5th BW Airmen return home from nine-month deployment

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D.

Airmen from the 5th Bomb Wing's 69th Bomb Squadron, 5th Maintenance Group, and 5th Mission Support Group returned to Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, from their deployment to Andersen AFB, Guam, April 20, 2020, where they supported U.S. Indo-Pacific Command's Continuous Bomber Presence mission in the Indo-Pacific region.

The 69th BS completed a ninemonth CBP mission in support of U.S. interests and those of America's allies, the longest deployment of its kind in Air Force Global Strike Command's history. Strategic bombers have routinely trained, operated and conducted exercises with partner nations throughout the USINDOPACOM theater of operations.

"I could not be more proud of the Warbird men and women, and especially the families that supported them during these back to back, incredibly successful, record breaking deployments. It's great to have the whole team back home after 15 months in the Pacific," said Col. Brad Cochran, 5th BW commander.

For the past 15 months, Airmen from the 5th BW have maintained B-52H Stratofortress bombers and flown a total of 6,100 hours in four different geographic areas of responsibility. While doing so, they also worked with 10 allied nations in the Indo-Pacific region, strengthening regional partnerships and military interoperability.
"The 69th Bomb Squadron

and its aircraft maintenance unit executed 352 Continuous Bomber Presence sorties in support of United States INDOPACOM objectives. They flew over 2,000 flight hours and delivered \$2 million in high explosives, precision-guided munitions, and sea mines," said Lt. Col. Dennis Zabka, 69th BS commander.

The 69th BS practiced maritime strike tactics, performed search and rescue missions, integrated with fifth generation fighter aircraft launched off of aircraft carriers, and achieved dynamic force employment objectives from three different operating locations.

"I'm grateful for the patience and support of our families back home," said Zabka. "They could probably write a book on resiliency right now. Not only did they support the longest B-52 deployment since Vietnam, but they did it over the winter in Minot, North Dakota, and finished it off during a health pandemic."

The return of Air Force units from deployments are customarily large gatherings with loved ones eagerly waiting near the flightline with large signs to match their joyful smiles, however, this type of gathering isn't possible during ongoing precautions in an COVID-19 environment. Thankfully, there was no stopping the joy of

reunited families for this return, as they waited in their cars as their returning Airmen received their "Welcome Home"

This reunion was unique with leadership and families wearing masks and maintaining social distancing as they celebrated a physical distance that is no longer thousands of miles.

Airmen returning from Guam were placed in "Restriction of Movement" upon their return as a precautionary measure. Members will be restricted to their homes and dorms for 14 days to reduce the potential spread of COVID-19, in the event the returning service member is carrying the illness asymptomatically.

The 5th BW leadership team is proud of the accomplishments and sacrifices of these Airmen and their families, and are happy to have their Global Strikers back home.

GET THE CINCO DE MAYO PARTY STARTED

No Cinco de Mayo celebration would be complete without a spicy, tangy salsa dip. In fact, May is also National Salsa Month, making it an ideal time to whip up some homemade salsa. When planning Cinco de Mayo parties, consider this recipe for "Salsa" from "Vegan Cooking for Beginners" (Publications International) from the PI Kitchens. Why not pair it with the equally delicious "Guacamole" for plants of many actions? for plenty of menu options?

Salsa

Makes 4 1/2 cups

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 can (28 ounces) whole Italian plum tomatoes, undrained
- 2 fresh plum tomatoes, seeded and coarsely chopped
- 2 tablespoons canned diced green chiles
- 1 tablespoon canned diced jalapeño peppers (optional)
- 1 tablespoon white vinegar
- 1 clove garlic, minced • 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

• 1/4 teaspoon salt

Combine tomatoes with juice, fresh tomatoes, green chiles, jalapeños, if desired, vinegar, garlic, onion powder, sugar, cumin, garlic powder and salt in food processor; process until finely chopped.

Guacamole

Makes 2 cups

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 large ripe avocados • 2 teaspoons fresh lime juice
- 1/4 cup finely chopped red onion
 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
 1/2 jalapeño, finely chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Cut avocados in half lengthwise around pits. Remove pits. Scoop avocados into large bowl; sprinkle with lime juice and toss to coat. Mash to desired consistency with fork or potato masher.

Add onion, cilantro, jalapeño and salt; stir gently until well blended. Taste and add additional salt, if desired.

Minot defenders join U.S. Air Force Rugby Team

GLENDALE, Colo. --

The United States Air Force men's and women's rugby teams gathered in Glendale, Colorado in March for what was supposed to be a historic two week tournament named The Australia, New Zealand, United States Shield, where the United States Air Force would battle the Royal Australian Air Force and Royal New Zealand Air Force rugby teams.

