

# Air Force announces NCO **Career Status Program for** Airmen with 12 years of service

#### WASHINGTON (AFNS) --

The Air Force announced Oct. 30 it will implement the new Noncommissioned Officer Career Status Program for active duty Airmen, which will affect reenlistment contracts executed on or after Nov. 18.

The change will eliminate the need for Airmen who have 12 or more years of service to continue to reenlist by aligning their separation dates with their high year of tenure dates.

"Career Airmen are consummate professionals who have demonstrated their commitment to service," said Lt. Gen. Brian Kelly, Air Force deputy chief of staff for manpower, personnel and services. "They play a crucial role in developing the next generation of Airmen. With this adjustment, we're providing them the associated flexibility to make individualized career decisions."

Airmen who reenlist under the NCO Career Status Program will follow processes similar to those of officers and will incur active

duty service commitments.

The Selective Retention Bonus program will not be impacted by CSP other than a few administrative processing changes. If eligible for an SRB, Airmen electing to accept the bonus - and the associated ADSC — will apply for the SRB via myPers and complete an application electronically. The Air Force's Personnel Center will identify and notify those Airmen on career status contracts who are eligible for an SRB on a monthly basis.

Like officers, enlisted Airmen may apply for separation prior to their high year of tenure date with an effective date no later than 180 days from the date of request.

"What we are saying to our Airmen is we hear you," said Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright. "We recognize your commitment to a profession in the Air Force, and we're going to manage your service commitment in a way that provides you with reduced paperwork and increased efficiency.

Airmen with 12 years of service who sign a reenlistment contract on or after Nov. 18 will fall under the CSP and that will be their last contract. CSP Airmen will no longer see a date of separation in their records until they are within 12 months of their high year of tenure date. Upon getting promoted, the date of separation for CSP Airmen will automatically be updated to the high year of tenure date of the new rank.

Current high year of tenure lengths of service by rank are:

- 20 years for E-5
- 22 years for E-6
- 24 years for E-7
- 26 years for E-8
- 30 years for E-9




#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**



# Becoming a New Father While You're Deployed

Don't let the stress of deployment spoil the bliss you feel as an expectant father. Even if you won't be there for the delivery, you can still experience the joys of new fatherhood.

Planning for your baby's birth Reduce pre-deployment stress by helping your partner prepare for the baby's arrival. Here's how to get started:

Communicate with your partner. Before deploying, talk about both of your expectations for the birth and about the ways you can stay in touch throughout the pregnancy and birth. Don't forget to let your command know how to reach your partner.

Seek support from family and friends. Your baby's mother may need help emotionally and physically during her pregnancy. If so, encourage her to seek help. Family, friends or family readiness groups can be great resources.

Create a plan with your partner. Work together to plan how she will get to the hospital and back home after the birth, and arrange assistance in the first few weeks.

Help your partner select a birth coach. Your partner's birth coach will help her through labor and delivery. Talk with the birth coach about how you can be involved during labor.

Help your partner make a birth plan. Create a birth plan ahead of time so you and your partner can lay out your wishes for the birthing process. This will let the hospital staff and your partner's birthing coach know what she prefers.

Contact TRICARE. Enroll your partner in Defense Enrollment

#### MILITARY ONE SOURCE

Eligibility Reporting System, or DEERS, to be eligible for medical benefits if he or she qualifies. Confirm enrollment through your installation's personnel office, by calling the Defense Manpower Data Center at 800-538-9552 or online at TRICARE's DEERS website.

Take parenting or childbirth classes. Encourage your baby's mother to enroll in a parenting or childbirth class before deploying. If you can, accompany her to some of the classes. It will help educate you on what to expect when your baby comes home.

Call the New Parent Support Program. The New Parent Support Program provides oneon-one support for expecting and new parents. This free service has information, support and guidance on pregnancy, parenting and child development, and can provide information about classes, including those just for fathers. Go online to MilitaryINSTALLATIONS to find your installation's program.

Pick out a car seat together. Before you deploy, you may want to help your partner pick out an infant seat so your child will be safe in the car.

Decorate the nursery together. You can also help your partner pick out baby furniture or paint the nursery. You'll feel more involved and your spouse will appreciate the help. You can also leave one of your old T-shirts in the nursery so your baby can touch it, smell it and hold it.

