MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -- The 5th Bomb Wing held a ribbon-cutting ceremony to introduce a new Welcome Center facility August 21, 2020 at Minot Air Force Base.

Newly arriving Warbird and Roughrider Airmen and their families will now have the ability to in-process at the Welcome Center, allowing for a speedy and personalized onboarding experience. The ultimate goal of the project is not only to streamline and consolidate the necessary activities involved in arriving at a new duty station, but to ensure a warm and informative welcome to the base and the local Minot community. The \$380,000 remodel provides the opportunity to onboard the new Airmen in a single facility while delivering quality services that save time.

"It's ultimately a place the Airmen and their families can come to be comfortable, while also having the agencies needed here to make the ins and outs of arriving at a new base easier to tackle" said Fabian Perales, Welcome Center Manager.

The new facility is now open for appointments, during which Airmen will in-process with representatives from finance, traffic management, housing, medical group, and military personnel flight. Additionally, onboarding Airmen have the opportunity to connect with various helping agencies and entities such as a True North provider, chaplain, key spouse, community support coordinator, and resident advocate.

After his in-processing appointment, Staff Sergeant Nicholas Colbert said "This is my thirdtime in-processing to a new base and the way they have it set up here at the Welcome Center made the entire process so much easier than either of my two previous moves. Not only is it all in one place, but it's a lot more personal since each of the representatives from the organizations takes the time to sit with you one on one and go over everything you need. That made a huge difference

The Welcome Center isn't just a building. It's an opportunity to reach out to Airmen and to help them get settled, connected, and learning their jobs. Our Airmen need to understand they are supported by their leadership and our Minot community.

"Our goal is to get everyone coming into Minot taken care of in a stress-free environment so they're done with this part by the time they have to report to their unit, which saves everyone time" Mr. Perales said.

In 2019, the welcome center concept proved its value under the True North program in a previous location by in-processing 1148 Airmen at a different location. By consolidating the majority of necessary appointments into one location, Team Minot saved 957 man-hours in 2019 alone. The newly dedicated location is easier to find and better configured for an even smoother onboarding experience.

The new Welcome Center is a crucial part of earning positive and lasting impressions from arriving Airmen that our Warbirds, Roughriders, and Team Minot community take care of our own.

WHAT IS PROBATE?

Most of us do not realize what Probate is until someone dies. Probate is the legal process necessary to ensure your loved one's assets are distributed legally or in the way they desired, after they pass away. Having a will does not necessarily help avoid Probate. 

When a person dies, their assets become part of his or her estate, unless those assets are co-owned by someone else. How those assets are distributed to loved ones is a major part of Probate. If your loved one passed away with a will, they passed away testate and the will directs Probate. On the other hand, if they passed away without a will, they passed away intestate and therefore the court will determine the rightful heirs. In both cases the court's decision can be contested.

But what if your loved one passed away many years ago, Probate was never done, and now real property cannot be deeded to their heirs. Is it too late? Although North Dakota law does have some restrictions on timelines, generally Probate can be opened at any time to help your family deed land, minerals, or other assets-even many years after the individual has passed away.

In all cases, however, it is necessary to designate an individual known as a Personal Representative. If your family member had a will, they probably picked someone to fill this important role. If they did not, North Dakota specifies who has the highest priority to be appointed, based on the type of relationship they had with the decedent. The Personal Representative must be appointed by the court and his or her job is to make sure everything is handled in a timely, legal manner.

U.S. Bombers & Allied Aircraft Integrate Fly Over All 30 NATO Nations in a Day

U.S. AIR FORCES IN EUROPE & AIR FORCES AFRICA RELEASE NUMBER: 010820

In a unique spin on regularly recurring Bomber Task Force (BTF) missions in Europe, six U.S. Air Force B-52 Stratofortress strategic bombers flew over all 30 NATO nations in Europe and North America on Aug. 28.

single-day mission titled Allied Sky is intended to demonstrate NATO solidarity, enhance readiness and provide training opportunities aimed at enhancing interoperability for all participating aircrews from the U.S. and NATO allies. Allied Sky is the latest iteration of routine BTF missions that have occurred in the European theater of operations since 2018, with more than 200 sorties coordinated with Allies and partners. BTF missions are long-planned and not in response to any current political events occurring in Europe.

Allied Sky will be conducted by two teams:

Stratofortress Four bomber aircraft currently deployed to Royal Air Force (RAF) Fairford, U.K., will fly the European portion of the mission. Strategic bombers will integrate throughout the day with several NATO nations' air force fighter aircraft and aerial refueling aircraft in the skies above each host nation.

Two B-52 Stratofortresses assigned to the 5th Bomb Wing

at Minot Air Force Base, N. D., will fly over the NATO nations of Canada and the United States.

