

Chief Master Sgt. JoAnne S. Bass named 19th Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --

Chief Master Sgt. JoAnne S. Bass was selected June 19 to become the 19th Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force, becoming the first woman in history to serve as the highest ranking noncommissioned member of a U.S. military service.

In selecting Bass, incoming Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. CQ Brown said Bass brings skills, temperament and experience that the job requires and an outlook on leadership that meshes with

"I could not be more excited to work side-by-side with Chief Bass," Brown said.

"She has unique skills that will help us both lead the Total Force and live up to the high expectations of our Airmen," he said. "She is a proven leader who has performed with distinction at every step of her accomplished career. I have no doubt that Chief Bass will provide wise counsel as we pursue and implement initiatives to develop and empower Airmen at all levels."

Brown, who will become the 22nd Chief of Staff in August, said selecting the correct candidate to serve as chief master sergeant was one of his most critical decisions in advance of his becoming Chief. The search to replace outgoing Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright was both broad

Bass emerged as the consensus choice from a group of more than a dozen finalists from across the Air Force's global operation, officials said. The finalists were selected based on breadth of experience, recommendations senior commanders and performance across each candidate's Air Force career.

"I'm honored and humbled

to be selected as the 19th Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force, and follow in the footsteps of some of the best leaders our Air Force has ever known," Bass said. "The history of the moment isn't lost on me; I'm just ready to get after it. And I'm extremely grateful for and proud of my family and friends who helped me along the way.'

When asked about the job and her partnership with Brown, Bass acknowledged that strong "chemistry" is important and the standard was set by Wright and Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David Goldfein.

Brown, she said, is "the kind of leader we've all wanted to work with. I'm excited for the opportunity to serve as his chief and his wingman. Together, we will do everything we can to ensure that every Airman and their families are taken care of and feel like they are a part of our Air Force family."

She added, "CMSAF Wright and Team 18 have set a pretty high bar, but I know that Team 19 will rise to the occasion.

"... My job will be to help set the stage for individual and team development, so our brothers and sisters are healthy, engaged and ready for the fight!" Bass said.

Wright endorsed the choice as

"I've known Jo for many years and watched closely as she's guided Team 18 and led her own teams to great success," he said. "This is a historic moment for our Air Force and she is a phenomenal leader who'll bring new ideas and her own style to the position. She'll do great things for our Airmen and she'll blaze her own trail as our CMSAF.'

Bass is clearly prepared for the new assignment.

She currently serves the command chief master sergeant, Second Air Force, at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi. In her current assignment, Bass is the senior enlisted leader and advisor to the commander on all matters relating to the professional development, proper utilization, and the readiness of the enlisted

The command consists of four training wings, 18 groups with 76 operating locations worldwide, in support of 13,000 enlisted, officers, civilians, contractors and 36,000 basic military trainees per

In addition, Second Air Force is home to more than 260 Air Force specialties through 2,300 courses graduating 150,000 Airmen, Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, and international students annually in various fields including financial management, security forces, cyber, personnel, weather, civil engineer, and aircraft maintenance, while providing 93% of the Air Force's initial skills training.

She began her career in 1993 with a posting at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina, and has served at Ramstein Air Base, Germany, as the command chief master sergeant for the 17th Training Wing at Goodfellow Air Force Base, Texas, and

at the Pentagon as chief, Air Force Enlisted Developmental Education.

Her service awards include "Distinguished Graduate" from the Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy in 2009 and the 2011 Senior Noncommissioned Officer of the Year Award for the 86th Operations Group.

By coincidence, Bass also shares two notable similarities with her soon-to-be partner, Brown. Both come from Army families. Bass lived in several overseas and stateside locations, prior to entering the Air Force. Brown's father is a retired Army colonel.

Brown is the first African American in history to be confirmed as a chief of staff for any branch of the U.S. military. Bass will be the first woman to serve as the senior enlisted leader for a military service.

When Brown and Bass move to their new assignments, they will confront an Air Force in transition. The force is moving from a heavy focus on

combatting terrorism to one that must be prepared to confront China, Russia and other peer adversaries. Each will be called on to continue the Air Force's efforts to improve resiliency across the force and reduce

They also will be responsible for addressing racial disparity in the Air Force.


