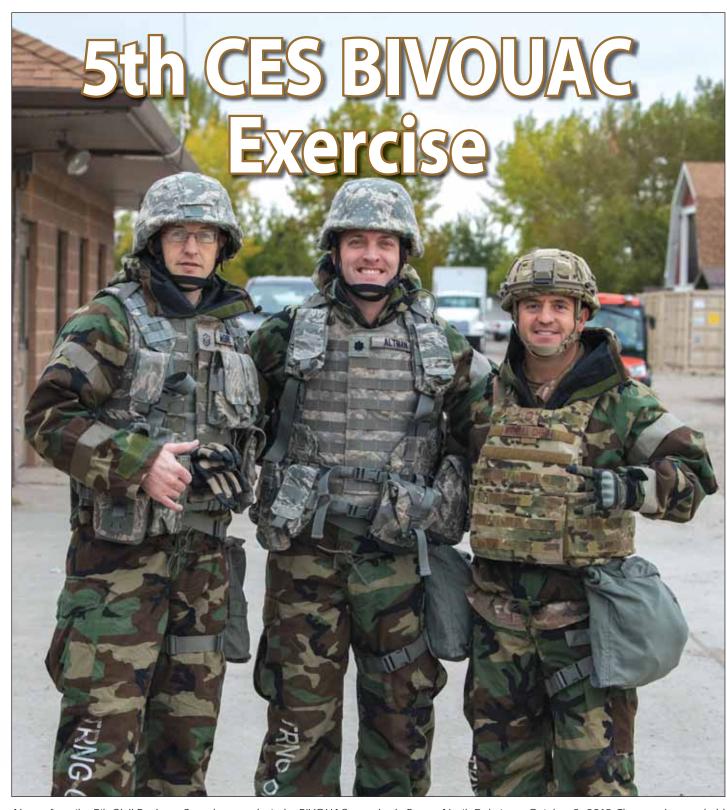

Follow These Stress Relief Tips

Some stress in your life is healthy. It can motivate you to change behavior and develop skills, especially in military life. However, constant stress is not good for you and can cause health issues and performance problems. Here are some tips for recognizing and managing stress.

Learn to recognize when you feel stress

Stress can cause a variety of different symptoms. Some people experience back pain and tense muscles, headaches, nausea or stomach pain, trouble sleeping and fatigue. Less-obvious symptoms include:

Irritability

Anxiety or panic attacks Difficulty making decisions

Trouble concentrating

Apathy

Feelings of being out of control Changes in behavior - low energy or loss of libido

Learn how to manage stress

The good news is that once you recognize the signs of stress, you are well on your way to managing it. Try this simple Chill Drill designed by a therapist specializing in working with service members and their families to help reverse the symptoms of stress. You can also use these stress-management techniques to help minimize your symptoms:

Focus on the things you can control. When you feel stressed out by a situation, think about what you CAN control. Give yourself some action steps. If your actions will have no impact on the situation, then learn to accept it for what it is.

Exercise. Commit to a regular workout. Run. Lift. Swim.

Make time for your favorite activity. Treat yourself to some "me" time. Continue doing those activities that give you pleasure. Try to fit leisure activities and hobbies into your day.

Simplify your life. Do whatever vou can to simplify your life. Say no to social commitments you don't enjoy and limit your time on email and social networking sites.

Laugh often. Look for the humor in everyday life. Rent your favorite comedy or laugh with a friend. You can take your military duty seriously without taking yourself seriously.

Breathe deeply. By taking long, slow breaths, you increase your oxygen and calm yourself down. Even a few deep breaths can relax tension throughout your body.

Stay in the present. Try to be aware of what is happening in the present moment and focus your attention on what you are doing in any given moment. When your thoughts turn to the past and the future, gently try to bring them back to the here and now.

Learn how to relax. Try some visualization exercises, such as picturing yourself in a relaxed or happy setting like the beach. Go for a walk. Listen to music. Read a book.

Get organized. Too much clutter can add to feeling things are out of control. Do your best to get rid of it. File old paperwork. Clean out your closet. Donate your excess belongings to a second-hand clothing store.

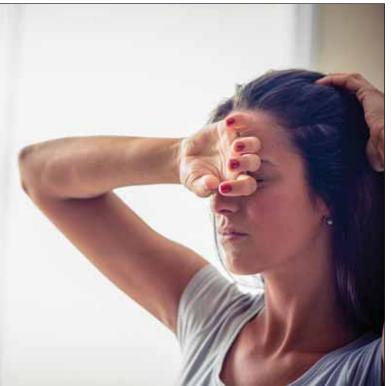

Dump and Bake Meatball Casserole



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (16 ounce) package uncooked rotini pasta
- 1 (25 ounce) jar marinara sauce
- 1 (14 ounce) package fully-cooked miniature (cocktail-size) meatballs (if using frozen meatballs, make sure that they are completely thawed before using)
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella (or Italian blend cheese)

Optional: Parmesan cheese and fresh chopped herbs (such as basil, oregano, and parsley for garnish)

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 425 degrees F.
- In a large baking dish (about 9 x 13), stir together uncooked pasta, marinara sauce, water, and meatballs. Cover tightly with aluminum foil and bake for 35
- Uncover; stir. At this point you should check the pasta to make sure that it is al dente (firm but just about finished cooking). If it's still too hard, cover the dish and return to the oven until pasta is all dente. Then move on to the next step.
- Sprinkle mozzarella over the top and bake uncovered for 5-10 more minutes (or until cheese is melted and pasta is tender).