"U.S. security commitments to the NATO Alliance remain ironclad," said Gen. Tod Wolters, commander of U.S. European Command (USEUCOM). "Today's bomber task force mission is another example of how the Alliance sustains readiness, improves interoperability and demonstrates our ability to deliver on commitments from across the Atlantic."

NATO nations scheduled to participate in the mission and integrate with the bomber include aircraft Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Spain, Turkey, the U.K. and the

Operations and engagements with Allies and partners serve as cornerstones highlighting USEUCOM's commitment to global security and stability. These opportunities also serve as a reminder that, despite ongoing challenges presented by COVID-19, U.S. forces remain fully ready to execute their missions across all domains while enhancing interoperability alongside Allies and partners.

"By further enhancing our

enduring relationships, we send a clear message to potential adversaries about our readiness to meet any global challenge," Wolters added.

Unsafe, unprofessional intercept of US bomber by Russian aircraft over the Black Sea

U.S. AIR FORCES IN EUROPE & AIR FORCES AFRICA RELEASE NUMBER: 010820

At approximately 11:19 a.m. on Aug. 28, 2020, two Russian Su-27 Flanker pilots intercepted a U.S. Air Force B-52 bomber that was conducting routine operations in the black sea over international waters. The Russian pilots flew in an unsafe and unprofessional manner while crossing within 100 feet of the nose of the B-52 multiple times at co-altitude and while in afterburner causing turbulence and restricting the B-52's ability to maneuver.

"Actions like these increase the potential for midair collisions, are unnecessary, and inconsistent with good airmanship and international flight rules," said Gen. Jeff Harrigian, U.S. Air Forces in Europe-Air Forces Africa commander. "While the Russian aircraft were operating in international airspace, they

jeopardized the safety of flight of the aircraft involved. We expect them to operate within international standards set to ensure safety and prevent accidents," he added.

Our B-52 Stratofortress aircraft was conducting routine operations in international airspace exercising our freedom of navigation and overflight. The U.S. Air Force routinely operates aircraft in the region in accordance with recognized international safety standards as prescribed in International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) rules of flight.

The Legacy of The Mighty Eighth...

Grandfather & Grandson Serve Their Country



It was a different time when Henry "Hank" Meyer stood in the recruiting line. The world was at war as WW II raged in both the European and Pacific Theaters. His goal was to become a pilot in the Army Air Corps. And so, the military life of Henry Meyer would begin in 1943, and some 76 years later would be closely chronicled in a paper written by his grandson, Major Keith Meyer, Commander of the 5th Munitions


For Major Meyer, sharing the stories of both of his Grandfathers, who both served in World War II, is an honor and a pleasure. But the military life of Henry Meyer, who served in the 8th Air Force in England as a radio operator and waist gunner aboard a B-17 bomber, would eventually be the topic of a paper written by Major Meyer at Air Command Staff College at Maxwell Air Force Base,


"We are a military family, and there is service on both sides of my family" according to Major Meyer, "my parents were incredibly supportive of my dream of serving like my grandpas both did when I grew up, and my Dad always took me to local air shows, or the Air Museum in Fargo. We have a cabin in Detroit Lakes, Minnesota, so Fargo was close." His interest in airplanes and WW II, was fueled by his Grandfather Henry's willingness to talk about the war. "He knew that as an aircrew member, that the odds were 1 in 10 of him not returning from the war" continues Major Meyer, "he was assigned to the 8th Air Force's 94th Bomb Group (Heavy), 331st Bomb Squadron." Not as a pilot however, "Unfortunately he would have trouble counting the number of rotations while performing barrel rolls in the aircraft and would eventually be "washed out" of pilot training for dangerous flying," continues Meyer. The 94th Bomb Group fell under the Mighty Eighth Air Force in the chain of command, "and at the time Hank was flying for them, the Eighth was commanded by the legendary Air Corps General James "Jimmy" Doolittle." The first mission of the 94th was flown on the 13th of May 1943. According to the Major in his paper, "In total, the 94th would fly 324 missions, 8,884 sorties, drop nearly 19,000 tons of ordinance and lose 153 aircraft of the course of the war.'

Much of the information that Major Meyer was able to gather about his Grandfather's service time in WW II comes from a very small, "probably illegal" according to the Major, journal kept by Henry. In it are short, but descriptive, notes about each mission. Date, destination and general conditions are hand written in the journal. The journal is now preserved with other paraphernalia, including both of his Grandfathers' dog tags, to be passed on to the next generation. Maj Meyer tells of one more treasured belonging. "At an ROTC "Dining In" celebration dinner inside of a hangar in the 934th Airlift Wing in Minneapolis, MN, we had the opportunity of having the Mighty 8th's (then) Commander, Lieutenant General Robert J. Elder Jr. as our guest speaker.

