The leaders of tomorrow

The room was silent until the instructor started to speak, her voice echoing off the auditorium walls, capturing her student's attention.

Staff Sgt. Symphony Leyk, 5th Force Support Squadron Airman Leadership School instructor, said her favorite part about being an instructor is that she has an influence on leadership development of Airmen.

"They inspire me," said Leyk. "They show just how much they truly care about taking care of the Air Force, not just from a professional standpoint, but a personal one. The leaders developed here will no doubt influence the next generation of the Air Force."

For five weeks, ALS instructors train Airmen for their future role as a NCO in the Air Force.

The first step in becoming an effective leader is learning the proper material, said Silchuk. The real challenge begins by communicating what they have learned to their subordinates, peers and leaders.

Throughout the course, these future leaders learn how to effectively communicate the mission to their teams.

"Leaders are developed over time, so they'll have a lot of experience," said Leyk. "We equip them [with the knowledge] to share those experiences with their Airmen.'

Using past experiences will promote trust between the NCO and Airman relationship, resulting in a more effective working environment. The more personal and engaging the conversation is the more effective it will be, according to Leyk.

"Our students learn the crucial parts of preparing their future Airmen for success," said Tech. Sgt. Zachary Silchuk, 5th FSS ALS instructor. "They will learn [there is not a] one-size-fits-all leadership style. [These future NCOs] will have to find out how to motivate their Airmen individually if they want to see them grow personally and

professionally."

Motivating people to be successful can be done in various ways, and ALS instructors strive to encourage their students to take the time to discover what will motivate each of their future subordinates.

Leyk said, preparing Airmen for the NCO role is done by encouraging them to invest in people and embracing a positive perspective in themselves and those around them.

"It is now their responsibility to train, guide, and mold their Airmen into our future leaders," said Silchuk. "A very daunting task that I strongly believe each one of them are ready to accept and carry out."

Airmen graduating from ALS are trusted with the responsibility to lead those around them using all of the tools they have learned and their past experiences.

"The roles we hold today are not to be filled by us tomorrow," said Silchuk. "Our Airmen are our future."

23rd EBS Deploys to Pacific

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

As part of the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command's Continuous Bomber Presence mission, Airmen with the 23rd Expeditionary Bomb Squadron recently deployed from Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, to Andersen Air Force Base, Guam.

The CBP mission provides combatant commanders a global strike and extended-deterrence capability against any potential adversary. The U.S. military has maintained a deployed longrange bomber presence in the Pacific since March 2004, which has contributed significantly to regional security and stability.

"Our job is to be ready to fight tonight, no matter what is asked of us," said Capt. Nicholas Stein, 23rd Bomb Squadron flight commander. "Our daily training out of Minot Air Force Base is

what we rely on to prepare us for that. Recently, we had several home-station exercises where we trained in several aspects of what we can expect to be doing while deployed to the Pacific area of responsibility."

Following these exercises, 23rd BS B-52H Stratofortress bombers flew to Andersen AFB, where they replaced the 96th Expeditionary Bomb Squadron from Barksdale AFB, Louisiana.

"As the world's premiere long-range, strategic bomber, the B-52 excels at this mission," said Stein. "During this deployment, we will be conducting routine training missions in addition to any higher headquartersdirected missions in support of allies in the region – including Australia and Japan."

These same missions will also provide 23rd EBS Airmen opportunities to advance and

strengthen alliances, as well as strengthen long-standing military-to-military partnerships

"Nobody flies the B-52 better than the world-famous Bomber

Barons," Stein said. "We want to assure the American people and our allies that we can be anywhere in the world at the drop of a hat."



Six Airmen from Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota were selected to participate in the Engineer Week Immersion to learn the various jobs within the 5th Civil Engineer Squadron, Feb. 21, 2019.

From operating an excavator to putting on full bunker gear, participants got to experience a day in the life of a Team Minot Engineer.

"The immersion was an opportunity for people [in different career fields] to see what we do," said 2nd Lt. Tyler Rodriguez, 5th CES project programmer. "We have our hands in a lot of different things on base and we try to make sure everything runs smoothly."

To show the various aspects of 5th CES, the participants were taken to several different shops to get a hands-on experience.

