Flash Fire Hero

In the dead of night, a lonely truck's headlights swept across a quiet housing community. The lights fall upon a house unlike the others.

Slowing down, he saw it, a yellow and orange light flickering inside of the house, a plume of gray smoke escaping from a window.

"I knew they might have been harmed if I didn't step up," said Senior Airman Cody Vojtko, missile maintenance operations controller for the 791st Missile Maintenance Squadron at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota. "If I didn't do anything and someone was hurt afterwards, I have no idea how I would feel."

Voitko jumped out of his pickup and raced towards the house, the cold air stinging his face. He pounded on the door, frantically trying to get attention from the family inside. He shook the door handle to no avail. Unable to pry the windows open, his mind is racing, looking for anything he could do to get inside.

Vojtko stayed calm. Dialing the base emergency number, he told the operator everything. After a first responder arrived, he was relieved.

"If you see something, do something," said Vojtko. "Don't ever be afraid to help someone who may need it."

After what seemed like forever, the front door finally opened. As the family escaped the house, Vojtko helped control the situation. He facilitated the family's escape along with their

"It was very rewarding," said Vojtko. "Knowing that they all got out with no injuries. It's an amazing feeling."

Vojtko's actions earned him an Air Force Achievement Medal, awarded by his commander,

Major Patrick McAfee. What Senior Airman Vojtko did for his wingman displays the ultimate dedication to help people in need. He was willing to put his life on the line for this family.

Vojtko's supervisor Staff Sgt. Jordan Gleave, senior missile maintenance operations controller for the 791st Missile Maintenance Squadron, says this isn't unlike his personality at all.

"Airman Vojtko is an exemplary Airman," said Gleave. "He has

an intense worth ethic, and has never failed to put his best foot forward to help anyone in need.'

His willingness to always put himself out there is uplifting, says Gleave. She hopes Airmen across the Air Force can learn from Senor Airman Vojtko's willingness to sacrifice.

"I knew what I had to do," said Voitko. "I had to get their attention and save whoever was in that house."



Barksdale and Minot: Epitome of Interoperability

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. --

Two B-52H Stratofortresses from Barksdale and two B-52s from Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, teamed up for an exercise Nov. 21, 2019.

During the exercise, Minot went south to a range in Kansas and Barksdale went north to a range in South Dakota.

"We come together as one bomber community," said Capt. Tim "Vice" Nichols, 20th Bomb Squadron weapons officer at Barksdale. "It's not just Barksdale and Minot, we all realize we're all under Air Force Global Strike Command and it's one team."

The exercise simulated a scenario where B-52s were launched from multiple locations to strike the same target areas.

"All of this planning has to be very, very meticulous," said Capt. Ryan "Rhino" McDaniel, 20th BS weapons systems officer. "Being able to use the same language, tactics, techniques, procedures and foundation in which we operate is vital."

The interoperability is derived from the air crews ability to communicate. They are using the same terminology all while being two geographically separated units, this allows them to accomplish a task where success or failure is within the margin of a few seconds.

"We talked over great distances to effectively communicate to make sure that we could strike targets that are way beyond where we could visually see simultaneously," said Nichols.

Upon completing the mission, both teams met up at Barksdale for a mass debrief to discuss what the team's successes and setbacks were in order to stay mission ready.

According to Nichols, the goal of exercises like this is to allow U.S. leadership to plug and play any one of the bomb squadrons in the Air Force and get the same lethality.



Stump Lake elevation: 1,448.75 MSL.

• N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: No reports from area lakes, Devils Lake, or the Missouri River System.

• Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: More anglers on small feeder lakes with some walk-on access on Devils Lake bays. Best areas for success remain in the feeder lakes but it's still spotty and inconsistent dayto-day. Look for some nice early season pike spearing activity in areas with better ice conditions.

• Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Lake Irvine fair for walleye using jigs and minnows but ice still requires extreme caution. Some perch mixed in. Bays icing over on Devils Lake but limited activity at best yet.

· Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Limited activity on Lake Darling.

Lake Metigoshe, Four Bottineau: Seasons, Some bluegill and walleye success but only walk-on access still recommended. Try the south side using jigs and minnows for walleye; wax worms for bluegill.

Sakakawea/Lake Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: East end of main Lake Sakakawea still open with several back bays re-opening recently so no activity. Parts of Lake Audubon also re-opened and many areas remain unsafe for access.

Sakakawea/Lake Lake Audubon, 6-Mile Bait & Tackle, Garrison: A few anglers walking onto Lake Audubon at Velva Point and Nelson Bay but extreme caution required with

Use extreme caution because ramps could be icy. Look for some possible ice along shorelines, as well. Some walleye activity in the river working deep in 30 to 40 feet.

•Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Weather permitting anglers continue finding walleye success in the Missouri River tailrace from shore off the rocks at night. Try casting crankbaits. Lake Sakakawea remains quiet.

Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Trenton Lake continues producing nice crappie catches. Kota-Ray and Blacktail dams remain fair for bluegill. Decent shore success for walleye on the Missouri River. Try the pump house and confluence.

·Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: Anglers walking onto area lakes are finding some nice early season success, including Clear Lake in Pierce County.

• North-central/central N.D. lakes, Towner Hdwe. Hank, Towner: Limited activity at best yet on the river and area lakes.

<u>Hunting:</u>

• Deer: Rut slowing but still fair deer movement for muzzleloader and late season archery hunters. •Upland: With progressing corn harvest hunters are seeing more pheasants in some areas.

·Waterfowl: Good Canada goose numbers remain on the east end of Lake Sakakawea, the midsection around the Van Hook Arm, and open water of the Missouri River below Garrison Dam.

INGREDIENTS 1 CUP WARM WATER

2 TBSP QUICK RISE YEAST 1 TSP SALT 1/4 CUP SUGAR 1/4 CUP UNSALTED BUTTER, SOFTENED 1 EGG 3 1/3 CUPS FLOUR

COOKING SPRAY, AS NEEDED 1 EGG FOR EGG WASH BUTTER, FOR SERVING

Combine yeast and warm water in a small bowl to activate the yeast. Let sit until foamy 5-10 minutes.

Combine salt, sugar, and flour in the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the dough hook. Pour water and yeast into the dry ingredients with the machine running on low.

Add butter and egg and mix for 10 minutes gradually increasing the speed from low to high.

Form the dough into a ball and place in a buttered bowl. Cover with a cloth and let the dough rise for approximately 40 minutes.

Transfer the risen dough to a lightly floured surface and divide into 8 pieces forming a ball with each.

Lightly spray a cast iron pan with cooking spray and arrange balls in the pan. Cover with a cloth and let rise 20 minutes. When ready to cook, set temperature to 375°F and preheat, lid

closed for 15 minutes. Brush rolls with egg wash and then bake for 30 minutes until

Frost Fire Park to open for the season

For Natalie Gebur, General Manager of Frost Fire Park in Northeastern North Dakota, excitement is mounting as the clock ticks toward the December 6th and the opening of the ski hill that has been closed for 3 seasons. "We're just putting the finishing touches on the brand new 4-person chair lift", according to Gebur.

The new lift, combined with the Magic Carpet Lift which services the tubing hill and beginner ski hill, will give skiers, boarders and tubers complete access to Frost Fire Park, which boasts a 330-foot vertical drop. "We have 10 runs, the longest being over ½ mile, and a terrain park", continues Gebur, "so we are perfect destination for a family who wants to enjoy winter." Gebur also stresses that "safety is big for Frost Fire Park; we want to stress that."

For Gebur, the position of General Manager of Frost Fire Park came as an opportunity to return to North Dakota. "I grew up in Grafton, graduated from NDSU, and moved to North Carolina where I was a ski school director for a small hill and during the summer I managed a horse stable for a private community." But the beauty and the now open as fate would have it, Natalie would meet her husband who convinced her to return to North Dakota. "The Frost Fire GM

position was open, and it was a great opportunity".

For over 40 years, the entire Frost Fire area had been under the ownership of Dick & Judith Johnson. "Dick built it from scratch" says Gebur. After Dick passed away in 2016, Judith decided it was time to transfer ownership, and a new Pembina Gorge Foundation was formed to purchase ownership and begin management of Frost Fire. Fund raising began then, and the culmination was the re-opening of the summer theater last year, and now the winter recreation area on December 6th.

Over 4.1 million dollars has been raised, including a \$750,000 matching grant from the state of North Dakota that gave the Pembina Gorge Foundation the necessary financial boost to deal with mechanical issues on the hill, including the snow making equipment. "We expect over 5,000 people to visit Frost Fire this winter", says Gebur, "we encourage people, if they need information, to visit our new web site; www.frostfirepark.

If you don't ski, Gebur encourages you to visit the Pembina Gorge area for both Howatt Hanger Restaurant. "We're open Friday and Saturday nights from 5 to 9 after the ski hill closes, with steaks,

burgers and sandwiches. We have been thinking about being open on Sunday evenings, too,' according to Gerbur, so watch for further announcements in the future.

Frost Fire is a complete experience with rental shop and food service. "We start with a snacky type of breakfast at 9

AM, and at lunch we serve soup, paninis, burger and fries," just to name a few of the items on the menu.

Frost Fire is open every Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 9 AM to 4:30 PM, "and we have additional holiday hours, and those hours are listed on our web site."

Frost Fire opens December 6th at 9:30 AM with a ½ off lift tickets and rentals on Friday, and 25% off lift tickets and rentals on Saturday and Sunday.

And according to GM Natalie Gebur, "It will be a lot of fun to have families back at Frost