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"From Russia with Love" Saturday, November 14, 2019

MINOT SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

MINOT, ND, October 28, 2019 - The Minot Symphony Orchestra presents "From Russia with Love" on Nov. 16 at 7:30 pm in Ann Nicole Nelson Hall - MSU.

Explore three of the most wellknown pieces in the Russian repertoire including Festival Overture Shostakovich, Dances Symphonic Rachmaninoff and Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No. 1 featuring Ukrainian-American pianist and Steinway Artist Marina Lomazov.

"For our second concert I have planned an old Russian program. I'm thrilled to have virtuoso pianist and my good friend Marina Lomazov joining us performing probably one of the best-known warhorses of the Russian Piano repertoire, Tchaikovsky Piano Concerto No. 1" said music director Efrain Amava.

Ms. Lomazov is a Professor of Piano at the Eastman School of Music She has served as a jury member for the Cleveland International Piano

Competition (Young Artists), Hilton Head International Piano Competition, Eastman International Piano Competition, Minnesota International Piano e-Competition, National federation Biennial young Artist Auditions and is currently serving as a chair for National Classical Music Panel for YoungArts, the only organization in the US that nominates US Presidential Scholars in the Arts. For 17 years, she served on the faculty of the University of Southern Carolina School of Music, where she held the chair of Ira McKissick Koger Professor of Fine Arts Music and currently holds a Guest Artist Residency. Together with her husband and piano duo partner Joseph Rackers, she co-founded and serves as Co-Artistic Director of the Southeastern Piano Festival in Columbia, SC. Lomazov has established herself as one of the most passionate and charismatic performers on the concert scene

"Yes, Marina Lomazov certainly

did play Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No. 1 in B minor, but she did so much more. She breathed life and passion into the music's very existence, digging deep into the marrow of its musical bones...She practically set the piano afire in the Allegro con fuoco of the third movement. She played with high drama and strength that threatened to overpower the entire orchestra. Mix astonishing technique with perfect accuracy and impeccably satisfying musicality. That's the way Marina plays Tchaikovsky." – Greg Barnes, The Free Times (November 17, 2014)

A pre-concert talk which is perfect for newcomers, experienced listeners, anyone in between are presented 1 hour prior to the concert and is free with your concert ticket (excluding Holiday Magic). The talks will provide an engaging overview of the works being performed, talk about the story behind the music, the composer and historical context.

The symphony will partner with The Spot for beer and wine beverage service for patrons age 21 and over before the concert as well as during intermission. Funds raised will be used to support future symphony programming.

As a community service project, winter gloves and socks will be collected and donated to the Minot Area Men's Winter Refuge at the concert. The refuge provides year-round service and shelter from Nov. 1 to April 30.

The symphony's upcoming performances include "Holiday Magic" December 14, featuring MSU's Emerson Eads and area choirs, "The Remarkable Farkle McBride" family concert - February 8 at 3pm, "Fun and Games" - March 8, and "The Titan" season finale on April 25 featuring the Heartland Marimba Ouartet.

Season tickets are available and include a reserved seat and admission to all regular season performances. Season ticket

prices for adults are \$155 for balcony or \$130 for main floor. Senior and student discounts are available. The symphony also offers a Flex Pass which includes 6 unreserved concert tickets for the price of 5. The Flex Pass can be used for multiple tickets to the same performance or spread out between performances. Individual main floor tickets are \$25 or \$30 for balcony with senior and student discounts available. Tickets are available at www. minotsymphony.com or through the box office at 701-858-4228.

The Minot Symphony Orchestra is a unique blend of student, community, and professional musicians from the Minot area. The symphony is directed by Maestro Efraín Amaya, assistant professor of music at Minot State University.

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Minot State Veterans Center announces Veterans Week Community Fair, Veterans Day presentation



MINOT, N.D. – The Minot State University Veterans Center will commemorate Veterans Day during the week of Nov. 4, culminating with a presentation on Friday, Nov. 8.

"We are proud to announce our Veterans Week Community Fair lineup for Minot State University's 2019 Veterans Week, with the intention of recognizing all living military personnel who served honorable in the U.S. Armed Forces and extending a special thanks to those who served the United States during a conflict," Andy Heitkamp, Minot State Veterans Center director, said.