"As people mature and progress in their careers, they have opportunities to see what other career fields do," said Lt. Col. Matthew Altman, 5th CES commander. "If we can expose what engineers do to other Airmen earlier on in their careers. it will give them a broader perspective to take back to their work centers."

The participants traded a day at their work centers for a day dedicated to the tour, so they

could fully immerse themselves into the engineering world.

"The Airmen were selected by their first sergeants to give us high performers who they thought would be good ambassadors to share what they learned from the immersion with their squadrons," said Rodriguez.

The tour included visits to the following: power production, heavy equipment, water fuel maintenance systems, engineering flight, emergency management, the fire department and the explosive ordnance disposal team.

Throughout the day, each shop was eager to show the tour members their shop's responsibilities and the importance they have on the mission.

"The engineers are excited to be a part of Team Minot," said Altman. "We are very proud to contribute to the important missions of both wings and glad to have the opportunity to expose people to what we do."

Although the participants for the Engineer Week Immersion were selected by their first sergeants, anyone interested in engineering has the opportunity to find out more.

"Anytime we have people interested in 5th CES, even outside of engineer week, we are more than happy to show other Airmen what we do," said Rodriguez.

Team Minot wonder women

Even though March is Women's History Month, the Airmen at Minot Air Force Base break barriers every day.

Team Minot supported equality this month by hosting an allwomen's missile alert.

"The all-women's alert is a day where all women in missile career fields come together and pull alert from top to bottom," said 1st Lt. Symantha Fry, 740th Missile Squadron nuclear missiles and operations officer.

For the fourth year in a row, these women led a 24-hour nuclear missile alert in the missile field of North Dakota on March 7, 2019.

Just a few years ago, women in the career field didn't have the capacity to lead an all-female 24hour alert.

"There are some captains that would tell you that five or six years ago there weren't enough females to pull an all-women's alert and cover all of the missile alert facilities," said 1st Lt. Hannah Andrick, 741st Missile Squadron nuclear missiles and operations officer.

In the past, women were assigned support roles for missile wings. It wasn't until the late 1970s and early 1980s that women were allowed to train as missile crew officers. In honor of this all-female alert, each missileer wore a special patch.

"Each year they make new patches," said Fry. "To signify each of the three intercontinental ballistic missile wings, this year's patch has three superhero logos with Wonder Woman being first."

Just as the superheroes represented on the patch may be role models, the missileers say they hope to inspire future generations.

"There are a lot of different theories of why getting young females involved in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math career fields are difficult, but hopefully seeing positive role models of women in our type of work can give them that positive image they need," said Andrick.

Andrick said, whether or not young females view these women as role models, they are becoming a part of history.

'There's a lot of beauty in an all-female crew standing together as a part of history to accomplish the mission for the three ICBM wings," said Andrick.

While the all-women's alert has included bombers, the submarine counterpart has yet to have the sufficient amount of women in the field to pull off an all-female effort

"I look forward to the future to hopefully have an all-female alert for all three legs of the nuclear triad," said Andrick.



Airfield management runs checks and balances

Even though Stratofortresses regularly takeoff at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, there are many checks and balances done to ensure a smooth departure.

Airfield managers responsible for various aspects of airfield operations to assure that all takeoffs and landings occur without incident.

"We are in charge of airfield safety, filing flight plans and maintaining the airfield at all times," said Staff Sgt. Logan Winter, 5th Operations Support Squadron airfield management operations noncommissioned officer in charge.

Although it is everyone's responsibility to keep the flight line free of debris, these Airmen are the primary eyes on the flight line and must be prepared to address anything on the airfield that may need to be fixed prior to a B-52 taking off.

"During normal operations, we go out to inspect the flight line every two hours," said Winter. "When we have snow, we could

be out there all day for traction control readings.'

Attached to their vehicle, there is a piece of equipment that takes traction control readings. In the past, they had to speed up and abruptly slow down to verify the flight line traction was in a good state, said Winter.

Having good equipment can make operations run smoother, but no matter the amount of

equipment, these Airmen must have a strong attention to detail when examining the airfield, Winter continued.

Airfield management essential to operations ensuring everything on the airfield is safe for our Airmen in the skies.

"In order for a plane to take off, they need us here," said Winter.

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D --Even after many days out in the field, the 91st Missile Security Forces Squadron Airmen still have responsibilities left.