Due to the rapid spread of COVID-19, in favor of all of the teams' health and safety, the tournament was canceled. The tournament took two years of work and collaboration to plan what was projected to be the largest event ever hosted by the U.S. Air Force Rugby Team. This is the first time this tournament was to be held in America as well as to include a women's competition portion.

The players and staff were set to play at Infinity Park. The team leadership had to act quickly to dismantle the event and get more than 140 players and staff home to more than five different countries.

"The team was really excited to be here," said U.S. Air Force Maj. Nicole Jansen, U.S. Air Force Women's Rugby Team officer in charge. We had camp in January and everyone had worked so hard to get here. We were all disappointed that it was canceled."

Some of the players have played for more than 10 years and competed together before, and some were meeting for the very first time. The staff selected players stationed at Air Force bases around the world, and two of the U.S. women's players are from the same base.

U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Jena White, 5th Security Forces Squadron response force member assigned to Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, began playing in South Grenville, North Carolina two years ago. After getting assigned to Minot AFB she met U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Jordan Agnello, 5th SFS response force member. After working together and bonding over their mutual love of sports, White convinced Agnello

to try rugby and apply for the Air Force team.

"Jena is extremely skilled at [rugby], she has played for a while," said Agnello. "She was already on the Air Force team so I guess you could say she recruited me to come try it out. I'm definitely going to grow more into it and stick with it.'

Despite the tournament being canceled, Agnello remained committed to staying fit and learning how to play rugby so she wouldn't miss future events. As of April, all further Air Force sporting events have been canceled for the remainder of the fiscal year.

"Rugby is just a unique sport, from how players bond together on and off the field even [to bonding] with the opposing team," said White. "It's truly its own sport... There's something about the camaraderie in this sport that's not like any other. I've always wanted to play and finally found a team close to where I lived."

Even though White and Agnello are the youngest two players on

the team, they have dreams beyond I loved how proud he was even playing on the team during their Air Force careers.

"My Air Force goal is to excel in anything I participate in, such as sniper school," said Agnello.

"I want to earn my degree in criminal law, victimology or behavior analysis in hopes of commissioning.'

White mentioned her aspirations to be in Special Operations someday as well as continuing on her rugby iournev.

"I want to better the ones that I play with and someday play at the Olympics for the USA [national team]," White said.

The team goes beyond the 15 players on the field in rugby. Coaches, fans, friends, and families all come together to support the players.

"I'd say my biggest fan is my whole family, no matter where they are, they all are always cheering me on and supporting me," White said. "My favorite rugby memory is the first game my dad was ever able to come to and I scored that day. though he knew little about the

Agnello didn't know much about rugby prior to this tournament. However, she has an athletic background.

"I'm an all-around athlete so I've played just about everything, mainly basketball and softball,' said Agnello. "I really enjoy more contact sports such as football, wrestling and, of course, rugby."

Agnello and White both got a taste of international rugby camaraderie and traditions at this tournament. Even though the tournament was canceled White reflected on the memories with teammates and new friends.

"I'm excited to get to know the ladies I play with and the game more," said White. "It's always a good time with them and being a younger player, I always learn something from just being around them. It's always awesome to see where different teams come from as well, especially when they're from different countries."









Air Force expedites N95 mask production contract awards

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) -- The Department of the Air Force rapidly executed three contract awards worth \$133 million with 3M, Honeywell and O&M Halyard to increase domestic N95 production dedicating long-term mask capacity for national demand. These are the first Department of Defense funded awards utilizing Defense Production Act Title 3 authorities in response to COVID-19.

The Department's Air Force Research Lab DPA Title 3 Executive Program Office, in coordination with the Office of the Secretary of Defense Office for Industrial Policy and Department of the Air Force's Acquisition COVID-19 Task Force, or DAF-ACT, finalized contracts within five days of White House Task Force approval. 3M received \$76 million, O&M Halyard received million and Honeywell received \$27.4 million for facility and machinery conversion to boost industrial capability and collectively produce 39 million masks in the next 90 days.

"As the Department of Defense's Executive Agent for the Defense Production Act, increasing N95 production is priority one," said Dr. Will Roper, the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics. "This week's award of \$133 million to 3M, Honeywell and O&M Halyard will add around 13 million N95 masks per month to our nation's supply in the near term. I sincerely thank our program team and each company for closing on this critical deal quickly."

