North Dakota resident licenses. Otherwise, nonresident youth hunters must purchase a nonresident small game license.

Shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise to sunset. Youth ages 12 and older need to have passed a certified hunter education course. The daily bag limit and all other regulations for the regular pheasant season apply.

An adult at least 18 years of age must accompany the youth hunter in the field. The adult may not carry a firearm.

Purchased by the Game and Fish Department's Encouraging Tomorrow's Hunters grant program, the trailer is designed for families who don't have the appropriate gear for their young hunters to hunt waterfowl. The equipment is donated by Avery Outdoors.

Use of the trailer is free, and it is equipped with goose and duck decoys for field hunting, and two bags of floating duck decoys and marsh seats for hunting a wetland.
