Minot AFB Shoppers Can Save More with MILITARY STAR!

From March 5 through March 19, Minot AFB shoppers who apply and are approved for a new MILITARY STAR account will receive 15% off all purchases made the first day instead of the 10% discount regularly offered. The discount will appear as a credit on the first monthly billing statement.

“With special discounts and cardholder-friendly terms, the MILITARY STAR card is a financial benefit to military members and their families,” said General Manager Michael Bell. “Opening a new account during this special promotion

means extra on top of the everyday savings shoppers get with MILITARY STAR.”

Cardholders receive two points for every dollar spent with MILITARY STAR and automatically earn a \$20 rewards card every 2,000 points.

Other benefits of the MILITARY STAR card include:

- The lowest flat-rate APR (11.74%) among store cards—rate is offered to all cardholders upon account approval.
- No annual, late or over-limit fees.
- Reduced-interest deployment plan with no

payments required for eligible customers.

Misawa F-16 pilots integrate with bombers, Koku Jieitai counterparts

MISAWA AIR BASE, Japan -- Six U.S. Air Force F-16 Fighting Falcons integrated with two B-52H Stratofortress bombers and 13 Koku Jieitai (Japan Air Self Defense Force or JASDF) F-2s to conduct bilateral and theater familiarization training at Draughton Range near the coast of Misawa, Japan, Feb 3.

The 14th Fighter Squadron teamed up with pilots based out of Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, Minot AFB, North Dakota and Hyakuri Air Base, Japan, three days prior to mission execution to conduct a mission-planning orientation that ensured all the aircraft arrived in the airspace at

the same time.

“This exercise was unique because this was the first time we’ve combined F-2s and B-52s in a training scenario utilizing Draughton Range,” said Lt. Col. David Madson, the 35th Operations Support Squadron commander. “We continue to increase the capabilities and capacity of Draughton Range and the connecting airspace. In doing such we’re able to provide unmatched training opportunities in the Northern Pacific.”

With three different airframes in attendance from across the Indo-Pacific and continental United States, all are puzzle pieces

that, when teamed up, are ready for combat.

“Being able to mission plan and execute a large force engagement exercise from geographically separated bases throughout the world shows the interoperability of Japan and the U.S. and their ability to provide combat air power in the Indo-Pacific region,” said Maj. Joseph Valdez, 35th OSS wing weapons officer.

During the training scenario the B-52s and F-2s simulated strikes over 80 assigned targets, and then accomplished follow-on dynamic targeting while the F-16s provided escort for the strikers against simulated adversary aircraft, and

suppression of enemy air defenses against the integrated air defenses located on Draughton Range.

Each asset played a vital role over the course of the mission demonstrating the U.S. commitment to allies and partners through the global employment of military forces.

“This mission was significant in that it brought together U.S. Air Force and JASDF assets and is a representation of our ability to synchronize effects from all over the world to provide lethal airpower to combatant commanders whenever requested,” said Madson.