The community fair will take place from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the second floor of the Student Center with different service providers available each day of the week.

On Monday, Nov. 4, the North Dakota National Guard, Vet Center, United States Army, North Dakota Departments of Veterans Affairs (NDDVA) Family Assistance, Independence, Inc., and a military outreach specialist will be at the fair, while on Tuesday, Nov. 5, the American Legion Auxiliary, American Veterans (AMVETS), Community Options, and a Minot Air Force Base community support coordinator will be available. Wednesday, Nov. 6 features the American

Legion, Minot Area Homeless Coalition, Department Veterans Affairs (VA) Supportive Services for Veteran Families, and representatives from HUD-VASH, a collaborative program between the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the VA that combines HUD housing vouchers with VA support services. The fair continues Thursday, Nov. 7 with the North Dakota Job Service, Ward County Veterans Services, and Center for Rural Health/ Traumatic Brain Injury before concluding on Friday, Nov. 8 with Disabled American Veterans and Team Red White and Blue.

Friday will also feature a brief Veterans Day program led by Heitkamp at 11:30 a.m. in the Westlie Room, located on the third floor of the Student Center. This event is free and open to the public.

"The reason we celebrate Veterans Day on campus prior to the actual date, Nov. 11, is because it is a Federal Holiday and campus is closed," Heitkamp said.

Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, originally began as a holiday to honor the end of combat during World War I on Nov. 11, 1918. Following World War II and the Korean War, the 1954 U.S. Congress changed Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American veterans of all wars.

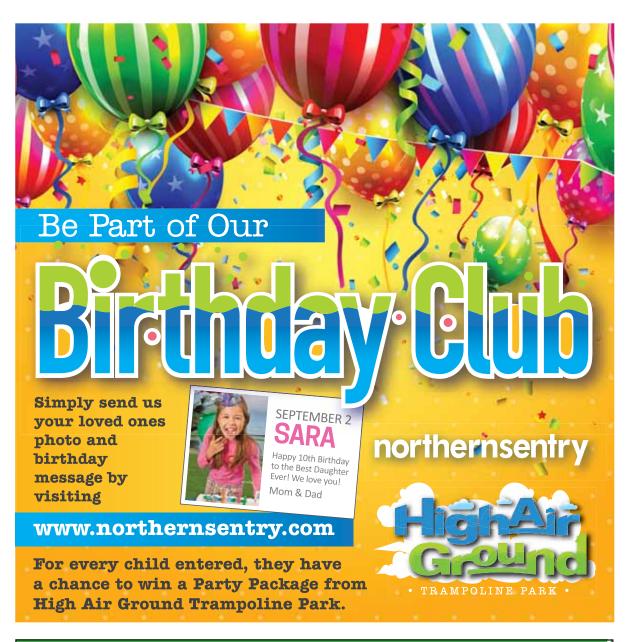

There is some movement but sloughs are icing over along the Canadian border, which is pushing birds out and over the area. Dabblers generally moved out of the Wells County area but hunters still finding divers on larger lakes. Fair to good snow goose numbers around central N.D. but they could move out with ice-over on sloughs and sheet water.

"This program is a great resource to help fill nursing positions in any North Dakota health care facility."

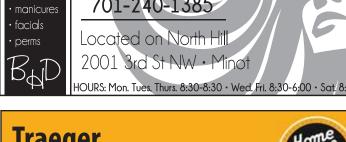
Under the program, licensed North Dakota health care facilities are eligible to receive up to \$4,000 of matching funds for each nurse relocating to North Dakota. Employers are responsible for selecting and hiring the licensed nurse.

Priority will be given to rural facilities, facilities who have never participated in the program, and the hiring of diverse nursing specialties such as: behavioral health nurses, geriatric health nurses, intensive care specialized nurses.

To qualify for the program, employers must select a nurse who; is licensed to practice in the state of North Dakota, identifies primary residence in North Dakota, or bordering states of Montana, South Dakota or Minnesota; signs a written agreement to work at least four years in a licensed North Dakota health care facility; and is employed by the health care facility, not a contractor.

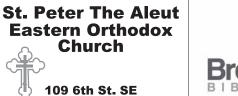

WINTER DRIVING SAFETY COURSE

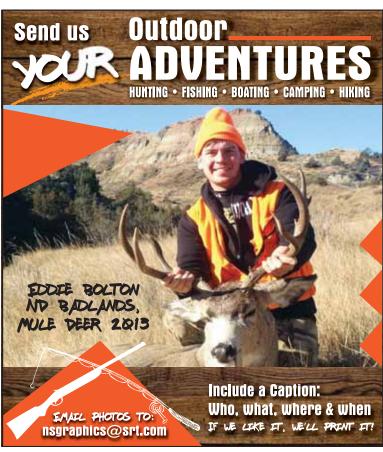