Once getting back to base, Airmen have a check list of items to complete before getting to go home to rest.

"The Airmen drop off all their personal gear to their cars, then they need to account and return all other gear to the appropriate locations," said 1st Lt. Megan Duenas, 91st MSFS team member. "The last

step is to get debriefed from their leaders."

The process can take several hours to complete.

Duenas said each Airmen is assigned a weapon and it is the same one they use every time they trip out to the field. A card associated with every item in the armory informs them which weapon belongs to which Airmen.

"It is the Airmen's responsibility to take care of their weapon," said Duenas.

The accountability doesn't end there. Airmen are issued gear they are responsible for during the 84 to 120 hours they spend out in the field.

"We invest in the equipment the Air Force gives us," said SSgt. Christopher Swanson, 91st MSFS team member. "We take the time to carefully inspect all the gear Airmen return."

The gear is thoroughly examined when it is returned, so it is ready for the following trip out.

"Each vehicle is washed, inspected and stored for the next time it is needed in the field," said Swanson. "The winters can get harsh here and washing our vehicles helps maintain them for as long as we can."

After the process is finished and every item is checked off the list, Airmen get debriefed and go home for a full day off.

"Airman are given documents to know about personal appointment and the next training cycle before they go home to get their rest," said



- N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: Not much activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. No reports from Devils Lake or north-central area lakes.
- Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Some nice-sized walleye coming from varying depths on Devils Lake. Try rattling bait presentations with minnows. Scattered perch success on Devils Lake around the casino, Creel Bay, East Devils Lake, and Black Tiger Bay using small jigs and wax worms or bobber with plain book and minnow. Most perch success remains in Black Tiger Bay and East Devils Lake, as well as the west side of Stump Lake. Limited pike reports but try shallow areas along the west flats or Pelican Lake.
- Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Decent walleye success but be prepared for potential heavy snow, more so along the shoreline, and bring shovels and tow rope. Try Stump Lake in 10 to 25 feet or walleye, working deeper for perch at Stump and main Devils Lake.
- Lake Audubon/Lake Sakakawea, Totten Trail Bait, Coleharbor: Lake Audubon producing 17- to 21-inch walleye along the south and east ends but more so a case of quality than quantity.
- Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Lake Darling and Grano areas fair for walleye but ice depths are extremely variable. Lake Audubon producing some pike and walleye.
- Lake darling, Upper Souris Nat'l. Wildlife Refuge, Foxholm: Lots of portable houses at Grano with permanent houses moving

onto Lake Darling with generally fair small walleye success. Ice depth varies and beware of thin ice and pressure ridges around Landing 3, which had open water earlier.

- Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Continued bluegill success in shallower water with walleye out deeper.
- Lake Śakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Audubon Garrison: Lake continues producing walleye on the east end with numbers of houses along the south shore off Audubon Nat'l. Wildlife Refuge. Varied walleye success from Douglas Bay on the east end of Lake Sakakawea.
- Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Increasing activity on the Van Hook Arm with occasional to fair walleye success. Try jigs and minnows in 18 to 25 feet but access limited to ATVs yet. Watch for pressure ridges.
- Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Weather and access permitting, Missouri River tailrace continues producing OK walleye success from the chutes at dusk and night using crankbaits with occasional jig bite during the





This course is designed to train joint-service leaders in small unit tactics, leadership skills, and skills required to perform as part of a combined arms team.

Sappers are combat engineers who support the front-line infantry and perform tasks that include bridge-building, laying or clearing minefields, demolitions, field defenses as well as building, road and airfield construction and repair.

Two Team Minot Airmen initially competed in the U.S. Army sapper leader course.

"During halfway through

the course the other Airman sustained an injury and was cut from the course," said Jones. "Afterwards I was the only U.S. Air Force member there." The course is broken up into 2 phases.

Phase 1 is General studies which includes mountaineering, airborne operations, water ops and other exercises. Phase 2 is Patrolling out in the field, planning and executes missions, putting you to the test.

"What kept me going was the team aspect and the drive to earn the sapper tab," said Jones. "It's about the people working alongside you and willing to carry you through your low points.

After the end of the course Jones was tired and beaten but knew he successfully completed the course. He was now a sapper.

"At that moment when I got my sapper tab I knew I did it," said Jones. "I could finally lay down and take a nap."