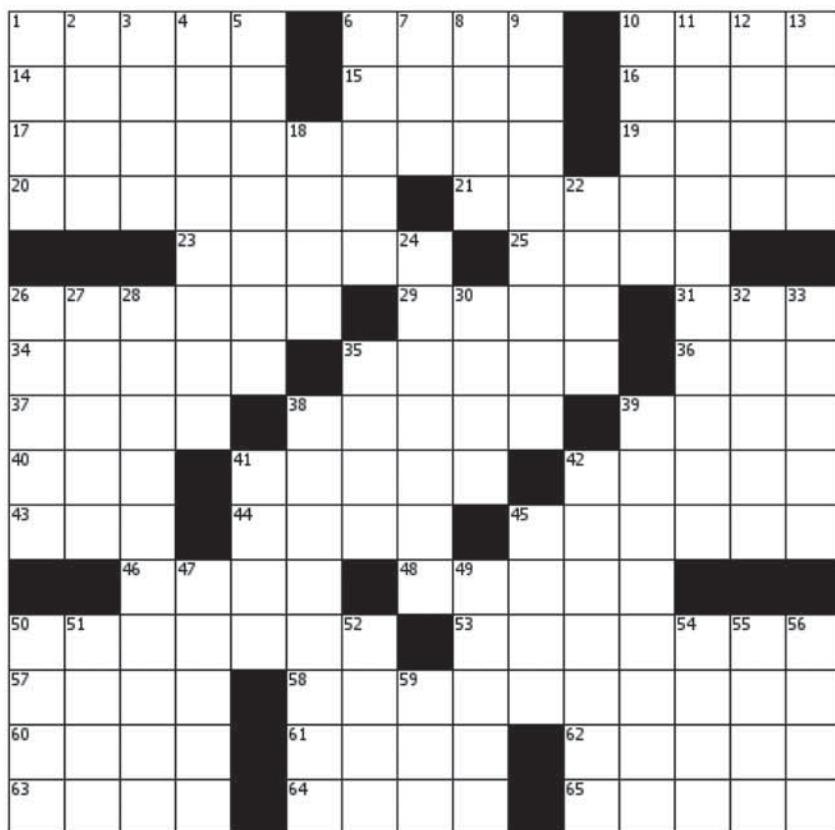

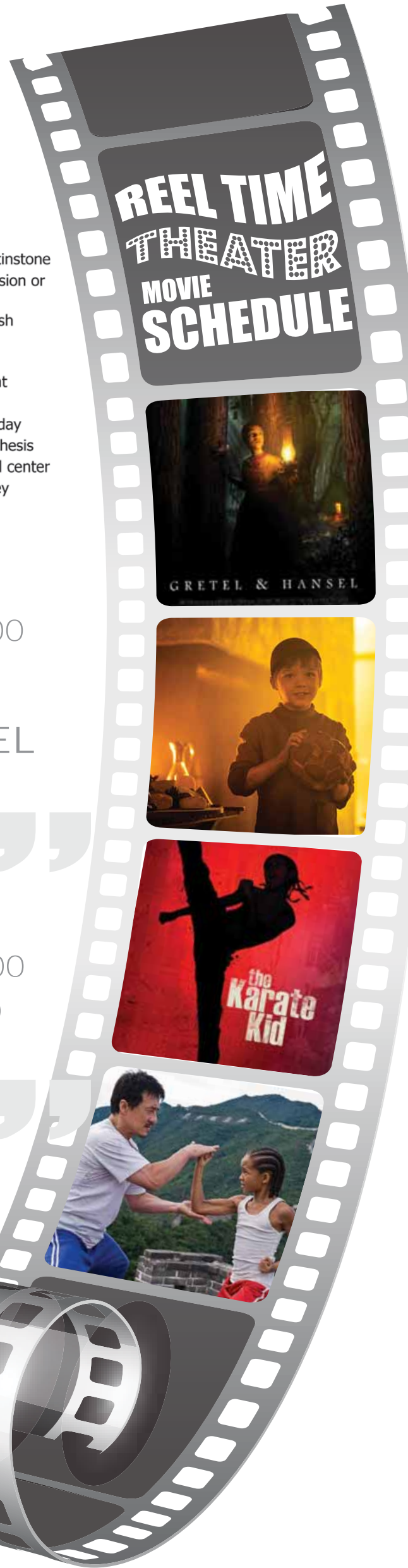

Jalapeno Popper Dip

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 (8 ounce packages) of cream cheese, softened
- 6-8 slices of bacon, cooked till crispy and crumbled (you can use the precooked bacon too)
- 1 cup mayonnaise (or sour cream or Greek yogurt)
- 4-6 Jalapeno's, chopped & seeds removed
- 1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1/2 cut mozzarella cheese shredded
- 1/4 cup diced green onion

TOPPING

- 1 cup crushed Ritz crackers
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup of butter melted

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 350F.
- Spray 8x8 casserole dish and set aside.
- Blend cream cheese until smooth and creamy.
- Add to cream cheese mixture: bacon, mayo (or substitute), jalapenos, cheddar cheese, Mozzarella cheese & diced onion. Mix well.
- Transfer mixture to casserole dish. Spread evenly in dish.
- In a small bowl combine Ritz crackers, Parmesan cheese & butter.
- Sprinkle all over the top of the dip.
- Bake the dip for 20-30 minutes or until bubbly.

