Reserve Citizen Airman reaches 10,000 flight hours

DOBBINS BASE, Ga. --

If Chief Master Sgt. Terry Studstill took all of his flight hours and flew them in one trip, it would last approximately one year, one month and 21 days.

Studstill, 700th Airlift Squadron flight engineer superintendent, completed 10,000 flight hours at the end of November on a C-130H3 Hercules bound for Key West, Florida.

"When I started flying as a helicopter flight engineer, the max we flew was around two-and-ahalf hours," Studstill said. "After seven-and-a-half years, I had only flown a little bit more than 1,400 hours. I had no idea I'd ever make it to 10,000 hours."

Chief also discussed the unique aspects of his particular journey to 10,000 hours as a result of the types of aircraft he's flown on. For example, in the strategic airlift world of KC-10s, C-5s, and C-17s, aircrew members reach 10,000 hours more regularly, he explained.

"Being a helicopter and a C-130 guy, it's very rare that crewmembers reach 10,000 hours," Studstill said.

In 2011, he reached 8,000 hours during a deployment with the 440th Airlift Wing. Since then, it has taken him eight years to obtain the remaining 2,000 hours.

This is a significant accomplishment in an aviator's career, and one that doesn't come easily.

"This is a monumental accomplishment," said Col. Patrick Campbell, 94th Operations Group commander. "Very few Air Force aviators will ever meet this milestone. This is a reflection of Chief's dedication

AIR RESERVE and commitment to our country and to the U.S. Air Force. I can honestly say that I have not met anyone more passionate about our Airmen and our mission than Chief Studstill."

> It's fitting that Studstill would reach such a lofty career milestone: he's widely known around base as an "old-school" chief. He holds his Airmen to a high standard and readily provides guidance along the way. He's the type of chief who will reprimand you for calling him "sir." Last year a loadmaster even dressed up as Studstill for the Falcon 5K, donning his trademark mustache and flight suit.

> "I always to try to treat everyone fairly," said Chief. "To me, it's the right thing to do. Treat each Airmen in your section equally across the board."

> He also credits the work of the aircraft maintainers as playing a crucial role in keeping the aircraft airworthy so that he could reach 10,000 hours of flying.

> "Reaching 10,000 hours is impossible without maintenance," said Chief. "Whether it's back shop maintenance or line maintenance. I wouldn't fly at all. I attribute this accomplishment to every maintenance organization I've ever worked with, because without them I never would have attained 10,000 hours."

> Throughout his 37-year career, he's served as both a rotary-wing and fixed-wing flight engineer. He began his career on the MH-60G in 1987, and went on to fly AC-130, HC-130, MC-130 and WC-130, before landing at Dobbins in 2000. He has flown on the C-130H Hercules ever since.

"Those 10,000 hours include combat, aeromedical evacuation, humanitarian relief,

headquarters taskings, routine training and instructional sorties," said Campbell. "He has done it all. Indeed, we are all fortunate to be serving with a true American

"I enjoyed the mission of the MH-60G," said Chief. "I liked the low-flying in the helicopter and also the customers we supported: Army Rangers, Delta Force, Green Berets, Air Force Pararescuemen, combat controllers. Also being able to do hoist missions and shooting the guns off the helicopter as a defensive weapon to protect the

He'll continue to fly the rest of the year, but he now has his sights set on retiring in early 2020.

Studstill plans to settle down in his wife's hometown of Greensboro, North Carolina, where he hopes to use his degree in education to teach part-time.

He said it'll be difficult to leave behind his wingmen and said he'll miss the camaraderie, but he's looking forward to beginning the next chapter in his life and taking a shot at reaching new milestones in the classroom.

"What I'll miss the most is the camaraderie and the friendship I've gained over the years in active duty and the Reserve," said Studstill. "A fellow flight engineer from a unit I was in back in 1987 is coming to my retirement ceremony. I've kept in touch with him over the years. Having friendships from that far back more than 32 years ago - and being able to stay friends and keep in touch is certainly a great part of being in the military."



Tips for a Safer Holiday Season

holidays provide a wonderful opportunity for family and friends to gather and celebrate. It is also a time of continuous activity, with errands to run and scheduled activities that demand attention and time. It's also a time when busy people can become careless and vulnerable to theft and other holiday crime. The following tips can help you be more careful, prepared and aware during the holiday season.