After the banquet ended, I made my way to the podium to share stories about my Grandfather and his time in the Mighty 8th. When the conversation ended, General Elder reached into his pocket and pulled out his personal 8th Air Force Commander's coin. He handed it to me and said, "Son, please thank your Grandfather for his service from me." I gave the coin to my Grandfather and there were tears in his eyes when I told him the story. After he passed away, my Mom was cleaning out his desk, and there in a mahogany box was that coin. I have it now in my office."

His memories of his Grandfather Henry Meyer include many conversations about the war, "but you really don't pay attention to what they are telling you at the time" continues Maj Meyer. "My Grandfather could hold a conversation with almost everyone, and he did. He talked about the comradery of the bomber crews, and the importance of the missions. I just want people to know that my Grandfather was just an ordinary



guy, who was a hero. We should appreciate their service."

As coincidence would have it, Henry Meyer's last mission (his 28th in total), would also be the final mission of the 94th Bomb Group in Europe. The 94th was deactivated after the war. Henry would spend Victory in Europe (VE) Day (9 May 1945) in England, enjoying a welldeserved celebration with his fellow comrades in arms, as well as the British community surrounding the airfield. He would also be inducted into the "lucky bastard club," which was a joke certificate handed out upon completing the required number of missions to return home. Hank's personal celebration was short lived however, because upon completion of the war in Europe, men with insufficient points in the 331st Bomb Squadron were to be transferred and retrained to fly and operate another heavy bomber, the B-24 "Liberator." But his transfer

would to the Pacific Theater would never happen. President Truman would make the decision to drop the atomic bombs and ultimately end the war. Music and a career as a police officer would occupy Henry's time when he returned stateside. He married Thelma, who he met in his pilot training years. In his paper about his Grandfather Maj Meyer talks about the man that was Henry Meyer. "Growing up as Hank's grandson, I was awestruck by his tales of the men and machines used to fight the war, as well as the heroic tales of the bomber crews that would return, and those that wouldn't. Henry never shied away from discussing his missions when asked, and, like many veterans of the war, would claim that he was "just doing his job, and did it the best he could for the men in the fortress with him." He would pass away peacefully in August of 2008.

For Major Meyer, it was a special day when both he and his wife, Major Leah Meyer, received orders to Minot. He would be able to now serve as a legacy Airman in the Mighty 8th Air Force, because it falls under Air Force Global Strike Command. He would move his family of Charli, 9 years old; Kate, 7 years old; and Henry, the name sake of his Grandfather, 4 years old, to Minot Air Force Base.

"I will continue to pay homage to my Grandfather and his service in the Mighty Eighth," says the Major. And should one of the Major's Meyer children choose the Air Force for their career, he or she too will be thankful for the time Henry Meyer spent not only in service to his country, but for the stories he shared about those men, like him who flew the missions and returned. But also, the stories about the many who did not return. To all of them we owe a debt of gratitude.







Physio Moments: Joint By Joint, Part 1, The Ankle

DR. RON GILES, PT, DPT, CSCS, PHYSICAL THERAPIST, 5TH MDG

If you missed the last article printed in the August 21st issue I strongly encourage you take a moment to go back and review it because this week we are kicking the Joint by Joint series off at the ankle. The ankle could be considered our foundation for quality movement; the way we step, run, squat, lunge, negotiate stairs and more is all impacted by our ankles' ability to move. In much of the research, particularly research focused on military and athletic populations, they find a lack of ankle mobility to be one of the leading risk factors for

The ankle moves in several different ways, but our primary focus is going to be dorsiflexion. This is the ankles' ability to bend in a way that brings the foot closer to the shin. A very easy way to assess your ankle mobility is shown here:


- Place a piece of tape a hands width (measured at the widest point) distance away from the wall.
- In a ½ kneeling position with shoes off place the big toe on front edge of tape
- Keeping the heel of the front foot in contact with the floor slowly drive knee toward the wall





*If you can touch the wall with your knee and your heel easily stayed in contact with the floor, then you have reasonable ankle motion into dorsiflexion. not, let's work to improve your mobility with the following 2 exercises that require minimal equipment and time.





- Ankle Mobility Drill 1: Perform 2-3x daily x 12 repetitions/side and before every
- o Find a distance with front foot away from wall that is challenging to touch knee to the wall while your heel stays in contact with the ground. Move the knee back and forth from the wall while keeping your heel down. As the motion improves, slide your foot further from the wall to increase challenge.
- Ankle Mobility Drill 2: Perform 2-3x daily x 5 repetitions/ side and before every workout
- o Place forefoot on small step keeping heel in contact with the floor. Step opposite leg forward and up on to small step and hold for 5 sec. Step off and back to start position, repeat for a total of





5-6 reps/side. The taller the step the harder the drill.

Re-visit the self-assessment every 4 weeks to track your progress, the ultimate goal is to easily be able to clear the assessment and staying consistent with these drills you will get closer each time. Next time we will dive into our 4 part series covering the hip. As always, move well, live healthy and keep the mission alive Warbirds and Rough Riders!