NOTES

- Serve with Ritz Crackers or Wheat thins as a dip or spoon some on to each cracker and serve.
- If making this ahead of time, assemble dish and refrigerate. Cook 30 minutes prior to event and serve hot.

The first shed

They glistened like hidden treasures awaiting discovery.

Lying in the bottom of a coulee, they beckoned to be released from their fate, which, granted would probably have provided food and nourishment for a happy rodent.

Pay no heed to the fact that the coulee slopes were muddy and slippery with melting snow and ice. Ignore the fact that trekking down to retrieve a small matching set of moose antler sheds meant a serious test for one knee that was only about a month post-operative knee replacement surgery.

The sheds were precious, they begged to be appreciated because, given their size, they likely were this bull's most valuable set of antlers. They meant he survived his first winter on the North Dakota prairie.

So the shimmy was on to retrieve the sheds and then figure out how to maneuver back up the steep, slick slope with sheds in hand. The upward climb dashed some of the giddiness over the discovery but with determined, clenched hands, those sheds were going to their new home.

That little set of moose sheds now lay nestled on a coffee table. Perhaps that's an indication they're not exactly the biggest moose antlers when they fit neatly on a piece of furniture. That's OK, they're a matched set of antlers, shed side-by-side by a moose living on one's own property.

That's what makes shed hunting such an amazing activity.

Well, that and other things.

Things like being able to get outside after winter breaks, getting exercise, and watching spring try to eek its release from winter's grasp.

It's taking the dogs along so they get exercise, hoping they didn't find too much mud and icky things to roll in on their own personal treasure hunt.

It's the opportunity to marvel at creatures who each year grow and drop their antlers. Think about the energy and nutrients needed for a bull elk to grow antlers of any size in a matter of a few months.

And, of course, moose. Even growing those little sheds on that coffee table put demands on that young bull. It's not a minor feat for deer to grow antlers, either.

There is an art to shed hunting and while it involves knowing and understanding deer, elk, and moose movements in winter, what to look for – things like game trails or perhaps across from a fence should antlers pop off as a deer lands, for example.

Yet the art of shed hunting is doing it properly so wildlife isn't disturbed. When spring breaks out of its shell and wildlife isn't as stressed – even in this winter's relatively mild snow conditions – that's a good time to shed hunt.

Next winter and early spring, though, pass on shed hunting when wildlife is congregated in heavy cover. Don't chase and harass wildlife. Not only is it illegal, but also when people get out shed hunting, deer and other animals are at their most stressed point coming off winter. Don't push them over the edge.

Shed hunt only where it's legal. Places like U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service lands are closed to shed hunting, including all National Wildlife Refuges and Waterfowl Production Areas.

Find out what is and isn't allowed on other public land – U.S. Forest Service National Grasslands, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers land along Lake Sakakawea and Lake Audubon, or N.D. Game and Fish Department Wildlife Management Areas, for example.

It's especially important to make sure you have permission on private land. An old, tattered "No hunting or trespassing" sign still means the landowner doesn't want someone on their property.

Ask for shed-hunting permission first. It's entirely possible, the landowner will be glad to have someone find an antler shed. Those sharp antler tips can do some nasty damage to a tractor tire.

Just be sure to ask first.

Air Force's proposed \$169 billion budget focuses on 'great power competition,' readiness, establishing Space Force

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) -- The Department of the Air Force released a \$169 billion budget proposal Feb. 10, which for the first time includes funding for the newly created U.S. Space Force while also focusing funds to help both services modernize, address threats from Russia and China, and sustain readiness.

The spending plan for fiscal year 2021 carries a \$900 million increase from the previous year. But unlike 2020, funding for 2021 is apportioned differently, with \$153.6 billion directed to the Air Force and \$15.4 billion for the Space Force.

"Our fiscal year '21 budget proposal helps drive irreversible momentum as we implement the National Defense Strategy," said Secretary of the Air Force Barbara Barrett. "The strategic advantages the Air Force and the Space Force bring to our nation are vital. This budget allows us to meet today's national security challenges while taking important steps toward the Air and Space Forces we need in 2030."