Collectively, this quick-turn effort is postured to accelerate N95 mask delivery to 141 million in the next six months and increase the total production to 450 million per year. This kind of rapid acquisition and scaling is possible because of previous acquisition delegation of authority and contracting revamp to match the speed of relevance.

"I couldn't be more proud of our team — especially the Air Force Research Laboratory contracting officers — who used their expertise to rapidly coordinate and secure these contracts. This is just one example of many critical acquisition efforts that the DAF-ACT is proud to support as part of a whole-ofgovernment response," said Maj. Gen. Cameron Holt, DAF-ACT



Try These Home-Schooling Tips, Resources

Many schools across the continental United States and the globe have temporarily closed their doors to help keep students, their families, administrators and teachers safe and slow the spread of coronavirus disease 2019. Here are some tips and resources you can use to help your child learn

Talk with your child about the pandemic

Children may know more about the virus than you realize, even if they are young and are not talking about it. Here are ways to address the topic:

Speak with your child, in an age-appropriate manner, about COVID-19 and its impact on their normal routine and the routines of those around them. Start the conversation by determining what, if anything, they already know.

Reassure your child that you are doing everything you can to protect their well-being and that of the family.

Encourage your child to come to you with any questions or concerns. You might start a journal together to document your experiences and emotions during this time.

Establish a routine for learning at

Consider your child's age. Transitioning to home-based learning will be very different for a preschool student than a middle or high school student. Discuss your expectations for learning at home and go over any concerns so you are on the same page.

Set and follow a weekday schedule for starting and ending the school day and going to bed. All children benefit from structure, even if they try to resist it.

Build in flexibility accommodate your own work and other responsibilities. You may be teleworking, for example. See if you and your spouse, partner or another adult in your household can share some of the teaching. It might also help to set aside time in the evenings to check over

assignments or work together on reading and other skills.

Take breaks. Schedule time during the school day for lunch, snacks and age-appropriate breaks. Think physical education, recess,

Build in time for creativity. Make time for music, art and other creative subjects. This may include time for your child to practice an instrument, draw, paint, try their hand at drama or develop other skills. Have younger children practice counting by stacking blocks, or build a fort from sheets.

Help your child safely connect with friends and relatives. Connecting with friends and family members outside your household is important. Work with your child's school, their friends' parents and others to help them stay in touch. Consider taking turns leading virtual lessons or hosting virtual play dates. Have your child write letters to people they care about while practicing handwriting and grammar.

Tap resources through your child's school

Embrace online assignments and virtual lessons. Many schools are offering online assignments and/or virtual lessons in place of traditional in-person learning. Monitor your child's assignments and make sure they complete all work and log in on time for online sessions. Provide any help they need, such as reading instructions and using laptops and other devices.

Ask for teaching advice. Don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teachers, guidance counselors and administrators for advice as you support your child at home.

Seek assistance. Contact your child's teachers or school to resolve issues that may come up with technology, connectivity, assignments and more.

Tap installation and community resources

home-schooling Explore resources on your installation. These can include school liaison officers, Department of Defense Education Activity school activities, and programs for children, youth and teens.

Check out Head Start and Sure Start programs. Head Start teaches reading, math and other developmental skills to children 5 and younger before they start school. Sure Start is a Department of Defense Education Activity program open to commandsponsored military children at overseas installations who meet age requirements and other criteria.





never forget the great atrocity of which mankind is capable. If you have free time during next Tuesday, there are some virtual events you might want to check out.







A LIVING FOSSIL PATRICIA STOCKDILL

They're a treasure, a living fossil surviving vertically airborne. millions of years found in only one part of North America.

And some call North Dakota home.

They're paddlefish, a massive, prehistoric fish scientists trace back to the Cretaceous Period 65 million years ago.

Only one other paddlefish species (in Asia) exists outside of the large, slow-flowing freshwater Mississippi River Basin, which includes portions of the Missouri River.

Unique in appearance, paddlefish are unlike other fish species in the Missouri River System, in Montana, North Dakota, and South Dakota, which in North Dakota includes the river,

an 18-mile stretch of the Yellowstone River in the northwestern part of the state, Lake Sakakawea, and the river below Garrison Dam widening into Lake Oahe below Bismarck.

Appearance wise, appropriately earn their common name because of a large paddle on their face in front of their eyes and mouth. The paddle serves a critical function: Its darkish dots detect electricity generated by its prey, which is microscopic zooplankton.

As a paddlefish swims, the paddle helps it focus on zooplankton, which it filters into its wide-open mouth. Close-set gills then filter the zooplankton – food – out of the water entering the mouth, allowing a fish that can weigh more than 100 pounds to devour microscopic morsels.