Across all those issues and others, Bass, as chief master sergeant of the Air Force, will provide direction for the enlisted force and will represent their interests.

Like previous CMSAFs, she will be the public face of Air Force enlisted personnel and those in all levels of government. As noted by Brown, she will be a personal adviser to the chief of staff and Department of the Air Force Secretary Barbara Barrett on issues regarding the welfare, readiness, morale and proper utilization and progress of more than 410,000 enlisted members.

Uncontested Divorce Part II: With Children

Couples often assume that if they have minor children, they cannot have a simple divorce and the process will inevitably be lengthy and expensive. This does not have to be the case.


When one parent is in the military, decisions and agreements about how to co-parent children are even more important—and sometimes complicated. If a couple agrees on all terms of their divorce, including those regarding children, we can handle the matter in our straightforward uncontested divorce process.

There are several major areas that have to be decided regarding minor children in a North Dakota divorce proceeding. These include the

- 1. Parenting Plan: This plan outlines which parent will have custody of the children at what time. It generally includes a day-to-day schedule as well as a holiday and summer schedule. If one or both parents is in the military, it is perhaps inevitable that that parent will be required to move out of state at some time in the relatively near future. An uncontested divorce parenting plan for military families should carefully outline what will happen when that occurs.
- 2. Decision-making: There are two types of decision-making for children-routine and major. Routine decision-making deals with everyday issues and activities while major decision-making covers larger topics like medical care, religion, education, etc. Parents can share both types of decision-making or assign them to either party.
- 3. Child Support: The state of North Dakota does not allow parents to waive or set child support for minor children. Even if you and your spouse agree that each parent can care for the children out of their own financial resources and no child support is required, this is not legally allowed because child support has been ruled to belong to the child, not the parent. As such, there are specific calculations based on income that will be performed to determine the exact child support obligation.

There are also additional issues to be covered including health insurance (generally biological or legally adopted children of the military member will continue to be eligible for TRICARE following divorce), income tax exemption, among others. In our intake meeting, we discuss all of these issues to verify that both parties are in agreement and are aware of the relevant laws which affect their situation.

Deciding that divorce is the best choice for your military family is always difficult but even more so when there are children involved. If matters can be decided amicably, we can help expedite the process with an uncontested divorce so everyone can begin to adjust to new circumstances.



- · Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Increasing activity with calmer winds but Lake Darling still somewhat slow. No new reports from the Grano area.
- · Lake Darling, Upper Souris Nat'l. Wildlife Refuge, Foxholm: A few walleye starting to show up from Lake Darling but overall still generally slow. Some smallmouth bass success from shore from Lake Darling. Outlet Fishing Area slow.
- · Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Continued bluegill activity in the shallows and around the docks. OK walleye success with better activity in morning hours. Nice numbers of pike still showing up.
- Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon. Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Fair to good for walleye on the east end of Lake Sakakawea working shallow along shorelines out to 15 or 16 feet. Try Steinke Bay, east end humps, or Mallard Island or west around Church Island and Douglas Bay. Try a variety of presentations and bait. Missouri River producing nice-sized walleye in the chutes. Lake Audubon fair to good

- Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Good numbers of small walleye with increasing success on nightcrawlers. Work a variety of depths.
- Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Nice numbers of small walleye. Work a variety of depths and move around with activity throughout much of the Van Hook Arm. Better success now coming on nightcrawlers.
- ·Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Resort, New Town: Improving walleye success using minnows yet. The key is working deeper water in about 25 feet for larger fish. Move around with success scattered throughout the Van Hook
- · Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River continues producing walleye in the spillway channel with lots of small fish and anglers sorting for their keepers. Some catfish mixed in. Try Lindy rigs and nightcrawlers or leeches but a variety of other presentations are also producing success. Jigging down river in the holes is producing larger fish. Try the cable crossing or coal veins. Chutes remain good for catfish with some walleye and salmon mixed in. Try 3-way swivels. Some night success, as well. Rocks still producing success at night from shore. Lake Sakakawea spotty on the east end for walleye. Move around to locate active fish. Try working from point to point. Look for a transition to deeper water soon. Occasional salmon using downriggers.
- Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: West end of Lake Sakakawea starting to clear with less wind. Best walleye

Remove from the heat and stir in the vanilla, cinnamon, and almond extract. Let cool slightly.