The 2018 National Defense Strategy is an overarching blueprint for the entire U.S. military for defending the nation and its interests. At the heart of the Department of the Air Force's strategy for winning future conflicts is creating a resilient battle network that connects ships, ground forces,

planes and satellites to fight together at speeds far surpassing any adversary. This budget provides funds for a rapid experimentation, prototyping and development effort supporting the overall Joint Staff-led initiative to connect every sensor and shooter in land, sea, air, space and cyber.

The budget proposal calls for increased investments in space as well as ensuring sufficient combat power to respond decisively to any attack against the U.S. or allies. The budget proposal also addresses what the service calls "logistics under attack," ensuring equipment, personnel and supplies are available when and where they are needed to sustain high-tempo actions in combat operations.

Specifically, the budget calls for spending \$5.8 billion to purchase 48 F-35A Lightning II aircraft. It provides \$3 billion to purchase 15 KC-46A Pegasus tankers and \$1.4 billion for 12 F-15EX fighters.

Research and development will grow by \$1.5 billion for the Air Force to a total of \$26.9 billion, which includes increased investment in the burgeoning battle network – the Advanced Battle Management System – development and capability demonstrations connecting the joint force. Funding for research and development in the Space Force will grow to \$10.3 billion from \$9.8 billion in fiscal

year 2020.

The budget carries \$2.8 billion for continued development of the B-21 Raider, the next generation long-range bomber, and \$1.5 billion for upgrading and modernizing the ground-based nuclear force. That figure is nearly \$1 billion greater than the previous fiscal year, underscoring the priority attached to modernizing the aging ground-based nuclear deterrent.

"This budget moves us forward toward meeting the missions required under the National Defense Strategy while also providing room to innovate and build for the future," said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein. "That's the sweet spot we always want to hit. Like every budget, we didn't get everything we put on the table, but we got a lot and the reason is our story resonated in terms of the force that we know we need to build to win."

In order to strike a balance between the capabilities needed to fight today and the capabilities that the two services require for the future, the 2021 spending plan anticipates retiring some planes to free up funding for critical new equipment. The list includes 13 KC-135 Stratotankers and 16 KC-10 Extenders; 24 C-130H Hercules, 17 B-1 Lancers and 24 RQ-4 Global Hawk Block 20/30 aircraft.

The Space Force portion of the

budget reflects a continuing shift to address the challenges and threats posed by potential adversaries.

"Space is now a contested domain which is why it is an imperative that we train and equip our forces to ensure freedom of action in space across all phases of conflict," said Chief of Space Operations Gen. John Raymond. "This budget provides the resources we need to meet those requirements and to deliver vital space capabilities to our joint and coalition forces."

Reflecting the importance of space, the budget funds the National Security Space Launch program to ensure access to space and achieve independence from relying on launch vehicles from non-allies.

It also funds, at \$2.3 billion, rapid development of Next-Gen Overhead Persistent Infrared Space and Ground systems to provide strategic missile warning.

Threaded throughout the entire budget document is a focus on people and readiness.

Funding to pay for flying hours increases in fiscal year 2021 to \$6.6 billion. The budget envisions an increase in the Department's force of active duty, Guard and Reserve by 1,500 personnel. That would bring the uniformed force to 512,100.

Since April 2018, the Air Force has increased overall readiness by

16% and increased readiness for frontline units, known as pacing squadrons, by 35%.

In response to challenges with military privatized family housing, the budget provides money to hire 218 additional on-site base housing managers to monitor project owner actions, provide quality assurance and advocacy.

The fiscal 2021 proposal also provides funds to expand resiliency resources and fund programs that promote a culture of dignity and respect, including \$51 million for the True North initiative, which embeds mental health professionals, physiologists, physical therapists and religious support teams within high-risk groups of a wing.

While Department of the Air Force officials say the 2021 budget request is the result of rigorous analysis and a series of "tough but necessary choices," it represents only the starting point for the budget process.

The proposal now goes to Congress for its consideration and what is likely to be months of deliberation, debate and revisions. Under the typical schedule, the budget for the new fiscal year must be approved and signed into law by the president by Oct. 1, 2020, when the new fiscal year begins.