Already this holiday season there have been tragic incidents around the country; so it's a good time to remind everyone of the dangers that lurk out there if you don't follow some simple safety rules. Obviously, some crimes occur in busy areas during broad daylight, but thieves usually prefer more secluded areas that aren't well-lit. Many thefts occur because we're not paying attention to business. Women's purses are especially easy targets when

they are left in a shopping cart. Thieves rely on the trust that good people place in others. Some people go Christmas shopping and get very intrigued by items on the lower shelf. A person might never think that an older woman would steal something from them when their eyes are diverted for just a moment, but this type of theft occurs more often than people realize it does. Thieves can take on any type of personality and have any type of body style.

Here are some holidays shopping safety tips from various websites our office would like to pass along:

Stay alert at all times and pay attention to your surroundings.

Do not leave your purse unattended, avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Whenever possible, use credit cards or checks instead. Carry only the credit cards you need.

When using public rest rooms, be cautious; avoid putting your purse on the floor.

Keep receipts separate from the packages; this will make it harder for the thief to refund the stolen

Remain alert in parking lots; don't carry so many packages that you aren't aware of your surroundings and personal safety and shop during the daytime, if possible.

Walk confidently, with your head up, and stay in well-lighted and well-traveled areas, and have your vehicle key in hand and ready when walking to your car.

Visually check the backseat before opening the door, and lock your doors immediately when inside, when loading your purchases into your vehicle, place your purse in the vehicle first, so it's not in the cart while your back is turned.

Shopping with Children:

Teach your children to go to a store clerk or security guard if they get separated from you in a shopping mall.

Keep children under age 4 in a

stroller or supervise them closely.

If you place your child in a shopping cart, always use the safety belt, and stay close to the cart and never let your child stand in or push a shopping cart.

Toy Safety:

Make sure the toys you give children are safe for them. Read the package labels and follow age recommendation.

Do not give children under the age of 3 toys that contain small or metal parts or toys that break easily and can be swallowed.

Do not give children under the age of 8 toys that have sharp edges, points, or heating elements.

Include helmets and other protective gear (such as elbow, knee, and wrist pads) when giving bicycles, skates, or skateboards as gifts.

Dispose of toy packaging properly (do not burn in fireplace). Keep packaging materials away from children because they can become a choking or suffocation hazard.

Keep batteries away from children. They are toxic if swallowed.

We realize this alert might put a damper on your holiday spirit, but being safe is much better than being sorry. By taking a few prevention measures can help keep your holiday season joyous!



Air Force Security Force Airmen now Eligible for Law Enforcement Partial Training Waiver

NORTH DAKOTA NATIONAL GUARD

BISMARCK, N.D. - The North Dakota National Guard along with the North Dakota Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) board recently announced a partial training waiver for U.S. Air Force trained Security Forces personnel who want to become North Dakota law enforcement officers.

This waiver would allow qualified U.S. Air Force Security Forces personnel to take the examination to become licensed North Dakota peace officers with a 2-week course, rather than current 12-week course. This waiver is already in effect for Army and Marine Corps trained military police.

"After obtaining the waiver for the Army and the Marine Corps military police we began the process of granting the waiver for the Air Force security forces," said Highway Patrol Lieutenant Dan Haugen, director of the North Dakota Law Enforcement training academy. "The Security Forces training program is accredited by FLETA (Federal Law Enforcement Training Accreditation), because of that we are able to offer the same waiver to trained security force Airmen as we do for Army and Marine Corps military police.

According to the North Dakota Administrative Code, "an individual having peace officer experience or having completed an equivalent basic full-time peace officer training course conducted in another state or by a federal law enforcement agency may qualify for a partial waiver of basic full-time peace officer training requirements".

"We appreciate the POST Board's support and willingness to work with us to put this waiver process in place," said Maj. Gen. Al Dohrmann, North Dakota adjutant general. "This waiver authority will benefit North Dakota National Guard members, as well as veterans transitioning to civilian careers, and will provide highly qualified law enforcement officers to fill vacant position in our law enforcement agencies.

The Air Force Security Forces Apprentice Course is designed to train non-prior service and prior service students to perform law enforcement and other duties as a Security Forces enlisted member. FLETA granted accreditation to the program in March 2012, and was reaccredited November 2016.

Free Ice Fishing Weekend

North Dakota's free ice fishing weekend is Dec. 28-29.

Resident anglers may fish or spear that weekend without a license. All other ice fishing regulations apply.

Those interested in darkhouse spearfishing, however, must register with the North Dakota Game and Fish Department prior to participating. Registration is available by visiting the Game and Fish website, gf.nd.gov. Legal fish are northern pike and nongame

Watercraft Registrations Online

North Dakota watercraft owners are reminded that 2020 is the first year of a new three-year registration period.

Watercraft registrations must be renewed online by visiting My Account at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's website, gf.nd.gov. A credit card is required.