Make a plan for emergencies. Create an emergency plan in case of a natural disaster, including an evacuation plan and a way for you to get in touch with your family. Also, help your partner put together an emergency kit for the car.

Take care of finances and other necessities. You may want to make sure your partner has a power of attorney before you leave. Visit your installation's legal assistance office for help. Also, be sure to take care of any car repairs or home maintenance.



# 'Innovation Engine' drives Air Force innovation process

Air Force Global Strike Command's chief scientist introduced "Innovation Engine," Nov 1., which is a new process that will reorient, reinvent and reimagine the AFGSC innovation process.

Innovation Engine focuses on creating a margin in the command's processes and procedures, thus building space to empower Airmen to find innovative solutions. This new process also expedites the implementation of solutions, allowing the command to acquire new technologies at the speed of relevance.

"I really see Innovation Engine snowballing," said Dr. Donna Senft, AFGSC chief scientist. "I think we're going to start out small with a couple of successful projects and the excitement will catch on and we'll grow rapidly."

This process comes as a byproduct of the command's 2020 strategic vision where Gen. Tim Ray, AFGSC commander, communicated his plan for the command's future, which includes innovation at the heart of every effort.

"By emphasizing teams and innovation, we will achieve the dual goal of encouraging our Airmen to view themselves beyond the individual, as well as exhibiting the command's dedication to an innovation

Under the new 2020 strategic vision, the command reorganized the way it does business, focusing on a team approach that uses boards, bureaus, centers, cells and working groups. This approach creates a cadre of cross-functional teams working problems together, allowing issues to be worked more rapidly than individual directorates working problems separately.

In addition to this team problem-solving approach, Airmen can submit innovation ideas directly to their wing spark cells, which will then be communicated to the AFGSC Spark Working Group under the A9 - Innovation, Analyses and Leadership Development Directorate. Once the ideas have been vetted through this working group, nicknamed Hornet's Nest, they will then be sent up to the Doolittle Group, the directorate board and chaired by the chief scientist, referred to as the "Innovation Raiders."

These specialized groups are designed to streamline the overall process of implementing innovative solutions.

With the return of the great power competition, Ray said cultivating a culture of innovation will allow AFGSC to maintain its global competitive edge.

# **Global Strike this past week:** Capability, professionalism and boldness

The men and women of Air Force Global Strike Command have not only had a busy week, but have repeatedly showcased the importance of rapid deployment to conduct combat operations.

During the past week, AFGSC, in coordination with U.S. Strategic Command, U.S. European Command and U.S. Central Command, executed two bomber deployments in three different combatant command areas of operation, as well as hosted the first official trip of the Secretary of the Air Force at F.E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming.

On Oct. 24th, multiple B-1B Lancers launched from Ellsworth AFB, South Dakota, as part of Bomber Task Force operations in the CENTCOM AOR. The B-1s returned home after a mission that reached across the globe from South Dakota to Prince Sultan Air Base, Saudi Arabia and back. This unannounced arrival demonstrated the ability of AFGSC to rapidly deploy and conduct combat operations anywhere, anytime to provide lethal precision-strike options for combatant commanders.

This rapid deployment was executed while the command was also participating in Exercise Global Thunder 20, USSTRATCOM's annual nuclear command and control and field training exercise.

As part of GT20, a BTF mission involving B-52 Stratofortress and B-2 Spirit aircraft took place Oct. 27 to28 to train AFGSC forces, assess joint operational readiness, and integrate with a full complement of U.S. and key allied aircraft. The aircraft departed from multiple locations in the United States and conducted training operations in the European theater. Upon completion of their training, the bombers returned to their home bases at Minot AFB, North Dakota, and Whiteman AFB, Missouri.

Incorporating this BTF mission into a global exercise enhances U.S. integration with allies, and improves overall readiness of the U.S. nuclear deterrent.

"I'm extremely proud of the work our team continues to accomplish every day on behalf of the nation," stated Gen. Tim Ray, AFGSC, Air Forces Strategic-Air and joint force air component commander. "We demonstrated our capability, professionalism and boldness these past few weeks with the flawless execution of Global Thunder, unannounced B-1 deployments to Saudi Arabia,

control and communications at the ready, and also supported the Secretary of the Air Force's first base visit. We sent a bold signal to the world-We are Strikers!"