Lightly butter the bottom and sides of a rimmed baking sheet. Combine the oats, sunflower seeds, wheat germ and nuts (coarsely chopped) in a large mixing bowl.

Pour the warm syrup over the oat mixture. Butter your hands and mix well. Press the mixture into the prepared baking sheet.

When ready to cook, set the grill temperature to 300° and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes. Bake the granola until lightly browned, about 1 hour. Let cool,

then break into chunks in a large mixing bowl.

Stir in the coconut and dried fruit. Store in an airtight container. Enjoy!






Aerospace medicine: flight surgeons

Flight surgeons, despite their official duty title do not perform surgeries while in flight. The misnomer stems from the early days of aviation medicine, when the U.S. Army Aviation Section ordered three military physicians to attend aviation school to ensure aircrew were physically prepared to fly. Today, flight surgeons are more commonly known as 'flight doctors' or 'flight physicians.'

In current times, flight surgeons still play a unique and integral role in the Air Force mission.

"Flight surgeons are rated officers and are thus required to log flight hours every month," said Maj. Andrew Pellegrin, a flight surgeon and chief of aerospace medicine at the 28th Medical Group. "This helps us to maintain the knowledge and

ELLSWORTH AIR FORCE credibility required to make decisions as to whether our aviators are fit to fly.'

Pellegrin, who was awarded his flight surgeon wings in 2018, explained that flight surgeons must complete an aerospace medicine primary course in addition to having completed medical school and post-graduate medical training. After obtaining their flight surgeon wings, there are supplementary trainings that must be completed within their first year. Examples include advanced trauma support, centrifuge training and an aircraft mishap investigation course.

Pellegrin is well aware of the particular physical difficulties a crew member may face during aviation. Although not typical of all flight surgeons, Pellegrin was a pilot prior to attending medical

There are several physiologic stressors that can impact aviators during a mission, explained Pellegrin. Altitude, acceleration, increased radiation exposure and time pressure are examples of conditions that may come into play – depending on the aircraft and mission.

Recently, aircrew assigned to the 28th Bomb Wing participated in several long-range Bomber Task Force missions and flight surgeons were there to help aircrew members prepare.

"[Flight surgeons] work with aviators to educate them about proper sleep hygiene, circadian rhythms, nutrition and exercise," said Pellegrin. "Preparing for long-range missions starts well before the night prior to takeoff. We use computer models that predict how alert the crewmembers will be during

each phase of the long duration sorties based on takeoff time, time zones, sortie duration, and other variables."

In addition to ensuring that aviators are fit to fly, many flight surgeons - dependent on their base - serve as occupational medical specialists. They help monitor the safety and health of the base population, particularly those who work in hazardous work environments.

"Every day we work with outstanding aerospace medical technicians, as well as colleagues in optometry, public health, bioenvironmental engineering, and others across the medical group and the base," said Pellegrin. "All of our colleagues have a tremendous impact on the mission, but flight surgeons get the opportunity to see it with our own eyes as part of our daily work."

Flight surgeons or 'flight docs' are an essential part of the mission. They ensure that every Air Force member is healthy and mission ready in order to provide airpower - anytime, anywhere.

AFLCMC acquires new Air Force handgun

WRIGHT-PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE, Ohio (AFNS) --

Combat arms units across the Air Force are getting new and improved 9mm caliber handguns to replace the M9 pistols that have been in service since 1985.

The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center's Small Arms Program Office acquired approximately 125,000 M18s from Sig Sauer for \$22.1 million, and is making them available to Air Force organizations that have a handgun requirement.

purchase includes test ammunition as well as engineering services.