The price to register motorboats

in North Dakota under 16 feet in length, and all canoes, is \$18, motorboats from 16 feet to less than 20 feet in length is \$36, and motorboats at least 20 feet in length is \$45. Fees are prorated.

In addition, Ŝenate Bill 2293, passed by the 2019 state legislature, created an aquatic nuisance species program fund in the state treasury. Effective Jan. 1, 2020, this new state law establishes an ANS fee of \$15 for each motorized watercraft registered in North Dakota to run concurrent with the three-year watercraft registration period.

motorized watercraft operated on waters in North Dakota and not licensed in North Dakota, the state law establishes an ANS fee of \$15 to be paid for each calendar year, and to display an ANS sticker on the watercraft.

New watercraft owners can attach the required documentation, such as the bill of sale or proof of taxes paid, with the online purchase, or send in the required documentation via standard mail. A 10-day temporary permit will be issued to allow for processing and delivery of registration and decals. For timely processing, Game and Fish encourages watercraft owners to submit attachments online.

2020-22 watercraft registration cycle begins Jan. 1 and runs through Dec. 31, 2022.

Winter Fishing Regulations

North Dakota anglers are encouraged to refer to the 2018-20 North Dakota Fishing Guide or the state Game and Fish Department's website for winter fishing regulations.

In addition, anglers can visit the Game and Fish website, gf.nd. gov, for an extensive list of fishing questions and answers.

Some winter fishing regulations include:

A maximum of four poles is legal for ice fishing.

Tip-ups are legal, and each tipup is considered a single pole.

Mechanical devices that set the hook are legal; however, the use retrieves the fish is illegal. There is no restriction on the size

of any device that automatically

of the hole in the ice while fishing. Materials used to mark holes must be in possession of anglers and spearers as soon as a hole larger than 10 inches in diameter is made in the ice.

It is only legal to release fish back into the water immediately after they are caught. Once a fish is held in a bucket or on a stringer, they can no longer be legally released in any water.

It is illegal to catch fish and transport them in water.

It is illegal to leave fish, including bait, behind on the ice.

All aquatic bait, such as fathead minnows, must be purchased or trapped in North Dakota.


Depositing or leaving any litter

or other waste material on the ice or shore is illegal.

The daily limit is a limit of fish taken from midnight to midnight. No person may possess more than one day's limit of fish while on the ice or actively engaged in fishing. If a situation occurs when an angler fishes overnight, the first daily limit must be removed from the ice by midnight prior to continuing to harvest fish.

The possession limit is the maximum number of fish that an angler may have in his or her possession during a fishing trip of more than one day.

It is illegal to introduce anything into the water for the purpose of attempting to attract fish (chumming, artificial light, etc.) that is not attached or applied to



Winter Vehicle Prep...

Getting Ready for another Cold Morning

Winter driving can be trying on both the vehicle and its pilot. As with many other things in life, preparation is the key to success. A few cold-weather parts and preparatory procedures can make the difference between being stuck in a drift and making it home. There are a number of simple things you can do to help prevent some of the more common hassles that winter weather brings on. Some of these can be done by handy DIY'ers; others will need to be done by qualified auto mechanics. Note: Always follow vehicle owner's manual instructions for maintenance and upkeep of your vehicle, including recommendations for winter preparations. Routine vehicle care is the best way to keep from being left out in the cold. This includes tune-ups and inspection and replacement of worn belts and hoses. Cold weather makes pliable materials stiffer and more brittle. It also makes fluids thicker. With this in mind, people who live in extreme climates often use lightviscosity synthetic lubricants, which work across a wider temperature range than conventional oil. Those who don't want the added expense sometimes use lighter-weight oils in the winter, such as 5W30.

Antifreeze should be kept at approximately a 60:40 coolant-towater ratio. In extreme conditions, too little antifreeze in the mix can allow the coolant to freeze and crack the engine block. Installing a higher-temperature thermostat, say 195 degrees, will help heater performance and help the engine burn off condensation.

Windshield Wipers -- Replace, if more than one year old -- consider the "winter blades" which are designed to prevent ice and snow buildup. The same goes for windshield washer fluids --Fill all reservoirs (front and rear, if so equipped) with non-freezing washer solution. A good point to remember is to fill them when they get to the half-way point.

Tires -- Be sure your vehicle is equipped with tires that are appropriate for your climate. Many tire manufacturers have very decent "all-weather" tires which are adequate if snowfall is typically minimal. However, in areas where snowfall tends to be heavier, it might be necessary to install actual "snow-tires", which are designed with more aggressive tread for added traction in deeper snow. Also, you might want to consider "studded snow tires" if ice-storms are frequent in your area. Note: It is good idea to check your tire pressure at least once a week in the winter months, and be sure to check your spare tire as well.