As the JFACC for USSTRATCOM, Ray is responsible for all air assets within the USSTRATCOM joint force. The USSTRATCOM IFACC conducts kinetic (nuclear and conventional) and nonkinetic effects planning and execution, while managing global force air activities to assure allies and to deter and dissuade actions detrimental to the United States and its global interests.

"Global operations are not possible without the tremendous work of our entire team, from the maintainers, loggies, comms, ammo, fuels, defenders and many, many more--our crews could not do this without your amazing dedication," Ray said.

On Oct. 27, the command also hosted Secretary of the Air Force Barbara Barrett at F.E. Warren AFB as she made her first official visit as the 25th Secretary of the Air Force. Barrett visited various facilities on base to gain a better understanding of the pivotal nuclear mission that defends the U.S. and its allies.

"I saw the precision and care of day-to-day operations across the wing," said Barrett. "Everyone takes pride in operating, maintaining and supporting the nuclear enterprise in a safe, secure and effective manner."

During a tour of U-01, Barrett descended into the missile silo, gathering perspective into the missile maintainer's job, the vastness of the ICBM and the equipment used to keep the mission operational.

"Our command and Airmen are strong. Our commitment to our Joint Team and our allies and partners is strong. No other nation on earth can do what you do every day; you make it look easy, but I know it is not. Certare Vel Mori!" said Ray.

Additionally, AFGSC currently has bombers and personnel deployed to the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command and U.S. European Command AORs.

# **Barrett publicly sworn in as** secretary of the Air Force

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --

Barbara M. Barrett was publicly sworn in Nov. 2 as the 25th Secretary of the Air Force at the symbolically potent U.S. Air Force Academy, Colorado Springs, Colorado, using the high-profile location to salute the service's history and potential as it positions itself to meet future challenges.

Norquist, David deputy secretary of defense, conducted the public swearing-in, which preceded Barrett's first formal remarks since becoming the secretary. Barrett said her highest priority is protecting and prolonging – the Air Force's unrivaled excellence.

"The men and women of the United States Air Force have earned the confidence of our nation. We know that it is ready, resilient and capable of defending America," Barrett said in her remarks.

Norquist, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein, Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright, other senior officials, family and friends joined Barrett. In separate remarks, Norquist both highlighted Barrett's background and experience and reinforced her focus on confronting new threats, adapting to an era of "great power competition" and fulfilling requirements outlined in the National Defense Strategy. "For the Air Force, that

means maintaining our air superiority and making greater investments in the modernization of our conventional and nuclear forces," Norquist said. "It means assembling the best minds in space and cyber to address our vulnerabilities and lead the way in these new warfighting domains."

Barrett, Norquist added, "is, without question, the most competent person to take on each of these challenges and lead our Airmen with the integrity and diligence that has enabled the Air Force to dominate the skies." Adapting to the new reality and

succeeding means pushing hard to continue modernizing the force while continuing the "superb flight plan for the Air Force's future path" conjured by her predecessor, Dr. Heather Wilson. Barrett said. Wilson was also in attendance for the ceremony.

Achieving that means holding fast to Air Force core values and ensuring those values serve as a compass guiding the service forward.

"The United States Air Force is enduringly guided by its core values, its Polaris," she said. "Integrity first, service before self and excellence in all we do. These unchanging values represent our Polaris.

"And guided by the core values, the United States Air Force is the best in the world at what we do: defending our nation in air, in

space and in cyberspace."

At a time of stresses to mental health and concerns about suicide across the Air Force, it means focusing on the needs, health and fulfillment of "our greatest asset," the Air Force's Total Force personnel, she said.

"The Airmen who wear our nation's uniform are our greatest asset and treasure. We have no greater charge than to develop and care for them and their families," she said.

Barrett. who was administratively sworn in Oct. 18 at the Pentagon, said the U.S. Air Force Academy was intentionally selected as the location for her ceremonial swearing-in and her first extended public remarks.

"It is not by accident that we gather at Polaris Hall, at the Academy, for this ceremony instead of the steps at the Pentagon," Barrett said.

"Here at this venerable institution, entrusted to mold future leaders of the United States Air Force, is a monument to character and leadership, the oculus, above us, points directly to Polaris, the North Star... true north.

The location of the speech -Polaris Hall in the Academy's Center for Character of Leadership Development - also reinforced Barrett's emphasis on ethics and integrity.