Paddlefish lack bones. Instead, their skeleton and paddle are made of cartilage, just like a shark.

A paddlefish ranges in color from blue-gray to almost black with a lighter underbelly and can stretch more than seven feet in length.

Paddles grow quickly on young paddlefish and almost seem disproportional to its small body until its body grows in relation to the paddle.

Perhaps befitting an ancient fish, paddlefish are long-lived, typically reaching 20 years of age and into their 50s.

The N.D. Game and Fish Department closely monitors paddlefish populations. While they were likely never abundant in the Missouri River, the river's once free-flowing state was altered with construction of a series of flood-control dams

diminishing their habitat and historic range. Paddlefish spawn in the spring, laying

eggs on silt-free gravel beds. Spawning in North Dakota takes place in the upper reaches around the Yellowstone and Missouri rivers west of

Williston. After spawning, they spend summer months in slack water of the two rivers, moving into Lake Sakakawea's deep

water in the winter. The state's paddlefish population is stable enough, though, to provide a limited season. North Dakota's first paddlefish season began in 1976. However, the Game and Fish Department closed the 2020 paddlefish harvest season for the first time given Covid-19 concerns and social distancing recommendations. It simply draws too many people to a small area. Because paddlefish feed differently than other fish and anglers don't' catch them with traditional open water fishing techniques, the harvest method involves snagging their massive bodies. Research found they could survive being snagged when promptly and properly released back into the water, so snag-and-release has been allowed in recent years.

Virtual daycare gives teleworking parents creative options

A new YouTube series gives families access to digital daycare opportunities for their military

School closings and mandated stay-at-home orders have put online education resources for kids in high demand. The Fab Lab with Crazy Aunt Lindsey developed an innovative solution that educates, engages and entertains students virtually through its new Digital Daycare™.

Between the hours of 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. PST, families can participate in livestream learning with Lindsey Murphy, creator of The Fab Lab. This supplementary educational programming is ideal for children

Air Force spouse Bianca Reed, a mother of three, has been streaming the Digital DaycareTM for her school-aged children.

"I think when you hear 'digital daycare' you're like, 'how is this happening? How are you making this work?' I was real impressed with the educational content. It's resonating with a wide range not just one age group," she said.

Reed isn't new to Crazy Aunt Lindsey. As the head of client development and marketing with Rain the Growth Agency, she's worked closely with Murphy. She's also been a subscriber to Murphy's popular YouTube channel for about three years. As a mother, Reed is conscious about the role models she puts in front of her kids.

"There's not a lot of diversity in STEM, so we're always looking for ways to engage our children there," she explained.

Michelle Cardinal, co-founder and CEO of Rain the Growth Agency, is proud to be a sponsor for this project. Murphy is the Artist in Residence at the advertising agency. Being located in the Pacific Northwest, Cardinal's company is always in disaster planning mode. While they were able to quickly deploy technology to allow their 240 employees to work remotely, she never considered what it would mean for parents being stuck at home working with their children. They needed a solution that would support parents on a day-to-day basis.

"A few weeks ago, she (Murphy) and I got on the phone and talked about the need that we were having in our company. She came up with the idea of Digital DaycareTM," Cardinal said.

The idea was green lighted and Murphy had it all ready to go within three days.

Here are some of the activities that will be covered during The Fab Lab with Crazy Aunt Lindsey: Easy DIY STEM projects,

American Sign Language, Kids fitness,

Yoga,

Snack ideas, and Storytime.

And there are a few ingredients that set The Fab Lab apart from other online educational programs

Reed says, "The kids aren't getting bored because she's constantly changing content. I also feel as though she's an educator. Sometimes you have an entertainment factor that outweighs



the education. She does a good job of balancing both.'

Murphy also has appearances from professionals who talk about their careers from companies like Microsoft and Nike. Reed's husband, newly-promoted Master Sgt. Reed, will soon be on to teach kids how to perform military emergency CPR.

For families who can't catch the program during its livestream hours, there is another alternative. Each Digital Daycare™ episode is uploaded to the Fab Lab's YouTube page. Viewers can also enjoy previous content like Murphy's DIY science projects that were featured in a summer series on Portland Today news.

Aunt Lindsey. Although the activities are designed to be done with the whole family to encourage bonding, adult interaction is not always necessary. Most projects are safe and easy.

"She does science that's safe for kids to engage on their own and parents can supervise," Reed said. 'My four-year-old can participate in about 60% of it without adult