Oil Change and other fluids--If your vehicle has not had an oil change recently, prior to the really cold months is a good time to schedule that. When you have your oil changed ensure the other fluid levels such as the brake fluid, power steering fluid, cooling system fluid, transmission fluid are checked and "topped off" as required

Batterv maintenance will improve cold-weather performance. For batteries that require maintenance, make sure that all cells are full of water. Keep all battery terminals and cable ends clean, and make sure the battery is well grounded.

Several engine-block heating systems are available, both on the original equipment level and from the aftermarket. Most new vehicles sold in cold country come with factory-installed block heaters that replace one of the engine's freeze plugs or connect to the heater hose. A block heater warms an engine to increase the chances that the engine will start as well as warm up the vehicle faster than it normally would in extremely cold weather. The most common type is an electric heating element in the cylinder block, connected through a power cord often routed through the vehicle's grille. The block heater may replace one of the engine's core plugs. In this fashion, the heater element is immersed in the engine's coolant, which then keeps most of the engine warm. Research by the Agricultural Engineering Department of the University of Saskatchewan has shown that operating a block heater for longer than four hours prior to starting a vehicle is a waste of energy.

Before heading out, ensure you conduct a "pre-flight" check of your vehicle, especially if you plan on traveling long distances.

* Perform a general check of brakes, lights, defroster/heater, fluid levels, belts, hoses and exhaust

* Check the condition of wiper blades and consider upgrading to winter/snow blades. Always "park" blades before turning off the vehicle to minimize chances of sticking to the glass. Better yet, lift blades off the glass overnight.

* Keep the gas tank at least half full. This limits the amount of condensation that can enter the fuel system and also can improve traction, especially in rear-wheeldrive vehicles, by adding weight. Adding gasoline antifreeze to the fuel tank will help protect against fuel-line freezing.

* Consider adding weight to the trunk or pickup bed in rearwheel drive vehicles. Bags of sand both add traction-improving weight and can be dumped on ice to improve traction further. Make sure to secure the extra weight to the vehicle with motorcycle straps or other suitable restraints.

* Before departing, scrape ice and snow from the roof in addition to every window, mirror and light. Never splash hot water on glass to

* Lube door locks and latches and coat weather stripping with silicone spray to help keep doors from freezing shut.

Prepare for the worst. Put extra winter clothes, blankets and even a sleeping bag in the trunk, take water and food (such as energy bars), pack a flashlight, extra batteries, matches and a firstaid kit. Take along a cell phone if

* Tune-up -- If your vehicle has not had a tune-up recently, or if it shows signs of needing one (i.e., rough idle, loss of power, skipping, etc.), it might be wise to schedule

* Ballast -- If you drive a pickup truck (especially two-wheel drive), vou might want to consider adding some ballast weight in the bed of the truck to ensure added traction and control in winter weather

* Sand/salt -- It's a good idea to carry a container of sand/salt mixture in your trunk. Be sure the container is one you can seal up, since the salt can have detrimental effects on metals.

Shovel -- Not that anyone wants to have to dig out from a snowbank, but if the need arises, a shovel can save the day. Small snow-shovels are available, if your trunk space does not allow for a standard shovel.

* Extra Blankets -- Heaven forbid that anyone should be stranded away from home in a snowstorm! It does happen, however, and being prepared can mean a world of difference. A couple of extra blankets kept in your car might save your life if you do become stranded.


* Cell Phone -- Most people today own cell phones, and they can be lifesavers if you become stuck or stranded. Be sure your cell phone is fully charged at all times, especially during winter driving season.

* Non-perishable Foods -- It is a good idea to carry some extra non-perishable food items in your vehicle during the winter driving season, in the event you become stranded. Items such as packaged crackers, packets of condiments, dehydrated foods, even military ready-to-eat meal kits are good for

* First-Aid Kit and an emergency road kit -- Every vehicle should be equipped with one of these, during

There are other things you may choose to do in preparation for winter driving, and you should try to think about some of the things you, personally, would be concerned with, given your geographical locale, your vehicle condition, your driving abilities, your typical commuting route in relation to access for services (food, fuel, other necessities), your typical travel distance, and any other item more specific to your own needs.

In closing, the 5th Bomb Wing Ground Safety office offers a winter driving/preparation course to all military member and their families and to all civilian employees. A 10% off on three or more winter items to be used at the Base Exchanged is offered to all attendees. Let's all make this the safest winter season in Minot







WINTER DRIVING SAFETY COURSE