Grants awarded for Marimba Quartet residency

Minot Public Schools, the Minot Symphony Association and Minot State University Division of Music have received grants from three arts organizations in support of an April 23-25 residency at MSU of the Iowa-based Heartland Marimba Quartet. The cooperative project includes a workshop for middle school and high school student percussionists, a free public recital, and a concerto performance with the Minot Symphony Orchestra.

Minot Public Schools applied for and was awarded a \$1250 Special Project grant from the ND Council on the Arts; the project as a whole has been granted \$1000 from the Arts Midwest Touring Fund and \$650 from the Percussive Arts Society. Additional support will be provided by the MSU Division of Music through its Northwest International Festival of Music. Other co-sponsors of the event are the Magi Drum Line and MSU

Percussive Arts Club.

The Heartland Marimba Quartet (HMQ), headquartered in Waterloo, IA, was established in 2016 and is comprised of founder Matthew Coley plus Michael J. Jones, Joe Millea, and Ujjal Bhattacharyya. The group's mission is to develop and disseminate the classical marimba art form in both academic and community contexts. Their appearance in Minot is one stop in a spring 2020 concert tour through Wisconsin, North Dakota, Minnesota, and Iowa.

A HMQ workshop and performance at MSU on April 24 will be part of the official 2020 Percussive Arts Society ND Day of Percussion. On Saturday, April 25, HMQ will be featured guest soloists with the Minot Symphony Orchestra, performing the "Marahuaka" marimba concerto by maestro Efraín Amaya and "Journey for Marimba" by

Coley. A complete schedule of residency events is available from minotsymphony@minotstateu.edu.

Financing Your Child's College Education

So, your child is ready for college — and you're ready to support their education goals. Now you just need to figure out how to pay for it. Luckily, you'll find lots of resources to help military families like yours to finance your child's college, from saving plans to scholarships.

Take advantage of military family scholarships

There are numerous scholarships available to children of service members. Each varies depending on eligibility, so check carefully to find the scholarships right for your child's educational goals, then apply, apply, apply.

The Defense Commissary Agency created the Scholarships for Military Children Program in recognition of the contributions of military families to the readiness of the fighting force, and to celebrate the role of the commissary in the military family community.

Military service relief

organizations offer scholarships and no-interest loans for family members.

Transferability of GI Benefits

The Post-9/11 GI Bill allows service members to transfer their education benefits to immediate family members, including a spouse and/or child.

The recipient must be enrolled in the Defense Eligibility Enrollment Reporting System, or DEERS, at the time of the transfer.

The transfer must occur while the service member is on active duty.

The service member can transfer up to 36 months of their benefits.

Apply for grants

In addition to scholarships, there are plenty of education grants which families don't have to repay. To begin the grant process, start with FAFSA, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Most colleges and universities use this form to determine students' eligibilities

for aid, grants and scholarships. Here are some of the grants available:

The Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grant is for students whose parent died as a result of military service in either Iraq or Afghanistan after September 11, 2001.

The FSEOG, the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant Program, provides need-based grants for low-income undergraduate students.

Federal Pell Grants are for undergraduate students without an existing degree.

Compare your financial aid and loan options

If you're taking out a loan, be sure to read the fine print. Each college or university will offer a host of financial aid packages, so research each carefully to make sure you're signing onto the right one. These options also allow you to borrow directly from the

government.

Use the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's "Know Before You Go" tool to create a personal financial aid spreadsheet to compare which loans and aid your student qualifies for.

Direct Stafford Loans are low-interest and available to both undergraduate and graduate students.

PLUS Loans are also available for both undergraduate and graduate students.

How to start saving now

You're already well equipped to start saving for your child's college education and have the discipline to commit to it. It may seem daunting, but there are plenty of ways to put some money away now that will pay dividends to your child's college education down the line.

Coverdell Education Savings Accounts let families save up to \$2,000 for college, and other members of the family, such as

grandparents, aunts and uncles, can also contribute here.

State-run Qualified Tuition Programs, or 529 Plans, allow families to lock in today's tuition rates for state schools. These accounts also grow generally tax-free and offer a variety of tax benefits.