"The Air Force bought the M9s back in the 1980s, and the design has not really changed since then," said Merrill Adkison, Small Arms Program Office senior logistics manager. "M9s are

larger, heavier, all-metal pistols; whereas M18s are lighter polymer pistols with a more consistent trigger pull and adjustable grips for large and small hands."

Adkison added that providing a modern handgun to Airmen was important in part due to the increasing difficulty of replacing and sustaining older technology in M9s.

In response to issues with the age and sustainment of M9s, the Air Force Security Forces Center developed the Capability Production Document for the Modular Handgun System that the Army later adopted, resulting in procurement of the M17 and M18 Modular Handgun System.

The new M18 costs the Air Force about one-third of what it would cost to buy an M9 today.

"It is important for the U.S.

Air Force to move forward with improvement and replacement of weapon systems to keep pace with potential adversaries and field the best technology and equipment available for our warfighters," said Brian Lautzenheiser, lead program manager in the office. "The USAF Small Arms Program Office has worked with the Army to get these new weapons on contract and in the hands of the warfighters. We are a small team with a lot going on as we work to procure and sustain all small arms from pistols to .50 caliber ground-mounted machine guns. We have a great professional team that understands the importance of assisting the field to meet their needs."

The program office anticipates that M18 delivery will be complete by August 2022.

The Air Force Security Forces Center, in partnership with the Air Force Small Arms Program Office, has begun fielding the new M18 Modular Handgun System to Security Forces units. The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center's Small Arms Program Office acquired approximately 125,000 M18s from Sig Sauer for \$22.1 million.



Air Force releases JADO doctrine

MAXWELL AIR FORCE BASE, Ala. (AFNS) --

The Department of the Air Force released the service's first doctrine annex on Joint All-Domain Operations June 1, outlining how the service expects to maintain its competitive advantage.

Annex 3-1, Department of the Air Force role in JADO, builds on the doctrine note signed by Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David Goldfein in March, and the direction to deter and defeat adversaries from the National Defense Strategy.

"Developing this new annex on an emerging concept was a challenge, and I'm proud of the efforts from all Airmen involved," said Maj. Gen. Brad Sullivan, Curtis E. LeMay Center Doctrine Development and Education commander. "Publishing JADO doctrine is a first step in changing how we think and conduct operations with the reemergence of great power competition."

The LeMay Center expects to continue testing and evaluating the annex to improve DAF support to JADO development across the Department of Defense.

developing emerging doctrine, we tapped into a community of experts across the Department of the Air Force. We will continue to engage and grow this community as we refine this doctrine," said Lt. Col. Jeremy Holmes, LeMay Center, Air Force Doctrine Development director. "Working with the Air Force Warfighting Integration Capability was essential as they had already begun work to establish and further develop joint all-domain command and control concepts. Input from our existing doctrine community in the DAF was key,

and will continue to be critical as we develop emerging JADO doctrine."

Shortly after taking command in July, Sullivan directed LeMay's Wargaming Center to design, develop and execute a wargame that would drive JADO insights. The first iteration of what would become the Chennault Series occurred in December and contributed to both the JADO doctrine note and annex.

"With the Chennault Series, we were able to leverage expertise

resident in LeMay (Center), pull students in from across Air University resident programs and include subject matter experts from around the DAF," Sullivan said. "The first two exercises in the series may be complete; however, we'll continue to test and adapt JADO."

As both the doctrine and the pace of near-peer competition evolves, the LeMay Center is looking for feedback from Airmen on how to improve Annex 3-1.

"This doctrine annex is not a static document, meant to gather dust in professional reading libraries," Holmes said. "We expect to update Annex 3-1 at a more frequent pace as lessons are learned and best practices become apparent, but we need bright minds from across the DAF to identify what is missing."

The LeMay Center for Doctrine Development and Education serves as the chief of staff of the Air Force's principal agent for doctrine, Air Force Lessons Learned and provides Air Force input to joint doctrine. The center also assists in the development of concepts and strategy. For any matters dealing with basic and operational level doctrine, Air Force organizations coordinate directly with the LeMay Center. It accepts feedback on all doctrine through the doctrine website, email address, as well as a doctrine subReddit.