BAKED SOFT PRETZEL WITH BEER CHEESE SAUCE



INGREDIENTS

- SOFT PRETZEL**
 1 1/2 CUPS WARM WATER (110-115°)
 1 TBSP SUGAR
 1 PACKAGE ACTIVE DRY YEAST
 4 1/2 CUPS ALL PURPOSE FLOUR
 2 TBSP KOSHER SALT
 2 OZ MELTED UNSALTED BUTTER
 COOKING OIL SPRAY
 10 CUPS WATER
 2/3 CUP BAKING SODA
 1 LARGE EGG YOLK BEATEN WITH
 1 TBSP WATER
 JACOBSEN SMOKED SEA SALT,
 AS NEEDED
- BEER CHEESE SAUCE**
 2 CUPS SHARP CHEDDAR CHEESE
 1/2 CUP CREAM CHEESE,
 ROOM TEMPERATURE
 1/2 TBSP WORCESTERSHIRE SAUCE
 2 TSP DIJON MUSTARD
 2 CLOVES GARLIC, MINCED
 1 TSP PAPRIKA
 1/2 CUP BEER

In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine the water and sugar and sprinkle the dry yeast on top. Let it sit for 5-6 minutes until it starts to foam on top.

Add flour, salt, and butter to the bowl, and with the hook attachment mix on low until well combined. Then mix on medium for about 5 minutes until dough is smooth and pulls away from the sides.

Remove dough from bowl and spray bowl well with cooking oil spray. Return dough to the bowl, cover with a cloth or plastic wrap and allow the dough to double in size.

When ready to cook, set the Traeger to 350° and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes.

While dough rises, bring to a boil 10 cups of water and the baking soda.

When dough is ready, divide into 8 pieces. Roll each piece into a 24-inch rope.

Form a U shape with each rope, holding each end of the rope and cross them over each other and press it down on the bottom of the U forming a pretzel.

One by one, place each pretzel in the boiling water for 30 seconds. With a flat spatula take them out and place in a sheet pan.

Brush pretzels with egg yolk and sprinkle with smoked sea salt. Bake in the Traeger for about 25-30 minutes.

To make the Beer Cheese Sauce: In a food processor bowl, add cheddar cheese, cream cheese, Worcestershire sauce, Dijon mustard, garlic and paprika. Blend until finely chopped, add the beer slowly until is smooth.

When pretzels are done serve with the beer cheese sauce. Enjoy!

Lake Sakakawea elevation, Feb. 24: 1,837.96 feet above mean sea level (MSL); 24,400 cubic feet per second (CFS) Garrison Dam average daily releases.

Deviils Lake elevation: 1,448.98 feet above mean sea level (MSL).

Stump Lake elevation: 1,448.91 MSL.

•N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: No new reports from Devils Lake or the Missouri River System. Use extreme caution with warm weather creating variable, slushy, and generally poor ice conditions on small lakes in some areas.

•Deviils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Fair walleye and perch success. Continue working deep for perch from 25 feet out to 50 feet depending on location. Try 18 to 25 feet for walleye using rattling presentations. Try tungsten jigs and spikes for perch. Most activity is in front of the casino, Creel Bay, or East Bay Campground.

•Deviils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Continued small walleye success working 17 to 25 feet. Try Lake Irvine for a mix of perch and walleye. Work deeper for perch starting around 20 feet. Try East Bay or East Devils Lake. Bigger perch seem to be coming from Lake Irvine, however.

•Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Lake Darling still somewhat slow for walleye with better success around Grano. Lake Audubon fair at best. Look for some improving walleye activity on Parshall Bay on Lake Sakakawea.

•Lake Darling, Upper Souris Nat'l Wildlife Refuge, Foxholm: Warm weather brining good numbers of anglers out to Lake Darling with so-so success. A couple of permanent ice houses now on the lake north of the dam.

•Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Continued good bluegill success along with pike spearing. Occasional walleye but look toward evening for any bite.

•Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Lake Audubon spotty for walleye. Anglers marking fish on the east end of Lake Sakakawea but the bite is finicky. Try the Honey Hole, stumps, or coal veins on the Missouri River for walleye.

•Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Spotty walleye success in the Van Hook Arm working shallow out to 20 feet using tip-ups with some jigs and minnows.

•Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace continues producing

•Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: Area lakes remain slow.

•North-central/central N.D. lakes, Townner Hdwe. Hank, Townner: Buffalo Lodge Lake slowed for walleye with scattered small pike success. Island Lake producing pike but a case of quality more so than quantity. No reports from other area lakes or the Souris River.

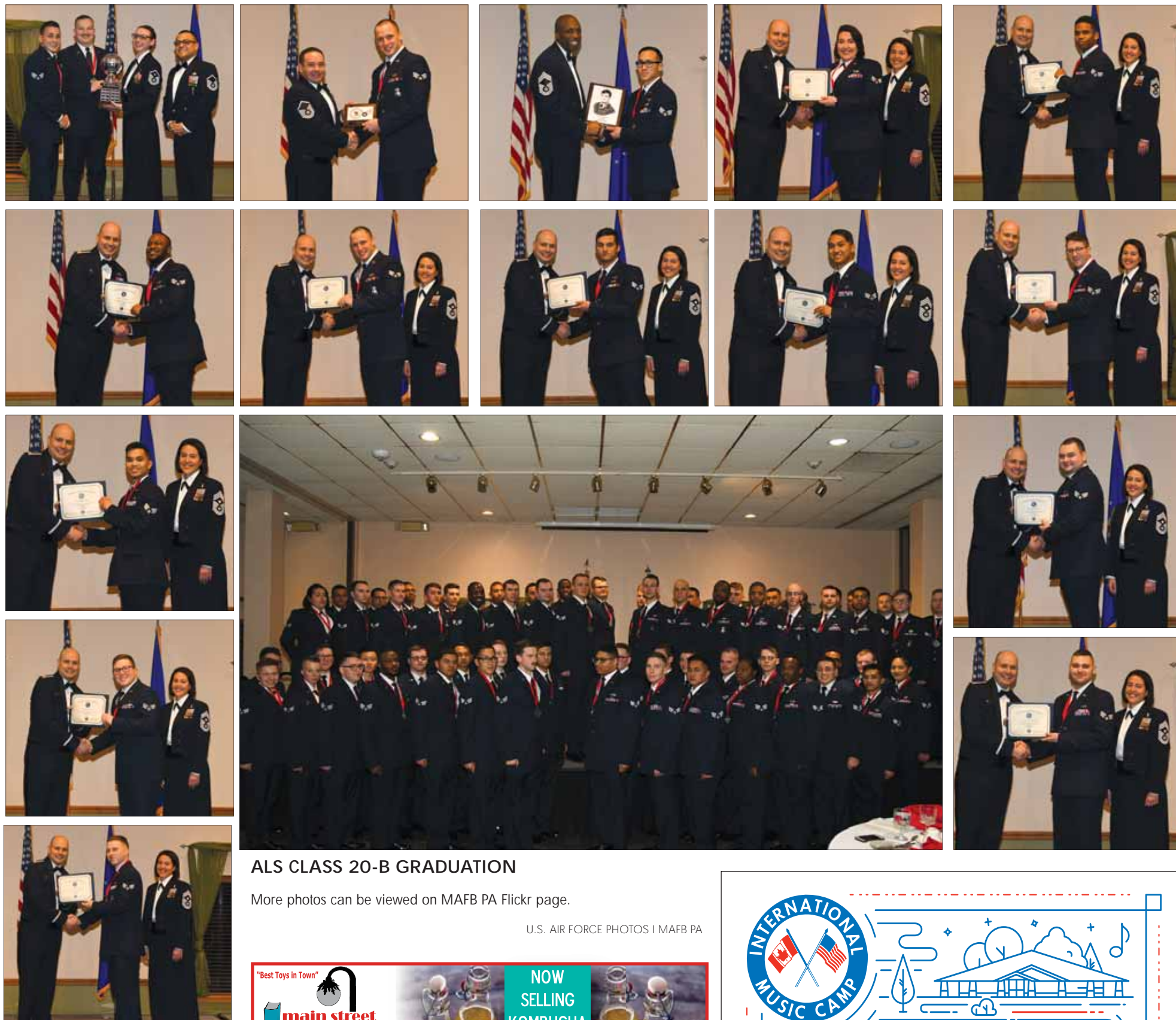
